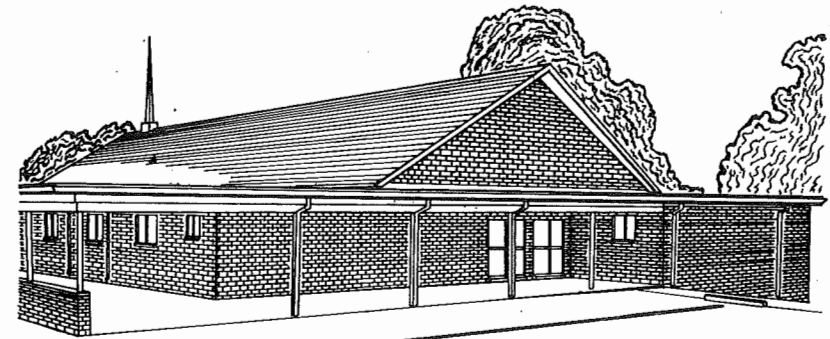

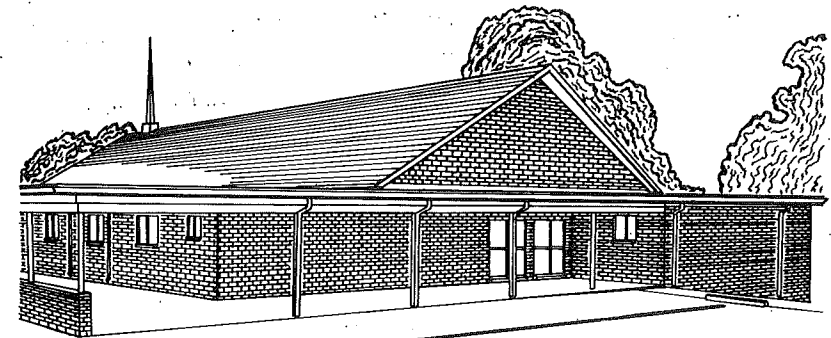

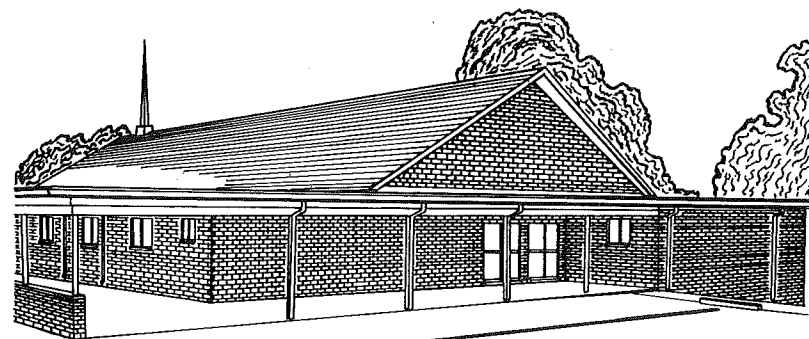

DO YOU PREPARE FOR WORSHIP?

Man has long recognized the need to prepare. Many women still freeze or can food--preparing for a later time. Young people go to school to prepare for later life. Surely we know we must prepare for the coming of the Lord and for this reason we become Christians. But when it comes to preparing ourselves for the weekly worship periods of the church, how often we fail. Some sleep through the worship, or are so exhausted that the worship is meaningless to them.

A congregation wants the preacher to prepare for his part of the worship service. Yet many who would condemn the preacher if he did not prepare are the same ones who make no personal preparation for worship.

A Christian should not stay out so late on Saturday night that he is unable to worship acceptably on the Lord's day. To worship God in spirit and truth is just as much a command as to be baptized or to eat the Lord's supper. (John 4:24). When we fail to make proper preparation for worship we are not likely to worship God in spirit.

We would not go to work on Monday so exhausted that we fall asleep on the job. We would lose our job if we so behaved. A man should fear God more than any man, 2 Cor 5 (verse 11). A Christian should be more afraid of losing his soul than his job.

Getting up before Sunday morning service early enough to read scripture and refresh our minds on the lesson would be a good way to start the day. Then when the hour of worship comes we will be better prepared to render acceptable worship unto God. Worship is so important in our lives that we should consider it and give preparation its place with regard to it.

