What God Calls an Abomination

It is clear from the Scriptures that all sins are an offense against God and punishable by death (Gen. 39:9; Rom. 6:23). However, some sins are so detestable and repulsive that God specifically names them as an "abomination." It is wise for us all to realize these sins as they are found all around us daily.

Sexual Perversion: The sexual relationship was created by God as honorable and pure, but only within the confines of marriage (Heb. 13:4). Therefore, God specifically men- tions the sins of adultery (Lev. 18:20), homosexuality, (Lev. 18:22), beastality (Lev. 18:23), and prostitution (Deu. 23:18). Our world needs to know that those who continue in such sins are practicing the condemning works of the flesh and will not inherit Heaven (Gal. 5:21).

Unauthorized Worship: God has a plan for all to worship Him according to His Truth alone (John 4:24) without adding any man-made traditions (Mat. 15:8,9). Idolatrous practices (Deu. 7:25) and hypocritical worship (Isa. 1:13) are considered especially repul- sive to the God of Heaven.

Wrongful Attitudes: Something like "pride" may sound harmless, but it is a great of- fense against God. It is something God hates (Pro. 6:17) and will not go unpunished (Pro. 16:5). Pride (conceit/arrogance) is the sin which caused Satan to rebel and those who follow after will fall into the same condemnation (1 Tim. 3:6). God also demands honesty rather than cheating in business dealings and all areas of life (Deu. 25:13-16; cf. Rom. 12:17). Anything less causes calamity (Pro. 17:20) and spiritual death (Rev. 21:8).

Murder: God hates hands that shed innocent blood (Pro. 6:19). This includes murder- ing innocent children as some did in sacrifice to false gods (Lev. 18:21) and aborting babies today. Murder is an assault against our Creator who made us in His image (Gen. 9:6). No unrepentant and unforgiven murder will go to Heaven (Rev. 21:8).

Remember, all sins must be washed away by the blood of Christ for anyone to have the hope of Heaven (Acts 22:16; Rev. 1:5). No one who continually "worketh abomination" will be in the Lamb's book of life (Rev. 21:27).

The Better Things Contrasted in James

The book of James is regarded as a very practical book to help Christians in daily living. We may find a solution to some of the things that hinder us in daily liv- ing for Christ if we will look at four things that are **contrasted** for us in **James 4: 13 - 17:**

1. There is a contrast in what we know with what we ought to know. We ought to know to do good (v.17) but we neglect that and pursue unprofitable things in our ignorance of what will happen tomorrow (v.14).

2. There is a contrast in what we say with what we ought to say. We actually say presumptuous things. "Come now, you who say, 'Today or tomorrow we will go to such and such a city, spend a year there, buy and sell, and make a profit" (v.13). "Instead, you ought to say, 'If the Lord wills, we shall live and do this or that" (v.15). The problem focuses on our tendency to speak with arrogant assumption rather than respectful submission to God.

3. There is a contrast in what we do with what we ought to do. We "boast in arrogance" and wind up doing evil (v.16) while neglecting to do the things we know to be good (v.17).

Paul's struggle with this same problem comforts us, in knowing that we are not alone, but it also shows how serious the problem can be if he, an apostle, was not free of it: **"For what I am doing, I do not understand. For what I will to do, that I do not practice; but what I hate, that I do."** (Romans 7:15)

4. There is a contrast in what we appear to be with what we really are. We try to appear invincible, as if we will live forever (v.13-14), but we are really vulnera- ble and unaware of the fact that life really is "a vapor that appears for a little time and then vanishes away" (v.14).

May this study in **contrasts** help us to appear more genuine as we keep trying to know, say and do the better things!
