# "Study in the Teachings of Christ"



### Fellowship Without Repentance?

With all of the recent "unity meetings" there has surfaced a serious problem in the church. Many are suggesting that our arms are open to all who will simply cease to practice the sin of will worship with the instrument. I wonder how many realize the fallacy of this reasoning? If a man who worships with the instrument of music comes and says, "I don't believe that it is wrong but I want to have your fellowship so I will give it up," is acceptable, then why cannot a prostitute say, "I don't think I am doing anything wrong but I don't want to have everybody in church to avoid me, so I will quit." Can we extend fellowship to the prostitute without her first repenting? Certainly not! Paul pronounced a condemnation on those who consented with the wrong, "who, knowing the ordinance of God, that they that practise such things are worthy of death, not only do the same, but also consent with them that practise them." (Rom. 1:32).


The Bible clearly teaches that simply covering up (sweeping under the rug) a sin will not prosper one in the sight of God, "He that covereth his transgressions shall not prosper, but whoso confesseth and forsaketh them shall obtain mercy." (Prov. 28:13). That is what God has to say about it. If worshipping with instruments of music is sin (and it is), then we cannot extend fellowship to them until they renounce that error and make it right with God. But, many may suggest that these people do not see any wrong in using the instrument. They, like many others in this world, are in the dark as to what God's word teaches. It is no different to say that a certain man thinks gambling is fine and acceptable. He must be taught better! We care for his soul, thus, we cannot cry "peace" when there is no peace with God. Those who claim to love these brethren in "instrumental" churches are not fully demonstrating it by allowing them to continue thinking they are alright in their beliefs. If they truly loved them, they would attempt to get them to be sorry for using the instrument and follow through with repentance (cf. II Cor. 7:9,10). Then, they would be walking in the Light and have fellowship not only with God but with his faithful servants (I John 1:3-7). I don't know who has "bewitched" (Gal. 3:1) our brethren into accepting this false approach but I pray that they give it up before they fill the Lord's church with unrepentant fornicators, drunkards, false worshippers and the like. ## "He Preached Him Into Hell"



Brother Franklin Camp, one of the outstanding preachers in the brotherhood, tells the story of a man whom he knew some years ago and whose funeral he preached. *"He was a member of the church."* He said when so question. He was a member, but could not be counted on to attend services. He worked six days a week and had to socialize sometime, and when could he except Sunday? He worked hard and needed some recreation and Sunday was the only time he had. *He was a member of the church* but he could not get to Bible Study. He needed the extra hour of sleep more than he needed Bible Study. He did not come on Sunday night. He had to rest to be ready for work on Monday. He never came to mid-week services. He could find no scripture where mid-week services were mentioned.

His salary increased but not his giving. He gave a dollar all his life. He was a member of the church. The church conducted radio programs but not with his money. He was a member of the church but he never had time to visit the sick and shut-ins. He said that was what the preacher was paid to do. If he was sick and no one visited him, he was hurt. He never tried to teach anyone. In fact, he did not know where to find the Great Commission. He had to call the preacher to find the answer to any question anyone asked him.

*He was a member of the church* but he died. I conducted his funeral. I said, "*He was a member of the church* but he was careless in his attendance. He did not think Bible Study was important and never came. He did not come to mid-week classes, he never gave as he was prospered. His funeral is being conducted in a building paid for by others. He never visited the sick. No one gathered here today has he taught the truth. He is now gone to judgment to meet his God and all he can say to God is, I was a member of the church." Brother Camp says that he heard someone say, "He preached him straight to hell." All brother Camp did was to tell the truth about his life. All he ever claimed while he lived was that *he was a member of the church*. Could brother Camp have claimed what this man would not claim while he lived?




# "Looog By Faota"

God told Habakkuk that "the righteous shall live by his faith" (Hab. 2:4). In three places in the New Testament this same phrase is used (cf. Rom. 1:17; Gal. 3:11; Heb. 10:38). While some have perverted this grand biblical phrase, the primary import of the passage is quite clear. To Habakkuk, the man who would live by his faith would be a man who was not haughty and self-righteous but one who was willing to follow God. To the Romans, it was a matter of one following the revealed will of God. Paul told the Romans that "belief ("faith," KJV) cometh of hearing, and hearing by the word of Christ." (Rom. 10:17). Hence, one would live by hearing the word of God. Further illustrating this point, one can note that Abraham who fully illustrated this point in chapter 4, lived by faith. "Yet, looking unto the promise of God, he wavered not through unbelief, but waxed strong through faith, giving glory to God, and being fully assured that what he had promised, he was able also to perform." (Rom. 4:20,21). Abramham showed that he lived by faith, he believed the promises of God. In the book of Galatians, the emphasis is different but the teaching remains the same. Paul emphasized that the man who is just (righteous) before God is so because of faith, not by the Law (of Moses). The occurence of the phrase in Hebrews is very significant. In fact, it sets up the great "faith chapter" in the Bible, Hebrews 11. The point of the Hebrew writer is the is to stress the great need for men to remain followers of God's word. It is not enough to simply believe then shrink back into the world. Men have to have a full active and obedient faith. That is he "lives by" (present action) his faith.