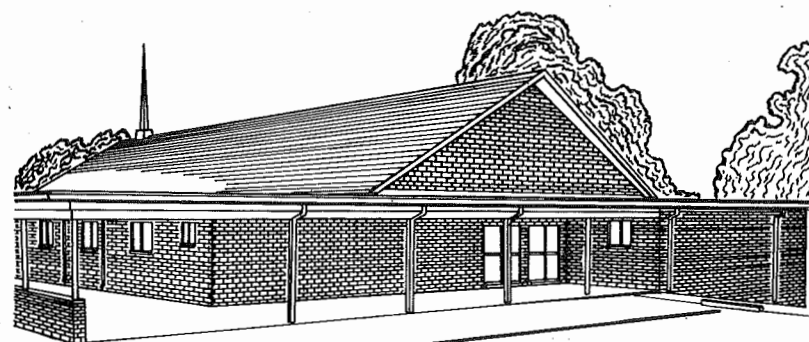

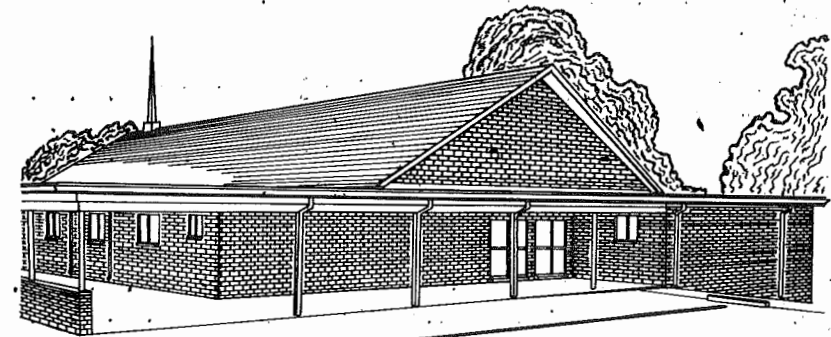

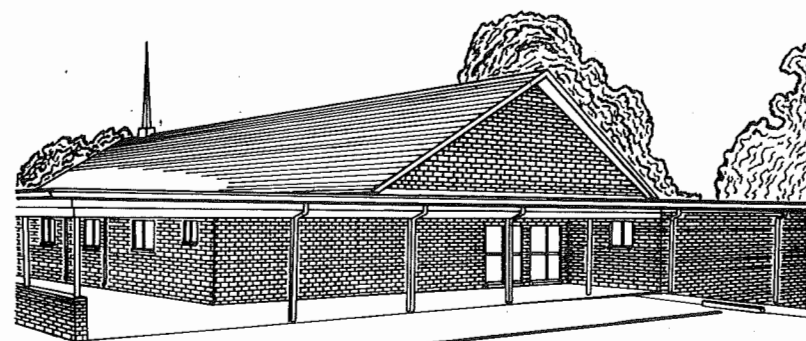

YOU ARE A MINISTER

IN The church today we have come to think of only one man in a congregation as being "the Minister" instead of realizing that every Christian is in reality a minister. The ministry is not something done TO the church but something done by the church. Those who seek to follow in the steps of Jesus would do well to heed HIS statement, "the son of man came not to be ministered unto, but to minister." Too many of the sons of God today come to be ministered unto rather than to minister. The result is that the saints are no longer participants in the arena but spectators in the grandstand.

Because of this attitude we are delivering babies who never intend to graduate, enlisting soldiers who never intend to fight, registering racers who never intend to run. Our motto has become, "Here he is, Lord, send him." The Ship of Zion is no longer manned by a volunteer crew working for the sheer love of the Captain, but is steered by a pilot and an assistant pilot while the remainder are paying passengers who are going along for the ride.

It is astounding how much dead weight and dead timber there is in the average congregation. Dead timber produces no fruit and dead weight must be dragged along. Somewhere along the way we have missed the very essence of the Christian concept and the result is that we have the greatest accumulation of unused talent and the richest deposit of untouched ability of any group of people on earth. If we are going to be honest in our plea for restoration, it is time that we began to revolutionize our thinking so that every soldier will don the armor and every child of God will be active in ministering.

