## **Vote NO to Packaged Liquor**

November 2,2010 will be election day. While many may want to participate in voting for or against certain candidates, there is something on this ballot that should draw



the attention of every faithful Christian. The city of McMinnville will be voting on whether or not to permit the sale of packaged liquor. This is a great opportunity to make a statement to the community that we honor God by respecting His word on the abuse of alcohol. There are numerous social and economic reasons for a person to vote "NO" but for the Christian the most important reason is the teachings of God's word. "Woe to him who gives drink to his neighbor, Pressing him to your bottle, Even to make him drunk, That you may look on his nakedness!" Habakkuk 2:15. "Wine is a mocker, Strong drink is a brawler, And whoever is led astray by it is not wise." Proverbs 20:1. Vote NO. #### **Should We Preach Doctrine**

Many today would say no. As a result, many "have a zeal for God, but not according to knowledge" (Rom. 10:1-2). Bill Hybels, leader of the mega-church movement recently said, "We brought in a lot of people, but we did not disciple anybody." Many today are attracted to a "feel-good" message but have very little knowledge of the Bible. Joel Olsten, the most popular preacher in America today, recently said on Larry King Live, "I wanted to reach the mainstream. We've reached the church audience. What I do is just try to preach practical principles; I may not bring the scriptures until the end of my sermon and I do not feel bad about that" (Joel Olsteen - Larry King Live). Olsteen preaches what is known as the "prosperity gospel" (an appealing and comforting message free from anything considered to be negative). Olsteen preaches to a congregation of about 16,000 and his services are watched by over 7 million every week in over 100 countries.

What does the Bible say about whether or not a preacher should preach doctrine? 2 Timothy 4:2 answers this question: "Preach the word! Be ready in season and out of season. Convince, rebuke, exhort, with all longsuffering and teaching." Preach the WORD (Bible), at all times. Convince (+ or -), rebuke (-), exhort (+), with all longsuffering and DOCTRINE (teaching). Paul shows us that preaching is both positive and negative; it involves both correction and encouragement. The time has truly come when people do not want to hear the word, but as Paul told Timothy, we must preach it (vv.3-5).

I recall some advice given to me by an older preacher when he said, "you do not have to preach the wrong thing to lead others into perdition, all you have to do is not preach the right thing." Speaking the truth in love incorporates every aspect of preaching. If all we preach is "doctrine" we miss blessings the Bible teaches; if all we preach is "blessings" we are not preaching the whole counsel of God.

### What "Bible" Means

I believe that the best definition I've ever read about what the "Bible" means was explained by a small boy. He approached his father and proudly declared, "I know what the Bible means!" The father smiled, and asked, "What do you mean, you know what the Bible means?" "That's easy, Daddy, the young son replied excitedly. "It stands for Basic Information Before Leaving Earth!"

You may be aware that the word "Bible" is a transliteration of the Greek word, Biblios, meaning "Book". However, it is no ordinary book. It is a book of books-66 in number-written over a period of 1600 years by 40 writers from varied backgrounds. Most acknowledge there had to be a creator, yet fail to realize that the Creator has sought to reveal Himself to man-through nature, His Son, and the Book inspired by His Spirit (Psa. 19:1-9; John 14:9; 2Timothy 3:16-17). Indeed, the Bible does provide the information and direction we need-the Basic Information Before Leaving Earth! God has not left man without what is needed to prepare for eternity.
