



Do you see difficulties in every opportunity or opportunities in every difficulty?

Can You Recommend Your Religion?



Quite often we find ourselves confronted with a question like this: "I am thinking about buying a car, can you recommend your car?" There are any number of similar questions which could be posed. I am frequently asked if I like my type of computer and would I recommend it to them. The important question is, "Can you recommend your religion?"

What makes something worthy of recommendation? Generally it is how well it serves us. If a car has given us good service with very little upkeep then we usually happy with it and can recommend it to

others. If we have unusually good service and perhaps other fringe benefits such as good gas mileage, then we often will give it an enthusiastic recommendation. On the other hand, if we get a lemon of a car, and we find ourselves constantly carrying it into the shop, then we often will say to those asking, "No, I can't recommend it, and furthermore, I would not purchase another myself."

Paul knew what kind of product he was dealing with. "...for I know him whom I have believed, and I am persuaded that he is able to guard that which I have committed unto him against that day." (II Tim. 1:12). This confidence led Paul to recommend his religion to everyone. To Agrippa, Paul said, "I would to God, that whether with little or with much, not thou only, but also all that hear me this day, might become such as I am, except these bonds." Paul knew the value of his religion. He knew what it had and would do for him.

The question now is "Can you recommend your religion?" Evidently some could not. They find many things more important, recreation, television, rest, etc. The person who is sold on his religion will be one who will not only enjoy the privileges of it himself, but will want to convince others of its benefits. Paul said to those Ephesian Elders "And now I commend you to God, and to the word of his grace, which is able to build you up, andto give you the inheritance among all them that are sanctified." (Acts 20:32).



Christianity And Status

In our society we are prone to want to associate and judge people by whether they are a part of our little group or not. In Bible times this was noted by whether or not one was an orthodox Jew or a lowly Gentile. More often than not, in our society, we find members of the church who are often divided from each other on the wrong grounds. We clearly cannot associate ourselves with evil, and when called for, we must withdraw ourselves from every brother that walks disorderly (II Thess. 3:6). However, it does not take one long to realize that there is a real gap between many in the church. There appears at one time to be a distinctions made between the black and white brethren, the educated and uneducated, the old and the young, and increasingly those of different class levels.

Jesus taught that a man was not to judge according to appearance but to judge "righteous judgment." (Jn. 7:24). Paul upbraided the Corinthians when he asked, "Do you look at things according to the outward appearance?" (II Cor. 10:7 NKJV). You see, too many are looking at the outward manifestations of a person, his ability to put subjects and verbs together correct, the "style" of his clothes, the job that he holds. And, from these manifestations there exists "classes" in the church. We only harm ourselves when we deprive ourselves from association with these great people. I have found some of the most deeply spiritual people are those from the most humble of backgrounds.

Some may reason that this is nothing more than those of like interests gathering together to enjoy one another's company. But, what is today's mutual interests becomes tomorrow's class distinctions.

As ones studies through the Bible, Jesus was often rebuked for eating with sinners (Matt. 9:10-13; Mk. 2:15-17; Lk. 5:29-32). He let them know of his love for all souls. Peter was rebuked at Antioch for failing to eat with the Gentiles and for playing a hypocrite (Gal. 2:11ff). What does all of this mean? There is no place for "status" in the church. We were all baptized into the same body (I Cor. 12:13) and there is no place for distinction (Gal. 3:28).



"I'll Bet You That Gambling Is Wrong"

I once read the above title on a notice advertising a youth meeting. The humour in it caught my eye. (Read it again.) There is a great truth expressed in the simple statement "Gambling is wrong." Gambling is nearly as old as man upon this earth. It has been found in one form or another in almost every society from the very earliest of times. Throughout the history of Christianity God-fearing men and women have strongly opposed every form of gambling on moral and Scriptural grounds.

While there is no specific statement in the Bible saying, "Thou shalt not gamble," sincere Bible students recognize that a number of Biblical principles are violated by gambling. The sin of covetousness is the very basis of gambling (Col. 3:5). Gambling caters to the desire to "get rich quickly" and with a minimum of effort and investment. It circumvents God's will that every man labour, working with his hands the thing which is good, that he may have to give to him that needeth." (Eph. 4:28). Gambling appeals to man's selfishness and greed. It is the opposite of love and the golden rule (Rom. 13:10; Matt. 7:12). It is a desire to get that which belongs to another without giving just recompense.

