ARE W. SILENT WHERE THE BIBLE IS SILENT?

For years a good motto for us as Christians has been, "We speak where the Bible speaks and remain silent where the Bible is silent." But it is still a good motto and expresses the Will of God regarding men in this world. It is sinful to legislate for God or to subtract from His written Word (Deut 4:2, Prov. 30:6, Rev. 22:18--19). We must not think of men that which is written, I Cor. 4:6.

But someone asks this question, "So shew me Bible example or Bible teaching for Bible study or Wednesday services. Isn't the Bible silent on these services?" In the matters of expedience where God has not spoken elders may acknowledge that freedom that God allows.

Jesus charged "Go teach," and "Go preach". He specifically told WHAT was to be preached and taught. But He did not specify when or how. Timothy was told specifically to sutdy (2 Tim 2:15) but he is not told when or how. By applying these principles I am free to preach and teach through the printed page, and readers are free to study in their homes any day of the week, or in any house where the church may assemble on any day of the week. There is nothing hallowed about a church building that we have not ourselves hallowed. "And daily in the temple and in every house, they ceased not to teach and preach Jesus Christ" (Acts 2:42).

Yes it is true that children are to be taught by the parents in the home (Eph. 6:4). The church is not primarily responsible for that instruction, the home is. But saints are charged to teach and preach everywhere, and they have an example in the passage cited above. It is increasingly apparent that those who contend the saints cannot teach the Bible in the church building are not doing it in the bungalo!





THE NAILS OF THE CROSS

John's Gospel (20:25) tells us that Christ had the "print of the nails" in his hands. Matthew tells us that the mob on the hill of Calvary challenged Christ to "come down from the cross." (27:40).

Several thoughts come to mind about these facts. Why didn't our Lord come down? Note the following:

1. It was not the nails that held him on the cross.

Jesus our Lord and King had the power to remove the nails. He could have called "more than twelve legions of angels" to help him and remove him from the cross (Matt. 26:53). He who had the power to still the storm, feed the multitude, and raise the dead could have removed the nails. The crowd could not have killed Christ if he had not wished to do his father's will.

"Therefore doth the father love me, because I lay down my life, that I might take it up again. No man taketh it away from me, but I lay it down of myself." (John 10:17--18).

- 2. The Father's will and wish held him to the cross.

 Matthew 26:39 relates "My Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as thou wilt."

 It was the Father's will for this to be the propitiation for our sins (I John 2:2).
- 3. God's eternal purpose held Christ to the cross.
 Acts 20:38, Christ's Church makes known this purpose.
 Ephesians 3:10 it is clear and manifest.
- 4. The jey set before Christ held him to the cross.
 Hebrews 12:2. Neither the lack of power or the nails held Jesus to the cross. His resignation to the will of God bound him to that suffering.



MUST AN ELDER DESIRE THE OFFICE?

Paul wrote, "This is a true saying, If a man desire the office of a bishop, he desireth a good work." (I Tim. 3:1). For a man to effectively serve an elder, a shepherd of Gad's flock, he must be willing to serve. Peter writes of this in I Peter 5: "The elders which are among you I exhort. . . Feed the flock of God which is among you, taking the oversight thereof, not by constraint, but willingly." An unwilling shepherd could hardly tend God's flock as He wants it done!

To "desire the office" doesn't mean "rumning for office" like a politician, though. A good man may be qualified to be a bishop in the church and still be reluctant to serve. Reluctance may stem from other things than shirking responsibility. If one is truly humble (as elders must be, I Peter 5:5), he may feel unworthy for the work. If he counts "others better than himself" (Phil. 2:3), he may feel there are others better qualified. Serving as an elder is a grave responsibility, and any man before accepting that work (Like 14:28). But when a man has the ability meets the qualifications, and is asked to serve, he should do it. And many men "desire the office," not for its prestige, but because of the need for the work which they can do. And while counting the cost, one should also count the cost of "burying his talent."

In the United States there has never been a Chinese conviction for rape, burglary, bank robbery, or desertion.

In the half-century of Chinese Chicago (Chinatown), there has been only one arrest for breaking and entering.

Despite the generations of western influence, this race has somehow neckreined the impulses of its vigorous youngsters. Why?

Albert K Leong, president of the Chinese Consolidated Benevolent Association of Chicago says, "We keep a tight rein on our children until they are truly responsible."

Editor Thomas Y. Fu of the "China Times" in Chicago says, "Our children just naturally respect and obey their parents. A boy or girl would not bring shame on his family or on his family name."

However circuitous the line of questioning (in a research I made) became, it always seemed to lead back to a simple formula so logical, so impertinently simple, "Our children are always at home at mealtime."

Most Chinese-Americans, no matter how wealthy or poor, maintain a strict family styled home. Meal times are ceremonious affairs which must be attended by every member of the family.

Could such a simple home remedy as this help explain why not one of New York's 10,000 Chinese-American school-agers has ever been brought to court for narcotics, speeding, burglary, vandalism, stick-ups, purse snatching or mugging? Not even speeding!

Apparently this commendable and enviable record has been achieved by family togetherness at mealtime and by perpetuating family oneness.





FROZEN CHRISTIAN

The Minister's Monthly recounted the story of a shipwreck off the Rhode Island coast one winter. A father and son managed to get into a boat together. The father took the oars and refusing to allow the boy to help row, the battle to reach the shore began. Finally they touched land, but when the father attempted to help the boy out, he found him frozen to death. Had the son been allowed to help with the oars, the activity would have saved his life.

