"IT WON'T DO ANY GOOD"

How many times have you seen these discouraging words kill some good idea, stifle some good impulse, or destroy some generous deed in its deception?

Jesus says through His servant the Apostle Paul: "And let us not be weary in well doing; for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not" (Galatians 6). Christians are commanded to "do good unto all men, especially unto them who are of the household of faith."

Satan is constantly trying to discourage every good work. He wants to kill every unselfish suggestion. He desires to sabotage every worthwhile project. One of his favorite weapons is summarized in this expression. "It won't do any good."

Do you remember the man who hid his talent in the earth because he thought it wouldn't do any good to work for his master? He said to himself, in effect, "It want do any good to try to use this money for my master is a hard man. I can't please him anyway, so I won't try." He took the course of least resist -ance and thought he was playing it safe by not doing anything with his master's money. Of course, this was a terrible mistake. Jesus condemned him saying, "Thou oughtest therefore to have put my money to the bankers and at my coming I should have received back mine own with interest. Take ye away therefore the talent from him, and give it unto him that hath the ten talents. (2) Jesus in seeking the lost reveals the value heaven places upon the souls of men. It shows he considers every person worth saving. (3) Seeking the lost reveals the love of God for man. God was willing to give his only begotten son that we might be saved. It is rankest ingratitude to refuse to let the Lord find us and save us from our sins. Too, we need to learn the lesson well that if Jesus was willing to seek the lost when it meant giving up his life on the cross, we should be willing to spend our lives in the same noble work in leading men and women, boys and girls, out of sin into the light of the gospel of Christ.

Not only did our Lord seek the lost, but he came to "save that which was lost." His purpose in seeking was to save. Only eternied from his sins. But with the frail insight possessed by mortal man we know it transcend -s anything and everything the world has to offer. (1) When Jesus saves us, he brings us back into God's favor. Reconciliation with God is possible only through Jesus Christ. (2) Christ delivers us from all the sins of the past, he protects and provides presently, and offers eternal sakvation in heaven. (3) Through divine grace, our usefulness to the purposes of God is restored, we become a vessel of honor that God can use to his glory and praise. --G. E. Woods.

CAN YOU DO THIS?

Consistency in religious matters is truly a bright jewel. Christ condemned people for saying and doing not. Many people claim to love God, but by their actions dispeove their claim. One must substantiate his claim by his deeds. Test your love for God by asking the following Questions:

1. CAN ONE LOVE THE LORD AND NOT OBEY HIM? Our Lord said, "If a man love me he will keep my words." People have different motives for engaging in some activities. One man works in order to get a better position, another man is employed at the identical task, but he is motivated by the desire to educate his children Still a third man may engage in the same duties for a better home. And I am sure that somewhere there is a man working for the sheer joy of working and of having more to give to those who are in need. Some men work for selfish purposes while nobler reasons prompt the efforts of others.

Even in the church, not all are engaging in right activities for the proper and highest motives. Ananias and Sapphira gave to the noble work being done by the Jerusalem chuch, but, their reasons for doing it were not nobl -e (Acts 5: 1-11). Jesus, in Matthew 6: 1-4, tells of some who gave to be seen of men. They were doing the right thing from the wrong motive. In the next two verses, Jesus condemns those who pray if they do it to be seen of men. One may even preach the truth for unholy reasons. Paul wrote, "Some indeed preach Christ even of envy and strife; and some also of good will: the one preach Christ of contention, not sincerely, supposing to add affliction to my bonds: but the other of love, knowing that I am set for the defense of the gospel. What then? notwithstanding, every way whether in pretence, or in truth, Christ is preached; and I therein do rejoice, yea, and will rejoice"(Phil. 1: 15-18). But this apost -le did not rejoice that some had bad and base motives. He knew the sinfulness of evil purposes, and he declares in II Corinthians 2: 17, "For we are not as many, which corrupt (meaning to peddle, to hucksterize, in order to get base gain) the word of God: but as of sincerity, but as of God, in the sight of God speak we in Christ." Paul was sincere and he knew that what he did was not done for sordid personal gain; he did it for Christ and for God.

