Miracles in Mark: Learning Your Lesson

Many of us are very familiar with the story of Jesus walking on the water. Many of us have known this story from the time colored in the blue waves in our coloring books when we were five. When I think of the story, I readily recall the storm, the fear of the apostles, and their amazement when they saw Jesus walking to them on the water. I usually think of a cool story with a happy ending.

When I was preparing for this week's article, I read Mark's account (Mark 6:45-52), and compared it with Matthew and John's account. When I did this I noticed something I had not noticed before.

I always remembered the story ending with Jesus getting into the boat, and the apostles learning another lesson about Jesus' power. However, as I again read Mark's account, it stood out to me that this story does not have the "happy ending" I remembered. Mark ends the story of Jesus walking on the water in verses 51 and 52:

"And he got into the boat with them, and the wind

ceased. And they were utterly astonished, for they did not understand about the loaves, but their hearts were hardened."

The story of Jesus walking on the water is about more than another demonstration of Jesus' power.. The previous miracle about Jesus feeding the five thousand with only 5 loaves and 2 fish was a miracle about Jesus' power. The story of Jesus walking on the water is a story of rebuke because the Apostle had failed to Jearn their Jesson.

Just as Jesus cared for the hungry multitude, Jesus would take care of his apostles when they were in need. Just as Jesus had the power to take care of the multitude, He would also have the power to protect his apostles. Mark says that the problem with the apostles was that "their hearts were hardened." Although they had some understanding and appreciation for Jesus' love and power, they were not yet willing to fully surrender their hearts and lives to Him.

I would imagine most of you reading my article already have some understanding and appreciation for how much Jesus has done for you. But have you fully let Him have control of your life? Have you learned from the past, or has the hardness of your heart prevented you from faithfully following Jesus all the time? May we learn from the apostles' mistake and let Jesus be our protector.