In practical terms, for us today to live by faith means exactly what it did then. We must take God at His Word. We must live daily by that book. We must seek no other means of justification. God has shown us through His Word what it will tak for us to be pleasing to Him. When we cease to follow that divinely ordained plan then we shrink back to where destruction will be found.







## Impressions of the Freed-Hardeman Lectureship



1. Many speakers this year were not those who were "well-known" preachers. They did the best job! That is the way it should be—emphasis on the message, not the man.

2. Many in attendance at the lectureship need to learn to "Amen" the subject and not applaud the man. I was strongly disturbed to hear people clap their hands after some speakers concluded their message.

3. The subject of *"grace"* is a very misunderstood Bible topic by many brethren. We must guard against those who would turn the grace of God into lasciviousness (Jude 4). Many of the speakers brought out areas where the word of God had been perverted.

Thus says the Lord God: "Pound your fists and stamp your feet, and say, 'Alas, for all the evil abominations of the house of Israell For they shall fall by the sword, by famine, and by pestilence."" (Ezk. 6:11 NKJV)

Many people think that there is no place for the servant of God to stand up and cry, "Enough!" There view of the Christian preacher is that of a person who is solely a compassionate, reserved individual. 



I was distressed to hear, as I am sure many of you were, that the new Governor has said that he will sign a bill legalizing horse racing in Tennessee if it passes the legislature. In our country where we have the priviledge to influence our elected officials, we must do so! If we idly sit by and watch evil be done we are no better ourselves. Edom was rebuked by God for not helping, "In the day that thou stoodest on the other side, in the day that strangers carried away his substance, and foreigners entered into his gates, and cast lots upon Jerusalem, even thou wast as one of them." (Obad. 11).

Even now one can hear all of the "so-called" benefits of having legalized gambling in our state. "Just look at all of the tax dollars it will bring in," some will say. Others will shout, "We have to have it if we expect to attract new people." First of all, we should never make moral decisions based upon supposed benefits, real or otherwise, Paul, said that it had been "slanderously reported" that they were saying, "Let us do evil, that good may come." (Rom. 3:8). It is never right to do wrong, regardless of the circumstances. Second, we need to realize that many of these "benefits" are benefits we could live without. Look at the tax revenue on alcohol sales. In 1974, the HEW report on ALCOHOL & HEALTH, NEW KNOWLEDGE. concluded that it took \$4.52 in expenses to deal with the problems that every \$1.00 of tax revenue brought! Do the figures look so impressive now?? Many have this false concept that legalized gambling will provide a windfall of revenue for the state. It will result in one of the greatest burdens on the state to control next to alcohol.

It is sad that our society has deteriorated to the point where seemingly people do not understand what is right and wrong. Isaiah pronounced God's woe long ago: "Woe unto them that call evil good, and good evil; that put darkness for light, and light for darkness; that put bitter for sweet, and sweet for bitter!" (Isa. 5:20). Let others know that you do not agree with legalized gambling. And, especially the elected officials.

Second, I noticed from last week's paper that our two local representatives voted against the pari-mutuel. Let them know that you appreciated it.




There is much good we can be thankful for, but let's continue to improve...

# Watch Your Associations!

It is not uncommon today to hear our brethren talking about unity and the need to "get to know" those with whom we differ. It has also been suggested that there are certainly areas where we can can have fellowship. Some have went so far as to suggest that we have pulpit exchange with them, that we cooperatively support missionaries together, and other forms of interaction. In spite of all of these suggestions, no one has offered scriptural sanction for them.

The Bible does address the subject. In the days of the divided kingdom, during the reigns of Ahab, king of Israel, and Jehoshaphat, king of Judah, there was a close association between the two (II Chron. 18:1). It could have conceivably been argued that the two had a common heritage, for after all, they were originally from the one nation which had been led by Saul, David, and Solomon. They were even of the same physical descent, that is, they were Jews. However, their league together was rebuked by God! The Chronicler records, "And Jehu the son of Hanani the seer went out to meet him, and said to king Jehoshaphat, Shouldest thou help the wicked and love them that hate Jehovah? for this thing wrath is upon thee from before Jehovah." (II Chron. 19:2).

