

WEEKLY TIME EVALUATION

(Isaiah 6:8) To build this confidence that Isaiah had, we must find time (everyday) to pray without ceasing (I Thessalonians 5:17), study to know what we are talking about (II Timothy 2:15), and then we will be ready to begin in earnest the commission that is so great for the Lord's cause. "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature." (Mark 16:15)
