

Youth Notes from Steve

I remember Terann (my oldest daughter) complaining at an early age about her living conditions. Seemingly, her life was miserable. Same old food, same old room, same old people. So, she was given an ultimatum. If free food and free lodging and people who loved and cared for her deeply was not suitable, she was invited to leave. Well after a few tears and I'm sorry, we eventually were on the same page (until she became a teenager, which is another story.)

The Israelites were in a similar position wandering through the wilderness. Numbers 21:4-9 reveals a people who were "fed-up," their patience had run out. So, they let Moses and God both know how they felt. God's chosen thought things could not possibly get any worse. Egypt was looking a whole lot better that the continuous exodus around the dessert, and the manna...everyday, the same old food and traveling with the same old people! Unfortunately for the Israelites, God took exception to the complaints and proceeded to unleash (not child psychology) but a serious and stern reminder of the freedom God was offering. As the fiery serpents reigned terror on the hapless people, they soon realized the error of their way and begged for mercy. What happens next is the most striking part of the story. God did not simply call-off the deadly serpents, but provided a way for the people to be reconnected to Him. Moses was instructed to make a fiery serpent (which he did), place it on a pole and all who had been bitten that looked on it would live.

The above story did not escape the attention of Paul, who used this as an illustration for the church at Corinth, "nor let us tempt Christ, as some of them also tempted, and were destroyed by serpents" (I Corinthians 10:9.) Our position today is no different than the Israelites. Meaning, who are we to test God? The Lord has sacrificed so much for us and His love is immeasurable. Any resistance or impatience to the will of God on our part could result in a failed relationship with Him. Obedience and loyalty has always been a prerequisite to a relationship with God, which is probably the key lesson from this story. The Israelites had failed God, but He gave them an opportunity, a choice to come back to Him.

Even Jesus harkened back to this episode while speaking to Nicodemus. "And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:14-15.) The Israelites, who were injected with deadly poison, were given a shot at redemption by obeying God's instructions and looking at the fiery serpent. We find salvation by looking at the humble, loving, selfless life Jesus temporarily forfeited for our sins on the cross. However, standing and gazing at the cross is not enough. We must be willing to deny ourselves (stop testing God) take up our cross (obey God's commands no matter what) and follow Jesus Christ (because He freely gave His life to save ours) (Matt. 16:24; Mark 8:34; Luke 9:23.)

Our focus should be to not let the struggles of this life, hinder our ability to reason in a sane manner. "Fiery serpents" can come in many forms (words, thoughts, and deeds) and from within or without. Remembering how God freely gave so we could have eternal freedom will hopefully be enough to help us look to the cross for inspiration and guidance. Because looking at the cross reminds us where we have been and the potential for where we can go.