It can almost be heard now, "but these are not parallels, old King Ahab, truly hated the Lord." The truth of the matter was that King Ahab just did not want to listen to what the Lord had to say. This was illustrated in his rejection of what the prophet Micaiah said. Micaiah spoke the Lord's message and was ridiculed and persecuted by Ahab for it. One who opposes the Lord's message and messenger, demonstrates his hatred for the Lord (cf. I Sam. 8:7). One is either with the Lord and is His friend (Jn. 14:15) or he is in league with the world and is an enemy of God (Jas. 4:4). Be careful who you associate with!



1. Do not bend the backs. It will break the binding and soon pages will fall out.


2. Do not write in the songbooks. If you need to write a note, find some paper.

### Will Faith Be Lost In heavenly Sight?


In some of our songbooks there appears a song "Only In Thee" which ends the final verse by saying: "Faith will be lost in heavenly sight, Only, dear Lord, in Thee." There is but little doubt that some have drawn this conclusion from reading II Corinthians 5:7, where Paul


says, "for we walk by faith, not by sight." However, in studying this both from the immediate context (i.e. those verses which appear just before and just after) and from studying the remote context (i.e. what the rest of the Bible says on the subject), it becomes quite clear, that the Bible does not make faith and sight mutually exclusive. The point which Paul was making was that the literal presence of the Lord was no longer with the disciples and thus they would have to live their lives in belief in the eternal home of heaven and to make preparations for the time that they would be walking by the "sight" of being at "home" with the Lord.

When one looks for connections of faith and sight elsewhere in the Bible, it becomes increasingly clear that the Lord's appearance on the last great day will not end our faith but will increase it! If faith lost in sight, how could Jesus reply to Thomas, "Because thou hast seen me, thou hast believed" (In. 20:29)? The Samaritans told the "woman at the well" who gave testimony concerning Jesus, "Now we believe, not because of they speaking: for we have heard for ourselves, and know that this is indeed the Saviour of the world." (Jn. 4:42). It is true that one can and should have faith in the testimony of reliable men without the need for sight as such was the exhortation of Jesus: "Blessed are they that have not seen, and yet have believed." (Jn. 20:29b). On the other hand, one should not go to the extreme that some have and conclude that faith will be lost in sight.

A proper view of this biblical theme would be: First, the disciples of the Lord walked by both faith and sight. Then, the Lord ascended back to the Father and left His will for man to follow, and man was left to walk by faith, not by sight (II Cor. 5:7). On the great judgement day when "we shall see him even as he is" (I Jn. 3:2), we shall be privileged to enjoy, as the disciples of old, faith and sight. For these reasons, when I sing the song "Only In Thee," I sing, "Faith will be more in heavenly sight, Only, dear Lord, in Thee."

## BEING UNTRUF To children


"If I had said, 'I will speak thus,' Behold, I would have been untrue to a generation of Your children." (Ps. 73:15 NKJV). Psalms 73 is an open statement of the problems that many have with the fact that sometimes the wicked seem to prosper while the righteous ones seem to suffer, or at least they do

nearly so well materially. Even the best of us occasionally struggle with the fact that it seems that others are always doing better than we think we are.

Asaph opens the psalm with the confession that he had looked at the situation among men and that he himself had almost slipped. What he saw was the prosperity of the wicked, "they have more than heart could wish" (vs 7b). "Behold, these are the ungodly, who are are always at ease; they increase in riches." (vs 12). His conclusion was: "Surely I have cleansed my heart in vain, and washed my hands in innocence. For all day long I have been plagued, and chastened every morning." (vss 13,14).

Perhaps each one of us at one time or another have identified with the sentiments of Asaph. Many have gone on to air these doubts before others, however, in so doing they been totally unfair to those who are children (either physically, or in spirit). Asaph came to realize that this type of thinking was only one-dimensional it did not look at the whole picture of life. He came to this realization after entering the sanctuary of God. He understood that God would punish the wicked in the end. From all of God's instruction, he drew the conclusion: "For indeed, those who are far from you shall perish...but it is good for me to draw near to God." (vss 27,28a). And, after looking at the whole picture of life, rather than airing doubts about the righteous life, he said, "I have put my trust in the Lord God, that I may *declare* all Your works." (vs 28b).

