CHRISTIAN RESPONSIBILITIES

(Ephesians 6: 10.)

Every responsible person should be a Christian and every Christian should be a responsible person. Yet the church finds itself with many irresponsibles reminding us of the one talent man; Demas, young John Mark or the Laodiceans. No congregation (to my knowledge) enjoys a 100% cooperation of its members. Too many congregations are trying to operate on 10% or less cooperation.

We cannot possibly adequately consider all "Christian responsibilities" in this article

but let us consider the following:-

(1) A Christian's first responsibility is to God, which included the church and all righteousness -- (Matt. 6: 33). Ones responsibility is determined by his ability and the existing or contemplated need. Consider the example at Antioch -- (Acts 11: 27-30).

(2) Every Christian has a domestic responsibility. (Eph. 6: 1-4; Col. 3: 18-21; Titus 2: 1-6; I Tim. 5: 4 and 16). To shirk this divinely appointed responsibility is but to deny the faith. The husband or father is the head of the house; wife or mother is to keep the house; the children are to obey their Christian parents.

(3) Christians have a responsibility toward "every good work." (Titus 2: 14; 3: 1). Aiding the sick and needy, conducting cottage meetings; actively participating in the work

as well as the worship of the church.

(4) Every Christian has a civil responsibility -- (Rom. 13: 1-7). This does not mean we must be so civically minded that we enter into politics, but it does mean we should render unto the civil authorities their just dues; while rendering to God the things that are His, remembering that God is first.

(5) Christians also have a social responsibility -- (Matt. 5: 16; I Tim. 3: 7; 4: 16). This is not to say that Christians should join social orders but it does mean we owe something to society. The world should be a better place because we live here. --Selected.

We cannot over-emphasize the importance of preaching. This is true because there is no substitute for preaching the gospel. We can make all the plans in the world, develop a hundred thousand schemes for converting the masses and still not convert a single soul to Christ. We can organize, legalize, and system -ize, but still we cannot convert a single soul to Christ without preaching. The preaching of the gospel of Christ is the only thing on earth that can and will convert men to Christ. "And he said unto them, Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature. He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned." (Mark 16: 15-16). "For I am not asham -ed of the gospel of Christ; for it is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth; to the Jew first, and also to the Greek." (Rom. 1: 16). "For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved. How then shall they call on him in whom they have not believed? and how shall they believe in him of whom they have not heard? and how shall they hear without a preacher? And how shall they preach, except they be sent? as it is written, How beautiful are the feet of them that preach the gospel of peace, and bring glad tidings of good things!"(Rom. 10:13-15).

We will never be able to hire anyone to do our own share of the preaching. (We can hire

men to preach from the pulpit, but pulpit pre aching is but a relatively small amount of the preaching that must be done). If you could hire some professional speaker to do your preaching for you, you could also hire someone to be honest for you, or hire them for any -thing else. You might even hire someone to go to heaven for you. But this is not possible. of course. Every child of God is burdened with the responsibility of preaching the gospel to the extent of his capability and opportunity. That responsibility cannot be shifted or shirked without incurring God's displeasure. "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world." (Matt. 28: 19-20). "And the things that thou hast heard of me among many witnesses, the same commit thou to faithful men, who shall be able to teach others also." (II Tim. 2: 2).

It is certainly a misconception that the re HO -sponsibility for preaching rests upon those workers only who are paid to do that. There is not one among us upon whom the great commiss-You cannot delegate your Christian responsibilities to someone else that must be performed by you. You cannot discharge your duties by proxy. Whether the church grows at Bybee's Branch or fails to do so will depend upon YOU and YOU only.

Our Meeting is now upon us and YOU will be responsible to a great degree for the success of the meeting. We trust that each person in H the congregation will realize the tremendous responsibility that rests upon them during this series of meetings. APRIL 13, 1966 STRANGE ATTRIBUTES OF GOD

1. Though He is the Creator of the heavens and the earth, and has absolute power over all creation, Jehovah leaves the freedom of choice upon us all. He imposes His will upon none, but allows men to choose just how they will deal with Him and His will. His word is: "Choose ye this day whom ye will serve."

It is amazing that God has so arranged it that even the silliest school boy or girl can keep God at arm's length, can ignore His word, can refuse to do His will. The most conceited egotist in the world can exalt himself to godlike proportions, can make laws, can arrogate himself to be honored and respected as a god.