There is a lesson in this for all Christians. The leadership of the church must recognize the life-sustaining qualities of involvement for all. Although one is young in the faith or possesses only one or two talents, rather than five, there is work for him to do. Wishing to spare some of the heaviness of a task may actually freeze them to death spiritually. For every Christian who has been worked to death, there must be hundreds who have frozen from inactivity.

To still others, this song furnishes the opportunity to survey the audience and make goo-goo eyes at the little one who has been amusing them most of the service.

To others, this song is a time to dress. Coats, wraps, shoes...whatever has been shed during the service...must be slipped on during the "invitation song" because at the "Amen" we must rush for the door. A moment for these chores after dismissal would throw their timing out of balance.

And, lest you conclude that I am totally negative, to many the "invitation song" is a sacred moment, a sensitive time at the conclusion of the preaching of God's power, when sinners have the opportunity and the encouragement of Christians to join the fellowship of that spiritual throng when souls may be saved for eternity. They pray silently in behalf of the lost while they sing.....



- 6. SUNDAY SHOES. Once-a-week Christians. "If any man will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily and follow me." (Luke 9:23). As the disciples continued each DA Y, the Lord added to the church DAILY. (Acts 2:46,47). How many congregations are growing DAILY?
- 7. WORK SHOES. No beauty, but always in style. This is the pair of shoes we put on when there are things to be done. "God is not unrighteous to forget your work and labor of love." "Every man's work (Cont.)

Let's all get the "we" feeling. After all, If I consider myself a Christian, then I am a part of the body of Christ. As such I will always refer to the church and its work as "we", never "they". When I criticize it will be "us" I am criticizing and self-criticism is usually more fair than criticism of other people. Remember--workers seldom complain and complainers seldom work.

Dear Mrs. Ford:

Our morning paper carried a review today of your taped interview, broadcasted on CBS-TV's 60 Minutes, in which you intimated that premarital relations "with the right partner" might lower the divorce rate. It was also reported that you assumed all your children have tried marijuana and that you might have tried it yourself if the drug had been popular when you were young.

The interviewer asked, "What if Susan Ford came to you and said, 'Mother, I'm having an affair?'" You responded "Well, I wouldn't be surprised. I think she's a perfectly normal human being like all young girls, and if she wanted to continue I would certainly counsel her and advise her on the subject, and I'd want to know pretty much about the young man she was planning to have the affair with—whether it was a worthwhile encounter or whether it was going to be one of those....."

The report continued, "Commenting further on her attitude toward premarital love affairs, she said there seems to be 'a complete freedom among the young people now.'"

Mrs. Ford, such comments by the First Lady of the land are inexcusable and reprehensible. You have given the green Light to girls and boys throughout the nation to engage in what you describe, euphemistically, as an affair. The Bible calls such conduct fornication and states emphatically that this sin woll not go unpunished. For some time our nation has been losing ground in the fight for morality and integrity. Your comments may turn the battle for decency into a rout. What a tragedy that would be.

"I Don't Believe in Whipping Children

Harry Rimmer tells of an unpleasant experience he had with a rowdy boy. After repeated efforts to get him to behave had failed, he approached the boy's father explaining that his son was destroying property and making a terrible nuisance of himself.

The father listened, then shrugged his shoulders and said: "Well, I can't do anything with the little devil! One of these days he'll land in real trouble, and the law will handle him. He belongs in a reform school anyhow!"

Astonished, Rimmer said he wanted to say: "Generally speaking, a little devil would be the offspring of a big one!" But instead he questioned: "What do you mean, you can't do anything? The boy is 12 years old and weighs less than a quarter of your weight. You have a hairbrush, haven't you?"

The father glared at him and answered: "I don't

believe in whipping children!"

"But you do believe," Rimmer retorted, "in letting

them go to jail?"

The man walked away without replying, and Rimmer never saw him again. However, he did see the boy occasionally. The last time was when he was taken away to the State Reform School.

Considering the attitude of that father, it's evident that the court was forced to sentence the wrong culprit! That father did not truly love his son, for: "He that spareth his rod hateth his son: but he that loveth him chaseth him betimes" (Proverbs 13:24).

While obedience may be produced primarily by patient teaching and careful guidance, almost every child needs a spanking on occasion. And the depth of a parents devotion to his child is at times measured by his willingness to inconvenience himself and inflict needed punishment, when every impulse cries out to "drop the matter and save yourself the trouble!" The loving parent heeds the Divine advice:

"Withhold not correction from the child: for if thou beatest him with the rod, he shall not die. Thou shalt beat him with the rod, and shalt deliver his soul from hell" (Proverbs 23:13, 14). continued:







"People do not accidently attend worship without missing one worship service for twenty years.

They have planned to always attend.

"Soon after I beyed the gospel in the fall of 1909, I read of another brother who had not missed going to church a single Sunday in forty-one years. That story caused me to resolve and to purpose in my heart that I would never miss the worship on a single Lord's day as long as I lived, if possible to attend. I have missed four Sundays in over fifty years, and then it was because of illness.

"It is a sin for any member of the church to miss worship unless he is unable to attend. The very nature of our religion is such that those who feel this is a burden need to be converted."

Can we say as brother Nichols did we haven't missed the services of the church except for illness? Or do we miss the services because we put more value on things of this life?

If believing and obeying the gospel of Christ offends others, only they are to be blamed for the offense. We must follow Jesus whether men like it or not. We must obey and serve Christ in order to go to heaven at last (Rev. 22:14). This we must do whether we are in unity with others or not (Lk. 12:51-53).
