From Tyler's Desk:

Fasting in a Fast Food World

Webster defines "fasting" as "abstaining from food beyond the usual time; to go without food; or to eat very little or nothing."

In today's culture we are surrounded with restaurants such as McDonalds, Burger King, Sonic, Pizza Hut, and Taco Bell. Most Americans eat three meals each day. Most people will only skips meals when we don't have time to eat, or perhaps when we don't feel like eating because we are sick. Most of us are dependent on food, not just for survival, but for fun with friends and family, or just the simply enjoyment of having something tasty to eat! We don't eat to live: we live to eat! In fact, many are dependent of food for dealing with depression, grief or boredom.

When we read our Bibles, we often read about "fasting". We read about Moses fasting. King David fasted. Elijah the prophet fasted. Esther the queen fasted. Daniel the prophet fasted. Paul the apostle fasted. Even Jesus our Lord fasted. In fact, the New Testament teaches more about fasting than it does repentance or confession. Jesus taught more on fasting than He did on baptism or the Lord's supper! And yet the concept of fasting has become very foreign and almost obsolete in our culture, and even in the church.

Since nobody *wants* to give up their food, fasting can be an emotional topic to discuss. Its also a topic with which many of us are unfamiliar. Teaching on the topic of fasting sometimes goes to extremes. Some have taught that fasting is to be bound upon all Christians. Others have viewed fasting as simply a Jewish tradition which is unnecessary and undesirable, and therefore ignore the topic all together.

In my next few bulletin articles I will be presenting a study on what the Bible has to say about fasting. I will address questions such as "What is the purpose of fasting? What does the Old Testament say about fasting? What does the New Testament say about fasting? Should Christians fast today? When should we fast? How should we fast?" I invite each of you to join me in this study. If at any point in the study you have any questions, I would welcome you to email them to me!

Kudzued!

The state of Alabama passed a law against owning a Japanese import—not just any import, mind you, but one—kudzu seeds or seedlings. Imported from Japan in 1876 to control erosion, this vine has taken over the South. Growing as much as 100 feet a summer—that's a foot a day—this pest has spread beyond the gullies to cover whatever is in its path-trees, old houses, or power lines. Kudzu now covers over 7 million acres in Mississippi, Georgia, and Alabama, an area the size of Belgium. Farmers, lumbermen, and utility companies now fight an unending battle against this fast-growing intruder.

What worries me is the ease with which we allow our spiritual lives to be "Kudzued." Things which are not wrong in themselves—careers hobbies, week-ending, etc.—have smothered the life out of the personal devotion and congregational involvement of untold thousands. Jesus, himself, explained how it happens:

"The seed that fell among thorns stands for those who hear, but as they go on their way they are choked by life worries, riches, and pleasures, and they do not mature."—Luke 8:14.