The incredible humility of God allows all this. He allows a man to exalt himself and magnify himself until he is nauseating and despicable to all the rest of the world. And yet Jehovah endures it all, tolerates it all

-- for the time.

2. It is strange that God allows Himself to appear weak to human-kind. He allows the reviler to live, the rebellious to prosper. He appears unmoved while men evade responsibility, while they make immoral decisions, and while they even crucify His son. "How unsearchable are his judgments and his ways past finding us out."

3. But most strange of all is the incredible strength of God, His ability to obtain His way and to carry on His great plans despite all the forces He allows to operate against His will. Through the ages men have opposed Jehovah and set themselves against God, to make void His law and to destroy His counsel. "But the word of the Lord abideth forever." Though men have revolted against the word, though centuries have passed, though wars have come and gone, kingdoms have risen and fallen, nations and cultures have decayed, nothing has prevailed against the word which is the "power of God unto salvation." The promise and prophecy of the Son of God holds true; "heaven and earth shall pass away. but my word shall

not pass away." "The word I speak unto you, the same shall judge you in the last day." This strength, this ability to prevail against all the oppositions of men, was epitomized in the word: "The stone which the builders rejected, the same was made the head of the corner." --Selected. ***** OUR SICK:

The New Testament, which is the Scripture of the New Covenant, is as valid and as authoritative and binding today as it was in the first century A.D., when it was given. Human nature has not changed, neither have human spiritual needs changed. The religious principles of the New Testament are as applicable to present-day man as to first-century man.

This being true, man's obligation to God is the same today as at the beginning of the current Christian dispensation. Also, the need to yield our lives in complete submission to Christ's will is the same, and our insistence on knowing the exact detailed truth of his will should be the same. death and sacrifice for us.

5. We tell our children we are not really concerned for their real needs, because such actions will not lead them to Christ.

6. We tell others we have poor judgment. Mar'ha tried the same thing and was told that Mar, who listened to Him, had chosen the good part, which shall not be taken away from her.

7. We tell people we are a gambler--gambl-

ing with our own souls.

8. We are telling the forces of evil that we are on their side. "Whosoever is not for me is against me."

If you have been telling these uncomplimentary things about yourself, then start now

we care. Let us show God we appreciate His efforts. Let us tell our children we want them to be saved. By our fruits we shall be known, so let us make sure the fruits are not rotten ones.

"THAT THEY ALL MAY BE ONE"

In the seventeenth chapter of John, Jesus not only prayed for the oneness or unity of his apostles, but for all who would believe on Him through their word. In the twentyfirst verse, Jesus said, "That they all may be one: as thou, Father, art in me, and I in thee, that they also may be one in us; that the world may believe that thou hast sent me."

It must be accepted by all that the Christian religion has a basic foundation upon which all who would follow Christ are to stand. Those who do not accept these basic truths cannot rightly call themselves Christians. As an illustration, Jesus was careful to teach all men that repentance was a necessary prerequisite to being his disciple (Luke 13: 3), also (Acts 17: 30). Because of this requirement no one who refuses to turn to the Lord can be accepted as a partaker of the faith. The same is true of all other stated requirements of the Lord.

Religious leaders commit a fatal error of trying to bring about Christian unity among non-christian people. So, any effort toward Christian unity must be based on the all important question of who is a Christian. Until every man who is interested in Christian unity faces the essential question of whether he is a Christian himself, all efforts toward oneness will be futile. Jesus never hinted that those who rejected his words would be partakers of that oneness in John 17: 20-21.

All Churches today would do well to examine their requirements for membership and compare them with those set forth by Christ and His apostles. If there is any difference, then the Church should re-examine its doctrines and bring them into conformity with Christ. One of the grave errors of the day is committed when it is believed that the Church itself has a right to establish its own requirements for membership. The Lord himself has set forth the plan, through his apostles, by which he saves men.

