"GUITTING THE CHURCH"

In one sense this is impossible, the church is the house or family of God. (1 Tim. 3: 15; Eph. 3: 14-15.) One becomes a part of God's family by being "born of the water and of the Spirit" (John 3: 5.) and thus becomes a child of God, (Gal. 3: 26-27; Gal. 4: 6.) In the physical sense, one stands, one always re -mains related to his family by virtue of his physical birth, and this fact does not change even though he forsakes his family and his fa -ther disinherits him. By the same token, in the spiritual sense, one stands related to th -e family of God by virtue of his spiritual birth even though he forsakes the family of God, makes "shipwreck" his faith and falls " from grace." (John 3: 3-5; 1 Tim. 1: 19-20; Gal. 5: 4.)

But in a generic sense there are many who "quit the church"—that is, they cease attending, they cease giving, they have little or nothing more to do with it, and if every member acted the same way, the church would disband and let themselves and the whole world

go to condemnation.

In Hebrews 10: 24-25 we read: "And let us consider one another to provoke unto love and to good works: not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is: but exhorting one another: and so much th -e more, as ye see the day approaching." The word "forsaking" here involves the use of the will. It means to abandon wilfully. It was in this sense that Paul said, "For Demas hath forsaken me, .. " (2 Tin. 4: 10.) Demas made up his mind to leave the apostle and he LEFT! He abandoned PAUL when Paul greatly needed him. Now, he may have done so reluctantly, but he did it nevertheless. I would think that the memory of Paul suffering imprisonment in Rome may have weighed heavily on his mind, but Demas, nevertheless, abandoned him. He did this wilfully.

In the same way people deliberately forsake the assemblies. They reach the point where they abandon the church altogether. What is their condition! READ HLB. 10: 26-29. Observe the following: (1) "There remaineth no more sacrifice for sins." The one sacrifice which could save is the blood of Christ; they --! ve turned from it in turning from His blood -bought body, the church. There is no more sacrifice for sin that can save. (2) They have "trodden underfoot the Son of God." (3) They have "counted the blood of the covenant ... an unholy thing." (4) They have "done despite unto the Spirit of grace."

Brother, and/or sister in Christ, are you headed in this direction? We beg of you, COME BACK! Make correction! NOW! We are concerned.

"THE MOST EXPENSIVE THING"

Sin is the most expensive thing possible. It wastes money.

It wears the body into decay. But, as bad as these things are, there are even worse things behind; for it blights the intellect and withers the moral nature of man.

It weakens the will; it blunts the conscience; it hardens the heart.

It dries up all the finer feelings of the soul, so that ultimately all regard for truth and holiness and purity is gone.

But worse yet. Sin is an everlasting thing. It becomes the master of the man who indulges in it, and sets him to do the hardest drudgery. It hires him out, as it were, to feed swine, leaving him to feed along with them.

APRIL **30**, 1969 "THE VALUE OF THE SOUL"

For moments let us think and consider seriously the value of a man's soul -- the value of your own soul! The value of a thing may be determined by its relation to something else. In sending forth the disciples under the limited commission (in which they were to go only unto the lost sheep of the house of Israel (that is the Jews), Jesus said, "And fear not them which kill the body, but are not able to kill the soul: but rather fear him which is able to destroy both soul and body in hell", (Matt. 10:28.) In seeking to impress upon the minds of the disciples the value of the soul, and to challenge their thinking, Jesus said, "For what is a man profited, if he shall gain the whole world, and lose his own soul (life) , or what shall a man give in exchange for his soul (life)"? (Matt. 16:26.)

The word "soul" refers to the life of the individual, the whole of his life. The term "world" was used of Jesus to represent the whole of that which appeals to the senses, summed up by John in these words, "For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life, is not of the Father, but is of the world. And the world passeth away, and the lust thereof: but he that doeth the will of God abideth for ever". (1 John 2: 16-17.) As one thinks of all the power, wealth, pleasure, or that which gives pleasure, he has what Jesus had in mind. Now suppose one possessed all of this -- and no man can ever have all of it -- and it cost him his soul, what kind of bargain would he be making? Jesus, who alone knew per -fectly the worth of the soul of man, indicat -ed the bargain would be a poor one indeed. Though in a faint measure, one can hereby grasp something of the value of his soul as God views it -- IT IS WORTH MORE THAN "ALL THE WOR -LD".

