

- We need more pursuit of holiness and less pursuit of happiness.
- We need more love for the truth and less love for our preferences.
- We need more foresight in planning and less hindsight in regret.
- We need more concern over direction and less concern over speed.
- We need more struggle against temptation and less surrender to it.
- We need more thanks for our blessings and less murmuring for our trials.
- We need more joy in sharing good news and less joy in sharing bad news.
- We need more who pray without ceasing and less who have ceased praying.
- We need more who seek to be hidden in Christ and less who seek to be hidden from Christ.

A Pessimist

The word "pessimist" at dictionary.com is defined as "a person who habitually sees or anticipates the worst or is disposed to be gloomy." Do you know anyone like that? Are you a pessimist?

No matter what happens in our world today or even around us at home, school, work, etc., some choose to focus on the worst possible case. They seem to be only looking for the "bad" and focus on that and therefore many times will fail to see the "good".

The Proverb writer in chapter 23 and verse 7 declares "For as he thinketh in his heart, so is he..." For the child of God we know the importance of watching our thinking and controlling it. "Keep thy heart with all diligence; for out of it are the issues of life" (Proverbs 4:23). "And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus. Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honest, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report; if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise, think on these things" (Philippians 4:7-8).

A "pessimist" sees and focuses on the problems & not the solutions He subscribes to thinking that life is utterly hopeless and helpless. The "pessimist" has set his mind on situations and circumstances in life instead of as the child of God should do, that is, have his mind set on our Spiritual relationship with the Lord (Philippians 2:5; 4:4-8, 13; Colossians 3:1-2; 2 Corinthians 5:17).

Defeating our "pessimistic attitude" is not something that will happen just by accident nor easily accomplished. Why? What is the first thing the "pessimist" is thinking? 'I can't do this". Then he begins to reason, "even if I do overcome this, it probably will not last".

Let me suggest a few things that we need to think about in defeating this "pessimistic attitude":

- REFLECT on the Persons of the Past. Think about Joshua and Caleb in Numbers 13-14 and the reports
 given by them and the other 10 spies. Joshua and Caleb focused on the precepts and promises of God
 and not on the people and possible problems in the land of Canaan. Or think about David in 1 Samuel
 17 as he does battle against the giant Goliath. Where was David's thinking? It was not upon the size of
 Goliath but upon the support of God.
- REMEMBER the *Power of Prayer*. Peter declares in I Peter 5:7 "Casting all your care upon him, for he careth for you". We need to pay special attention to the following words, "Be careful for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known unto God. And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus"
- RELY upon the Lord's *Precious Promises*. The Lord will keep His Word. He is one that we can and must always trust. "Trust in the Lord with all thine heart, and lean not to thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct thy paths" (Proverbs 3:5-6). We can face whatever comes our way and be victorious because of the confidence we have in the Lord. (I Corinthians 10:13; 2 Peter 3:9; Romans 8:28; I Corinthians 15; Revelation 2:10).
- RENDER our mind and life to the *Precepts and Principles* of God's Word. The only way we will ever be what God wants is to have our minds and manner of life conform to God's Word. Then we can live a life with assurance & confidence (2 Tim. 3:16-17; 2 Pet. 1:3; Rom. 12:1-2; Phil. 2:5; Col. 3:1-3).
