From Tyler's Desk

Miracles in Mark: Don't Make Jesus Angry! In Mark 3:1-5, Jesus posed the Pharisee's with an easy question with an obvious answer. He asked "Is it lawful on the Sabbath to do good or to harm: to save life or to kill?" The question was easy. The answer was clear. The reasoning was flawless.

Throughout the early chapters of the book of Mark, Jesus did amazing things. Jesus had the power to heal the sick. Jesus had the power to cast out demons. Jesus taught with authority. Jesus used reasoning which could not be denied. Common fishermen realized how great Jesus was. The crowds realized how great Jesus was. Even a tax collector realized how great Jesus was. Would the Pharisee's come to the same obvious realization?

Rather than thinking about Jesus' question and accepting their own error, the text says "but they were silent." Unlike the fishermen, the crowds of people, or even a sinful tax collector, the Pharisees were unwilling to submit to the truth which was placed right in their faces.

Jesus had done nothing wrong. Jesus had simply reasoned with them in truth. And yet, they still refused to accept him. Verse five tells us of Jesus' reaction to the Pharisees. "And he looked around at them with anger, grieved at the hardness of their heart." In spite

of the hardness of their hearts, Jesus then turned to a man with a withered hand, commanded him to stretch it out, and restored his hand to full health. Jesus healed the man on the Sabbath. Of course this was not wrong, as Jesus had just shown with his question. But the Pharisee's hated it. Jesus had transgressed, not against God's law, but against the traditions and self-proclaimed authority of the Pharisees. In verse six we read that the Pharisees responded to this action by holding council with the Herodians against Jesus, to destroy Him.

The Pharisee's did not accept Jesus as many others did. This grieved Jesus and made him angry. Why did the Pharisee's not see the simple truth and accept it? Why do some today not accept the truth, even when it is clear? And more importantly, how can we keep ourselves from denying to submit to truth, and thus make Jesus angry with ourselves?

The Pharisees were known as authorities in their religious interpretations in the day. Whatever they said, the crowds would follow. However, throughout the book of Mark, we read of Jesus' increasing popularity (1:28, 33, 45, 2:12). The Pharisees desired popularity and authority more than truth.

In their desire to continue in their popularity and authority, the Pharisees weren't even interested in hearing what Jesus had to say in the first place. In Mark 3:2, we read that they were watching Jesus... "so that they might accuse Him." They already had their mind made up before they even heard what Jesus had to say.

Submission to truth may result in us having to make changes. We may have to give up popularity, friends, or family. We must give God authority over our lives, rather than ourselves. We may have to accept things as truth we wish were not so.

Will you be like the fishermen, crowds, and tax collector who left everything to follow Jesus, or will you be like the Pharisee's, who grieved him and made him angry? James 2:22, "(Abraham's) faith was completed by his works"