Why did you do it? You attended church; but what was your motive? Did you come be-

cause you had nowhere else to go and nothing else more interesting to do. This is the reason why some attend, and if they ever get a chance to do so, they forsake the assembly. You came to class. Why did you do it? Was it because your parents made you? Surely we can be moved by purer reasons than this. You contributed into the treasury of the church; but why did you do it? Because you were afraid someone may shame you if you didn't. Or did you feel that you were "pressured" into it? Such motives are not high enough to be found in the child of the great Giver of all good things! We ought to give our time, our service, our worship, our all, because we know we are servants of the Christ whom we love. We ought to worship because we love God, to pray because we love God, to give because we love God. Love! That is the highest motive of all. It caused God to give His Son, the Son to give His life, and it will cause us to do all that we can for Him.' It will make us do our very best; because we care. "And whatsoever ye do, do it heartily, as to the Lord, and not unto men; knowing that of the Lord ye shall receive the reward of the inheritance: for ye serve the Lord Christ" (Col. 3: 23-24) Let us examine our motives, and serve God in love. -Hardeman Nichols*

AUGUST 5, 1964 WELL-BEHAVED USELESSNESS

One of the greatest mistakes that a professed Christian can make is the mistake of doing nothing. An idle Christian, if there is

such a thing, is a useless Christian.

In Matthew 25: 14-30, we read of the one talent man. The talents distributed were given in accord with abilities and thus the talents represented opportunities for service. Those who used their opportunities for service, received commendation from the Master. The one talent man was guilty of the sin of well-behaved uselessness, and was condemned. He thought what he was doing (hiding his talent) would be acceptable to his master--it was not. How many professed Christians differ from this poor unfortunate soul? God gives us opportunities for service, but we don't see them. We concern ourselves with our own souls, and do not concern ourselves with the souls of others. Our well-meaning, well-behaved idle -ness is no more acceptable to the Master than was the one talent man's.

In Luke 13: 6-9, we read of the story of the barren fig tree. Notice that this fig tree did not produce wormy fruit, or rotten fruit, or bitter fruit. It was ordered to be cut down because it bore no fruit at all. It had every appearance of a good healthy tree, but it did not bear fruit. This story makes very clear the sin of uselessness, the sin of failing to do the work intended for us. As Christians we are to bear fruit for the Lord. We are to bring souls to Christ. If we do not produce,

of what value are we?

In John 15: 1-6, Jesus gives the illustrat -ion of the vine and the branches. Notice that Jesus does not teach that once we are a branch there is nothing to do. He taught that we must produce or perish---If we bear fruit---That is use our opportunities to convert others --- we will be blessed. To do otherwise is to stand condemned. The Pharisee's of Christ's time said and did not, and they stood condemned by God. When we say and do not, it is not a sign that we are already there!

God never intended for His people to be a

group of inactive, lukewarm, well-behaved, useless people. He intended that we should be dynamic, wide-awake, active, growing, and useful people. We shall reap as we have sown. An old colored preacher once said, "You can't go through life just being a good egg. You've got to hatch or go bad." The point is crude, but well taken. God expects more of us than well-behaved idleness. The sin of doing nothing is real, it is all around us, and it will condemn our souls just as surely as any sin. "Therefore to him that knoweth to do good, and doeth it not, to him it is sin" James 4: 17. *****

Some one wrote "It is the highest form of self-respect to admit mistakes and to make amends for them."

Not many of us are very good at admitting mistakes. Even when we do admit making
them we hope those who hear us will disagree
with what we say. It is easier to find something or someone to blame than it is to admit
we have done wrong. Adam started this business in the Garden of Eden when he blamed his
wife and God for the mistake he made. His off
-spring learned this lesson well.

A student fails in his school work. He blames the teachers. They had it in for him. They never gave him a chance. Others in his class were able to make good grades but the teacher was determined that he should not pass. PRACTICE WHAT YOU PREACH!!!

How often have we heard the question, "Why don't you practice what you preach?"
This is an indictment of people who teach one thing and do another, or that just fail to do what they advocate. It is often accepted as a valid reason for not receiving religious truth, and as a final judgment against another person, more often than not this is used to condemn preachers and Bible teachers, and other devoted workers. But the very people who often use this may find that it applies to themselves.