Although denominationalism itself realizes

ment pattern, it has generally accepted the differences between denominations as a "necessary evil" until true unity can be obtained

Churches of Christ have long advanced the dismissal of all creeds but the Bible. If the creed holds to nothing but what the Bible teaches, then it is not necessary, and if it contains something the Bible does not teach, it is then a cause of confusion. Can there ever be Christian unity short of a common acceptance of the Bible as the sole guide in the Christian religion? Any council that decides to establish closer relation between Churches must first discard the human innovations which only serve to divide. You can be sure if it is in the Bible.

You need Christ, for without Him you have no salvation. "Therefore I endure all things for the elect's sakes, that they may also obtain the salvation which is in Christ Jesus with eternal glory" (II Tim. 2: 10). Why should you perish when Christ stands ready to lift you up and give unto you eternal life.

There is no approach to God without Christ. "Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me! (John 14: 6). "For through him we both have access by one Spirit unto the Father'

(Eph. 2: 18).

Without Christ one must go about groping in darkness. "For ye were sometimes darkness, but now are ye light in the Lord: walk as children of light:" (Eph. 5: 8). How can you hope to avoid the chasms and pitfalls of Satan if you walk in darkness?

evil, unto the resurrection of damnation" (John 5: 28-29). What will it be for you, life or damnation (condemnation)?

Without Christ, prayer has no effect (John 14: 13), the communion has no significance (Matt. 26: 26-28), and the gospel has no power to save. "For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ: for it is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth; to the Jew first, and also to the Greek" (Rom.1: 16). Truly, you have need of Christ.

"IS MORALITY ENOUGH?"

To be saved, anyone must live a good life morally, but morality alone will not save anyone. Christ declared that only those who do the will of the Father in heaven will enter the Kingdom of heaven (Matt. 7: 21) and in so doing, the Father's will includes much more than morality.

A true Christian follows the highest moral standard of any; however, if good morals were enough to save a person, then Christ died in vain. For he died so that those who obey Him might be saved (Hebrews 5: 8-9), and gave His blood to purchase the church (Acts 20: 28). So, our good deeds must be done in the church, if we expect to be saved by His blood and receive the reward (1 Cor. 15: 58).

There were good men on earth before Christ came, and if that were sufficient to save anyone it would not have been necessary for Him to die. Man could be saved without a Saviour and without faith or obedience to Him. Nicodemus was a leader in the leading religion, but Jesus said he must be born again (John 3: 5). The Ethiopian treasurer was a good religious man, but he wasn't saved until he obeyed the Gospel (Acts 8: 26-40). A better man than Cornelius could never be found outside the church. He was a devout man that feared God with all his house, gave much alms to the poor and prayed to God always (Acts 10: 1-2), but he wasn't saved until he heard and obeyed the Gospel of Christ. "Who shall tell thee words, whereby thou and all thy house shall be saved" (Acts 11: 14).

Regardless of how good a man is, everyone sins (see Ecclesiastes 7: 20), and falls short of the glory of God. "As it is written, There is none righteous, no, not one:...For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God;" (Rom. 3: 10, 23). One man kept the ten commandments from the time he was a boy, but even that was not enough to save him (Matt. 19: 20). We must obey the truth to have our sins forgiven (John 8:32; I Peter 1: 22). Those who obey not the gospel will be condemned (Mark 16: 15-16; IT Thesa. 1: 7.0) We are going to be judged.

"DO WE BELIEVE IT?"

"All blessings come from thee," is another statement we often make, but do we believe it? We often act like we are a blessing to God instead of being blessed by Him. We seem to think God should be as happy as a poor boy with a stick of candy because of what we give Him of that which we call "ours." Look here. God, what I brought you, we seem to say as we slip Him a tip now and then, like we would tip the shoe shine boy for shining our shoes. God should smile and say, "Thank you." In our desire to be superior to others, if we are not careful, we will find ourselves "looking down" on God. But whether we believe it or not all blessings do come from Him. We breathe His air, drink His water, and eat His food. Our clothing is made out of substance He provided and we live in homes made from materials for which

"BLAME THE LOST"

Blame the lost! They won't come to church. They love their sins. They are gospel-hardened. They won't believe the Bible. They have rejected Christ. Yes, blame the lost for these and countless other reasons.

But, before completing the catalogue of reasons why these persons are to blame, perhaps some courageous self-examination might indicate that some of the fault for their indifference may lie within the church. If so, then we must share the blame!

Consider these reasons why many unsaved do not come to church.

