THE WORLD IN A TOWN

Dr. Henry Smith Leiper of the American Bible Society has attempted to illustrate the kind of world we live in by reducing proportionately all the people of the world into a theoretical town of 1,000 people. If such a town existed—with each nation, color and religion represented in the same proportion as it \$\sigma\$s in the world today—what kind of town would it be?

There would be 60 Americans. The other 940 persons would represent the rest of the world. But the 60 Americans would have half the income of the entire town.

About 330 people would be classified as "Christians" in the widest us of the term, and 230 of these would be catholics. There would be at least 80 communists in our town, and 370 persons would be under the domination of these communists.

There would be 303 white people in our town, and 697 non-whites.

Half of the 1,000 people would never have heard of Jesus Christ or what he taught. But more than half would now be learning about Karl Marx, Lenin, and the philosophy of communism.

The 60 Americans would have an average life expectancy of 70 years. Each would own at least 15 times as many possessions as the other 940. The 940 would have a life expectancy of less than 40 years, and most of them would go to bed hungry many nights.

The American families would be spending an average of at least \$850 on military defense, but less than \$4(per year) to share their religious faith with their neighbors in the community.

Would you like to live in such a town? You are—for the world is just such a world! If such a world looks a little undesirable and foreboding, what can be done about it? Is the church powerless? Or can it be a leaven of righteousness—a pillar and ground of truth? Via Religious Reminder, Louisville and copied from Allen and Edgewood Bulletin, Jackson, Tennessee.

One young man insisted his parents bring him, even though he had been sick. That kind of loyalty will make a fine Christian when he grows up to the age to obey.

LOOK UP NOT DOWN-LOOK FORWARD NOT BACKWARD.

Paul tells us(Col.1:18) that Christ is to have the Preeminence in all things. Preeminence is a two-fold word, meaning before and above. Christ is to be prebefore, and eminent—above all things. Since he is before us and above us, we can't look at him without looking up and ahead. The following little story is worth while; "One day a young man found five dollars on the street. From that time he never took his eyes off the ground as he walked. In 30 years he picked up 25,916 buttons, 62,172 pins, 7 pennies, a bent back, sour disposition, and a miserable outlook on life. WHAT WE CAN DO FOR THE MEETING

- 1. The church has been charged with the responsibility of preaching the gospel, and teaching the people the great principles of Bible truth, and all of us make up the church (Eph. 3:9-11; 1 Tim.3:15).
- 2. THE CHURCH IS TO ASSEMBLE DURING A GOSPEL MEET-ING, and we are the church. "They assembled themselves with the church and taught much people" (Acts 11:26). This means "The whole church...come together into one place" (1 Cor.14:23). Those who obeyed the gospel on Pentecost "Continued steadfastly in the apostles' teaching...continuing daily with one accord in the temple", etc (Acts 2:38,41,46).
- 3. As members of the church we are forbidden to absent ourselves from the meetings of the church.(Heb. 10:25) All of us know here at Bybee Branch that a member of the church can sin by neglect of duty the same as by being immoral in conduct(Heb.2:3:Jas, 4:17) God pronounced a curse upon his people when they failed to come and help Him in his work(Judges 5:23).
- 4. Christ loved the church and gave himself for it. (Eph.5:25;Acts 20:28) Now the church must love him in return, or it does not have His Spirit, and is "None of His"(Rom.8:9). Those who do not love Jesus will be cursed of God (1 Cor.16:22). Those who do love the Lord will keep his commandments(Jno.14:21). There is no such thing as loving the Lord while putting other things before the church or kingdom and its work(Mat.6:33;Jno.5:3,4).
- 5. It is plainly sinful for the church members to lose their first love and become lukewarm in regard to the great work of the church, the "Pillar and ground of the truth" (Rev. 2:4,5; Rev.3:14-19; 1 Tim. 3:15). No one can follow Jesus and not be intensely interested in the salvation of the lost and the edification of the church (Lk.19:10; Eph.4:8, 11-16: Mat/16:24-26).
- 6. God will not hear the prayers of members of the church who neglect to worship Him and who fail to do his will(Jno.4:23-24; 9:31; Prov.28:9; 1 Pet.3:12). All of us know that it is God's will for every member at Bybee Branch to be present at every service of our meeting, unless hindered by illness or some

other circumstance over which we have no control (Mat. 7:21; Lk. 6:46; 1 Jno. 2:15-17).