Let's quit being spectators and "get where the action is."

No, not at all. Wine is simply the fruit or juice of the grape. In ~~the~~ Bible, instances of use would show that either in terms of quantity consumed, or degree of fermentation, sinfulness resulted. Where no such description is given, no man can assume that fermented or intoxicating wine was used. (the cluster of grapes were spoken of wine, and it was not fermented. Isaiah 65:8). None can show that the wine produced in John 2 was of the intoxicating quality. Neither can one show that the "fruit of the vine" in the Lord's Supper (Matthew 26:29) was of the fermented kind. Indeed it is ridiculous to assume that the Lord and his servants recommended or used that which the Lord condemns from one end of the Bible to the other. The Christian DOES NOT DRINK INTOXICANTS, socially or otherwise, and he can never find any encouragement in the scriptures to engage in such. Enough is said of the Christian's influence, and of the sinfulness of liquor, the company it keeps, its fruits and addictive nature of it to cause any sincere person to rule it out of his life.

FACTS REGARDING MIRACLES

In the midst of crises in Old testament times, miracles were employed by which the power of Jehovah was displayed in the visitation of judgments upon sin in behalf of the chosen people, and a measure to bring Judah and Israel to the recognition of Jehovah and his claim upon them.

During the time of Moses, about 30 miracles were performed.

In the time of Joshua and the Judges, six miracles were recorded.

Twenty miracles are recorded which were performed during the period of the divided kingdom. Seventeen in Israel, and three in Judah. A total of 56 miracles are recorded in the Old Testament.

There are 35 recorded miracles which were performed by our Lord in establishing his claim of the messiahship.

Sixteen specific miracles are recorded which were performed by the Apostles in the book of Acts, besides the Miracle of Stephen (Acts 6:8). The Miracles of Philip (Acts 8:6), and the special Miracles of Paul (Acts 19:11).

Miracles were signs, special manifestations of God, setting forth his character and used to accredit his messengers.

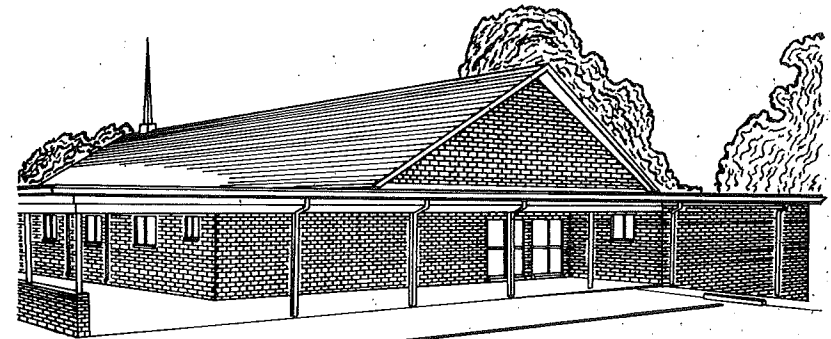

THE GREAT AND PROFOUND MISTAKE

By: D.C. Dubois

Some years ago an English author wrote concerning man's work an use of time. Among his observations were the following: "The great and profound mistake which many make in regard to their work is a mistake in their general attitude which weakens their entire effort and robs them of the joys they might otherwise derive. In the majority of instances they do not have any strong feelings of interest in their work--at best they do not like it. They begin their activity with some reluctance as late as they can, and end with joy as early as they can, and his 'engines' while engaged in his effort are not running at their full capacity. He looks on this time of activity not with pleasure and anticipation, but with a sense of duty."

Though this writing is a good many years old, the description of the attitude is readily recognized today. In every business and profession there are people who look upon their work in just such a way. It is even found in the church; consigning those who are so afflicted to failure, and robbing them of any joy they might find. It is an attitude of mind, and as has been suggested it is the "great and profound mistake" that many people are making in life.

In Psalm 122:1 David expressed quite a different attitude. In looking toward their time of worship David said, "I was glad when they said unto me, Let us go into the house of the Lord." There were joy and anticipation in his heart. There was eagerness to have a part in the Lord's service. Such an attitude should be characteristic of every Christian, but alas, it is not. Let's observe.