Just as evil companionships corrupt good morals (I Cor. 15:33), the evil of gambling can be seen in the company that it keeps. Statistics are available (I have a thick folder of them in my files) to show that gambling contributes to crime, liquor consumption (with all of its attendant evils), the break-up of marriages, and suicide.

What then should be the Christian's attitude toward gambling? Not many (hopefully none) of us will go to West Point Casino for a night of gambling or bet on the horse races. But what about gambling on a small scale such as buying a lottery or raffle ticket in a fund rasing drive for some worthy cause? What is the Christian to do? Support the the cause by buying a ticket and thus participate in gambling? Or refuse to buy a ticket and thereby decline to help a needy cause?

The end never justifies the means! "Shall we do evil that good may come?" (Rom, 3:8). The Christian's answer must be a resounding "God Forbid!" Gambling is either right or wrong! If it is wrong (and we have already shown it is), then it is just as sinful to gamble for a \$5 prize as it is to gamble for thousands of dollars at the casino.


Whenever I am asked to buy a raffle ticket for a worthy cause, I kindly refuse. However, I will make a direct contribution to the cause, ask for a receipt, thereby helping the good cause without violating Christian principles, and, as a "fringe" benefit, receive another deduction for my income tax.

Let us remember, brethren, that we are different from the world and must not compromise with its vices, whether great or small. "But ye are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an hold nation, a peculiar people; that ye should show forth the praises of him who hath called you out of darkness into his marvelous light." (I Pet. 2:9).

The New Hermeneutic (Part 1)

Some of you may have heard of *The New Hermeneutic* and wonder just exactly what is meant. This descriptive title has been batted around quite a bit of late and needs to be dealt with. In this article and those which will follow, we will attempt to define the subject and deal with it and its implications.

First of all, the word "hermeneutics" is defined as "the science of interpretation." (*Hermeneutics*, D.R. Dungan, p. 1). In a more practical way, it refers to the work of interpreting, understanding and applying of the Bible. When one says that he has a "new hermeneutic," he is saying that he has arrived at a new approach in interpreting, understanding and applying the Bible. One will understand how crucial of and issue this is when he understands that this subject directly affects what one *does* in the name of religion. And, it will be shown that the likely reason for those who argue for a "new hermeneutic" is to change what our *practice* has been.

The source or propagation of this new approach has been those of the higher academic community, that is, those in universities and graduate schools. It appears that many of them, while having attained advanced degrees remain ignorant or have forgotten the history of the restoration movement, and more importantly, the clear teachings of the Bible. They are noted by a super-critical of view of our past.

Briefly stated, the proponents of this view have some consistent tenets:

- 1. There is no "pattern" in the Bible which Christians must follow. Specifically, the examples which we find in scripture are not "binding." They would argue that these events described in the Bible reflect only a "cultural" situation. This approach will drastically affect things like the partaking of the Lord's Supper, role of women in the church, church organization, etc.
- 2. The silence of the Scriptures are not exclusive. It is contended that since the Bible is a "love letter" and not a constitution, then what is left out does not prohibit. This approach affects things like the use of instrumental music and other things.
- 3. There is a rejection of logic and reason. It is contended that only explicit statements in scripture can be binding. It is surprising that they never give the *explicit statement* that says that only explicit statements are binding.

In the next article, we will attempt to look at some of their justification for their views and some of their statements. We encourage you to *prove all things; hold fast that which is good (I Thess. 5:21).*

The New Hermeneutic (Part 2)

In the last article we began a consideration of *The New Hermeneutic*. At that time we tried to define just exactly what we were talking about. In this installment, we want to be a little more specific, to know *why* the subject has come up and consider some of what they are saying.


