





TEN COMMANDMENTS FOR IMPROVING THE WORSHIP SERVICE via Preston Rd. Bulletin, Dallas, Texas

- 1. <u>Make Sunday Worship a Priority</u>. It is the most important commitment of the week. It is nothing less than a "meeting with God."
- 2. <u>Don't Bring God Left-Overs</u>. God has always demanded the "first fruits." He cannot be satisfied with scraps. Get plenty of sleep on Saturday night and come to worship with an alert and refreshed mind.
- 3. <u>Prepare Your Mind</u>. Discipline begins in the mind. So does discipleship. Train your mind to <u>concentrate</u> on things of the spirit.
- 4. Be On Time. Rushing in late makes it difficult for you to settle into meditation and disturbs other worshippers. Get up a little earlier if necessary.
- 5. Bring Your Bibles. Coming to worship without your Bible is like going out to drive your car without the keys.
- 6. Open Your Mouth And Sing. Singing is not an option. It is a command. Those who violate this command are just as guilty as if they neglected the assembly in the first place.
- 7. Sit Close To The Front. Experience has shown that some marginal church members would rather switch congregations than change pews. Research indicates that the level of emotion and mental participation decreases as one moves closer to the back.
- 8. <u>Before and After The Service---Be Friendly</u>. Worship is enhanced when done as a family. Family members shoule know and love one another.
- 9. <u>Listen Carefully to the Sermon</u>. This will show non-Christians that we are serious. It will help you.
- 10. Make Your Worship God-Centered, Not Man-Centered!

When Lawrence of Arabia was in Paris after World War I with some of his Arab friends, he showed them the sights of the city: the Arc de Triomphe, Louvere, Napoleon's Tomb, etc; but none of these things impressed them. The thing that really interested his friends was the faucet in the bathtub in their hotel room. They spent much time turning it on and off. They found it amazing that by turning a handle, one could get all the water he wanted. (continued on page 3)

Later, when they were ready to leave Paris and return to Arabia, Lawrence found them in the bathtub with wrenches trying to disconnect the faucet. "What we need are faucets. If we have them, we will have all the water we want." Lawrence had to explain that the effectiveness of the faucets did not lie in themselves, but in the immense reservoirs of water to which they were attached.

The lives of many Christians are as dry as the Arabian deserts. They have the faucets, but there is no connection to the Living Water who enables us to share with others the life we first received from Him. Jesus said, "I am the true vine...Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, except it abide in the vine, no more can you, except you abide in me. I am the vine, and you are the branches. He that abideth in me, and I in him, the same bringeth forth much fruit: for without me ye can do nothing" (John 15:1-5).

What can you do without living and abiding in Christ? Nothing! You may even go through the motions of good works and men may call you faithful and fruitful, but everything you do apart from Him "profiteth nothing" (John 6:63). Are you attached to the only source that can make you fruitful and your life worthwhile?

We are all faucets. Christians should be faucets of God's love. But, unless we are attached to the reservoir of God's love, Jesus the Christ, we are only empty faucets.

HOW SIN DECEIVES

by Bobby Dockery; Fayetteville, Arkansas

"...exhort one another daily . . . lest any of you be hardened through the deceitfulness of sin" (Hebrews 3:13).

Sin is a deceiver. It pictures itself as being one thing when it is actually something else altogether. The Bible pictures sin as a delusive cheat which is able to deceive and destroy souls. And so we are warned to beware of the "deceitfulness of sin." Notice some ways in which sin disguises itself for the purposes of deception.

