From Tyler's Desk: Just a Spark

In I Samuel 14 there is a story told about two courageous men, and how their courage influenced an entire nation of people. In chapter 13 the Israelite army was threatened by the Philistines. Not only did the Philistines outnumber the Israelites by thousands, they also had equipment for war such as thousands of chariots and horsemen. With exception for King Saul, and his son Jonathan, the Israelites did not even have any swords. In the face of the threat, the Israelite army shrunk from 3000 down to 600, because most of the Israelites were afraid and went to hide in the mountains.

Chapter 14 tells of how Jonathan and his armor bearer retained a strong faith in God, even when things were looking hard. In vs. 6, Jonathan said to his armor bearer, "Come, let us go over to the garrison of these uncircumcised; it may be that the LORD will work for us. For nothing restrains the LORD from saving by many or by few." Although Jonathan realized that the LORD might not bless his efforts ("it may be..."), he also realized that God could not help Israel at all if Israel would not do their part and have courage.

To make a long story short, the Lord DID work for them. These two courageous men defeated twenty Philistines by themselves. This act of faith was like a spark which set the entire army of Israel on fire! In verse 21 we read about the Hebrews who were with the Philistines joining back up with Saul and Jonathan (probably those who had been taken captive). Then in vs. 22 then men who had hidden in the mountains of Ephraim followed them into battle. "So the LORD saved Israel that day..." (vs. 23). The entire army of Israel was saved by God, all because of the courageous action of only two men.

There is plenty of work to be done for the LORD today. There is work to be done at our jobs, at home, at school, at the ballfields, or anywhere else where we come in contact with non-Christians. Concerning this work, we can confidently say "it may be that the LORD will work for us." However we also must remember that the LORD cannot work for us, unless we work for the LORD. Let's have courage and get out and work for the LORD. We never know when our work might be the spark needed to accomplish great things.
