Miracles in Mark: Are Your Hearts Hardened?

In Mark 6:30-44, we read an account of Jesus feeding a multitude of five thousand, while using only five loaves and two fish. Through this miracle, Jesus once again showed an example of His compassion for the needy. He also showed the abundance of His great power. However, his closest friends, the twelve disciples, failed to learn their lesson.

Just several weeks later, Jesus and his disciples found themselves in a very similar situation (Mark 8:1-10). This time, they were surrounded with a multitude of four thousand men. They had seven loaves and a few fish. There were fewer people, and more food available, but the disciples once again lacked in faith. They asked Jesus "How can one feed these people with bread here in this desolate place?" But once again, Jesus showed his compassion and his power. He fed the four thousand, and even had seven large baskets of leftovers.

Surely the disciples would understand! But they STILL didn't get it. A short time later, the disciples traveled with Jesus in a boat across the sea of Galilee. However, somebody forgot to pack the lunch! They only had one loaf of bread. The disciples began discussing with each other the fact that they didn't have enough food. Mark 8:17-18 reads, "And Jesus aware of this, said to

them, "Why are you discussing the fact that you have no bread? Do you not yet perceive or understand? Are your hearts hardened? Having eyes do you not see, and having ears do you not hear? And do you not remember?"

We may ask ourselves "how did the disciples not understand?!". But before we come down too hard on the twelve, we must look at our own lives. We have scripture's inspired records of God's greatness. We have the records of the numerous times our faithful God worked to meet the needs of His people. We have witnessed that Christianity has passed the test of time. We have personally experience His help in times past. And yet how often do we fail to put our trust in Him?

I know most of your reading this article DO believe in God. You DO believe in His word. But do we always trust Him? In times of our greatest temptations, do we trust his commandments? Do we trust that righteousness is necessary to be with God? Do we prove that we trust God through the decisions we make?

We have all the evidence we need. Next time Satan tempts you not to trust in God's commandments, do not be like Jesus' twelve were. Do not let your heart be hardened.
