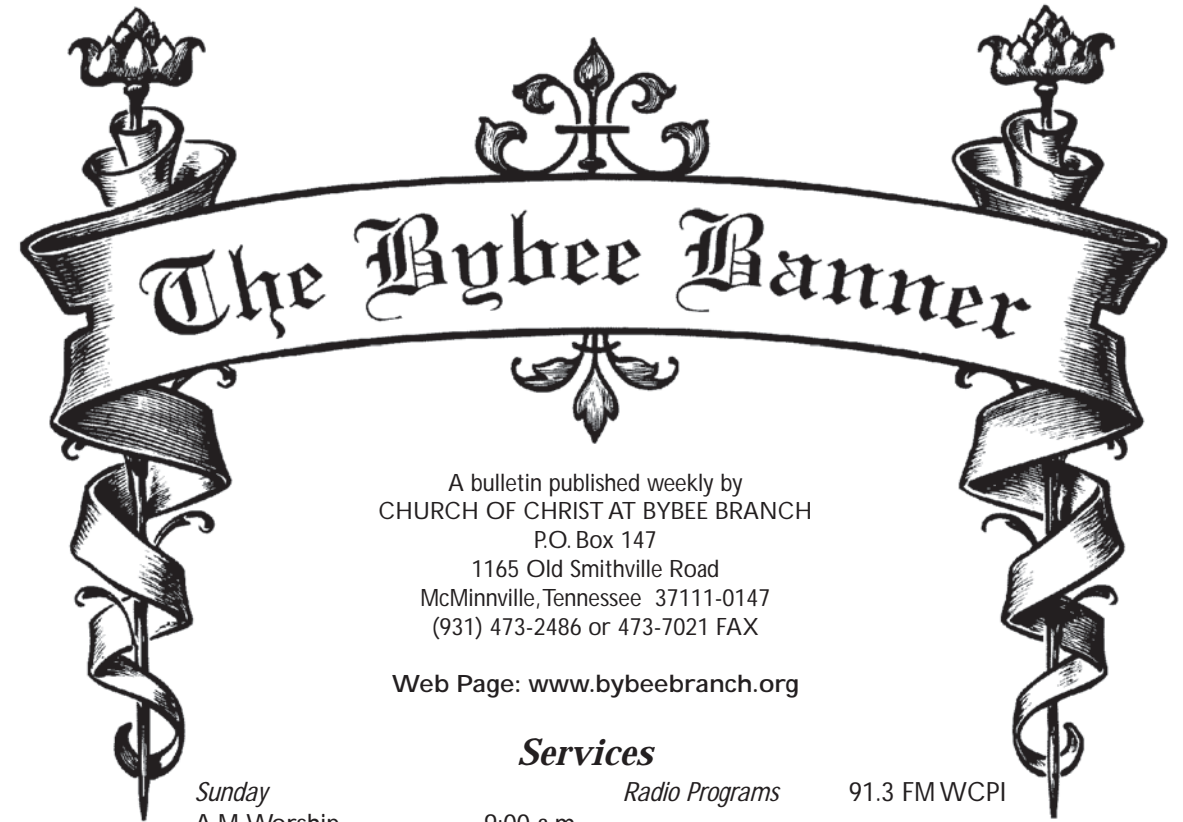

Lessons from Steve

Do you know the sensation of having a song "stuck" in your head? Sometimes I will begin to think about a song with a certain hook and it is with me all day, whether I like that particular tune or not. Our youth recently learned a new song that some teens brought back from summer camp. I have had several parents to ask me about this particular song because their kids keep singing or talking about it. The words to the song are, "Siyahamb' ekukhanyen' kwenkhos'." In the Zulu language this means "We are marching in the light of God."

The song is simple and easy to learn, yet the repetition is beautiful and uplifting. One praises God through the lyrics and at the same time each participant in the song is edified. The Bible indicates that is the whole purpose why singing only is the authorized music approved by the Lord and His apostles (Ephesians 5:19.)

The Hebrew writer placed a great emphasis on how God is praised. "Therefore by Him let us continually offer the sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of our lips, giving thanks to His name" (Hebrews 13:15.) The fruit of our lips are essentially the words and/or lyrics used to praise God. By implication that would devalue (greatly) additives to the worship of God, i.e. musical instruments other than what God has provided, which is the human voice.

Consider what Paul told the church at Colosse, "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom, teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord" (Colossians 3:16.) First, we are admonished to have an abundance of God's word in our account and know how to use it. Secondly, this abundance is distributed by way of instruction and warning. Third, the source used is songs that

praise the Lord and have spiritual meaning. Finally, the method that is to be used is singing. Singing to the Lord with joy and thanksgiving because God has showered us with unmerited favor.

No instrument created by man can replace the "fruit of our lips." To triumphantly declare "We are marching in the light of God" requires a thought out, verbal effort on our part.
