John Wooden was the legendary head coach of the UCLA basketball team. Known as the "Wizard of Westwood," Coach Wooden led his team to ten NCAA national championships in a 12-year period. At one point his teams won 88 consecutive games and seven national championships in a row. Wooden was named national coach of the year six times. There were, of course, many components in his teams' success: great players, dedication, determination, preparation, great coaching and motivation. The revered coach observed, "Little things make big things happen." Wooden followed that philosophy on the hardwood. He was even known for teaching his players how to put on their socks! What is interesting, however, is that this quote was made in reference to life - not just life on the basketball court."Little things make big things happen."

Consider what others have said! Vincent van Gogh said, "Doing little things well is a step toward doing big things better." Robert Collier said, "Success is the sum of small efforts repeated day in and day out." Eugenia Price said, "The great doing of little things makes the great life." H.
