

Fact versus Fiction on the Birth of Christ

This time of year there is a heightened focus on the birth of Christ. Nativity scenes appear in numerous places while some churches go all out with plays, performances and religious services. In this case it would be much better if people would just "read the book," the Bible. However, those reading the Bible often bring their "traditions" with them as they read.

A searching soul called the other day and wanted to discuss the Bible teaching on the birth of Christ. He had read the Bible accounts and was baffled by what he read when it did not agree with what he saw being portrayed by religious groups. I mentioned one must separate fact from fiction regarding the birth of Christ. We do know there have always been those willing to construct "cunningly devised fables" (2Pet 1:16). I ask you to consider some Facts versus Fiction regarding the birth of Christ.

Facts:

- 1. His birth was the subject of prophecy Isaiah 7:14; Micah 5:2
- 2. It happened when God intended for it to happen, at the right time Galatians 4:4
- 3. It was announced prior to His birth Matthew 1:18-25; Luke 1:26-38
- 4. The time was during the reign of the Roman Emperor Augustus (nephew of Julius Caesar). It was also dated during the time that Quirinius was governor of Syria Luke 2:1-2
- 5. Joseph and Mary went to Bethlehem (his ancestral home) to pay tax at census Luke 2:3-5
- 6. The large number produced a room shortage so they had to stay in an animal stable. It was here that Mary's time came due to deliver Luke 2:6
- 7. Jesus was wrapped in "swaddling clothes" (common term to describe medical strips used) and he was placed in a feeding trough (which almost certainly would have been made of stone) Luke 2:7
- 8. The great event was announced to the shepherds in the field. Luke 2:8-20.
- 9. It was eight days later when he was brought to Jerusalem (about 5 miles north of Bethlehem) when lesus was circumcised Luke 2:21.
- 10. It was 40 days afterward when he was presented at the Temple Luke 2:22

Fiction:

- I. That Jesus was born on December 25, I BC/AD. There are no indications in Scripture regarding the date. History records it was not celebrated on the date until the 4th century and that date was chosen to counter the pagan rituals.
- 2. That three wise men visited Jesus at His birth. Matthew 2:1 explicitly says, "after Jesus was born." There was necessarily time needed for them to travel to where the Lord was having seen the Star. This further confirmed the fact that when Herod sought to kill all the males 2 years old based on when the Star appeared a(Matthew 2:16). Additionally, the text says they visited Him in a "house" rather than a stable (Matthew 2:11). Likewise the text simply says, "wise men" and does not indicate their number. That hasn't stopped some from even making up their names as "Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar."
- 3. That we should celebrate this as a religious day. New Testament Christians were warned to do only that which God has authorized (Colossians 3:17). There simply are no instructions for celebrating the Lord's birth as there is for His death. Consider, should one have chosen to have their young boys circumcised for hygienic reasons or even as a national custom there was problem with such. However, if they did so as a religious activity it would have been sinful (Galatians 5:2). Paul was concerned with the Galatians participating in such customs (Galatians 4:10-11).
