When a preacher stops studying and prepareing lessons, stops preaching the "Wounderful Story Of Love", stops trying to reach the lost he is no longer a faithful minister of Jesus Christ, for it takes these things to make him a good minister of Christ.

When an elder stops watching over the flock, stops feeding the sheep, stops being an example to the Church, and stops ehorting Christians to be faithful to the Lord they cease to be an elder, for it takes these things to make one an elder.

When a Christian stops obeying God, stops living a godly life, stops attending services of the Church regular, stops eating the Lord's Supper, stops praying, stops study of the Bible stops using his talents, and stops trying to help the Kingdom of God he stops being a Christian, for it takes tese things to make him a Christian.





Cures For Spiritual Sicknesses

PREACHERITIS is a serious illness, Affected by this desease are those who forsake the assembly of God's people because a certain preacher is not there. This can be avoided if I Cor.1: 10-15 and 3:1-7 are taken regularly.

REUNIONITIS. Is a very common desease in the Church. Those who neglect their duty and the services are affected by it. A good dose of Matt.10:37-38, and a strong application of Heb.10:25, and Matt.6:33 will relieve this condition.

EASEITIS. This desease has almost reached the epidemic stage. Both young and old are affected by it. It usually results in spiritual paralysis and death. Several injections of Amos 6:1 and Rev. 3:14-18 is a sure cure for this sickness.

SUNDAY SICKNESS is also a common illness, but those who take a good dose of Bible study on Saturday night do not seem to be bothered with it. This desease is often caused by late hours on the night before, Sunday sickness usually occurs early in the morning, but last only untill about noon, but it will usually reoccur late in the afternoon. This sickness will keep you from Church services, but will never interfer with your working or pleasures. If you will use Jo.14:15 and Rev.2:10 often you will soon find relief for this condition.

DROPSY. This sickness is bad because it is catching. Signs of it is beginning to dpro out of one service and then another untill you are missing services regularly, You should use a good application of Jas.2:10 and 4:17 for the sickness.

MALNUTRITION usually appears in those who do not attend Bible study, and it is caused by a lack of desire for spiritual food. A good tonic for this illness is I Pet,2:1-2 and 2 Tim.2:15.

Jesus Christ, the Great Physician, has a cure for any and all of these ill's. Try Them. They work.

The Power Of Influence !

Because of the power of influence, no one goes alone to heaven or hell; he takes someone with him. Everybody has an influence: either good or bad. Believe it or not, someone is watching you, and about the only picture they have of Christianty is your life. How you live day by day, the way you talk and dress, even the way you conduct yourself has an influence upon someone around you.

Many have gone astray through evil influence, I Cor.15:33 Eve influenced Adam to sin, Gen. 3:6 Herod was influenced by "them that sat at meat with him," Matt.14:9 Jesus often warned his disciples of the influence of the Pharisees and Sadducees, Matt.16:6-12

One of the greatest hinderances to the Cause of Christ today is the influence of indifference and lukewarmress by some who are supposed to be Christians. Untill we awake to our responsibilities and begin acting like Christians we need not expect to convert family and friends. Our influence on others determine our ability to save them.

There are many areas where our influence may be exercised, but none so great as the way we support the work of the Church, and how faithful we are to attend it's services. A husband or wife tries to convert their mate, but they themselves show little interest in the Church. Parents try to encourage their children to be Christians, but they themselves are are not faithful. We are judged more by what we DO than by what we SAY. (Note:23:1-3)

Some Christians (?) think nothing about missing services, and will offer every kind of an excuse for their failure, but how may have they ever led to become Christians? Non-members do observe how faithful we are to attend services. They are here on Sunday morning and see a good number present, but when they return on Sunday night they do not see many who were present at the morning service, and even less on Wednesday night. Willfully missing services is a sin, Heb.10:25, Jas.4:17, and those who are guilty should make correction so that they can be an influence for good instead of a hinderance.