Another indication of the value and worth of a soul may be determined by the price Christ paid to redeem it. It cost God just as much to redeem one soul as it will all that

will be redeemed. The writer of the Hebrew epistle tells us, "But we see Jesus, who was made a little lower than the angels for the suffering of death, crowned with glory and honour; that he by the grace of God should taste death for every man". (Heb.2:9.) All the sacrifice involved in leaving His Father's home all the loneliness of being misunderstood by the world He came to save, all the suffering of humiliation and the cross, is summed up in this passage, and it is an expression of the value placed by God upon one soul; for it is the price God paid to redeem it.

Surely, in the face of such an evaluation as that declared by Jesus, and the price paid by the Father to redeem it, one cannot afford to throw away such a precious possession upon the empty and fleeting trifles of this world. In the service of Christ, let the soul be fash -ioned for fellowship with God, and prepared to spend eternity with Him.

JUNE 25, 1969 "THE FRUIT OF THE SPIRIT"

In the fifth chapter of Galatians verses twenty-two and twenty-three we read, "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, long suffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meek -ness, temperance: against such there is no law."

May it be observed that Paul called all of these the "fruit" of the Spirit, not "fruits". When one is led by the Spirit, all of these will be the fruit of such leadership. They all go to make up the spiritual man. If he has one without the others, it is likely to die becau -se he will have the opposite of the others and these evil opposites will choke out the good seed. In the parable of the sower Christ pictured the good seed falling among thorns and being choked out. "And that which fell among thorns are they, which, when they have heard, go forth, and are choked with cares and riches and pleasures of this life, and bring no fruit to perfection." (Luke 8: 14.) Like grapes, good fruit comes in clusters, this cluster being made up of the fruit of the Spirit.

Only those led by the Spirit can have this fruit in their lives. The apostle Paul also said. "But ye are not in the flesh, but in the Spirit. if so be that the Spirit of God dwell in you. Now if any man have not the Spirit of Christ, he is none of his. (Rom. 8: 9) So, only those who have produced this fruit are really Christ's. But the Spirit only directs through the word revealed by the apostles and inspired writers. So no man can possibly produce this fruit of the Spirit unless he knows what the word of God teaches. It cannot be do -ne accidently. All of this has been said to impress all of us how badly we need to be at every Bible class and every worship service, that we can know what the will of the Lord is and produce the fruit of the Spirit in our lives.

If you have not been attending the Sunday morning Bible study and the evening aervices, we beg of you to give this serious consider-

ation and be PRESENT at every opportunity of

OUR ATTITUDE TOWARD OTHERS REFLECTS OUR OWN HEART

The Bible teaches in Titus 1:15, "Unto the pure all things are pure: but unto them that are defiled and unbelieving is nothing pure; but even their mind and conscience is defiled." What we detect in a good many things depends on the type spirit we possess.

The pure mind is able to see and appreciate good. Those who have the spirit of Christ today will be able to do the same. The shallow, immature mind talks about and attacks people or groups. This is the way they have of receiving attention, but the persons who are attracted by that type approach are themselves immature. We have all seen the boy known as the neighborhood agitator. He had a good set of lungs and lots od brawn; he would challenge any boy in the block because he wanted to gain attention. This was the only way that he hoped to succeed in his effort. He was not appreciat -ed, nor greatly loved, for his so-called brav -ery. This type person has neither the ability nor willingness to elevate himself in the esteem of others by constructive methods.

The person with gentleness, love and understanding will be recognized in a way that is worthy by his good actions and deeds. Our Lord went about doing good; this same spirit must characterize His people today. Regardless of how bad we may think the other person to be. it does not make us any cleaner or purer to concentrate on his failures. We do not elevate ourselves by pulling someone else down.