They aren't invited. It may be that they are too poor--or even too rich. Perhaps they are too uneducated--or too highly educated. We may not even have located them, for one out of every five Americans changes residence annually. But they remain at home because nobody has come with a warm and cordial invitation.

They aren!t welcomed. Many churches have become social-class conscious. So often the person from the wrong side of the tracks, the person of obvious foreign extraction and numerous "misfits" of our society are not given an enthusiastic reception when they visit our churches (congregations). We let them slip away, perhaps breathing a feeble prayer that they will find somewhere a church made up of people more like them than we are. We often allow others to depart unnoticed.

They aren't attracted. Our building may not impress them half so much as the reputation we have gained for "feuding, fussing, fighting, or arguing." The unsaved do not want to be forced to take sides in any church.

They aren't convinced. At times, something is lacking in our sincerity when we ignore them for fifty weeks of the year. Our interest is obviously linked to the annual "gospel meeting" week.

They aren't aware of the presence of Christ.

Many have not clearly rejected the Savior.

They have never really seen Him living in His people. The image of Christ has been obscured by a cloud of self-seeking pride competition.

and worldliness.

They aren't loved. They are competed for by rival congregations. But they aren't really loved because so few have learned the great commandments: to love the Lord supremely and their neighbors as themselves.

Blame the lost! Yes, too often the fault does lie in them. But not always, for it may be that the fault lies to some valid degree with us.

Invite and welcome the lost, whatever their human strengths and weaknesses. Show them how precious Christian fellowship can be. Above all, reveal the living Christ and love them because He loves us.

"CHRISTIAN READ AND THINK"

A young doctor said a terrible thing to somebody who was talking to him about his need of a Saviour. He remarked, "I think I might have become a Christian if I had not met so many people who said they were." What cutting Words! May we examine our hearts and lives and make certain that there is no hypocrisy present. May these words never be said of us---"What you ARE speaks so loud that I can't hear what you SAY."

Perhaps we need to reconsider our definition of a Christian and true discipleship.

After we become a Christian, we are to follow Christ---walk as He walked. "Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus" (Phillipians 2: 5). The following was said of the early apostles, "They took knowledge of them, that they had been with Jesus" (Acts 4: 13). Their very conduct revealed to the world that they had been (walked) with Jesus. Can this be said of you?

Following Christ is the acid test of genuine discipleship. Jesus said in John 1: 27; "My sheep hear my voice and I know them, and they follow me;" and in John 8: 12, "I am the light of the world, and he that followeth me shall not walk in darkness. "In John 2: 26, He states, "If any man serve me, let him follow me."

To follow Jesus is to make every decision as we sincerely believe He would, after we have prayed and pondered over the problem in the light of scripture. It means to react under all circumstances as Jesus would, conduct our business as He would, perform at our job as He would, spend our money as He would, use our talents and time as He would, and engage only in the kind of wholesome, clean fun and recreation that He would.

How puzzling it is to see so many professing Christians living in luxury and singing: "Jesus, I my cross have taken, all to leave and follow thee," or "Take my silver and my gold, not a mite would I withhold."

"A WAY WHICH SEEMETH RIGHT"

"There is a way which seemeth right unto a man, but the end thereof are the ways of death " (Prov. 14: 12).

Not long ago I had a letter from a man who lives in another city. He said he always listens to our Sunday morning Radio Program. Among other things he said, "I don't go to church but I live an honest, decent life and I believe I will go to heaven without being a member of any church." The idea he has about pleasing the Lord is universal. Many people feel that being a Christian is being good, and that there is no more to it. To them it seems perfectly fitting that they receive an eternal reward while ignoring the commandments of the Lord, but the Bible teaches that those who do His commandments will be saved. If being good would save a person, the Lord died in vain. Salvation was here before He died, because there were good men before He died. This would mean that man could save himself. He would not need the Lord. One of the best men mentioned in the Bible was not a follower of Christ. He needed to obey the Lord who said, "He that believeth, and is baptized shall be saved" (Mark 16: 16). This Man's story is recorded in the tenth chapter of Acts.