It is easy to be short-sighted when we look at material things, for after all, they are only temporary (Matt. 6:19-24). However, we should be very careful when we start talking about these things. We always have around us those who are very impressionable, especially the young. Jesus warns us not to cause one of them to stumble (Matt. 18:2-10). If you feel that perhaps your efforts at righteousness is unprofitable, you should know "that your labor is not in vain in the Lord" (I Cor. 15:58).






One of the saddest things that every confronts us is to see a person who has great potential to waste his life in laziness. We see people everyday who have literally wasted their lives by doing nothing more than looking for the easy way through everything. Solomon, the great wise man of God, saw several characteristics of the sluggard (lazy man). I would like to list some of them here:

1. He is a man who will never have anything (Prov. 6:6,9; 24:30-34). The Lord's church will never prosper and have true growth with those who are spiritually lazy continue in their slothfulness.

2. He is not worth anything to those who he works for (Prov. 10:26). How can Elders lead the flock when they can't find anyone who will do the work? And, what about the Master above that we all serve?

3. He has great desires but never obtains because he is unwilling to work for it (13:4; 21:25). Solmon says that he "coveteth greedily all the day long." (Prov. 21:26). How often do you express your desire that the church would grow? Are you doing anything about it?


4. He is full of excuses (Prov. 20:4; 22:13; 26:16). Whether is be that it is cold outside or that there is a lion in the streets, Solomon says, "The sluggard is wiser in his own conceit than seven men that can render a reason." (Prov. 26:16). He can think of 1001 excuses why he can't help or work. When you are called on to help, do you show up or is there always something else that you have to do or some hindrance (the cold, or a lion) that prevents you from working?

Perhaps we, spiritually speaking, are like the sluggard, "As the door turneth upon its hinges, so doth the sluggard upon his bed." (Prov. 26:14). Or, are we so connected to our pews? Are you a church sluggard? TL.





# Wrong Is Always Wrong

In a period of loose, sagging morals, Satan provides many rationalizations for improper behavior. Those who would live faithful Christian lives must not be "ignorant of his devices" (II Cor. 2:11). Wrongdoing is always wrong despite our efforts to excuse or actions.

Wrong is wrong even if you don't get caught. Let us remember that "the eyes of the Lord are in every place, beholding the evil and the good" (Prov. 15:3).

Wrong is wrong even if you do it for a good cause. The honorable purpose does not justify a dishonorable deed or action. The end never does justify the means. "...for sin is transgression of the law" (I John 3:4; 5:17; II John 9).

Wrong is wrong even if others are doing worse things. It will be little comfort to you in the day of judgement, if you should be lost, that others you knew did things which you considered to be worse than your own sins.

Wrong is wrong even if it doesn't bother your conscience. The conscience can be trained or educated to accept wrongdoing, but even an honest sin or evil done in sincerity is sinful in the sight of a holy God. "... whatever a man soweth, that shall he also reap" (Gal. 6:7).


Wrong is wrong even if it is commonly considered acceptable. The Bible says, "Thou shalt not follow after a multitude to do evil" (Ex. 23:2). The Christian should enter not into the path of the wicked and go not in the way of evil man. "Avoid it, pass not by it, turn from it, and pass away" (Prov. 4:14-15). "Prove all things, hold fast that which is good. Abstain from the appearance of evil" (I Thess. 5:21-22).







By Thy Words...


Jesus taught, as we noticed in last Sunday's lesson, "For by thy words thou shalt be justified, and by thy words thou shalt be condemned." (Matt. 12:37). What we say and how we say it is important! Teachers are sternly warned by James, "Be not many of you teachers, my brethren, knowing that we shall receive heavier judgement." (Jas. 3:1). Teacher's have to be especially careful that what they are saying is, in fact, the truth, else they can be expect to be judged by God as leading others astray. However, I am fully persuaded that there is much in this for


the average person in the pew. As we all realize that the tongue has great benefit for encouraging those who are down and out, it also has an equally effective negative consequence on those who talk against that which is good and proper. Would you consider a few of the following points:

(1) If you start to speak against something, ask yourself the question, "Why?" Are you opposing something because you feel that it is against God's will. If so, be willing to give book, chapter, and verse. If you feel that an expedient was ill chosen, be willing to give a positive alternative to fulfill the need. If you are against something just because you don't like it, then be quiet. Nothing is more frustrating than being in a position of authority and constantly hearing from every side. "I just don't like the way you are doing things." Many a good leader has fallen from just such idle talk.