The woman who anointed Jesus was criticized by some. "And there were some that had indignation within themselves, and said, Why was this waste of the ointment made? For it might have been sold for more tham three hundred pen -ce, and have been given to the poor. AND THEY MURMURED AGAINST HER." (Mark 14:4-5.) Our Lord commended her. "And Jesus said, Let her alone; why trouble ye her? SHE HATH WROUGHT A GOOD WORK ON ME." (Mark 14:6.) (emphasis mine) In this event John specifically mentions Judas. "Then saith one of his disciples, Judas Iscariot. Simon's son, which should betray him, Why

was not this ointment sold for three hundred pence, and given to the poor? This he said, not that he cared for the poor; BUT BECAUSE HE WAS A THIEF, AND HAD THE BAG, AND BARE WHAT WAS PUT THEREIN." (John 12:4-6.) Judas was con -cerned about the way others spent their money. He thought it should have been used in some special way. Jesus said what the woman did was good. It is quite significant that the person most vocal about ones use of money in Jesus! day was Judas. It very well could be the same today. For some are critical of everything and everybody, almost! That is, unless they happen to be the engineer of the project.

The pure mind sees the good, the contamina -ted mind imagines evil. WHICH ONE DESCRIBES US? To please the Lord we must possess the attitude described in Titus 3:2-5, "To speak evil of no man, to be no brawlers, but gentle, shew -ing all meekness unto all men... Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but accord -ing to his mercy he saved us."

We, no doubt, fall far short of what we sho -uld do in so many ways. Since this is true, extreme care should be taken before we pass judgment on others. OUR SICK:

JULY 23, 1969 SCRIPTURAL LIBERALITY ILLUSTRATED AND ENFORCED

The secret of success is given in Proverbs 11:25, "The liberal soul shall be made fat; and he that watereth shall be watered also him -self." The principle is that when we live for the good of others we benefit ourselves. The best road to our own happiness is to seek the welfare of others. In nature there is a law that no one thing can be independent of the rest of creation, but there is a mutual action and reaction of all upon all. Selfishness is sin; when we live for others and minister to others, we are following the strictest obedience to God's will. To receive we must give; to accumulate we must scatter; to become spiritually vigorous, we must seek the spiritual benefit of others.

All God's people, like all God's plants, need watering. Some plants need unusual care because of various circumstances. All believer -s have the ability to water -- to strengthen -others. None of our good works can be viewed with pleasure by our Lord unless they spring from a right principle, are guided by a right rule, and are directed to a proper end. God looks at the motive of the heart and progress depends on our readiness to communicate of the blessings already conferred on us. The Christian's rule of spiritual advancement is not so much in proportion to the acquisition which he makes of knowledge, as to the use he makes of it. As we feed others, our own souls are nour-

ished by the Lord.

JULY 30, 1969 WANTED: BUSY PEOPLE!

If you want a job well done, get a busy person to do it. Indolent, idle people never have time.

Just as this principle is true in the business world, it is also true in the work of the Lord. God has always called busy people to His service. 'Peter and Andrew were casting a net into the sea when Jesus invited them to "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men! (Matt. 4: 18-19.) Likewise James and John were busy fishermen, mending their nets when the Lord called them. (Matt. 4: 21.) Matthew, a tax collector, was at his post of duty when summoned to follow the Lord, and Saul was intensely busy persecuting the church when the Lord asked for his services.

When we go to the Old Testament, we find the same thing true. Moses was called from tending Jethro's flocks to become leader of the Israelites. Elisha wasusyowing when summoned to the office of prophet. David was brought from the fields and flocks to be anointed king over God's people. Amos was working as a herdsman and a gatherer of sycamore fruit when divinely appointed to prophesy unto Israel.

AUGUST 6, 1969 "THE MOTE AND THE BEAM"

In the seventh chapter of the gospel according to Matthew verses three through five we read, "And why beholdest thou the mote that is in thy brother's eye, but considerest not the beam that is in thine own eye? Or how wilt thou say to thy brother, Let me pull out the mote out of thine eye; and, behold, a beam is in thine own eye? Thou hypocrite, first cast out the beam out of thine own eye; and then shalt thou see clearly to cast out the mote out of thy brother's eye."

The beginning point of our spiritual life is baptism. (Gal. 3: 26-27; Rom. 6: 3-4; Rom. 8: 1-2.) And. although baptiam is essential (Mark 16: 16: 1 Peter 3: 21), baptism does not wash away many personal characteristics and

problems.

