What do we do when our feelings are hurt?

I would imagine that everyone that is reading this at one point in their life have had their feelings hurt. It can be as simple as someone saying you do not match and you look ridiculous. Even though when you walked out the door this morning you thought you looked really good. My wife tells me I don't match all the time. I think I look as good as a show dog and I come strutting in the bedroom and say hey look at my tie, shirt and suit combo and doesn't it look great. Then I get a look, are you serious, is this a joke, go change that tie and don't ever put that combo on again. Maybe your feelings get hurt by something far more serious. Maybe someone attacks your family or even you. What would our first response be? How would you handle this situation? I can tell you from past experiences, that I would become angry and begin to lash out and ridicule that person and even enjoy watching them suffer. That is not being the best example. "For I have given you an example, that ye should do as I have done to you." (John 13:15 KIV) and "For even hereunto were ve called: because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that ye should follow his steps:" (IPet. 2:21KIV) Christ gave us the example that we should be striving to match.

When a person does not treat us well, and offends us, is it our goal to make them feel small and belittle them? Does that make us feel better, seeing them cry and become embarrassed? No, we should try to treat the person that has offended us the same way that we want to be treated. I KNOW this is not easy nor is it normally our first reaction. But let's read what lesus said: "Therefore all things whatsoever ye would that men should do to you, do ye even so to them: for this is the law and the prophets." (Matt 7:12 KIV) This is hard to obey, because when we are hurt our first tendency is to hurt the one that hurt us. The next time you find yourself in this situation let's try to do what Christ commanded us to do, and treat them the same way we want to be treated.

Here is one reason, of many, why we should do this. We do not know what they are go-

ing through. They could have a broken home (mom & dad constantly fighting and may be going through a divorce), or they could be getting physically and mentally abused at home. Maybe they are stressed with work or even the death of a loved one. We do not know what they are going through. I know they just hurt your feelings, but they may be going through something far more damaging than hurt feelings. You could be the Light in a dark world for them. "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven." (Matt 5:16 KJV) Can you imagine if your one action in a negative situation changed a person's life. By that I mean they became your friend and then started coming to services with you and then obeyed the Gospel because of your one action during a negative situation. How would that make you feel? We would be on cloud nine. We would be excited because we made a positive impact on someone and they are now a New Testament Christian and it is because you choose to strive to be like Christ in that moment.

To conclude, just remember that it is just our feelings that got hurt. "The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately wicked: who can know it?" (Jer 17:9 KJV) We can not lash out when our feelings get hurt. Instead we should strive to have the mind of Christ because at the end of the day God should be our top priority. We can not allow our hurt feelings to hinder us and slow us down from our ultimate purpose which is heaven. Satan loves when we as Christians get caught up in tongue lashing matches. Satan loves it when we do anything that is contrary to God's word. I know that this is hard for us to control and that we will have to be constantly working in this area. But we know that if everyone makes fun of us everyday, that God in heaven still loves us. That should bring comfort to our minds and our hearts.