People outside of Christ are not the only ones who believe the commandments of the Lord can be ignored without penalty. Many people with whom we have no difficulty in teaching them the necessity of being baptized into Christ refuse to believe that it is necessary to go on obeying the Lord. Children of God ignore His law all the time and feel no guilt at all. Such people have summed up salvation in baptism. Thus they believe that not only does baptism take care of all past sins, but all future sins as well. They do not find such teaching in the Bible. In fact, they find just the opposite, but in their case as well as that of this man, they have found a way that seems right to them, not realizing that the way they are going will end in death (eternal death). A child of God can no more ignore the laws of God that apply to him and he sayed

than a sinner can ignore God's law of pardon. In either case salvation is determined by obed -ience. "Not every one that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the Kingdom of Heaven; but he that doeth the will of my Father which is in heaven" (Matt. 7: 21). "Be thou faithful unto death, and I will give thee a crown of life" (Rev. 2: 10).

"I think," "It seems to me," "I feel," "It looks like, " and other such statements are dangerous when dealing with things that are eternal. In the Old Testament as well as the New, the attitude of God is made clear. He expects strict obedience to His commandments. Saul was rejected from being king because ho followed his own way. Nadab and Abihu were destroyed because they followed a way that seemed right to them. The whole world drowned, except a few (eight) souls, in the early days of the earth because they refused to listen to the righteousness which God's preacher preached. It is very easy to develop a loose attitude toward the word of God. It is easy to think that God will overlook a fault because of our being good, or doing good, in other ways. It is easy to allow human reasoning to replace divine reasoning and find ourselves going the wrong way. No doubt, this is one reason Jesus said, "narrow is the way and few there be that find it." --Selected.

5. Is it harmful to the body? (I Cor. 3: 16; I Cor. 6: 19).

6. Does it prevent or hinder Christian duty? (Matt. 6:33; Luke 12: 21; Col. 3: 1-2).

7. Does it destroy identity as a Christian? (Rom. 12: 1-2).

8. Does it subject the participant to influences which weaken Christian character of influence? (I Cor. 15: 33).

9. Does it place the Christian under an unequal yoke with unbelievers? (II Cor. 6: 14-16).

10. Does it create or encourage inordinate affection, excessive fleshly lusts? (Col. 2: 20; Col. 3: 5-6).

The more of these questions that can be answered in the affirmative——the more dangerous is that activity, and the more it ought to be avoided!

SEPTEMBER 7, 1966 WHAT IS THE WORTH OF A NAME?

It is a common saying that one name in religion is as good as any other, and that a "rose by any other name would smell as sweet! In direct contradiction of that, the Bible says salvation is in the name of Christ, and in that name alone. "Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved." (Acts 4: 12).

By no authority of scripture or reason has this doctrine been passed around that "there is nothing in a name, and one name in religion is just as good as another." This ridiculous teaching runs exactly counter to all that the word of God says on the subject.

The Bible says that we offer our prayers to God in the name of Christ. "If ye shall ask any thing in my name, I will do it." (John

14: 14).

The enemies of Christ knew there is something in a name, so they opposed the apostles speaking in the name of Christ. "But that it spread no further among the people, let us straitly threaten them, that they speak henceforth to no man in this name. And they called them, and commanded them not to speak at all nor teach in the name of Jesus. (Acts 4:17-18)

There is so much in the name that the apostles were glad that they were counted worthy to suffer for it. "And they departed from the presence of the council, rejoicing that they were counted worthy to suffer shame for his

name." (Acts 5: 41).

We are told to glorify God in behalf of the name of Christian, or in that name. "Yet if any man suffer as a Christian, let him not be ashamed; but let him glorify God on this behalf (or in this name). (I Peter 4: 16).

We are to assemble in the name of Christ. "For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them." (Matt. 18: 20).

God tells us to do all that we do in the name of the Lord Jesus. "And whatsoever ye do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus giving thanks to God and the Father

"And when they were come, and had gathered the church together, they rehearsed all that God had done with them, and how he had opened the door of faith unto the Gentiles." (Acts 14: 27).

SEPTEMBER 21, 1966 PREACH THE WORD

Paul's charge to Timothy in 2 Timothy 4: 1-4 is certainly not out of date here in the 20 th century. The apostle's admonition is sorely needed in this hour in the history of the church of Christ. High sounding words and the wisdom of men are as clouds without water in this floundering world.

