

Notes From Steve

Probably everyone has gone through spells of drifting in life. Maybe in a classroom you peer out the window and let the mind drift off into some other desired activity. Maybe while at work your mind wanders about a future vacation site. Maybe on vacation you allow yourself to think about the many tasks waiting at home. We drift, from time to time, to maybe get away from reality and the pressures of life. Many other instances can be given, but the above references will allow us to ponder the danger of drifting too far away from the shore, so to speak.

The Hebrew writer made this statement referring to the danger of drifting. The text states, "Therefore we must give the more earnest heed to the things we have heard, lest we drift away. For if the word spoken through angels proved steadfast, and every transgression and disobedience received a just reward, how shall we escape if we neglect so great a salvation, which at the first began to be spoken by the Lord, and was confirmed to us by those who heard Him, God also bearing witness both with signs and wonders, with various miracles, and gifts of the Holy Spirit, according to His own will?" (Hebrews 2:1-4) When I break this statement down three things come to the forefront.

1. The danger of spiritually drifting away. I read on the Internet the story of two fishermen who were fishing above a low dam. As they were concentrating on catching fish, they were unaware that they had drifted until they were not far from the water flowing over the dam. By the time they realized their situation it was too late. The current was too powerful and they were swept over the edge. The bodies were found three days later. The Hebrew writer is exhorting us to be aware of the current that can sweep us over the waterfalls edge and drown us under the surface. Don't drift! The second point gives us the reason.

- 2. The Word of God has proven itself constant and firm. Whether through angels, Jesus Christ, or His apostles God has always delivered in simple to understand terms His will for mankind. Follow His rules! And if we allow ourselves to drift away from God and His Word, then as the scripture so distinctly asks how shall we escape if we neglect the salvation found in His holy Word?
- 3. Salvation comes through Jesus Christ and His teachings. Whether from the Lord's lips Himself or through the ones He personally taught, the gospel message brings salvation. Notice the first two verses of Hebrews, "God, who at various times and in various ways spoke in time past to the fathers by the prophets, has in these last days spoken to us by *His* Son..." We are living in the last days and we are to listen to the Son of God, Jesus the Christ. Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth, the life, so one comes to the Father except through me" (John 14:6.)

We are to listen to Jesus. Matthew, Mark, and Luke record one of the most dramatic scenes in the Bible we call the Transfiguration. Jesus allows Peter, James, and John to witness this remarkable event. Jesus is transfigured and all of a sudden standing next to and speaking with Him, were Moses and Elijah. Peter was so startled he hardly knew what to do, except to make three tabernacles. Then comes a most emphatic statement from heaven itself, "This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased. Hear Him!" (Matthew 17:5)

Allowing ourselves to drift away at school or on the job might bring some issues in our earthly existence, but spiritually drifting from the Good News will surely take us over the waters edge to an eternity of doom and torment. Listen to Jesus and salvation will not be lost.