Bad habits often plague many Christians. Some of them stay with us for an embarrassingly long time, no matter how we try to dispose of them. One very serious bad habit which even a Christian can have is that of fault-finding.

Every one of us has numerous faults, even. though we are Christians. In spite of our glar -ing imperfections, we too often dare to declare ourselves the judges of other people. How absurd it is for us to seek to remove a small imperfection from someone when our own lives are scarred with so many faults.

The Savior, in the words of the text, uses a figure to show the absurdity of judging severely the faults of others, while we have greater ones. The term translated "mote" means a little splinter. It may be liken to a small particle, like a speck of dust. In contrast, a beam is something very large. A beam is the main beam in a house; it is the beam which sup -ports all of the others. One cannot express an opinion concerning someone without rendering a self-judgment. When a stranger makes an unkind comment about a friend, we learn nothing new about the friend. In judging others, he has judged himself. His own criticisms give him away.

The person who enjoys finding fault or cor-

recting his neighbor is usually compensating for his personal failures.

Superficial judging is a dangerous practice, whether we are judging a single person or a whole group. When we judge a group on the basis of pre-conceived evil notions, we pre-

judge; we are quilty of prejudice.

We would do well to consider the beam in. our own eyes before undertaking to cast the mote from the eyes of others. Jesus says the man who finds fault with another for a sin. while he is more guilty, is a hypocrite. Too: many are very zealous to convert the world, who are themselves unconverted. OUR SICK:

AUGUST 20, 1969 A PRAYER FOR REVIVAL

Is there not among us much spiritual insensibility, much formality, much worldliness? Is there any one of us who does not feel, when he seriously and thoughtfully reflects on his opportunities and privileges, that he is not what he ought to be, not what he might ha -ve been? The answer to these questions is ob -viously "Yes." The request made by the Psalm -ist is one we all should make: "Wilt thou not revive us again; that thy people may rejoice in Thee?" (Psalm 85:6.) Never was revival more needed than now. Therefore, let us make this prayer our own.

There is a remedy for religious decline. We must become alarmed about our state, and apply for the remedy. We must humble ourselves before God, and we must surrender ourselves completely. The Lord has blessed His people beyond our fondest and grandest expectations, but greater spiritual fervor is needed in the

lives of all of us.

The revival of a congregation can only be reached by the revival of the individuals of whom the church is composed. What is the kind of spiritual awakening that is required in the days in which we are living? It is the deep realization of God. When we realize God, He will be the power that dominates all our thoughts and every department of our being. When we realize God is near us, all places and tim -es will be holy, and all duties will be sacred. Why do we say that one man in some place is doing a great work for God, while one in another place is doing a work of insignifican -ce? The reason is that we do not appreciate that everything done for Him is great, and th -at those who are most faithful are those who are most worthy of praise. When we realize God in our life, all men are sacred. In the humbl -est, in the one who is outcast and forgotten, there is something of the Divine.

Revivals are a part of God's way of accomplishing His purposes. How can we obtain it? There must be a determination on the part of each member of the church to have a better st-

AUGUST 27, 1969 ADVERSITY -- THE TRIAL OF PRINCIPLE

What should be our attitude toward adversity? The Lord said, "In the day of adversity consider." (Eccles. 7:14.) We should consider the source, accept them with submission and deep trust in God, believing He will work out things that are best for us in every case. We must realize that our case is not an isolated one, but such as are common to all the race. We should know these are not meant to last forever for life is not a constant calamity.

There are days when the Lord's people must go down into the valley of adversity, and the -re meet the trials, sorrows and disasters. For a while we may walk in the sunshine path where all seems well, then suddenly without warning, there comes frowns of misfortune, ha -rd times, blight, crash and depression. God's people have seen the black storm clouds gather and have watched them hide the brightest sky and then the ill winds of disaster, trouble and hardship blow. Under such pressures of the soul many have gone down to defeat and have broken up against the craggy rocks of disaster However, others have braved the storms, held their heads high and kept their faith, and have come through stronger because they trusted in God. To a child of God who faces up to every trial of adversity, he may truthfully say, with David, "It is good that I have been afflicted; that I might learn thy statutes." (Psalm 119:71.)

