Ray Garraway of Ykinipa, Guyana ended his earthly journey Sunday. Until I began taking short term mission trips twenty years ago, I had never met anyone who had to sacrificed very much to follow the life of a Christian. Since that time I have met a number of men and women who followed Jesus with much personal sacrifice of material things as well as alienation of family and friends. Bro. Ray was one of those faithful gospel preachers who literally gave up a lot of material blessings to spread God's word to the Amerindian people. At the time of his conversion, he held a position with a Baptist organization which furnished him a nice house and support. He gave that up and spent two years in the preacher's school learning to be a gospel preacher. At the time he decided to go to the jungle to teach the Amerindians, he was preaching for a congregation that had a nice church building and he had all the material comforts that were available such as electricity and refrigeration. He admitted to me that for the first year or so after he went to the jungle, he really struggled with the lack of the things he had taken for granted. He continued to preach the word and converted nearly everyone in the village. Bro. Ray will be greatly missed by everyone he came in contact with. Please keep his wife, Inex, in your prayers as she struggles to adjust to her great loss.
