

At least once a month for the last few years I've passed by an old rusted, junked out 1957 Chevy, sitting and decaying on the side of the road. In original condition it can be worth up to \$100,000.00, yet year after year it sits there. I wonder how many years its been neglected, perhaps decades. The windows are broken, the tires have dry rotted, the floor boards are rusted out, the paint has all chipped off and the tail lights are busted. Despite all the damage and neglect, it can still be restored. It would take a lot of time and energy, and it would be costly, but it could still be restored to its former beauty.

I wonder how many marriages mimic that old car? At one time they were new, fresh and beautiful, yet over time they came to be neglected. Little by little, year after year, they fall apart more and more. For a long time the deterioration/decay goes unnoticed because of the distractions of children, jobs and vacations. Then one day the children have grown up, the job requirements have slowed down and suddenly they realize its not working the way it used to, or perhaps not at all. When this happens what's the next step?

Sadly, for most people the next step is to continue to do nothing. Once it reaches this stage of dilapidation, most people feel it would take too much time and energy to restore it, so they do nothing. Perhaps they feel its been sitting, rusting, for this long, they might as well let it continue. I don't know if there is much hope to convince people in this condition to do something about it, but there is certainly hope for those whose marriages might just be sputtering, but have not stalled.

The key is routine maintenance, not complete restoration. That old Chevy would never have gotten into such a sad condition if someone would have taken care of the little things all along. Nowhere is that more true than in a marriage. Over time work will need to be done on the marriage to keep it running smoothly. If you neglect it instead, it's only a matter of time before it breaks down permanently.