It is Sunday morning. They do not have any feelings of strong interest in the preaching, Bible study and Lord's supper. At best they do not dislike them but neither do they find any joy in them.

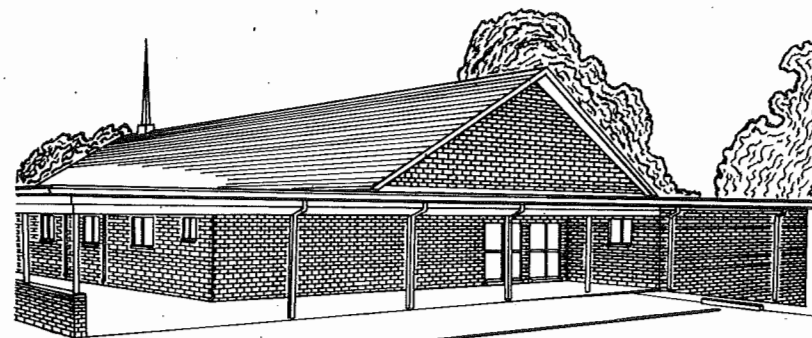

THE SCAR

John B. Gordon was one of the best generals the South ever had. He led the last attack upon the enemy lines at Appomattox Court House that Sunday morning, 1865, when General Lee surrendered his entire command to Ulysses Grant. General Gordon afterward became a candidate for the United States Senate. One of the old veterans who had served under him had become estranged from him for some political reasons, and being a member of the legislature, he vowed he would do everything in his power to defeat him. He stormed and raged against his old commander on every occasion. When the day of the convention came, he walked resolutely down the aisle to the ballot box with an anti-Gordon vote in his hand.

There on the platform sat his old commander with a face that had once been handsome, now all disfigured with scars and wounds of battle. As the old veteran saw him, the memory of other days came back. He tried for a moment to nerve himself, but it was no use. The sight of the General was too much for him. The tears began to run down his cheek. Suddenly, turning to the convention, his frame shaking with emotion, he cried aloud: "It's no use, boys, I can't do it! Here goes my vote for John B. Gordon. It was all up for me when I saw that scar. Forgive me, General. I had forgotten the scar."

There are those who once knew One, even Jesus, scarred and bruised and wounded for their transgressions, who gained victories under His banner, and who loved Him and found His comradeship sweet, but who have forgotten Him and gone away to the other side.

Read once more the story of the cross, and let old sad and sweet memories come back. See again the scars on His brow and the wounds in His side and in His hands and in His feet. Then you'll say again: "The scars! I had forgotten the scars! They call me back!"

HOROSCOPES AND OTHER NONSENSE

The present interest in the occult, astrology, crystal gazing, fortune-telling, palmistry and divination are reaching epidemic proportions. Horoscopes are published daily in an astonishing number of newspapers. All kinds of people will talk seriously about their sign in the Zodiac. TIME magazine says of this wave of occultism; "yet for all its trivial manifestations in tea-leaf reading and ritual geegaws, for all the outright nuts and charlatans it attracts, occultism cannot be dismissed as mere fakery or faddishness. Clearly it is born of a religious impulse and in many cases it becomes in effect a substitute for faith." (TIME June 19, 1972, p 65).

The teaching of the Word of God is quite clear with regard to such things. Sorcery was a sin for which persons were put to death under the Law of Moses (Ex. 22:18; Lev. 20:27). Of the person who put confidence in astrologers and fortune tellers, God said, "If a person turns to mediums and wizards. . . I will set my face against that person" (Lev. 20:6). When the Israelites went into the Promised Land and dispossessed the heathen and superstitious people who had dwelled there previously, God warned them against taking up their evils with regard to the "reading of the stars," etc., "For these nations, which you are about to dispossess, give heed to soothsayers and to diviners; but as for you, the Lord your God has now allowed you to do so." (Deut. 18:14).

Astrology, with its presupposition of the influence of heavenly bodies on human affairs, is altogether antagonistic to Christian faith in a personal God who created and controls this universe by the word of his power. Occultism is a denial of the providence of God in the affairs of men. It is a form of idolatry in that it replaces the worship of the Creator with the worship of things which have been created.