IT ISNIT TOO UNUSUAL to hear some member of the church say, "This just isn't a friendly church." No one ever comes to see me, and when I attend services no one speaks to me." Certainly no one would try to justify unfriendliness on the part of any person or congregation. The only price one has to pay to be friendly is to get rid of a "snooty" attitude. But let's notice the one that makes the complaint. Has he or she called on any of the members of the church? When he attends services, does he make an effort to speak to others? To introduce himself to visitors? or get acquainted with members he does not know? In other words, why doesn't he practice what he preaches? After all, he is the church just like any other member.

ALSO, IT ISN'T TOO UNUSUAL to hear some one complain, "I was sick in bed for a whole week, confined to my home for two weeks and no one came to see me, or even called. Or, "I was in the hospital for several days and no one came to see me or sent me a card. I just can't understand a church that will do that." Now all of us admit that the sick want and need to be remembered, visited, prayed with and prayed for. But again, let's ask a few questions: "Did you call on others when they were sick? In the hospital? In the home? Did you send them a card? Call them on the phone? Co and pray with them?" Too often the answer is "No" Again the complainer needs to practice what he preaches. Have you ever noticed that it is nearly always the complainer that foils to manting what he areaches The

shoe fits the membership----not just the leaders:!! --Unknown.

We readily see the necessity of authority in most every sphere of life. The matter of a correct standard of authority in religion is of supreme importance. There are standards accepted which are fallible, unsafe and unsound. Jeremiah said, "O Lord, I know that the way of man is not in himself: it is not in man that walketh to direct his steps." (Jeremiah 10: 23) And the wise man declared, "There is a way that seemeth right unto a man, but the end thereof are the ways of death." (Proverbs 14: 12)

THE BIBLE IS SUFFICIENT

NOVEMBER 25, 1964 TEACHER, SAY ON!

WHY?

Why did you accept a place as a teacher in your class? Was it because you wanted to feel important, and have a prominent place in the church work? Or did you become a teacher because you wanted to do some good in the world. Hearts are hungry to find a place in carrying on God's work. In Jesus' day, "Then they said unto him, What shall we do that we might work the work of God? Jesus answered and said unto them, This is the work of God, that ye believe on him whom he hath sent." (John 6: 28-29.) It is the opportunity of every teacher to help others to have a deeper faith -- then that teacher is working the works of God. WHO?

Who is responsible for the interest in Bible study? The teacher! Others may help in bringing pupils to class, parents may help at home by encouraging children to study, but the responsibility of class interest and enthusiasm is with the teacher.

The teacher has the responsibility of making each pupil feel he is having a part in a valuable work. Peter once said to Jesus, "Lord, what will this man do?" DECEMBER 9, 1964 CHRIST IS SUFFICIENT!

"And I brethren, when I came to you, came not with excellency of speech or of wisdom, declaring unto you the testimony of God. For I determined not to know anything among you, save Jesus Christ, and him crucified." (I Cor. 2: 1-2.)

Christ was sufficient in all things pertaining to salvation and the religion of Christianity when Paul and other inspired speakers and writers taught men and women the way of the Lord. When Paul preached the gospel to the Corinthians he was determined to know nothing save Jesus Christ, and Him crucified. This gospel that Paul preached was sufficient to save the Corinthians who believed unto obedience. (I Cor. L5: 1-4,) If Christ was sufficient then, and if preaching Christ then accomplished salvation among men; what more is needed today.

Christ is sufficient as far as doctrine is concerned. Men do not need to teach anything else other than Christ. No man-made creeds, catechisms, disciplines, or confessions of

faith are necessary.

Christ is sufficient as far as the organization of the church is concerned. He is the Head of the church; in fact, He is the only Head the church has. No council, no synod, no convention, and no bishop or pope is the head or a head of the church of the Lord.

Christ is sufficient as far as the designations of the church and its members are concerned. Individuals members of the church are known as Christians now, just as they were known as Christians then. There were no Paulites, or Cephasites, or Johnnites in the early church. Neither were there any Catholics, or Episcopalians, or Mormons, or Nazarenes, etc., in the early church. They were not divided into different religious groups, each group wearing different names. There was simply the church of Christ made up of many members who were all brethren in the Lord; and they were called nothing else other than Christians as to a proper name.

Christ is sufficient as far as the way

from earth to heaven is concerned. Our Saviour declared to Thomas: "I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me. " Christ is the only way to heaven; there is no other. There are not many ways" to heaven, only one. -- Foster L. Ramsey
