

Lesson From Steve

"Most assuredly, I say to you, he who does not enter the sheepfold by the door, but climbs up some other way, the same is a thief and a robber. But he who enters by the door is the shepherd of the sheep" John 10:1-2. Fake vs. Real. Counterfeit vs. Genuine. Imitation vs. Authentic. IMPOSTORS! Stories abound concerning people who have posed as someone only to be exposed as a fraud, especially in God's Word. Many Samaritans thought Simon was a "great power of God" until Phillip entered the scene with the true gospel message (Acts 8:9-13.) Sergius Paulus and the citizens of Paphos were mesmerized by Bar-Jesus (Elymas) until Paul and Barnabas unmasked the "enemy of righteousness" and his facade (Acts 13:6-12.) Later, Paul and Barnabas would defend the gospel against certain Judaizers trying to pervert the brethren of Antioch in Syria uncovering the false teachers lies (Acts 15:1-2; 22-31.)

Jesus is the true Lamb of God - the real, genuine, authentic Christ and Savior of the world. The Lord will go on to state in John chapter 10 that the true shepherd can and will enter through the appropriate door and does not have to sneak in. Another safe guard for the sheep is they will know the shepherd's voice and follow him only. Jesus uses this beautiful and clear illustration to teach us that *He is the door*! Only through Him can one enter into and find salvation, plentiful pasture, and life abundant. ALL OTHERS ARE COUNTERFEIT. Why? Because Jesus did not run away when the wolf came looking for a meal, but gave His life for the sheep – you and me. **"For** *the death* that He died, He died to sin once for all; but the life that He lives, He lives to God" Romans 6:10. Jesus is the good shepherd and His sheep follow His voice. If you are truly His, vou recognize and willingly follow the Master's voice. If you are not following Jesus' voice, then an impostor is leading you down a path you do

not want to be on.