(2) If you speak against something, make sure you use the right tone and words. Certainly there are those who would say that it doesn't matter how you say it but it must just be truth. That is not so! If it is our purpose to change the lives of men for the better, then we must use common sense. Solomon said, A soft answer turneth away wrath: but grievous words stir up anger. The tongue of the wise useth knowledge aright: but the mouth of fools poureth out foolishness." (Prov. 15:1,2). So often we have to eat our words, so we had better make them palatable. We often are ignorant of things which the leaders are not. Let us learn how to speak so others will listen and that good can come. We should speak as those who will be judged by God for what and how we speak!






## Right Attitudes Precede Right Actions

Many wonder why it is that their lives are not more spiritually oriented and why it is that their lives are not more in accordance with what the Bible teaches. Perhaps it is the case that we have been approaching the problem from the wrong perspective. Jesus taught, ...for out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaketh. The good man out of his good treasure bringeth forth good things: and the evil man out of his evil treasure bringeth forth evil things. (Matt. 12:34b, 35). In similar fashion, Solomon taught, For as he thinketh within himself, so is he... (Prov. 23:7).

Too many do not realize that they are treating a symptom and not the problem. If sinful behavior is a part of one's life, the correct response to change one's thinking about that sin. This is what is involved in the biblical teaching on repentance. We have a change in will that results in a change in action. Such is the explanation of what David meant when he said, *Through thy precepts I get understanding: Therefore I hate every false way.* (Ps. 119:104). Such is also the reason for the admonition of Paul to the Romans, *Abhor that which is evil; cleave to that which is good* (Rom. 12:9). One must learn to despise the sin which will condemn his soul to hell. Hence, if one expects to change direction in his life, he will have to make a change in his heart. For, a change in action requires a change in attitude.





Many of you have asked me to write something about gambling and *why* it is wrong. Certainly this is important! If gambling is not wrong, then we have no right to oppose it. However, if it is wrong, not only must we not participate, but must do as Paul instructs, *"Have no fellowship with the untruitful works of darkness, but rather even reprove them."* (Eph. 5:11). This means that it also become our responsibility to show sin to be sin.

We must stress that God teaches man through principles and that not every thing which violates God's word is explicitly stated. All of us recognize the sinfulness of taking mind-altering drugs but the Bible does not say, "Thou shalt not use cocaine." How is it then that we determine what God does and does not want us to do? We must look objectively at any given action and then see if it violates any of the principles of God's Word. I believe and know that gambling does! Consider the following:

1. Gambling violates the work ethic given in the Bible. Man is to work and gain his support by his own labor and it is wrong to live at the expense of others labor (c.f. II Thess. 3:10-12).

2. Gambling violates the principle of loving one's neighbor. In James 5:1-4, those who are rich are severely condemned because they fleece the possessions of others by exploitation. Those who operate gambling prey upon those who can afford to lose their possessions the least. The rich get richer and the poor get poorer! No device of gambling is set to lose its owner/operator money. They take advantage of the ignorance of the poor. They know time and chance happen (Ecc. 9:11,12) but they also know the odds. And, the odds are always in their favor! However, regardless of poor or rich, gambling is the gaining at the expense of one's neighbor.

3. Gambling is wrong because it violates the principle of good stewardship. Everything we call our own belongs to God (Ps. 24:1; 50:10-12). When we take that which does not belong to us and foolishly risk it, we do not serve our Master!

4. Gambling is wrong because it has the appearance of evil which a Christian

is to abstain from (I Thess. 5:22). If anyone doubts this, then why are "vice" officiers assigned to stop it?

5. Perhaps the easiest way to show that gambling is wrong is to notice its intent. Why would one want to gamble? To gain that which belongs to another. To have this desire is what the Bible calls "covetousness." Covetousness is a sin which can cause a brother to be withdrawn from (I Cor. 5:9-11). At the heart of gambling is the "love of money" which is strictly forbidden (I Tim. 6:10). Gambling has no good intentions!

Much more could be said, and many of these passages could be expounded upon, but I know that reasonable minds can accept such as a clear indication that gambling (in any form) is wrong.

Are You Getting Too Busy to Serve the Lord?

It seems that all of us think that our lives are getting faster and faster and that we have no time for anything. We think that we have so much to do and such a short time to accomplish it that


we must start letting some things go. I am certainly one to talk. It seems as if there are not enough hours to get everything that must be done. Just what is the solution, and how does this relate to serving the Lord?

First of all, we must realize that there is a limit to what one may accomplish. There are only so many hours in a day, and a wise man will not over-extend himself. One only harms himself when he promises what he cannot deliver. He causes others to loose confidence in himself and bring frustration in his own life.

