

What lies before us? Part 2

"Brethren, I do not count myself to have apprehended; but one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind and reaching forward to those things which are ahead, I press toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus." — Philippians 3:13–14, NKJV Every Christian has a past, but praise be to God— we are not prisoners of it. Whether it's a past full of mistakes, regrets, or even great successes, Scripture teaches us not to live backward but forward. As Paul so powerfully says in Philippians, we are to forget what is behind and press on toward Christ.

4. Reaching Forward to Christ

We don't just forget the past—we press forward. Christianity is not just about what we leave behind but what we are striving toward. Paul says he reaches for "the prize of the upward call of God in Christ lesus." That prize is eternal life in the presence of God. But reaching forward requires focus. We can't run the Christian race while looking backward. Just as a runner strains ahead toward the finish line, we must put our energy, focus, and hope into knowing Christ more each day (Philippians 3:10). We are growing into His likeness, and every day is an opportunity to become more like Him. This pursuit includes personal devotion, worship, service, evangelism, and faithfulness in trials. It means making choices today that align with the future we are promised. It means looking not at temporary setbacks, but at the eternal reward (2 Corinthians 4:17-18).

5. Grace for Today, Hope for Tomorrow

Sometimes we're not held back by past sins but by past pain—loss, trauma, betrayal, or broken dreams. Jesus offers healing for that too. He invites the weary and burdened to come and find rest (Matthew II:28–30). He is not only the Savior of our souls but the healer of our hearts.

God doesn't promise a life without difficulty, but He does promise new mercies each morning (Lamentations 3:22–23). He gives grace for each step, no matter how broken we feel. Our future is not determined by our past but by His promises. And His promises are sure. We are promised a home in heaven (John 14:2–3), a crown of life (James 1:12), and fellowship with God forever. That is what we look forward to. That is our motivation to keep going.

6. Living Forward as a Church

As a congregation, we too must apply this truth. Sometimes churches hold on to past conflicts, old wounds, or even traditions that hinder growth. Just like individuals, congregations must commit to being future-focused. Let us forgive as Christ forgave us (Ephesians 4:32). Let us support one another in growth and spiritual maturity. Let us reach out to the lost, build up the saved, and keep our eyes on Jesus. The church is not a museum of perfect people, but a family of redeemed sinners striving together toward heaven. Let's move forward in unity, purpose, and love.

Conclusion: Press On

What lies behind you may explain part of your story—but it does not define you. In Christ, you are a new creation (2 Corinthians 5:17). Forget what is behind. Reach forward to what is ahead. Keep your eyes on Jesus. The best is not behind you—it's ahead of you. "Let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith..." Hebrews 12:1–2.

Let's run with joy. Let's press on. Let's look forward to Christ.
