

Indian Mission Report

During the time we were in India on our mission trip, the Hindu people were having their annual worship of the god Ganesh. This idol worship consist of day and night homage to it with parades, loud music & drums, dancing and putting pink or blue powder all over their bodies. We would see this in every village we went through on our journey. One of the night meetings we had was at the home of a new Christian who had invited their friends and neighbors to hear the gospel. The meeting was held in the front yard of their home. They had ask their Hindu neighbors to allow them one hour of quiet to have our service as the idol was set up two lots down from where we would be. The Hindus had replied that they would not do this and threatened to beat them up and disrupt our meeting (we learned this after our meeting). Needless to say, there was quite a lot of noise and loud music while Steve was presenting his lesson. About half way through his lesson, the electricity went off greatly quieting down



the idol worshippers. It stayed off until Steve finished and then came back on! We like to believe God had a hand in the outage!!!!

This was just one of many ways we believe God had a hand in our outreach to the Indian people. We were often struck by the similarity between modern day India and the idol worship described in the Bible. The Directors of the Andhra Pradesh School of Preaching had planned a ten day campaign not only involving what Steve and I did, but with fifty preachers affiliated with the school. These fifty preachers each held two meeting a night for the ten day across the state for a total of 1000 meeting. How they were able to organize that is amazing. In those 1000 meeting they had 3589 baptisms!!! Steve and I spoke at 26 training sessions, gospel meetings, prayer and regular services. There were 883 baptisms in connection with these services. This gave us a total number of people who were added to the church of 4472. Of that number were 680 denominational preachers. The Directors and preachers know their main task for the next few months is to follow up on these conversions to keep them in the flock.

Thanks to each one of you who keep us in your prayers and helped send us to India. May God's richest blessings be with you.