Second, one must learn to give things of greater importance more priority in their lives. God demands first place! (Matt. 6:33; Rev. 2:4,5). While there are many things which are important, as Jesus taught, *one thing is needful* (Lk. 10:42). Whether it be our money, our time, or whatever, the Lord must come first. If this were consistently practiced, preachers could cease the endless begging for people to stay for Bible Classes, and return for the Sunday Evening and Wednesday Evening services. People would have already made room for these in their plans.

Many of us are confronted each day with feeling that we cannot get everything we need to do done. And, in the process we are allowing the Lord and His service to get cheated. Perhaps we need to sit down and take spiritual inventory of our lives and see if we are giving our best or our leftovers to the Lord. If you want to know how the Lord feels about receiving our left-overs, just read the book of Malachi. 





In the Bible, the word blessed denotes happiness, and the word occurs numerous times. Just consider how a few of these and the real happiness that comes there from:

1. Blessed is he whose transgression is forgiven whose sin is covered. (Ps. 32:1). David knew the anguish of carrying the guilt of sin and also knew that if he did not have such guilt he would be much happier. Christians are, or at least should be, the happiest people on earth since their sins are forgiven!





A little second grade boy started out in the morning by


falling from the school bus and hitting his head on the concrete, requiring three stitches to close the gash.







#### From the Preacher's Desk

#### Do You Pout?

The Lord knows that we all get down in the dumps every once in a while. We often feel that we have been unfairly treated in the game of life and we draw ourselves off in a corner and snarl at everyone who looks the wrong way at us. But, did you know that the Bible deals with people who were pouters? Consider what the Bible says about these people and then ask yourself the question if you should be a pouter.

First of all. let us consider the bad examples. Old King Ahab, the king of Israel, was a big pouter. In I Kings 21:1-16 we have the story of his desiring to purchase the vineyard of Naboth. When he could not persuade him to sell or trade it, he run to his bed and started pouting. His wife then went to drastic measures, she had Naboth falsely accused and stoned, leaving his vineyard open for Ahab. Not much better was Elijah, the prophet. In I Kings 18, Elijah had shown up all of the false prophets, and as a result. Jezebel ordered his death. In I Kings 19:14, Elijah sulls up and starts pouting to God! God quickly reminds Elijah that he is not the only faithful person to God. Neither one of these had any reason to pout. Ahab had more than his heart could desire, and Elijah had the protection of the Almighty. Yet, they pouted.


Next, let us look at some good examples. Job was a man who had been blessed in many ways. However, God put Job to the test, and he became one of the most severely stricken men in history. He lost all of his children, his wealth, and even his health. But Job did not give in to his own doubts by charging God foolishly (1:22), nor to the discouragement of his wife (2:9.10), or even to the so-called friends who came to bemoan him (2:11). The one who we would most likely understand his pouting, refused to do sol Consider also the suffering of Paul. The Lord sent a "thorn in the flesh" to buffet Paul. There is no doubt of the suffering and hurt which it caused him, for he besought the Lord three times to remove it (II Cor. 12:7-10). Instead of letting it get him down, Paul said that he would rejoice in his weaknesses. What an attitude! Paul was not interested in pouting. What good would it have done anyway?

As Christians do we have a right to pout? We are of all men most blessed. What if someone has mistreated us? Will our pouting change that? Will our pouting solve our problems? Will it make us feel any better? Look at the Bible, the ones who trusted God had too much to be thankful for to drown in selfpity. What about you?


# Getting Back To School...


# Excellent Teachers...





## **Did You Gamble?**





#### TWO DECADES OF SEX EDUCATION - THE FRUIT

In 1969, we printed an article in the Christian Courier (taken from a secular journal) which discussed the recent introduction of sex education into the American school system. At that time, as sexual problems among our youth were beginning to escalate, "education" was touted as the panacea for all our woes. "Just give the kids the facts" we were told, "and they will make informed decisions." Some authorities, however, strongly disputed this claim. They pointed out that giving youngsters sexual information -- without also providing a moral base for the proper exercise of sexuality -- was like teaching a youth how to load and fire a gun without the necessary instruction in the moral use of a firearm. It was also noted that Sweden, for example, had promoted sex education in its school systems (covering ages six through sixteen) since 1956, and that after more than a decade of that experiment, the country was almost in a state of teenage "sexual hysteria." The King's Physician and more than one hundred other Swedish doctors signed a petition expressing their concern to the government. They suggested that the near-epidemic rate of venereal diseases amongst Swedish youth "appears to be the product of modern education in our schools' sex education program."

