

# **Recovered!**

It's difficult to express the profound significance of the term "recovered" to those who have not been sick. As of today (Tuesday) I am able to come off quarantine and am officially in the category of recovered (though I still have the lingering fatigue). The past two weeks with COVID-19 have been tough. Needless to say, this is a troubling illness with some nasty symptoms. However, it has not all been bad.

I. Sickness has a humbling effect on a person. One is forced to realize that there are some things beyond one's control. I cannot just "will" myself to not be sick. Like many others when I was well it was easy to say I wasn't too worried about contracting it. One of my favorite verses in the Bible was spoken by the King of Israel to the King of Syria, "So the king of Israel answered and said, "Tell him, 'Let not the one who puts on his armor boast like the one who takes it off." (I Kings 20:11). God even used a "thorn in the flesh" to teach Paul humility (cf. 2Cor. 12:7).

2. Sickness also provides others opportunities to fill positions they would not otherwise have filled. Everyone must face it, there will be those who will assume our roles when we are no longer able to do them. That principle is true in every area of life. One former elder said, "if you don't think you can be replaced, just die and see what happens." Others get an opportunity to preach and teach. Those who have fulfilled my responsibilities while I have been sick have done a great job.

3. Sickness brings out the best in brethren (and even neighbors). Countless prayers have been prayed, wishes of goodness, cards, calls, texts, etc. have allowed Corretta and me to see the outpouring of love from dear brethren. Untold offers have been extended, food has been left "at the door" and grass has been mowed. "My little children, let us not love in word or in tongue, but in deed and in truth." ( 1 John 3:18).

4. Too often we don't appreciate what we have until it is taken away. It is usually then that we begin to see the distinction between what is important and what is not. Who cares if you have new clothes if one has no place to wear them?

Having said all of that, I am so ready for this virus to be gone. I want to assemble with my brethren. I want to be able to teach Bible classes. I want to be able to preach and hear a hearty "Amen." I'm ready for the building to be full and looking for others to worship with us. I'm disheartened that I was unable to attend funerals of great folks. I'm recovered but everyone else has not. Our city, county, state, and the country still have many people struggling with the virus. Others will contract it and enduring suffering because of it. Our hearts and prayers are with you as they were with me.