7. We can do as Cornelius did while waiting for the preacher, we can CALL TOGETHER OUR KINSMEN AND NEAR FRIENDS", and then say to the preacher when he arrives, "Now therefore we are all here present before God to hear all things that are commanded thee of God"(Acts 10:24-33). We can "Go and say Come ye"(Isa. 2:3). The church or "bride" is to say, "Come", and we are the church, or the "bride"(Rev.22:17). We can invite by telephone."

V.B.S. MAY 28-JUNE 1--TIME FOR ALL TO GET BUSY!!!

The annual VBS at Bybee Branch has always produced problems, at least since I have been connected with the church. First, we have never had enough space to allow us to advertise for children in the way we would like, for we want them to come and study with us. The basement space is usually filled to the capacity in all rooms. We have had ample room in the auditorium for more, but our problem has been that many of the adults have to work. The auditorium class has always been a good one, but where our means for doing is the largest, the class does not occupy all our space, although we have had more in the adult class than any class in school. Another problem we have faced each year, is the proper staffing of the classed, ... due to job requirements in certain key positions of our VBS. This year we have no exception, because we still have the uncertainties although for the time we have teachers selected, but some are subject to call at a moments notice --- we hope we will be able to complete our school before any teachers are called out of town. Another problem we annually meet is the selection of a time that will be to the best interest of every teacher. Each year we have had wonderful VBS by all working together even though there have been problems. We expect another fine school this year also, because we are expecting the same fine cooperation from teachers and pupils we have enjoyed in former years. A LESSON FORGOTTEN



"Verily, verily, I say unto thee, except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God. . . Except a man be born of water and of the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God" (John 3:3-5). - 1. We were born to serve Christ. "Know ye not, that to whom ye present yourselves as servants unto obedience, his servants ye are whom ye obey; whether of sin unto death, or obedience unto righteousness?" (Rom.6:16). We presented ourselves unto Christ to be his servants. If we sit around and wait to be served all the time, we fail to live up to that for which we presented ourselves unto Christ.
- 2. We were born to serve humanity. Christ came to minister to the needs of the world—to serve the world and to die for their sins. Since we follow him—he set us an example that we should follow his steps(1 Peter 2:21), and he came to serve the human race, we too must serve the human race by following the example he set for us. Too many members of the church expect to be served all the time. If they attend services they expect everyone to come to them and speak, but they are to go to no one. LOSING CONFIDENCE IN THE TRUTH

The Russian Cosmonaut, Gherman Titov, bragged in Seattle that he saw "neither God nor angels" on his flight around the world. That is not surprising. Titov didn't know how to look for God. He hadn't been taught.

Another thing to consider is that he was riding backward, and God is always ahead of man. Or, consider that Titov probably thinks he has conquered all the universe when he has in reality never been 200 short miles off the ground. He will see God some day—at the end of another flight!

Titov did see something up there that he didn't understand. We wouldn't, of course, suggest that it was God, but it just might be that the Russian would not know God if he saw him. We are convinced that what Titov saw, and didn't know what was, God knows all about.

The lack of visible evidence of the existence of God does not rule him out; how do we know that Titov has a mind? God is just as visible as a man's mind, and evidence that he is is more abundant than the evidence that man has a mind.

What Titov said isn't remarkable. It is, however, an indication of how swiftly ideology of the world can change. It was less than 100 years ago that the seeds of religious doubt were sown in Russia. Now the tares have completely choked the wheat!

It Could happen here. There has been as much atheism and infidelity taught in the United States in the past 100 years as in Russia. The chief reason why Christianity still persists in this land is that those who were our rulers did not hold a piece of lead pipe in their hands. As yet we are free moral agents.

