

More Than A Children's Song

Sometimes one of life's greatest lessons can be found in places where we would not think they could be found. There is a simple song which has been sung by children for at least sixty years which has profound truth. In reality, while it may be thought of as a children's song, those who are older would truly profit if they thought about its message:

"Watch your eyes, watch your eyes what they see. Watch your eyes, watch your eyes what they see. For the Father up above is looking down in love, So watch your eyes what they see."

Each succeeding verse is similar but changes the word eye and the word see to point to another part of the body. The children point to each part of the body so there is a lot of action. Those of us who are older could profit, not by doing the accompanying actions, but by doing the "action" in our hearts.

WATCH YOUR EYES, WHAT THEY SEE. "The woman saw that the tree was good...pleasant to the eyes" (Gen. 3:6). "All that is in the world...the lust of the eyes...is not of the Father" (I John 2:16). "The eyes of man are never satisfied" (Pro. 27:20). "The way of a fool is right in his own eyes" (Pro. 12:15).

WATCH YOU EARS, WHAT THEY HEAR. "Hear my prayer, O God: give ear to the words of my mouth" (Psa. 54:2). "He that turneth away his ear from hearing the law, even his prayer shall be an abomination" (Pro. 28:9). "And he read therein before the street...from morning until midday... and the ears of the people were attentive unto the book of the law" (Neh. 8:3) "Incline thine ear unto wisdom, and apply thine heart to understanding" (Pro. 2:2).

WHATCH YOUR LIPS, WHAT THEY SAY. "Keep thy tongue from evil, and thy lips from speaking guile" (Psa. 34:13). "O Lord, open thou my lips; and my mouth shall show forth thy praise" (Psa. 51:15). "My lips shall greatly rejoice when I sing unto thee; and my soul, which thou hast redeemed" (Psa. 71:23). "Lying lips are abomination to the Lord; but they that deal truly are his delight" (Pro. 12:22).

WATCH YOUR HANDS, WHAT THEY DO. "My hands also will I lift up unto thy commandments, which I have loved; and I will meditate in thy statues" (Psa. I19:48). "These six things doth the Lord hate: yea, seven are an abominations unto him... hands what shed innocent blood" (Pro. 6:16-17).

WATCH YOUR FEET, WHERE THEY GO. "I thought on my ways, and turned by feet unto thy testimonies" (Psa. 119:59). "I have refrained my feet from every evil way, that I may keep thy word" (Psa. 119:101). "Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light to my path" (Psa. 119:105).
