From Tyler's Desk:

Shield of Faith

"In all circumstances take up the shield of faith" – Ephesians 6:16

Paul, the writer of Ephesians teaches that faith, like a shield, provides protection. But for just a second, think about the protection Paul's faith provided him.

In 2 Corinthians II we learn that Paul suffered beatings at the hand of the Jews. Where was Paul's shield of faith?

Paul was once stoned. Why did Paul's faith not protect him?

Paul was shipwrecked, suffered toil and hardship, he was often without food, and suffered exposed in the cold. On top of all this, Paul was under a constant pressure to help the churches. Where was Paul's shield of faith? Why did his faith not provide him protection?

Or perhaps, Paul's faith did protect him. Notice that when Paul wrote about the shield of faith, he teaches that we should take it up in "all circumstances". A shield does not protect a soldier from having to go into battle. A shield protects a soldier when he is in the thick of the battle.

Our faith does not protect us from the hardships in life. It provides the hope and endurance we need to keep going in those hardships.

May we always take up our shield of faith, so that having faced all of life's hardships, we may still be able to say the following words with Paul:"I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith." (2 Timothy 4:7)