A fact pointed up to the Christian by the present interest in occultism is the felt need of men in our generation to believe that there is a world beyond the one in which we live

and that there is some sort of spiritual help available to us as we live out our lives upon the earth. But the satisfaction for such a need cannot come through astrology and witchcraft. The satisfaction of man's real and deep spiritual longings is found only in the knowledge of the true God of the Bible and his will for our lives!

Yes, a spirit world does exist. It is just as real as this material world with which we are familiar. A battle is taking place between the forces of God and Satan which involves those who live in both the seen and unseen worlds. (Eph 6:12). The souls of men are at stake in this conflict. All the trappings of occultism are instruments of Satan to destroy faith in the Word of God and must therefore be opposed by Christians. We have the need of man fulfilled and satisfied in faith in the Bible, and prayer and divine providence!

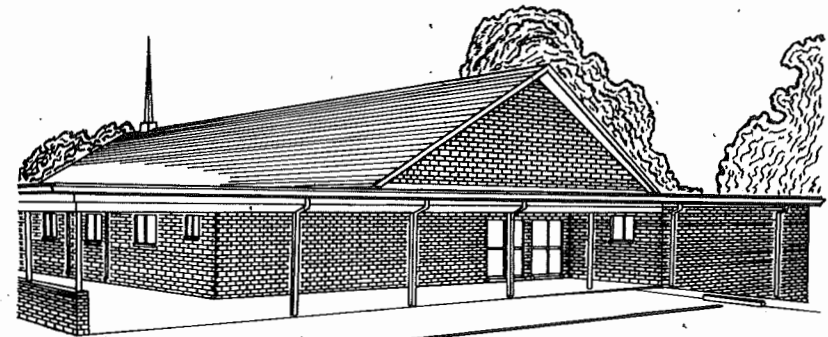

TURN THE WELCOME MAT OVER --by John Gipson

Friendship can be both wonderful and dangerous. For a man is not only known by the company he keeps, but becomes like the company he keeps. A Dutch proverb says, "He that lives with cripples learns to limp." Thus friends can either make or break us, for our lives tend to move with theirs toward the same goals. Solomon is especially careful to point out the company we should avoid.

1. SHUN THE WICKED WOMAN. Association with a wicked female is more than folly. It is fatal. "Say to wisdom Thou art my sister; and call understanding thy kinswoman; That they may keep thee from the strange woman, from the stranger which flattereth with her lips." (Prov. 7:4-5). Illicit love, that rendezvous with lust, leads inevitably to death. Solomon said, "Let not thine heart decline to her ways, go not astray in her paths. For she hath cast down many wounded; yea, many strong men have been slain by her. Her house is the way to hell, going down to the chambers of death." (Prov. 7:25-27).
2. AVOID THE ANGRY MAN. Even the best of tempers will sometimes be ruffled, but an angry man breeds anger. "Make no friendship with an angry man; and with a furious man thou shalt not go; Lest thou learn his ways, and get a snare to thy soul." (22:24-25).
3. KEEP THYSELF FROM A MEDDLESOME BUSYBODY. Mr. Loquacious Mouth is a social pest. With a tongue longer than any street in town, he spews out scandal and gossip like Old Faithful. If you cultivate him as your friend, it will be to your sorrow. Solomon says, "He that goeth about as a talebearer revealeth secrets, therefore meddle not with him that flattereth with his lips." (20:19).
4. PLEDGE NOT PARTNERSHIP TO A THIEF. Honest IS the best policy. "A man" says the Hindoo, "is witness (or partner) of wickedness, can never of course wish for purity. Cloth washed in muddy water can never be clean." And Solomon says, "who is partner with a thief hateth his own soul." (29:24).
5. DODGE THE DRUNKARD AND THE GLUTTON. These who live only for the gratification of their appetites are lead into prod-

gality and poverty. Dissipation soon tells in a man's clothes and on his countenance. If you would avoid misery, physical deterioration and ruin, "Be not among winebearers; among riotous eaters of flesh." (23:20).