It is clear that many who advocate *The New Hermeneutic* must have an ulterior motive. This is not judging their motives, it is apparent from what they say. Those who hold these views are concerned primarily with unity and acceptance. They reject the "old hermeneutic" because it does not allow for them to be in fellowship with a number of people. It appears that there are three specific areas which they are concerned with: the allowance for those who want to use instrumental music, an expanded role for women in the church, acceptance as "Christians" for those involved in denominational churches. They know that our current approach to the Bible will not allow for such, and as a result they search for a new hermeneutic. This approach should be suspect on the very surface. It puts the proverbial "cart before the horse." We should never decide what we want to do then to try to find justification for it in the Bible. Rather, we should determine what God wants us to do and then conform our lives to that. Else, God's Word is not having "free course" in our lives (II Thess. 3:1 KJV).

As we outlined in our last installment, the first proposition in their new hermeneutic is to reject the Bible as a pattern. More specifically, they do not see examples in the things which the early church did, but only see them as expressions of their cultural situation. It should be obvious that one must consider how the Bible expects its readers to approach it in determining whether there is a pattern and whether or not examples are binding. It is to this point which we want to address ourselves now. The idea of a pattern is quite obvious in the Bible, and perhaps nowhere move obvious than in the book of Hebrews. The writer stresses that Moses was told "See, saith he, that thou make all things according to the pattern that was showed thee in the mount." (Heb. 8:5). It is the contention of some of the New Hermeneutic that this is only a part of the legalistic Old Testament system. Look closer. Why does the Hebrew writer make this point? It is because, Jesus is a High Priest over a new covenant. And, more significantly, the pattern from which the Old Testament tabernacle was taken was that of the true tabernacle (cf. Heb. 9:11, 23,24). What this says is what Paul stated explicitly to the Corinthians "for God is not a God of confusion, but of peace." (I Cor. 14:33). God does not preside over a haphazard or disorganized system. Instead, God operates with order and precision. Consider further that the when we obey the Gospel that Paul said: "But thanks be to God, that, whereas ye were servants of sin, ye became obedient from the heart to that form (pattern ASV margin) of teaching whereunto yet were delivered. Paul stated that we have examples which we are to learn from (I Cor. 10:6,11; Phil. 3:7; II Thess. 3:9). Contrary to what some would advocate, the Bible still says, "For hereunto were ye called: because Christ also suffered for you, leaven you and example that ye should follow in his steps." (I Pet. 2:21).

1. 第二章

"The New Hermeneutic" (Part 8)

In the last two installments we have attempted to deal with identifying the essential elements of this doctrine known as the "New Hermeneutic" and to put its teachings to the test. In the last installment we noted that it was incorrect in its rejection of the Bible as a pattern, for the Bible sets itself forth as a pattern. In this installment, we will consider the issue of silence. It is recognized at the outset that a brief column is insufficient to controvert the position of the "New Hermeneutic."

The matter of silence is significant that some would appreciate. If it is the case that silence is permissive, then one would befree to do anything not specificially forbidden. Coupled with the fact that those who hold to the "New Hermeneutic" also hold that examples are not binding and implications are not compulsory, then in reality one could do as he pleases, for there would be no passage which would say, "you _____ cannot do this."

The advocates of the "New Hermeneutic" say that the Bible should not be viewed as a constitution, but more as a love letter. The real question is, "How does the Bible itself expect its teachings to be taken?" One example will suffice. In Hebrews 7:12-14, the writer argues, "For the priesthood being changed, there is made of necessity a change also of the law. For he of whom these things are said belongeth to another tribe, for which no man hath given attendance at the altar. For it is evident that our Lord hath sprung out of Judah; as to which tribe Moses spake nothing concerning priest." It is abundantly clear that the Hebrew writer understood that silence of Moses on the matter of the priesthood was prohibitive, to the extent that for Jesus to

serve as a priest would require a change of the law!

It has been said long ago, "the Bible is its own best interpreter. This is certainly true! More will follow next week...

"The New Hermeneutic" (Part 4)

As to this fourth installment, it will be our purpose to deal with the "New HERMENEUTIC" and its rejection of logic and reason. In previous installments we have noticed that the other elements of this position involve a rejection of the Bible as a pattern, which mean that they believe that there are no "examples" in the Bible which are binding, and that the silence of the Bible is not prohibitive and exclusive. In both cases we let the Bible speak for itself. God does expect us to follow the examples of the Bible, and God does expect us to respect His silence on a matter. In this installment, we want to approach the subject in a similar manner.