In adversity we become acquainted with God, with ourselves and with others. Without it, we hardly know how good God is, how weak we are, and how stable and true are our friends, Many Christians can truthfully say they have never faced an adversity which did not in the end prove to be the best for them. The Christ -ian soul is somewhat like the palm tree which seems to push upward most under weight, pressure and burden. It seems sometimes that the best people on earth are the most tried, troubled and distressed.

When adversity comes we are told not to fa int but to among on with arguer and try to

find the lesson in it. The tests of life are to make us or break us. Troubles may demolish a man's business, but build up his character. The blow of the outward enemy may be the great -est blessing to the inner man. If God, then. puts or permits anything hard in our lives, be sure that the real peril, the real trouble, is that we shall lose if we flinch or rebel. Let us take what comes -- and endure to the end.

SEPTEMBER 3, 1969 A SERMON ON GIVING

Many people regard a sermon on giving as an attempt to try to extract something from somebody. Jesus did not teach on money because he needed it, or because he was trying to extract it from the hands of its owners. He taught along this line because he was attempting to develop the proper attitude toward life He knew if men coveted money it would become their god and would displace JEHOVAH in their thoughts and affections.

What attitude does God want us to have toward money?

He wants us to regard it as a stewardship. He wants our love for himself and he knows he does not have our love unless our money is de-dicated to Him. So, he teaches us the meaning of stewardship. He commits a certain amount of material goods into our hands. We sheall stand in the judgment and give an account for the way we handled God's money.

The New Testament does not legislate as to the exact amount we are to give. It seeks to create a right attitude toward money that would cause us to use it properly rather than legislate as to definite amounts. Paul teaches us that we are to give as God has prospered us. "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store, as God hath prospered him, that there be no gatherings when I come." (1 Cor. 16:2.) So many of us live beyond our prosperity that we are unable to live according to it.

Paul also teaches that we must give cheer-fully and liberally and assures us that God loves "a cheerful giver." "But this I say, He which soweth sparingly shall reap also sparingly; and he which soweth bountifully shall reap also bountifully. Every man according as he purposeth in his heart, so let him give; not grudgingly, or of necessity: for God loveth a cheerful giver." (2 Cor. 9:6-7.) What is liberal giving? Again, we must say that God doesn't inform us as to the exact amount. He left us on our own honor, so to speak. However this does not decrease our responsibility in

the matter. Rather, it increases our responsibility.

We see liberality in the home. Fathers and mothers willingly deprive themselves of things they need in order that their children might have what they need. Their liberality will reach extreme sacrifice. What is the cause of such free-hearted giving and sacrifice. The answer is LOVEL, It is the deep, undying love for the children. Such LOVE FOR GOD--and even greater--will cause us to do likewise to support His church.

The question is not how much we have, but what we do with that which we have. "For if there be first a willing mind, it is accepted according to that a man hath, and not according to that he hath not." (2 Cor. 8:12.) If we are not liberal with that which we have, we would not be if we had even more. "He that is faithful in that which is least is faithful also in much: and he that is unjust in the least is unjust also in much." (Luke 16:10.)

Take a good look at our contribution from week to week and determine where we stand in our LOVE FOR GOD, our respect for our Eldership who have set the amount necessary to carry on the work, and how much of a sacrifice we are making to insure the growth, progress and advancement of the congregation.

SEPTEMBER 17, 1969 A. CALL TO WOMEN

One of the leading magazines'for women of our nation recently in an editorial called upon the women of America to put an end to violence. It cited the illustration of Dr. John Snow of England who sought a cure for the devastation of a cholera epidemic in London. He found that all the victims had been drawing their drinking water from the same pump. He removed the handle of the Broad Street pump, and he stopped the epidemic.

Today we may not know all the reasons for violence, but we do know some sources from wh -ich our children are drinking in violence, and we can help to turn it off before the poi-son destroys them. Here are some ways to re-

move the pump handle.