Titov did not find God because he was looking for him in the wrong place. You don't find God in outer space—you find him in human hearts. That's where he dwells. In America when men cast God out of their hearts they may search the universe in vain for him. They will not find him.

When men will not retain God in their knowledge he gives them over to reprobate minds. When a nation's women parade themselves in shameless immodesty the moral decay of that nation stinks to high heaven.

It may not be many more years before Titov could look for God in America and not find him.

So many are losing confidence in the Truth of God's Almighty Word, and are imposing modernistic and materialistic concepts of what is right and what is wrong, we are already in danger. Many have about given in to the idea that God and the Bible are about to be overthrown and are ready to throw the inspiration of the Scriptures and the God of the Scriptures overboard. We need to turn again to the grand old texts of the Bible; quit preaching this half-modernistic-half-existential stuff and go back to hammering the old fundamental facts and principles of the gospel of Christ." Dr. Irving Sands, Columbia University Neurologist, referred to our national use of weekends as "National weekend neurosis." A recent article, challenging the average use of weekends, asks, "Are they a pleasure or a plague?" With many, I must agree with the article, it is a plague. The Monday morning paper and a canual observance of the physical fitness of those who appear on the job are clear testimonies of a plague-ridden weekend. Monday morning news records tragic and violent deaths. Two of every five traffic fatalities happen on the weekend. "Sunday drivers" among with other drivers who are itritated and tension ridden or stupified by alcoholic consumption have produced this statistic.

Weekends seem to say to Americans, "GO!"—to the lake, the seashore, the mountains, the resort area—just so long as we are pursuing pell—mell an activity of pleasure. They are far from pleasurable, however, for even those so absorbed in the wild chase for it are frequently unhappy because pleasure has degraded from personal enjoyment to "keeping up with the Jones!" The strain is telling. Our weekends are periods of conflict, emotional strain, automobile wrecks, and physical and mental upsets. Consumption of alcohol and sexual promiscuity reach their peaks on weekends. No wonder, then , Dr. Sands made his reference and the article asks its question.

Christians cannot afford to be swept by such a tidal wave of weekend madness. Recreation must be "Recreation" of body and mind for more important activities. "Bodily exercise" is of some value but we must never lose sight of the more important—"Godliness is of value in every way."(1 Tim.4:8 RSV).

By the way, what about your weekends?

The above timely article from L. Arnold Watson in the Highland Street Bulletin of Memphis is very needful. Many people have become pleasure mad. The Lord's day is used for the plasure emphasis and the Lord is forgotten or trampled under foot. I suppose Bybee Branch congregation is as free of this as any church we know, but even here the article is timely and should serve to halt those who mis-use the Lord's day and warn others against starting the practice.BCH

WHAT ABOUT PUBLIC CONFESSION?

A member of the church who has done a wrong so public in nature that others know about, is never humble enough to be forgiven until he is humble enough to publicly take away the reproach he has publicly brought upon the church. When such men and women are ashamed to go before the whole church and make their confession by their own mouth, or through someone else when they are present to give their personal sanction to it, their repentance is not sincere enough to merit their forgiveness.

Some have the false pride of thinking it is degrading to go before a congregation and publicly acknowledge a public sin. The sin is already public. The whole church knows about it. The stain of it is felt by all, and all are entitled to hear the confession of the wrong and enjoy the benefits resulting from such confession. Such confession is calculated to have a good effect upon all parties concerned. It shows the humility of the sinner. It asks the forgiveness of offended brethren, and together offended and offender may pray and petition our heavenly "ather to forgive."

One is only adding hypocrisy and falsehood to the public sin committed when he attempts to act as if no sin has been committed. THERE IS NO SIN MORE PUBLIC THAN THAT SIN OF FAILURE TO WORSHIP GOD. There is no sin that wrongs more people(brethren) than a failure to attend public worship services and so avow disassociation with the brethren. One who has dropped out of the church a long time cannot slip back as if nothing happened.

Christians are commanded to confess their faults that they may be healed(James 5:16, 1 John 1:9,10), and they should honestly, truthfully and faithfully do so.