Paul said, "For I am not ashamed of the Gospel of Christ for it is the power of God unto salvation." (Rom. 1: 16). The wisdom of man, his doctrines and theology, may tickle the ears of many, but they contain no power to save the lost.

What many preachers and teachers need today is a good course in the Bible and soul winning. Too many have elevated themselves above the level of the average person and so varnished their message with fancy words and quotations from the fountain of human wisdom that little wonder the church becomes just a social gathering and no one finds real peace in their lives. These teachers have left the fountain of life in search of strange waters that cannot satisfy.

I have noticed over the years that those who are out in the by ways and highways preaching the word to the lost and downtrodden are the most enthusiastic preachers of the word, always ready to defend the faith and stand for truth. On the other hand the "great" theologian must expound on his knowledge and the secrets that he has discovered while drinking at the fountain of athiests and unbelievers, unaware that what he has to say will not save one soul. He is little concerned about the lost, and could in no way sit down with just the Bible and bring himself to the level of the hearer in simple words as did Paul and the early Christians.

If there is a lesson for Gospel preachers today, it is this: "Preach the word!" Know the book! Contend for the faith! Paul and the apostles had trouble with preachers and teachers in the early church who were preaching a watered down version of God's word, and warned the church against such.

Brethren, it is high time that we begin to take heed to what is being taught in the pulpits today. It is the duty of the elders to mark those who would water down the Gospel story so as to make it pretty, respectable, and popular in the eyes of the world. Jesus could not do it, the apostles could not, and the preacher does not live who can do it today and remain true to the Book.

Yes, we must preach the word. The world is lost, and we as stewards in God's kingdom must rise up and proclaim this message that has within it the power to save the lost. Let us not dilute and poison it with the wisdom of men.

things, as of silver and gold; but with the
precious blood of Jesus (1 Peter 1: 18-19)

That the devil offers some fancy prices for souls is apparent both from the Bible and experience. He has bought some for paltry amounts. He bought Judas for thirty pieces of silver, but he could not buy Jesus with all the kingdoms of the world and the glory of them. He still offers this world's goods, fleeting pleasure, the applause of men, or perhaps just freedom from criticism, as is in each case the stronger temptation. Jesus warned against selling out by saying, "What doth it profit a man if he gain the world and lose his soul..." (Matt. 16: 26). Do not sell honor, conviction, faith, or hope. Take the long range view as did Moses, who "chose to suffer affliction with the people of God rather than to enjoy the pleasures of sin for a season." Let your character be so strong that within itself it says, "NOT FOR SALE."

THE HOLY SPIRIT'S SYSTEM OF GIVING

(as written by Paul)

Paul believed in being systematic in Christain giving. (1) Upon the first day of the week (weekly offerings); (2) let everyone of you (everyone to have a part); (3) lay by in store (get ready for the offering); (4) as God hath prospered (proportionate giving); (5) that there be no gatherings when I come (no need for special offerings if this plan were followed.) I Cor. 16: 2.

Paul then makes it plain that giving is not just a blessing to the recipient, but in greater measure to the giver. The point is this: he who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and he who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each one must do as he has made up his mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. You will be enriched in every way for great generosity, which through us will produce thanksgiving to God, for the rendering of this service not only supplies the wants of the saints but also overflows in many thanksgivings to God. (II Cor. 9: 6-11).

God wants us, every bit of us. Let us see our giving as the building up of our souls rather than a drain on our lives. "For I seek not what is yours, but you." (II Cor. 12: 14).

The above may serve for more than instruction for members of the church. It may help our non-member friends to understand why the church of Christ does not solicit funds on radio and TV programs, or on street corners. It has been clear for many years that if Christians are taught to follow the Holy Spirit's plan of giving such actions will be unnecessary. They tend to cast the church in the role of a charity rather than an organ of service. When we beg on the street corners we confuse the principle of giving and receiving. The church, like Christ, is here to minister and not to be ministered to.

Remember -- when we die we leave what we have ... and take only what we are.

Ye are cursed with a curse; for ye have robbed me, even this whole nation. Bring ye all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be meat in mine house, and prove me now herewith, saith the Lord of hosts, IF I WILL NOT OPEN YOU THE WINDOWS OF HEAVEN, AND POUR YOU OUT A BLESSING, THAT THERE SHALL NOT BE ROOM ENOUGH TO RECEIVE IT. (Malachi 3:8-10).

