

Sunday Guest: Dave Miller

This coming Sunday speaking at all three services will be brother Dave Miller. The evening lesson will be a part of the Summer Series with the topic: Jesus Teaches About Worship.

Brother Miller is the executive director of Apologetics Press. He received his BA in Bible and Speech from Lubbock Christian University, MA in speech from Texas Tech, MDiv from Harding School of Theology, and PhD from Southern Illinois University. He has been with us previously speaking on Islam and then on the Silencing of God.

Can One Have Sins Forgiven Before Baptism?

That is a very good question! It is a question of eternal consequence! Really, the question is, "At what point is one saved?" I'd like to share three passages with you – passages that answer this question.

The first passage is Mark 16:16. Jesus said, "He who believes and is baptized will be saved; but he who does not believe will be condemned." Who was speaking? Jesus! He has the words of eternal life (John 6:68). His word will judge us (John 12:48). Where does He place salvation? Does He place it at the point of faith? No! Does He place it before baptism? No! Jesus said, "He who believes and is baptized will be saved..." Belief and baptism are connected by the coordinating conjunction "and." Belief is essential for salvation "and" baptism is essential for salvation. Both believe "and" baptism precedes salvation.

The second passage is Acts 2:38. When the people on Pentecost asked what to do to be saved, Peter responded, "Repent, and let every one of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit." What must we do to receive the remission of sins? Peter, and inspired apostle, said to "repent" and "be baptized." Again, "and" is a conjunction that connects "repent" and "be baptized." Both are essential for "the remission of sins." Since

both precede and are essential to salvation, the remission of sins cannot possibly take place before repentance and baptism!

The third passage is Romans 6. In verses 3 and 4 Paul explained how baptism is a "form" of the death, burial and resurrection of Christ - the fundamental facts of the gospel (I Corinthians 15:3-4). Paul wrote, "Or do you not know that as many of you as were baptized in Christ lesus was baptized in His death? Therefore we were buried with Him through baptism into death, that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life." Now note what Paul said in verses 16-18: "Do you not know that whom you present yourselves slaves to obey, you are that one's slaves whom you obey, whether of sin leading to death, or of obedience leading to righteousness? But God be thanked that though you were slaves of sin, yet you obeyed from the heart that form of doctrine to which you were delivered. And having been set free from sin, you became slaves of righteousness." Before we obey this "form of doctrine" (before we are baptized into Christ), we are the "slaves of sin." When we obey this "form of doctrine" (when we are baptized into Christ), we are "set free from sin" and become "slaves of righteousness."

Now put these passages together in answering the question, "Can one have sins forgiven before baptism?" To be saved we must believe and be baptized – Mark 16:16. To have the remission of our sins we must repent and be baptized – Acts 2:38. Before baptism (the form of doctrine we obey), we are servants of sins. It is when (not until) we are baptized (obey that form of doctrine) that we are set free from sin – Romans 6:3-4,16-18.

Have you been baptized to be saved? Have you been baptized for the remission of sins? Have you obeyed this form of the death, burial and resurrection of Christ and been set free from sin? Can one be forgiven without doing what God requires?