Be it understood that sins of a private nature are an entirely different matter, but the sin of being absent from any worship of the church cannot, under any circumstances, be classed as a private matter."



WHAT ABOUT THOSE "MISSING LINKS ? "

In November, 1953, the "Piltdown man," which for forty years has been described as one of the "missing links" between man and his simian ancestors, was exposed by three British Scientists as a DELIBERATE FRAUD—a HOAX PERPETRATED ON THE PUBLIC by some unknown prankster more than four decades ago.

The "Piltdown man", which was composed of a portion of a jawbone, several important parts of the skull, and three teeth, was subjected to chemical tests by Dr. K.P.Oakley of the British Museum, and Oxford University professors J.E. Weiner and W.E.Le Gros Clark. These tests "prove beyond doubt that the vital jawbone of Charles Dawson's Discovery(in 1911) was a deliberate plant faked up" from the jawbone of a modern ten-year-old ape, said the Associated Press dispatch of November 21, 1953.

This is by no means the first case of fraudulent missing links being foisted on an unsuspecting public. Many "Dawn Men" of earlier finds have, after further investigation, turned out to be spurious. The "Heidelberg man" is neither a man nor a skull, but a jawbone found in a German Quarry in 1907. It is very similar to the jawbones of the Aborinines of New Caledonia, who are quite "modern" in all other respects. (Theodore Græbner, God and the Cosmos, Page 393)

The "Neanderthal man", a skull cap found in 1856 near Duesseldorf, Germany, while unusual in some respects, was believed by DR. Meyer, of Bonn, and some other scientists, to be the remains of a Cossack killed in 1814! In any event, DR. T.H. Huxley admitted, "In no sense can the Neanderthal Bones be regarded as the remains of a human being intermediate between man and apes." D. Schaaffhausen confessed, "In making this discovery, we have not found the missing link" (Quoted in God and the Cosmos, P.394).

In 1922 the "Nebraska Man" was discovered and was used as proof of evolution in the famous Scopes evolution trial in Dayton, Tennessee in 1924. Five years after its discovery, however, the belated news was that the "Nebraska Man" was nothing more than the tooth of an extinct Peccary(pig) (Evolution, International Christian Crusade, P. 31).

The "Southwest Colorado Man" was another missing Link that turned out to be a tooth, this time a tooth from a small horse. (Harry Rimmer, The Theory of Evolution and the Facts of Science P. 123).

Perhaps the most ridiculous "Missing Link" of all was that of a South American man discovered about 1927. There were found "certain skulls of distinctly ape-man traits--- (which) proved on examination to be peculiarly shaped rocks" (Graebner, OP.CIT., P. 311).

This, then, is the type of "scientific proof" that has been given to the public to demonstrate the theory of organic evolution. Let us bear in mind the fact that the so-called missing links are not links between man and a "lower animal."

The missing link is still missing. We shall continue to believe that "God created man in his own image" (Genesis 1:27). Adapted from 20th Century and passed along through the Paducah, Ky. Bulletin

THERE ARE MANY ADVERSARIES

Recently Brother Fred G. Taylor Jr. was filling out some papers in which the FBI listed more than 350 subversive organizations in our country. Some of these operate under as many as five names. When the people become wise to one name they change to another. These names are usually good sounding names—names which make the victim think he is serving the nation or community in benevolent work or as civil defense. These organizations work against our nation. The children of God have had and will continue to have Adversaries also. Their Adversary seeks to destroy the soul.

When Solomon departed from the Lord's way, God raised up an adversary unto him(1 Kings 11:14,23,26. Peter said for us to "Be sober, be watchful: your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour: whom withstand stedfast in your faith, knowing that the same sufferings are accomplished in your brethren who are in the world" (1 Peter 5:8,9). The devil has more Aliases (assumed names) than any criminal on the FBI files. I have a partial list of the names applied to him in the scriptures -- this list has 26 names applied to him. Satan, god of this world, serpent, tempter etc. are a few. With so many names we often lose sight of the fact that we are dealing with the enemy of our souls. It is indeed necessary for us to heed Peter's warning to be watchful.