OCTOBER 26, 1966 THE "HOW" AND THE "WHAT"

Within the past few yoars there has been a great deal of emphasis on the "how" in the church. We have had training programs and workshops on HOW to teach, HOW to do personal work, HOW to operate a projector, HOW to take a religious census, HOW to do missionary work, HOW to visit prospects, and HOW to organize practically every phase of the work of the church. This emphasis has been good, as far as it has gone. Members of the church need to know the best methods of carrying on the work.

It is becoming readily apparent, however, that the emphasis has not gone far enough. We have people who have become experts in the "how" but woefully lacking in the "what" How much value is it to know how to teach, but not what to teach? To know how to do personal work, but not what to tell the person involved? To know how to evangelize but not what to say? To know how to organize a program of work, but not what work needs to be done? In short, do we not need some training programs and workshops now that are designed to teach people the "what" as well as the "how"? To root and ground them in the fundamentals of the faith? To indoctrinate them with the truth of the Word of God?

The ideal situation would be to have people who are well grounded in the truth and who know how to impart it to others. If a choice had to be made, however, the writer would rather have a consecrated, faithful teacher, who knows and believes the Word of God, but who lacks up-to-date knowledge of methods, than to have one who knows all the principles of sale-smanship and public relations, but who has a scanty and inadequate knowledge of the Bible.

The Jews of Paul's day had a zeal for God, but not according to knowledge. They had enthusiasm, but it was misdirected. How much better is misdirected entusiasm and zeal in this day?

A bulletin article recently noted implied that we should be preaching on civil rights, poverty and social welfare. The same article rather ridiculed the idea of preaching on the

distinction between the covenants, and pointing out the place of the Old and New Testaments.

It is not uncommon to hear doctrinal sermons and lessons styled as "irrelevant". To make the gospel "relevant," we are told that we must deal with the social and political trends of the day. The sad truth is that it is some with the greatest enthusiasm and zeal who are leading the way in modernistic pathways.

We are reaping what we have sown in some places. The emphasis has been on "scholarship" and "getting the job done" without regard to the truth. There is no substitute for teaching the truth. We must do God's will, but in God's way. It is time for elders, deacons, preachers and Bible teachers to begin anew emphasizing the fundamentals of Bible teaching. Remember that it takes only one untaught generation to lead us into complete apostasy. --Selected.

NOVEMBER 9, 1966 FAITH DETERMINES BEHAVIOR

Somewhere I recently read this statement, "How people behave is usually a pretty fair test of what they really believe." I do not wonder since the Holy Spirit declared, "Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen."

We show our faith by our attitude toward the word of God. A person does not have much faith who is not interested in studying the Bible. After all, "Faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God." The only food we have for our souls is God's word. The only message we have from the God in whom we claim to belive is the Bible. How can we talk about our faith when we are not the least bit interested in God's word? Faith would increase attendance at our Bible study periods. If all of God's people had the kind of faith the Bible talks about all of God's people would be in Bible study every time possible.

We show our faith by our giving. The Lord taught us that He would take care of us. He told us not to be anxious about food, clothing and shelter. He is greater than things. He pointed out the fact that God feeds the birds and clothes the flowers and that he loves us more than He loves them. He said, "When we were anxious about such matters we do not have enough faith." When we are unwilling to be liberal we show our trust in things and our lack of trust in God. If we really believe the Lord will multiply the seed we sow, that He will bless us when we give, and that He will care for us, we will gladly give liberally of that which He has given us. No one reveals his lack of faith more than the person who withholds from God that which He gave us in the first place.

We show our faith by the way we live. The world calls us to one way of life while the Lord calls us to another. The way of the world is the way of destruction. But, though we see people being destroyed by following the way of the world, we cannot accept the fact that we also will be destroyed. So we leave the way of purity for the way of lust. We de-

cide to taste a little of what the world has to offer. We decide to try the "new morality", always intending to get ourselves back to the way of virtue and happiness, but never able to find it again.

We show our faith by the way we treat souls for whom Christ died. A person who really believes in God cannot let his neighbor perish without making some effort to save him. The gospel of Jesus Christ is the power of God unto salvation to everyone that believes. It has not lost its power. That which brought salvation to us will also take salvation to others, but God has left the task of teaching the gospel to others to us. If we really believe people are lost who do not obey the gospel, and we really believe those who are lost will be banished from the presence of God into hell, we cannot keep from using every opportunity we have to tell them the story of salvation.