The Purpose Of A Gospel Meeting

Too often we judge the success of a GOSPEL MEETING by the number of baptisms or restorations. This is a sad mistake, and it has led many of our brethren to think of their efforts as a failure when a large number did not respond to the invitation during the services. A gospel meeting can be a great success even though there are no additions. Let me show you why.

- 1. The Gospel Must Be Preached! Mk.16:15,
 The Lord promised that His word would accomplish it's purpose (Isa.55:11) The Word of God is the seed of the kingdom (Lk.8:11-12), and if we are faithful to sow (preach) it we can trust the Lord for the harvest. No service in which the Gospel was preached was a failure. "I have planted, Apollos watered; but God gave the increase" I Cor.3:6
- 2. To Save The Lost is the goal for which we reach in preaching the Gospel (I Cor.1:21, and Rom.1:16), but this is the results that will follow and we know not when. Jesus nor the Apostles converted everyone they taught. We need not to expect to do what they did not do 3. Restore The Erring is another purpose of a meeting (Gal.6:1, Jas.5:19-20), but here again we need not be discouraged if this does not take place during the meeting.
- 4. To Edify The Saved is also a part of a series of meetings (Rom.14:19, I Thess.5:11) The saved need to be taught (Matt.28:20) as well as the sinner needs to be taught (Mt.28:19) The Word of God is food for the soul (Mt.4:4, I Pet.2:1-2), and by it we are built up (Ac.20:32).

While we hope and expect to see souls saved during a GOSPEL MEETING, let us not be too discouraged if it doesn't happen then. When we have preached the gospel to the lost we have placed the responsibility of accepting it or rejecting it in their hands; we have discharged our duty in teaching them. But, let us make sure that we have done all in our power to teach them (Ac.20:20-27)



Some Christians Remind Me Of Ole Dave Several years ago, when I was just a small boy my dad had to plow with an old gray mule named Dave. Old Dave was one of the most uncooperative and oreniest long eared creatures that had ever nibbled on an ear of corn. He had a morbid fear of "crawfish" holes. He would off into a ten foot ditch just staying away from one. I have often thought just how much some members of the Church are like Old Dave. I guess some folk are just plain muleheaded about the way of righteousness and salavtion. No one ever failed to obey the gospel unless he wanted to disobey. No one ever became an unfaithful Christian unless he wanted to. We have a choice to make in this life that will determine our place in eternity. Make your choice today to obey the gospel and live faithful for the Lord.

For the past Eight (8) weeks the attendance has averaged:

Sunday morning 9:00 A.M. - 292

Sunday morning 10:00 A.M. - 256

Sunday night 6:00 P.M. - 205

Wednesday night 7:00 P.M. - 200

The contribution has averaged \$640.00

While we all will admit this is a little better than usual, or more than it has been in recent months, yet it is still not what is should be, or even could be. For a congregation the size of Bybee Branch the attendance on Sunday morning for the worship service the attendance could be well over 300, and why should the attendance for the Bible Classes be any less? It should be no trouble for us to have at least 275 or 300 on Sunday night. And the same is true for the Wednesday night service. Why should the day or the hour make juch a difference (a great difference) in the attendance?

We have a total membership of 211, and this does not enclude children or husbands and/or wives who are not members of the church. A total of 131 families help make up the membership at Bybee. If just an average of 3 out of each family at Bybee attended services the attendance would be near the 400 mark.

We usually have from 40 to 55 members out each Sunday morning, and somewhere between 30 and 40 leave after worship and do not stay for the Bible classes. From 60 to 80 members are absent for the Sunday night service, and from 60 to 85 do not attend on Wednesday night. Do these figures sound good to you?

I wounder if the reason could be that we are just not CONVERTED to begin with. We allow any and everything to keep us from attending the assembly of the saints, yet we claim to be faithful disciples of Christ. How can this be? Why should there be such a difference in the attendance from one service to another? Could it be a lack of love for the Lord on our part?

ONE B PTIZED Tuesday morning, after the ladies Bible Class, Mrs. Lucille Bilbrey, the sister of Sis. Elsie Fisher, made the good confession and was baptized into Christ for the remission of sins. Sis. Bilbrey has been attending services at Bybee for about a year. We welcome her into the family of God, and pray that her iffe will be fruitful in the church.

