Great Example Of Humble Service

This past Friday services were conducted at High's for brother Charles (Chuck) Jackson Conner. His life was eloquently memorialized by brethren Doris Hughes and Brandon Parsley. He and his wife had been members at the Centertown church of Christ for many years. What many people did not know was that brother Chuck and his deceased wife Mary Ella (Nicki) Conner did good works quietly for many years.

About 20 years ago brother Chuck and his wife came by the church building in earlier November wanting to know if we could help them with a project they wanted to do. They said they wanted to prepare a "Thanksgiving Meal" for some needy family. He said that they wanted to do so anonymously so that the Lord got the credit, not them. So for many years they prepared a large, delicious meal with all the trimmings in disposable plates and delivered it to the church building on Wednesday before Thanksgiving. Then one of the deacons would assist in locating a needy family and taking this meal to that family. Each year, he would say, "let's just keep this quiet," often asking me not to even tell the deacons who had prepared the meal. Now that brother and sister Conner are gone I think it is time to tell of just one of their good deeds.

When I heard of brother Chuck's passing I could not help but think of what Jesus said. ""Take heed that you do not do your charitable deeds before men, to be seen by them. Otherwise you have no reward from your Father in heaven. Therefore, when you do a charitable deed, do not sound a trumpet before you as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, that they may have glory from men. Assuredly, I say to you, they have their reward. But when you do a charitable deed, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, that your charitable deed may be in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will Himself reward you openly."
