What Is Repentance

Repentance is a foundational doctrine of the gospel of Jesus Christ. From the preaching of John the Baptist to the apostles of the early church, repentance has always been proclaimed as necessary for salvation. In a religious world that often minimizes repentance or redefines it as mere regret, the Bible presents repentance as a decisive change of heart that results in a changed life.

John the Baptist prepared the way of the Lord by preaching repentance. "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!" (Matthew 3:2). His message demanded more than emotional sorrow; it required fruit consistent with a transformed life. John warned, "Therefore bear fruits worthy of repentance" (Matthew 3:8). True repentance is always visible in conduct.

Jesus Himself continued this same message. "I tell you, no; but unless you repent you will all likewise perish" (Luke 13:3). Repentance, according to Christ, is not optional. It is a divine requirement for those who desire forgiveness and eternal life. The Lord did not teach repentance as a vague feeling but as a response of submission to God's will.

Biblically, repentance involves a change of mind that leads to a change of direction. Paul explains this clearly when he writes, "For godly sorrow produces repentance leading to salvation, not to be regretted; but the sorrow of the world produces death" (2 Corinthians 7:10). Worldly sorrow may involve guilt or shame, but it does not lead one back to God. Godly sorrow, however, produces repentance—a turning away from sin and a turning toward righteousness.

On the day of Pentecost, when the people were convicted of their sin in crucifying Christ, they asked the apostles what they must do. Peter responded, "Repent, and let every one of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins" (Acts 2:38). This verse demonstrates the clear connection between repentance, obedience, and forgiveness. Repentance is not a stand-alone experience; it is part of the obedient response to the gospel that includes baptism.

Repentance is inseparable from faithful obedience. Faith alone, without repentance, cannot save. James reminds us that faith without works is dead (James 2:17). Repentance is one of the essential works of faith—an act of humble submission to God's authority. When one truly repents, they abandon sinful practices and commit themselves to living according to God's word.

Paul declared that he preached "that they should repent, turn to God, and do works befitting repentance" (Acts 26:20). Repentance, therefore, is not completed at the moment of sorrow but proven by ongoing obedience. A person cannot claim repentance while continuing in the same sinful lifestyle without change.

Repentance also remains vital for Christians. Though we are baptized into Christ for the remission of sins, we are not immune to temptation. When Simon the sorcerer sinned after his baptism, Peter instructed him, "Repent therefore of this your wickedness, and pray God if perhaps the thought of your heart may be forgiven you" (Acts 8:22). Repentance remains the pathway to restoration for the erring child of God.

Ultimately, repentance reflects the mercy and patience of God. The Lord does not desire that any should perish, "but that all should come to repentance" (2 Peter 3:9). God's call to repent is an invitation to life, forgiveness, and reconciliation through Jesus Christ.

May we never diminish the importance of repentance. Instead, let us preach it plainly, practice it faithfully, and encourage one another to walk in lives worthy of the gospel. True repentance leads us away from sin and closer to God—and that is a blessing beyond measure.