Fruits Of Repentance

John the Baptist said to the Pharisees, and the Sadducees, "Bring forth therefore fruits meet for repentance" (Mt.3:8) Repentance is a change of mind or will, which results and shows itself in a change of life or actions. (Mt.21:28-32) True repentance is a turning away from sin to serve God. One has not repented unless there is a change in his life. The change of life is proof of the change of heart. Repentance is shown in these words: "Let him that stole steal no more" Eph.4:28 In true repentance the drunkard stops drinking, the liar stops lying, the adulterer no longer lives in adultery, and the thief stops stealing.

Some who profess Christianity have shown no fruits of repentance. Their life is no different now than it was before they were baptzed. Baptism is a necessary condition to our salvation (Mk.16:16, Ac.22:16), but baptism accomplishes nothing unless it is preceded by repentance (Ac.2:38) A Christian cannot continue to live in sin and expect God to save him in his sins (Rom.6:1-2, 8:1-3) When we confess the name of Christ we must depart from sin, and live no longer therein (2 Tim. 2:19) How can we claim to serve God while we are serving sin? (Mt.6:24)

By hearing the gospel of Jesus Christ we receive faith (Rom.10:17) That faith leads us to obey God in repentance (Ac.17:30-31) While we were in sin we were without hope, and without God (Eph.2:11-12), and were fulilling desires of the flesh and of the mind (Epg.2:2-3) In true conversion we quit these practices; and begin a new life in Christ (Rom.6:3-4, 2 Cor.5:17, Eph.2:10)

'In the "new life" our interest is in spiritual things (Col.3:1-3), and the things of the world have lost all their meaning to us(Phil. 3:7) The life following obedience to the Gospel proves if we have repented or not. What fruit in your life shows repentance? Have you really repented? If you don't repent you will perish - Lk.13:3,5

Reverence For God

When we assemble to worship God we should remember that we are in the presence of Deity, and conduct ourselves accordingly. Unnecessary noise, loud talking, laughing, and running in and out of the building during the services is completely out of order in worship. Outsiders are given the impression that we have come together for a "good time", instead of worship.

The worship should be preceded with a period of sober mediation, and this will help us to

enter the worship in the right frame of mind. The building and property should be taken care of and not destroyed. The song books are to sing from, not to mark in and tear up. The benches are for your comfort, not to be carved on with knives or penciles. The floor and book racks are not waste baskets. Parents would not think of letting their children destroy or misuse the furniture at home, but are seemingly indifferent about the furniture at the church building.

We church people are very peculiar in some way When we go to a ball game or other sport we sitasclose tothefront, evenifwehaveto sit next tosomeone, but when we come to servoces sit all the building, and as over far away from others as possible The pews in the back are usually filled, but the seats up front are left empty. Sometimes visitors may get the idea we are mad at one another because we sit so far others. We usually get out of the worship just what we put into it. Let us serve God with reverence and fear (Heb.12:28)



Have you ever been lured into the game of the old "Shell-N'-Pea"? This is a game of chance where you try to tell under which shell the pea is to be found. You very seldom find the pea, because it is a con game. The game of "hide-n'-seek" is some what like the "shell-n'-pea" game, but one in which you do not invest anything to play.

Confessing Sins

"If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleans us from all unrighteousness." I John 1:9 This passage, and also James 5:16, teaches that we, as Christians, must be willing to confess our sins in order to be forgiven. If we are not willing to confess our sins the Lord will not forgive us our sins. In addition to confessing our sins, we must also repent of them. Note: Acts 8:22 and Rev.2:5 "If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us" I John 1:8

Some seem to see no reason for confessing sin in a public way, but the sin should be confessed just as public as it was committed. If we sin in private, and no one else knows of it, we can confess it in private to God and He will forgive. (Psa.32:5) If the sin is between you and a brother correct it with him alone (Matt. 18:15-17) If it is a sin that others know of then confess it in such a way that all will know of your repentance (Jas.5:16)

Real confession of sins includes repenting of it, and asking God to forgive, as well as others against whom the sin is committed. Read the story of the Prodigal Son in Luke 15:11-24

Often we try to justify our sins by something someone else has done, but this will never correct our sins. Each one will be accountable only for himself, and the sins he has committed. Regardless of what others may do, we should strive to make right the wrongs we are guilty of.