- 1. Sin Deceives By Minimizing. Sin attempts to make a mask out of smallness. Sin pictures itself as "such a <u>little</u> thing," and it whispers that "a <u>little</u> bit" of sin never hurt anyone. Sin pleads for you to enjoy its pleasures for "just a <u>little</u> while", and then for "just a <u>little</u> longer."
- is defined by the dictionary as: "to find excuses for one's desires." Through rationalization sin tries to explain itself away with such excuses as "everybody does it," or "this is not really wrong." Satan insists that times change and that moral standards must change with the times. But God declares: "Woe unto them that call evil good, and good evil.." (Isa. 5:20).
- 3. Sin Deceives By Glamorizing. J. B. Philip's Paraphrase of the New Testament gives this translation of Hebrews 3:13: "Beware that none of you becomes deaf and blind through the delusive glamour of sin." Satan paints a glowing picture of life in sin as one filled with glamour, excitement, and fun. But the word of God warns that the supposed pleasures of sin are seasonal, lasting but for a moment in comparison to never-ending eternity. (Hebrews 11:25).
- +. <u>Sin Deceives By Paralyzing</u>. One of the most terrifying characteristics of sin is the hypnotic spell which it casts. Sin holds a strange fascination over the sinner which can paralyze his will and mind. If persisted in, sin can actually gain such a stranglehold over an individual that it becomes impossible for him to escape. (See Hebrews 6:4-5).

DOUGH OR LEAVEN?

There are two facts concerning which there is no doubt. One is that Christianity made a tremendous impact upon the life of the first century world. It made the difference between B.C. and A.D. The second equally important fact is that this impact was made, no, not because the Christians were numerically superior to the pagans, for they were not. Nor was it made because the Christians were by worldly standards impressive. They made a unique impression on the first century world for one reason only: under God they were different.

The key to Christian effectiveness is not in numbers, whether few or many, because multiplying numbers does not necessarily result in more Christianity. One would have to ask what sort of members they are——just an echo of the world's voice or the voice of God in the world? Are they dough or leaven? This is why statistical methods applied to the church, though necessary and inevitable, are misleading. They are misleading because what one is trying to measure in Christianity cannot be measured. It is imponderable, a matter of spirit, attitude, motive, and life.

PREACHING TO NEEDS

The ideal sermon deals with the needs of those who sit in the pew. The unending quest of those who preach must be to find the real needs of people and meet them with inspired truth. However, one does not preach very long until he is struck with the fact that what people need and what they desire are often far apart. This is not a new phenomenon. In 700 B.C., Israel needed to hear the law of the Lord, but desired something else. They told Isaiah: "Prophesy not unto us right things, speak unto us smooth things, prophesy deceits, get you out of the way ... " (Is. 30:11). By the time of Jeremiah, circumstances had grown worse. The priests and prophets had begun to cater to the desires rather than to the needs of the people. The prophet laments: "A wonderful and horrible thing is come to pass in the land: the prophets prophesy falsely, and the priests bear rule by their means; and my people love to have it so" (Jer. 5:30-31). Paul predicts that such a time would come in the church: "For the time will come when they will not endure the sound doctrine; but having itching ears, will heap to themselves teachers after their own lusts; and will turn away their ears from the truth.."(II Tim. 4:3-4).

It is human nature to seek approbation rather than admonition. If I had been given the choice as a boy, I would have taken orange juice instead of castor oil! When I preached on immodest clothing, social drinking, etc., where I lived a few years ago, one of the deacons became very upset, withholding his contribution for several weeks. He didn't desire such preaching, but he and his wife surely needed it! Another church I worked with had a portion of the eldership and the church to fall under the influence of doctrinal and moral liberalism. The critical need of the church was clear doctrinal preaching, but regretably, they would not have it so. The adulterer does not relish sermons on adultery (witness Herod and John), but they must still be preached because they are needed.

When you hear a sermon, I counsel you not to judge it merely on whether you "liked" it or it made you "feel good." The better criterion is whether you needed it. But even if you didn't, someone else probably did!

POSITIVELY NEGATIVE by W. T. Hamilton

Most of us like positive preaching more than negative preaching. And the positive is important—just as important as the negative. But the negative is important, too—just as important as the positive! The Bible contains some mighty important negative statements:

"He that believeth not shall be damned." (Mark 16:16).

"Except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish." (Luke 13:3)

"Whosoever shall deny me before men, him will I also deny before my father which is in heaven." (Matthew 10:33).

"Except a man be born of water and of the Spirit he cannot enter into the kingdom of God." (John 3:5).

It is easy to get hung up on one side or another of this "positive vs. negative" argument. Such a one would do well to read the Scriptures and see how many Biblical statements are positive . . . and how many are negative . . and how many are both positive AND negative!

By such a study we may avoid the paradox of being POSITIVELY AGAINST ANYTHING NEGATIVE!