- 1. Violence on television rams its way into our homes. It brings instant brutality and savagery, instructing children in the ease and casualness with which life can be humiliated, tormented, twisted. Respect for the preciousness of life is blotted out. The precious arts of gentleness and compassion and moderation and love are weakened. Write to Junian Goodman, President NBC, 30 Rockefeller Plaza: Frank Stanton, President of CBS, 51 West 52nd Street; and Leonard Goldenson, President of ABC, 1330 Avenue of the Americas, all in New York City. Letters make a difference.
- 2. Violence in movies. Write to Jack Valenti, Motion Picture Association of America, 522 Fifth Ave., New York. Tell him of the movies that have sickened you and made you fear for the children.
- 3. Toys. Do not buy toys of violence and tell the store clerk or owner why you are not buying them.

4. Books and magazines. Write to the publisher when you feel that a book or article

adds to the spread of violence.

5. Political leaders. Let them know by your respectful letters of your views on matters that concern the moral fabric of our nation and homes.



"MY CHILD DOESN'T LIKE BIBLE CLASS"

"My child doesn't like to go to Bible School. What can I do about it?"

1. YOU CAN BE CONSTRUCTIVE. Don't criticize or blame the teacher, yourself or the child A negative attitude only aomplicates matters and hardly ever helps.

2. YOU CAN BE ENTHUSIASTIC about the class, the teacher, the lesson, the other child-ren, and in preparing for the Lord's Day. Kindly, but firmly, ignore any negative ex-

pression by the child.

3. YOU CAN PREPARE through the week for the class. Do not rush, scold, or nag on Sunday morning. Prepare clothes ahead of time. Get up early enough that the child can leisurely finish his regular morning routine.

4. YOU CAN HELP THE CHILD PARTICIPATE in the class. Have him select and take flowers for the class table. Let him take a Bible story picture or book to the teacher. Participation increases interest. You can teach him a prayer to repeat in class.

5. INVITE ONE OF HIS NEIGHBORHOOD PLAYMATES to the class. Offer to stop and pick up other children that attend regularly.

6. EXPAND YOUR OWN BIBLE SCHOOL ACTIVITIES at home. Sing Bible songs as you work. Say simple Bible verses to him as you go thro-

ugh dressing routines.

7. OFFER TO HELP THE TEACHER in every way pos -sible. Be sincere, specific, and construct -ive in your offer. Regardless of the teach -er's weakness, never criticize her, or him before the child.

8. YOU CAN HELP YOUR CHILD TO PREPARE HIS BI-BLE SCHOOL LESSON for the following Sunday. Read aloud to him each day. This will help him to establish the habit of daily Bible

reading.

"And that from a child thou hast known the holy scriptures, which are able to make thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus." (2 Tim. 3:15.) We cannot overemphasize the importance and value of such teaching in the lives of our children.

OCTOBER 22, 1969 MOTIVATION NEEDED!

On one occasion during the ministry of Jes -us a lawyer asked our Lord, "Master what shall I do to inherit eternal life?" The question of the lawyer is the question of men ever -ywhere. This motivated Jesus to give the par -able called the Good Smaritan in Luke 10:25 -37. He told of a man who started from Jerusalem going to Jericho, and who was attacked on the way by thieves. There came along the road a Jewish Priest and a Levite. They passed by on the other side leaving the man wound -ed and near death in the road.

The lawyer of Luke 10 tried to justify him -self. No doubt the Priest and Levite did the same. They undoubtedly rationalized that they were in a hurry and were expected at home. The sun would soon be down, and the road was dang -erous at night. Neither of them understood surgery, and besides the poor man would probably not survive anyway. Beyond question they used much salve on their conscience to justify their action.

When the Samaritan came along he did not rationalize in an effort to pass by. With him love meant the doing of everything within his power for all who required his help; therefore , without any question or making any excuses, he gave the poor man all the assistance he could. It is not always convenient to do good. Goodness requires self denial which runs against self-convenience. It is not always agreeable to do good.

Along the highway of life we encounter men in various conditions. Far too many of us behave like the Priest and the Levite. We want better communities, schools and churches, but only if someone else will build them. We do not want to pay the cost ourselves. We realize a need, but are we willing to help correct it? There are many forms of misery within our knowledge as we journey along the road of life. We pass them by because they do not stop our progress until we give our help. We put them out of mind and live as if these problems do not exist.

