IT JUST WASN'T CONVENIENT, BUT WE WENT ANYWAY!

I remember as a young lad, attending church wasn't nearly as convenient as it is now. I remember most of the time we would hitch the mules to the farm wagon and make the 2 mile trip to the meeting house. It didn't matter how cold, hot, or wet it might be — we had an appointment to keep. There were no paved roads — just mud. There were no modern conveniences such as indoor plumbing, electric lights, air conditioning, or electric heat. There were two small buildings, one was marked "Women" the other "Men" and they were outside, one on either side of the church building. They really did stink too!

The windows would be up in the dog days of summer and the insects must have loved the preaching because the building would be full of them. There were no padded pews, no nursery for crying babies, and no water fountain to entice kids to run in and out. Children were not allowed to get up and down and disturb the worshipers. Revival meetings lasted for 2 weeks, sometimes 3, and the preacher dare not quit before 2 hours of "Explaining the way of the Lord more perfectly" to us!

That really kept us away, Right? Wrong, because the people came. We walked. We drove cars. We borrowed rides. We drove mules and wagons. It was not an inconvenience for us to make the effort to be there. Obviously, we did not come because of those inconveniences, but neither did they keep us away.

Today we have nice buildings, padded pews, electric lighting, central heat and air, carpeted floors, well furnished nurseries, cold water fountains, indoor plumbing, and sermons that dare not go beyond about 30 minutes. Even our transportation is heated and cooled. All of these things have increased interest and attendance, right? Wrong again!

I like conveniences as well as the next fellow but we do not go to worship because of them nor do we stay away because of a lack thereof! Instead, we assemble because of an intense love, devotion, and appreciation to the Lord who loved us and saved us by His blood. And when we are willfully absent it is because of a lack of these same attributes of love, devotion, and appreciation. The answer is not more gadgets and gimmicks but in lifting up the Lord. When men appreciate what Christ has done for them at Calvary, convenience is the last thing on their minds!
