From Tyler's Desk:

The New Testament and Fasting

During the Old Testament times, God's people frequently reacted to times of physical or spiritual danger with fasting. But the practice of fasting was not limited to the Old Testament.

In the biblical accounts of the life of Christ, we learn that fasting played a role in the life of Jesus. He practiced fasting, taught about fasting, and told of a time when his disciples would fast.

Matthew 4:1 tells of a time when Jesus was led by the Spirit into the wilderness "to be tempted by the devil." In Luke's account we read that he was tempted for forty days. During those days "he ate nothing" (4:2). Apparently Jesus believed that fasting was an appropriate response to this time of temptation.

On the "Sermon on the Mount," Jesus discussed the importance of giving to the needy, praying, and fasting, which were all to be done in secret and not for the praise of others. When Jesus addressed fasting, He began by saying, "When you fast" (Matthew 6:16). In the way Jesus addressed his audience, He did so

based on the assumption that fasting would be a part of the life of his disciples, just as giving to the needy and prayer would also be a part of their lives.

In Matthew 9:14, Jesus was asked, "Why do we and the Pharisees fast, but your disciples do not fast?" Jesus responded with the following illustration: "Can the wedding guests mourn as long as the bridegroom is with them? The days will come when the bridegroom is taken away from them, and then they will fast." Jesus thus taught that fasting should not be practiced without a reason for doing so. (The Pharisees would fast twice a week, whether the occasion called for it or not). Jesus also mentioned that a time would come when his disciples would fast.

Throughout the rest of the New Testament, we read of several examples of Christians practicing fasts. In Acts 13:3, we read of the church at Antioch fasting in preparation to send Saul and Barnabas to do mission work.

When the churches in Galatia were undergoing the serious task of appointing elders, they did so with prayer and fasting (Acts 14:23).

In 2 Corinthians 11:27, Paul, in describing his hardships he had faced as an apostle, mentioned that he was often in fasting.

Fasting was more than just an Old Testament practice, or a Jewish tradition. It played an important role in the life of Christ and in the first century church.

Lord willing, next week I will discuss what I have found the New Testament teaches about the question, "should Christians fast today?"