Our community will never be better until more people are willing to be helpers toward solving many problems rather than just being passers-by. There is something we can do. Let it be said of us as Jesus said of the woman who anointed Him, "She has done what she could ." (Mark 14: 8.) When we do what we can the results will be noticable in our lives and in our community. The place to begin is with ourselves. To use the adage, "A better world begins with me. " ********

The problem of faithful attendance is one thing that perplexes and gravely hinders the growth and progress of many a congregation of God's people. With some congregations it is more of a problem than with others. It is indeed a common one, for sure, and can rightfully be considered a serious problem among us.

How would you solve the problem, if the responsibility were yours. You might contend that occasional attendance is sufficient, or you might vigorously contend that a sermon or two might be needed on the subject. Or, you might bitterly denounce the offender and threaten church discipline. Or again, you might just re -flect for a moment and say, "You'll never get all to come anyway."

Herewith is an article that strikes at the root of this devastating problem. It was written by an elder, a man of mature wisdom, a phy -sician. Read it carefully, and perhaps you will conclude that absenteeism is much more

than just missing "another service."

"We are concerned with the church absentee not simply because he misses services, but because it is a symptom of a deeper problem, a lack of LOVE for God. What this member needs is not a sermon on being absent, but on sin and the grace of God. What he needs to be told is not that he has sinned in deliberately miss -ing the services, though it is, but that he was a sinner, a REBEL AGAINST GOD, before he ever heard of a worship service. When he can stand at the foot of the CROSS and see a LOVE that reaches even unto death, it will not be necessary to preach to him about attending Bible study and worship services."

Remember these lines! Remember them when you are tempted to sleep late, to catch that TV program, go to the lake or the like while God's people are worshipping Him. Remember too , you are missed when you are absent from the services. **********

"He who feeds on Christ becomes Christ-like , as the silkworm takes the hue of the leaves on which it browses." *****

Suppose that you left your family by just walking off and staying three or four weeks without explanation. You did not help your wife care for the children, nor pay the rent. provided no groceries to eat, and did not supply other necessities.

But very suddenly one morning you walk in and inquire about your breakfast without making one word of apology or explanation to your wife. You feel no shame for your behavior and

do not state that you are sorry.

How many wives would receive a husband like that without a word of explanation? I seriously doubt that any would. Yet there are many church members who are absent from the services of the church for weeks at a time, who do: not care whether it lives or dies, or if the Lord's work is carried on. Then they come back as though nothing had happened without any word of apology or repentance. LET US MAKE IT RIGHT WITH GOD. ****** OUR SICK:

DECEMBER . 3, 1969 "REVERENCE IS NOT OUTMODED"

We live in an age when emphasis is placed on freedom and personal rights. There is some good to be derived from these efforts, but ob -viously we have gone to the opposite extreme. There are things that still remain solemn and sacred. These should be treated with reverence In the clamor for our freedom and our rights, have we not forgotten the proper reverence toward God?

Worship is an exalted privilege, and it sh -ould be treated in that way. The Scriptures emphasize the proper attitude for worship. One of them being: "But the Lord is in his holy temple: let all the earth keep silence before him." (Habakkuk 2: 20.)

We know in the Christian age God is not con-fined to a building, but certainly when we come together for worship our reverence should not be less than that of the Israelites. Paul-'s teaching to Timothy is needed today, "These things write I unto thee, hoping to come unto thee shortly: but if I tarry long, that thou mayest know how thou oughtest to behave thyself in the house of God, which is the church of the living God, the pillar and ground of the truth." (1 Timothy 3: 14-15.) The teach-ing, "Let all things be done decently and in order," (1 Corinthians 14: 40), is not outmoded today.

A genuine atmosphere of reverence should characterize every worship service. This does not imply we are not to be friendly, but we should be reverent before and during the worship service. Jesus was disturbed when the temple was not truly a place of prayer, but simply a business enterprise. "And he went into the temple, and began to cast out them that sold therein, and them that bought; saying, unto them, It is written, My house is the hourse of prayer: but ye have made it a den of thieves." (Luke 19: 45-46.)

Let each one of us determine to do what we can in creating an atmosphere conducive to wor-ship. We will all benefit from whatever effort we individually make in this effort.