Some live and do as they please, they live in sin, and if and when they wish to be restored they see no reason why they should come back by making public confession of their sins. They think time will erase the sin, and God will not remember it. If we desire to be forgiven we must (1) Repent, Ac.8:22, (2) Confess the sin (Jas.6:16) (3) Pray for forgiveness, Jas.5:16, Ac.8:22-24. This is God's Law of pardon for the erring Christian. Our duty to the erring is to restore him (Gal.6:1)

A Reminder

The Apostle Peter thought it a good thing to remind brethren of certain things (2 Pet.1:12-13, 3:1) Since the human mind is capable of "forgetting" it becomes necessary sometime to remind ourselves of things we already know. We may need to learn things that we have not known in the past, but lest we should forget the things we know there must be reminders.

We need to be reminded that all good and perfect gifts come from God (Jas.1:17) We must remember that we are dependent upon Him, and without Him we can do nothing (Ac.17:28)

We need to remind ourselves that we can not direct our own foot steps ((er.10:23), but that we need God's Word to furnish us every good work (2 Tim.3:16-17, 2 Pet.1:3)

We need to be reminded from time to time that we do not belong to ourselves, but to Him who hath "bought" us (I Cor.6:19-20, I Pet.1:18-19

We need to be reminded, lest we forget, of our duty to (1) God- Eccl. 12:13, Mt. 6:33, (2) Our fellowman Mt. 7:12, (3) Our family, Eph. 5:21-32, 6:1-4, and (4) Ourselves- (Ac. 2:40, Phil. 2:12)

It often becomes necessary to remind brethren of their duties as a Christian, lest they fall into the sin of neglect (Jas. 4:17) Some neglect (1) Attending the services <u>faithfully</u> (Heb. 10:25-26, (2) Giving as they are prospered, I Cor. 16:1-2), (3) Trying to restore a fallen brother (Gal. 6:1), (4) Their talents (Matt. 25: 14-30), and (5) Doing good for all men (Gal. 6:9)

It is important that we remember that Christ will come again (Jo.14:1-4, 2 Pet.3:1-10) that we will be judged for our own deeds (Rom.14:11-12, 2 Cor.5:10), and that we will either enter into eternal life or everlasting punishment (Matt.25:31-46)

We should "give the more arnest heed!" to these things, lest we let them slip - Heb.2:1-2 'Remember, the "Doer"; and not the "hearer", is blessed. Jas.1:22-25, Mt.7:24-27.

The Power Of Singing

"Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom; teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, winging with grace in your hearts to the Lord" Colossians 3:16

Singing is a part of our worship to God; it is a command, yet, at the same time it is a joy and privledge. Not only does the Bible tell us to sing, but it also tells us how: "with the spirit and with the understanding" (I Cor.14: 15), and to make melody in our heart to the Lord (Eph.5:19)

Singing is for two purposes: (1). To praise God (Eph.5:19, Col.3:16, Heb.13:15), and (2) To teach one another (Col.3:16) There are many great lessons that have been set to music, and if we sing with the spirit and with the understanding we are engaged in a form of teaching. Singing of praise to God was not designed for entertainment to men, yet we all love and appreciate good singing. The joy of singing comes from the motive behind it, and we enjoy it because we are pouring out our hearts to God in song.

While we should always do our best in everything do for God, and we should try to the best of our ability to sing according to the written music, yet the tune, the notes, the time, and the pich of the song are not prerequisities to "Scriptural" singing. From the view point of the music we should sing the song as near right as we can, but the important thing is to learn the lesson taught in the song. You can tell a lot about a person by the way he sings. His attitude and character is usually protrayed in his manner of singing. can very often tell if one really enjoys his worship to God by the way he sing. Poor irreverent singing show the lack of love we have for God. Good and enthusiastic singing will help us to receive more benifit from the services. We will get out of singing only what we put into it. Let's try to improve our song services. There is a lot of improvement to be made, and we can make it if we try.

