From Tyler's Desk:

Confidence

Earlier this week I heard a song lyric that got me thinking. The lyric was this: "Too young to make a good decision, so frozen in my tracks I stayed."

We're often faced with tough choices. Life throws us opportunities and situations, and we must make decisions. Sometimes our decisions can have huge impacts on our future. As the above song lyric points out, it can sometimes feel like we are "too young" or "too inexperienced" to make the right decision. How can we know what choices to make? How can we keep opportunities from passing us up because of our fear? How can we make good decisions with confidence?

In Isaiah 31, we are given three descriptions of God, each of which can give us confidence in our decisions.

In Isaiah 31:1-3, we are reminded that "He is wise." The politicians at that time *thought* they were wise. Having secured an alliance with the Egyptians, they thought they could trust in the power of their chariots and horsemen. But as verse I mentions, they "did not look to the Holy One of Israel or consult the LORD." As a result, their "helper would stumble" and they would fall.

If we are to be confident in our decisions, we

must first seek God's counsel. Is our decision in accordance with God's commands? Are we acting out of selflessness and love? As we consider how our decision should be impacted by God's revealed guidance, we should also stop and pray for wisdom. "If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask of God, who gives generously to all without reproach, and it will be given him" – James 1:5.

In Isaiah 31:4, God is compared to a lion roaring over his prey. In describing God, the text reads "and when a band of shepherds is called out against him, he is not terrified by their shouting or daunted at their noise." In this description, we are reminded that God is not afraid. Therefore if we live on God's side, we don't have to be afraid either. When we are faced with fear, we can remember, "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble" – Psalm 46:1.

Finally, in Isaiah 31:5 we read, "Like birds hovering, so the LORD of hosts will protect Jerusalem; he will protect and deliver it; he will spare and rescue it." Picture in your mind a mother bird flying circles around its nest, protecting it's young. This is what God has promised to do for His people! He keeps a close eye on us, and has promised to protect, deliver, spare and rescue his people.

God is wise, God is powerful like a lion, and God cares for us. When we consider God's way in making our decisions, we can have nothing to fear.