Those who do not learn from the mistakes of history are destined to repeat them. Tragically, we are seeing some of the same heart-breaking consequences as a result of America's amoral (in many instances *immoral*) sex education programs. Now, however, with the intense concern over the AIDS plague, some officials are taking another look at our so-called sex education programs.

On January 22, 1987, William J. Bennett, U.S. Secretary of Education, gave a speech at the National Schools Boards Association Meeting. In a powerful presentation Mr. Bennett confessed that our nation's sex education programs over the past couple of decades have been virtually worthless in preventing the acceleration of teenage sexual difficulties. For example, Bennett declared that:

\*More than one-half of America's young people have had sexual intercourse by age 17. \* More than one million teenage girls in the United States become pregnant each year. Of those who give birth, nearly half are not yet 18.

\* Teen pregnancy rates are at or near an all-time high. A 25 percent decline in birth rates between 1970 and 1984 is due to a *doubling* of the abortion rate during that period. More than 400 thousand teenage girls now have abortions each year.

\* Unwed teenage births climbed 200 percent between 1960 and 1980.


\* Forty percent of today's 14-year-old girls will become pregnant by the time they are 19.

In view of these shocking figures, Mr. Bennett concluded that sex education courses clearly have not prevented the problems they were designed to curtail. He quoted Professor Larry Durban of Stanford University who has written: "Decade after decade ... statistics have demonstrated the ineffectiveness of such courses in reducing sexual activity (and) teenage pregnancy..."

The following example, taken from a curriculum guide used in one of the nation's largest school systems, helps to illustrate the nature of the problem. A situation is presented to the class in which an unmarried teenage girl becomes pregnant. Various people in her life recommend that she: (a) marry the baby's father and raise the child; (b) give birth and adopt the child out, or, (c) get an abortion. The class is asked: "Which solution do you like best? Which do you like least? What would you do under a similar circumstance?" The teacher is then instructed to help the student feel "comfortable" with whatever choice she makes in such matters.

It is just this type of nonsense to which our children are being daily exposed in the public school systems. It is thus absolutely imperative that Christian parents assume their rightful responsibility in teaching their children the fundamental facts of human sexuality -- within the context of New Testament morality. We must stress that sexual activity outside of marriage is sinful. We must insist that abortion is a moral atrocity. We cannot leave this duty in the hands of pagans who have no more than a brutish sense of ethics. WJ





#### "Our father..."


What is your view of God? It is likely to be influenced by your view of your earthly father. Since the Bible often portrays God as our heavenly Father, then we often associate that with our impressions of our earthly fathers. This can be a distinct advantage for us because generally our earthly fathers show the greatest amounts of care and compassion to us, their children. As Jesus illustrated in Matthew 7:7-11, earthly fathers know how to give good gifts to their children who ask. Likewise, the father of the prodigal son rejoiced to see his wayward son return.

In spite of the advantages of our making comparisons between earthly fathers and our heavenly Father, we must be extremely careful that we do not associate the bad elements of the earthly with the heavenly. God is perfect! He is not beset with the moods of temperment which many earthly fathers have. To put it simply, at best earthly fathers do have problems with selfishness, tempers, harsh and inconsistent discipline. And, to those who have had particularly bad fathers there is the difficulty to get them to see that their heavenly Father loves and cares for them. Hence, it is important for us to stress that God is not man. Hosea stresses the nature of God is above that of man in 11:1-12. He recorded in verse 9, "I will not execute the fierceness of mine anger, I will not return to destroy Ephraim: For I am God, and not man; the Holy One in the midst of thee; and I will not come in wrath." God

When we think of God, let us remember that, like our own earthly fathers. He cares for us and will provide for our needs if we will but ask Him.









#### We Couldn't Believe A Gospel Preacher Said It!

Just a short time ago, in defending the practice of avoiding negative preaching, a gospel preacher actually said that Paul, to the Corinthians, never "called names." Worse, he said that in most of Paul's letters, "he didn't talk specifically abouth their sins at all!" This preacher then comforted himself that if some accused him of being "soft on sin," he was just like Paul.


I can hardly believe my eyes! The first Corinthian letter is a scathing rebuke of specific sins of division (I Cor. 1:10), envy and strife (3:3), immorality (5:1), lawsuits (6:1), misbehavior at the Table (11:23ff), denial of the resurrection (15:12), etc. Again, PAUL DID NOT TALK SPECIFICALLY ABOUT THEIR SINS????

This preacher cannot build a case on Paul not calling names, not on one epistle alone, for Paul called these by name: Hymeneus and Alexander, who made shipwreck of the faith (I Tim. 1:19,20).; Phygellus and Hemogenes, who turned away from him in his time of need (II Tim. 1:15); Demas, who loved the world and left him (II Tim. 4:10); and Alexander the coppersmith, who did him much evil (II Tim. 4:14).