The Power Of Singing No.2 "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom; teaching and admonshing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord" Colossians 3:16

There are several things that are prerequisites to good singing. We offer a list of a few of them in this article with the hope that you will carefully and prayerfully consider them, and try your best to act by them.

- 1. The audience should be close together. When we scatter over the building we are not able to do our very best in singing. Notice how close together all of the good singing groups are.
- 2. Take a book, and open it to the proper page Don't rely altogether on memory. Sometimes in a song a word has been changed, and sometimes it may be the same song, but with a different tune. It is important to good singing that we all sing the same words and by the same tune.
- 3. Open your mouth and SING. We contribute nothing to good singing by speaking the words under our breath. When our voices blend together in singing out we can help to make good singing.
- 4. Watch the song leader. Often times de directs the time with his hand, and this will help us to stay together in singing. Maybe he will idenify the verses to be used with his fingers It is imbarrassing for the leader to sing one verse and the congregation singing another.
- 5. Sing like you really mean what you say. If the preacher failed to preach the truth as if he was really not convinced that it was the truth we would not get much out of his sermon. If we don't sing like we mean it we will not get much out of the singing. Remember, we are teaching when we sing.

I am fully persuaded that if each member of the congregation would practice the above list of suggestions we would see a great improvement in our singing in just one service. We have the talent to sing if we will just use it. NEW BOOK "Alleged Discrepancies of the Bible" by John W. Haley, has been purchased by Sis. Earlene Ray's class and donated to the church library. We encourage everyone, especially the teachers, to use the books in the library at any time. Please return the books when you are finished with them so others may have a chance to read them.

The Power Of Singing No.3
"Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom; teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymn and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord" Colossians 3:16

Psalms, Hymns, and Spiritual songs are designed to teach great and important lessons. We can only learn these lessons if we pay close attention to the words. How well we receive the lesson intended depends on how well we engage in the singing.

Christian Influence

When one becomes a Christian he is a changed person, a "new creature" (2 Cor:5:17) The old man of sin has died, was buried, and is raised to "newness of life" (Rom.6:1-5) A Christian is the new creation of God, a regenerated person (Eph.2:10, Tit.3:5) and his life must be different than it was before his conversion. The Bible has much to say about the influence a Christian must have over others. "Let your light so shine before men..." (Mt.5:16) "Ye are the salt of the earth..." (Mt.5:13) "Ye are the light of the world..." (Mt.5:14) "...be thou an example of the believers..." (I Tim.4:12) These are but a few passages which show the power in proper influence.

Many have a distorted picture of the Church and of Christianity because of some who claim to be Christians have shown a bad influence. We can convert others to Christ only if we show a good influence.

Wives who have unbelieving companions can do much by their influence to win their husbands: Observe Peter's instructions about this point, I Pet.3:1-6 The husband can also influence the wife, I Pet.3:7

Our words, deeds, life, and even our attitude must display a good influence. How could we possibly hope to convert others when we are not right with God ourselves?

If we are not Christians ourselves we cannot hope to convert others. They will look at what we do more than they will listen to what we say It is almost impossible to influence others to do what we are not willing to do ourselves.

If we want others to live right let us show them how by living right ourselves. If we want others to give more let us lead the way. If we want others to attend services more faithfully let's begin with self. If we want others to do more visiting, more helping, more studying, more praying, and more loving let us show them the way by doing it ourselves.

Convenience or Conviction, Which ?

Those who serve God must serve Him from conviction, not merely because of convenience. Our service must come from the heart; a desire and a will to serve Him. In everything there must be "a ready mind (will)" No one should be overly persuaded (persuaded against their will) to serve God. If this be the case then we serve God not by conviction, but rather only by convenience.

