From Tyler's Desk:

The Light of the World

In our culture we are not accustomed to darkness. At night there are always lights on. Street lights automatically come on at dusk. Our homes become well lit with just a flip of a switch. Many of us have motion-censored floodlights which turn on as soon as we pull in the driveway. On the rare occasion of a power outage, we scramble in the dark to immediately find a flashlight. If a flashlight can't be found, we will resort to using at least the dim light provided by a cell phone so that we can see the few inches in front of us. We rarely experience what its like to be in complete and utter darkness.

This has not always been the case. In Bible times, there would have been very little artificial light. For the most part the day was divided into two profoundly different sections; twelve hours of light, and twelve hours of darkness. When it became dark, you couldn't do much. You would have to wait until day to accomplish your work. You could not travel at night; it would be too dangerous. Night was the time when criminals would be out. Often at night, wild animals would prowl the streets. The difference between day and night was profound. Darkness was dangerous. Darkness was overwhelming. Everything became more difficult in the dark.

In John 8:12, Jesus boldly claims, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in

darkness, but will have the light of life." In a world of darkness and sin, Jesus was the light. In a world overrun with the terrors of Satan, Jesus was the daylight. He enlightens us. He guides us. He exposes errors which are hidden by darkness. He shows the correct way!

But just as light cannot mix with darkness, if we are to walk in the light, this excludes the possibility of walking in the darkness of sin. But through our avoidance of sin, and our dedication to righteousness, we too can have the light of life.