To what has a gospel preacher been giving his time and mid, that he would state that Paul never "called names," and never spoke specifically about the sins of those whom he addressed???? We do not know what, but we know WHAT NOT——NOT THE NEW TESTAMENT!




The preacher said he kept the book for 40 years, opened it probably a thousand times, and never wrote a line in it.







#### Do You Know What "Lasciviousness" Means?

I am a particular fan of word studies. I like to know where a word has its origin. I like to know what kind of things a word would involve. For one such as myself, the New Testament is a literal gold mine of rich studies. A few years ago, I took the time to study the sins which Paul lists in his epistles. A word which appears often but which is seldom understood is the word "Lasciviousness." This word is defined by Thayer as: *"unbridled lust, excess, licentiousness, laciviousness, wanton (acts or) manners, as filthy words, indecent bodily movements, unchaste handing of males and females, etc."* (Greek-English Lexicon, pp. 79,80). It is a word which describes one who has contempt for common decency. It is a flaunting of shamelessness. Certainly one could say that much of what goes on in our modern society could be described by this biblical word. All of the New Testament occurances are: Mk. 7:22; Rom. 13:13; II Cor. 12:21; Gal. 5:19; Eph. 4:19; I Pet. 4:2; II Pet. 2:7,18; and Jude 4.







#### And Such Were Some Of You...


In the news recently has been the past indiscretions (sins) of several of the political candidates and one Supreme Court nominee. Lest someone misunderstand, this article has nothing to say one way or another on any political candidate or office holder of any kind. What is important in this article is to make the point that though we may not have sinned in the like manner of many of these, we all have sinned (cf. Rom. 5:12-14). To the Corinthians Paul wrote: "Or know ye not that the unrighteous shall not inherit the kingdom of God? Be not deceived: neither fornicators, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor effeminate, nor abusers of themselves with men, nor thieves, nor covetous, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor extortioners, shall inherit the kingdom of God. And such were some of you: but ye were washed, but ye were sanctified, but ye were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, and in the Spirit of our God." (II Cor. 6:9-11).

What is the point? "...all have sinned, and fall short of the glory of God;" (Rom. 3:23). Everyone has what may be called "skeletons in his closet." Truly some people's sins may appear more severe or "greater" than another's. but sin is sin! What is more important is what has a person done with his sins. Has he tried to cover them up? If so, he will not prosper (Prov. 28:13). Solomon says that he must "confess and forsake" to obtain mercy. If he has repented of them, and made it right with God (either by being baptized for the remission of his sins, Acts 2:38, or by praying for His forgiveness, Acts 8:22, depending on whether or not he is a Christian), then they are to be remembered against him no more (cf. Heb. 10:17). Should the Christians at Corinth have been considered second class Christians? Not at all. They were washed. They were sanctified, set apart for the Lord's use. The were justified, that is they were holy in God's sight.

When we hear about the errors of one's past we must be careful to ask, "Has this person changed?" "Is his life any different now?" If we feel that we must hold a person's past against him regardless, then let such a one consider again that "such were some of you."

Sympathy



The vast majority of the religious world proclaims to believe that faith alone is enough to save the soul. Is this correct? If it is, then we are being too narrow in our fellowship. If it is wrong, then we should be more enthusiastic in getting the truth to them. Let us consider what the Bible has to say.

First, the Bible makes it clear that faith alone is insufficient. In fact, the only time that the words "faith" and "alone" appear together it is described as "DEAD." "Even so faith, if it hath not works, is dead, being alone." (Jas. 2:17). Also, we learn of several who believed but did not love the Lord enough: "Nevertheless among the chief rulers also many believed on him; but because of the Pharisees they did not confess him, lest they should be put out of the synagogue: For they loved the praise of men more than the praise of God." (Jn. 12:42,43).

Second, those passages which teach that a man is saved by faith in God (e.g. Jn. 3:16; Acts 16:30,31, et. al.) are passages which include the idea of a full, obedient faith. In these passages faith is used as a synecdoche, a figure of speech in which the part is put for the whole. It is as in Jude



What Do You Think Would Improve Sunday Night Attendance?






#### Faith Alone-Can It Save, continued...



All who can are asked to stay after services in December 16, to help prepare the fruit baskets which we prepare every year for the holiday season.






Our New Mission Family Daniel, Anne, Sarah, & Mary Emily Ridinger




#### "20 Years" Contribution Averages