Some attend services of the Church only because of convenience, and not because they are convinced that it is God's Will that they attend. This is proven by the fact that they will will attend only occassionally, and not regularlly. If we are convinced and convicted that it is our duty to attend we will attend every service, and not just a few of them.

Some attend services at any cost, even if it means a denial of something they would enjoy. These will not let company keep them from being in services. They will not let ball games, sports, PTA meetings, jobs, family, business, pets, farms, yes, and even sickness and death keep them from attending services regular. These people are convinced it is their duty to attend the services. They believe Hebrews 10: 25

Some will let anything and everything keep them from services, and they see no sin involved in this neglect of duty. The weather (Good or bad) will keep some from services. Some will plan events that they know will keep them from services. They will not use their time for these things, but rob God of His time Some will attend services only if there is nothing else to do. These attend only as a matter of convenience, not because of conviction.

I voted to close the Bible on the pulpit, voted for our minister to stop preaching the glorious truths of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, voted that the children not be taught God's Word, nor sing the songs of the love of God.

You see, I could have gone to church last Sunday, and I should have gone, but I didn't. I stayed away, and by my laziness and indifference I voted to close the doors of the church building." - Selected.

How did you vote last Sunday? Last Sunday night? Last Wednesday night? Would you like to see the building closed for ever? Each of us cast a vote; by our presence we vote to keep the doors of the building open, and by our absence we vote to close them. How do YOU vote?

Would you vote, and sign your name to the vote, to close the doors for every service? Would you vote to close them on Wednesday night? Would you vote to close them on Sunday night? If you do not attend every service when you can you are voting to close the doors of the building.

Failure to attend a service when we can is a vote against the Lord and His Church, and is a vote for the devil. Man makes a choice each day he lives (Mt.6:24)

If every members was as indifferent to the services as some are the doors would be closed for ever. You can tell a lot about the interest people have for spiritual matters by the way they attend services. Usually those who are not regular in attendance are not dependable in any work the Church does. Our attitude toward the services is usually the same attitude toward other Christian duties.

Why Are Bible Classes Important ? We read nothing in the Bible about a " Bible class" as such, and for this reason some have thought them to be unscriptural, but they are not, for in a Bible class we are carrying out the command to TEACH (Mt.28:19, Mk.16:15,2Tim. 2:2, Tit.2:1-6). Others see no real importance in a Bible class, therefore they never attend one. I had just as soon belong to the first group as to the second. Some will defend the right to conduct Bible classes, but they do not practice what they preach. Why do some preachers and teachers try to point out the wrong for not attending a Bible class? Is it just because we did not attend the particular class? No! It is because when we fail to attend the Bible class we are failing an opportunity to "grow in grace and knowledge" (2 Pet.3:18, 1:5-11) Usually many people offer the "excuse" for not being able to teach, "I don't know enough", which may betrue, but what are they doing to prepare themselves to teach? Note what Paul said in Heb. 5:12-14 Every Christian who is aware of their responsibility to teach others, and who have a desire to increase their knowledge of God's Word will attend every Bible class that is offered to them. In addition to the regular classes on Sunday morning and Wednesday night we are often given an opportunity to attend a (1) Men's Training Class, (2) Ladies Bible Class, and (3) Other special classes such as a new convert class, a Teacher's work-shop class, a special preacher's class, and a personal work class. But we often let these opportunities slip away without taking advantage of them. I often think of the example of Mary and Martha in Luke 10:38-42 Martha was too much concerned about things other than the words the Lord. Mary was willing to let some things go for awhlie in order to listen to these words which are the "Words of eternal life" John 6: 66-68, 63 Some people remain ignorant of God's Word be-

cause they will not take advantage of classes

where they can be taught,

Why Are Bible Classes Important?
Some show little or no concern at all for an increase of knowledge of God's Word. They prefer to remain in ignorance, believing they will be saved if they don't know any better. May I ask you to read Acts 17;30-31 to see about this matter? After reading this passage then turn to 2 Thess.1:7-9 and note what Paul said the Lord will do with them that "know not God". Bible classes are a healthy climate for Christian growth. They are important to us for a number of reasons. Consider these.