Yes, how we behave is a pretty fair test of what we believe. --Selected.

He's still sitting there. It goes without saying that our actions are greatly influenced when we are conscious of the eyes of others watching us. Workers increase their pace when the boss enters the room; pupils become very intent on study as the teacher returns; children stop jumping on the couch as they hear the approaching footsteps of mother. All of us pur on our best behaviour in the presence of one whose favor we seek. 7. To watch against shyness of each other and put the best construction on any action that has the appearance of opposition or resentment.

3. To observe the just rules of Solomon-that is, to leave off contention before it is meddled with (Prov. 17: 14).

9. If a member has offended, to consider how God-like it is to forgive, and how unlike

a Christian it is to seek revenge.

10. Remember that it is always a gaint artifice of the devil to promote distance and animosities among members of the church; and we should therefore watch against everything that furthers this end.

11. To consider how much more good we can do in the world at large, and in the church in particular, when we are all united in love, than we could do when acting alone,

and indulging in a contrary spirit.

12. GRATITUDE

Their responsibilities have involved many meetings and many problems of which some have been difficult to solve. They have done an excellent job and our sincere appreciation is expressed.

The building committee realized the need of having "workings" repeatedly. Brothren have been good to respond and much work has been done through this medium. The ladies of the congregation have also had their "workings." They have done much work sewing, cle-

aning, decorating and etc.

Many have given of their efforts and gifts in various ways. The painting of the folding chairs and furniture in classrooms, installing the P. A. system and ear-phones, and etc. has required time and effort. Many have made special contributions toward the draperies, curtains, communion ware, song books, chairs for the small children, flowers and etc.

The teachers have given and continue to give much time and effort to making the class-rooms more attractive and desireable with one goal in mind, and that is to do a better job

teaching.

To all of you we express our sincere thanks and appreciation. With the new and modern facilities may we realize that our responsibilities have never been greater. With the Lord's guidance and help let us go on to greater things in His service.

DECEMBER 21, 1966 IT IS MORE DLESSED TO GIVE

"In all things I gave you an example, that so laboring ye ought to help the weak, and to remember the words of the Lord Jesus, that himself said, It is more blessed to give than to receive." (Acts 20: 35). When saints are liberal in their giving, they are following the example of God. We are told that God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son to die for our sins (John 3: 16). Again, "Herein is love, not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent His Son to be a propitiation for our sins (I John 4: 10). This is the greatest demonstration of love that ever has been made or can ever be made. The individual Christian who learns to give liberally and abundantly is learning to be God-like. Since God gave His Son because of His love for us we should give because of our love for Him. Some give because they are afraid they will be lost if they do not, which is true, but that is such a poor motive compared to the love that should constrain us to give. We become like God, our Father, when we give because we love. When people learn to give liberally, they are following the example of Jesus our Lord (Matt. 20:28). Jesus gave His all, His time, His energy, and His very self in serving people every day of His ministry. So when we learn to give ourselves which will include our material gifts in helping others and in building up the church in glorifying God, we can say that we have grown into the likeness of Christ Jesus.

In Luke 21: 1-4, we learn that Jesus "saw the rich men that were casting in their gifts into the treasury." Some of the rich men put in great sums that they might receive the praise of men. The Lord also saw "a certain widow casting in thither two mites." We are told that the mite was the smallest coin used by people in the Lord's day. This poor woman gave less than a penny of our money, yet Jesus said "this poor widow cast in more than they all." Our Lord did not mean to say that this widow had cast in more than all the others, for the rich were casting in creat sums. The meaning

is that she gave more according to what she had than they. Our gifts are not measured by the number of dollars that we give, but by the amount we have left after giving.

TORNADO SHELTERS ARE BUILT WHEN THE WIND ISN'T BLOWING

With a calm and far-sighted look ahead, the farmer in the storm country builds his shelter when the horizon is clear. He does not wait until an ominous black funnel herald -s the approach of twisting winds. Then it would be too late. The same attitude toward life prompts a thinking man to make some provisions for the future when all is well.
