

Notes From Steve While scanning the Internet for le

While scanning the Internet for lesson ideas, I ran across an excellent source for dealing with peer pressure. Peer pressure can be defined as being faced with a compelling influence by a person of the same ability, rank, etc. No one is immune to peer pressure, regardless of age. How we deal with peer pressure goes a long way in determining the growth of our character. When we are confronted with questionable issues amongst our peers, how do we react or handle the situation. The article I alluded to gave a four-step process for dealing with peer pressure. The steps were:

- Asking a question or question.
- Identifying the wrong.
- Evaluating consequences.
- Suggesting an alternative.

For example look at the situation that happened with Aaron in Exodus 32. Moses was on Mt. Sinai communicating with God, but the people grew tire of waiting and began to put pressure on Aaron to succumb to their demands, which he did. He took the gold they supplied and molded an idol (calf.) The people were so excited they rose up early the next day and sacrificed, ate, drank, and played. We would call it partying. God became furious (as was Moses) and the end result was Aaron lying to Moses, causing the people to sin, and eventually 3000 people were killed, and the rest were plagued. Aaron gave in to the pressure and look at the result! What if he had followed the steps mentioned above?

- Why do we need to construct a worthless god? (Asking a question)
- God has warned not to make idols. (Identifying the wrong; Exodus 20:23)
- God has illustrated what He will do to those who disobey Him. (Evaluating consequences; The Ten Plagues)
- We should pray to the Lord and wait for Moses to come back. (Suggesting an alternative.)

Probably this would not have made Aaron popular, but at least he would have kept himself blameless and save several lives.

Daniel was just the opposite. When the pressure got hot, he withstood and persevered. Read Daniel chapter one realizing he was probably a teenager. He is in the court of arguably the mightiest man on the planet and is being

asked to compromise his morals. Notice verse 8 and 12-13, "But Daniel purposed in his heart that he would not defile himself with the portion of the king's delicacies, nor with the wine which he drank; therefore he requested of the chief of the eunuchs that he might not defile himself...Please test your servants for ten days, and let them give us vegetables to eat and water to drink. Then let our appearance be examined before you, and the appearance of the young men who eat the portion of the king's delicacies; and as you see fit, *so* deal with your servants." Notice how Daniel actually followed the steps we have mentioned.

- Daniel obviously asked if he had to follow the king's orders. (Asking a question)
- Daniel knew he would defile himself. (Identifying the wrong)
- Daniel understood even at his young age that disobeying God was not wise. (Evaluating consequences)
- Daniel offered a solution that would help him and not hurt his steward. (Suggesting an alternative)

Daniel withstood the pressure and refused to conform to what was against his Godly belief. The end result was finding favor among his countrymen and captors.

God will never put us in a situation that we cannot get out of. Never! I Corinthians 10:13 states, "No temptation has overtaken you except such as is common to man; but God *is* faithful, who will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able, but with the temptation will also make the way of escape, that you may be able to bear *it.*" Regardless of what situation we place our selves in; God will provide a way to escape.