- 1. They afford us an opportunity to be taught, and to learn things that we do not know. The eunuch desired Philip to teach him, Ac.8:29-39 The reason some do not know any more than they do is because they do not "desire" to know more 2. They give us a chance to ask questions about things we do not fully understand, and maybe the teacher or someone in the class can help us 3. They let us know that WE can also learn the Word of God. If others have, surely we can. We are often inspired by the knowledge of others to want to know more.
- 4. They give us an opportunity to share in fellowship with Christians, and to learn from their examples as weel as their teaching.
- 5. Attending a Bible class will help us to have a better influence on those we are trying to encourage to be a Christian.

There are many other reasons, but if these were the only ones, they should be enough to show how important a Bible class really is.

Do you feel that you know all there is to be known about the Bible? If so, then there is no reason why you should attend a Bible class, unless it is because you want to share your knowledge with others. But I have never met a person yet that knows it all. Since we don't know it all we should be seeking to know the things that we don't know.

The ones who know the least about the Bible are those who will not attend Bible classes. They could never teach others the Way of Life, and it is likely they do not know it themselves. Come to Bible classes. regularly.

"Unto What Were Ye Baptized ?"

This question was asked of Twelve men in Ephesus by Paul (Acts 19:1-7) Their answer was: "Unto John's baptism" (verse 3) Since these men had not received the Holy Spirit, promised in Acts 2:38, it was evident they had not been baptized "for the remission sins". Their baptism, therefore, was not Scriptural, and they had to be baptized for the right purpose (Verse 5) In order for baptism to be Scriptural, and in accord with the command of Christ there are Three (3) things that are necessary. 1. The Right Subject. Before one can be baptized Scripyurally he must (a) Be Taught, Mt. 28:19-20; (b) Believe, Mk.16:16; (c) Repent. Ac.2:38; (d) Confess Christ, Ac.8:35-39 These conditions that precede baptism rule out the practice of "infant baptism" A baby is not ' taught, he does not believe, he has no sins, and cannot make the confession. Therefore, a baby (irresponsible) are not scriptural subjects to the command of baptism. 2. The Right Purpose. One is baptized in order to be saved. Mk.16:16; for the remission of sins, Ac.2:28; to wash away sins, Ac.22:16; to get into Christ, Gal. 3:26-27; and to get into the death of Christ, Rom. 6:3-4. It is the blood that washes away our sins, but we contact this blood in His death, Jo. 19:31-34 One who is baptized believing he is ALREADY saved is not scripturally baptized. 3. The Right Motive. One must not be baptized just because another is, nor just because someone talked him into it. We should do it because (a) The Lord commanded it, Mt.28:19-20, Mk.16:16; (b) We love the Lord, Jo.14:15, Jo. 15:14: (c) We understand and believe what the Lord said and are doing it from the heart Rom.6:16-18. "Unto what were you baptized ?" Is your baptism Scriptural? Have you done what the Lord has commanded? And in the right way? If not,





A Baptist's Impression

Edward T. Dahlberg, a Baptist preacher, vis- ' ited the Central Church of Christ in St. Louis, Mo., and gave his impression of the visit on KSF on the "Protestant Hour" and he mailed out copies of that impression to all in the radio and television audience that were interested. Here, in part, is his letter: "I had a very interesting experience during my vacation this summer. One Sunday when was not myself preaching, I walked over to the nearest neighborhood church close to my home. Now, this church was very different to my home church. It is a church that does not believe in church choirs, such as the beautiful quartet we have listened to this morning. For example, it does not believe in any instrument. In that little church there was not an organ or piano in the whole church building. The church was crowded to the doors with a youthful congregation, and the singing was led by a well trained young man, with great dignity; the singing was of superb volume of praise to God, and untill the time for the sermon the minister took no part in the service. Eight capable young laymen, fine looking young men, read the Scriptures, offered prayer, gathered the offering, and even administered the Lord's Supper. It was a perfect demonstration of believers, and I felt myself veritably in the fellowship of First Century Christianity. I went home inspired. saying, "It was good to be in the house of the Lord today."