One of the elements of our interpreting the Bible has been stated as "necessary inference." In other words, if God has implied that we must or must not do a given thing, then we say that the authority comes from a necessary inference. Some of those who argue that this should not be done appeal to Thomas Campbell's Declaration And Address (p. 61, in appendix), "Thus we reason, thus we conclude, to make no conclusion of our own, nor of any other fallible fellow-creature, a rule of faith or duty to our brother." A very simple question—what about this conclusion? Is it to be bound? It appears truly that the legs of the lame are not equal! When reason and logic suit the needs of those who argue, then it is at their disposal, but when it does not suit their needs, then certainly it could not be binding. You see, those who argue for the "New HERMENEUTIC" know that to even make a point they have to rely on reason and logic, yet, they must disparage and mock it lest they position be devastated!

To the humble servant of the Word, there is no doubt but that God expected for His children to be reasonable people (I Thess. 5:21; Acts 17:11; I Jn. 4:1; Rom. 12:1,2). If one were not able to draw a necessary inference, how would he ever learn the plan of salvation? The advocates of the "New Hermeneutic would be opposed to the suggestion that their is a "plan" of salvation. *More next week...*

History of Brother Pradit Gamannee

Born at Thuem village, Ban Phu district, Udornthani. Born 20 November 1953. Fathter name is Pung, and mother's name is Chu. They were divorced and I lived with my grandmother on my mother's side. My father died when I was about 4-5 years of age. I was a rice farmer. I was married when I was 18 years of age to Miss Phan from Ban Nha See, about 3 kilometers (1.8 miles) from Ban Thuem. We had 3 childrend, the first Miss Amnuoi, the second Mr. Somreet, and the third, Mr. Somjit. At their present ages are 17 years, 16 years, and 14 years. I have studied through the 4th grade in school. In 1979, I went to study the Bible at the church of Christ in Udornthani. I finished after two years of study and went to work with the Bible school in NongKhai being there for 1 year 8 months. Then I moved to work with the Bible School. I was there 1 year, 1 month. I then went to open the new work in Srisaket province. I was there beginning November 1985, but the word did not start until about

March 1986. I had to move there to get my children into school. I am presently 37 years of age and my wife, Phan, is also 37 years of age. I have been working in Srisaket for about 5 years now. On the 21st of February 1989, I took in an orphan boy. The mother had died at the hospital and the father had cast the children off and left to other province. I heard about this boy and brought him into my home. We have received help from the Bybee Branch church in providing for food and other items. My daughter is not going to school now, so she can help raise the boy. The boy's name is David, but the authorities have given him the name of Prasit. David is now 1 year, 2 months old. We are all living at the preacher's house at the Bible school property. The other family that helps in the work is Ganya Sankhasaht. While working at Srisaket, it has been very difficult because this province is one of the poorest in Thailand. Most of the people are interested in making a living. It has gotten a little better now. Also, most of the poor people will have their children to go to Bangkok to work in the factories. Therefore, it is difficult to win souls and to bring men in for Bible study. But, I thank God that I can give God all my energies and abilities and be full in the heart. I want to thank God and the brethren at Bybee Branch for being able to be a servant to God and a preacher of the gospel. It is a work that is pure and holy before God. Before, when I had not obeyed the gospel, I and my family were very poor, but when I became a Christian God has lifted us up and strengthened us according to his Word in I Cor. 1:26-28. I want to thank God, thank the brethren at Bybee Branch and brother Ted for the time to be a servant of God, now about 10 years. There is no way for me to express the grace of God and the good things that have happened to me and my family. We pray that we may do the best we can do in the work of the Lord. This is the history of my life. May the brethren at Bybee Branch be blessed greatly be responsible for the work that has been given us. Amen!



History of Brother Ganya Sangkhasaht

I was born in the heart of the ricefields and jungle. I studied thru grade 4. When I was 14 years of age my mother and father sent me to the temple to study Buddhism and be a monk for 1 year. This was according to the traditions of the people. When I came out of the monkhood, I ran around with a group of young men doing all kinds of things. We would work and play from one province to another.

At the age of 27 years, my mother and father gave me in marriage so I would stop running around. I had also had some study in the First Aid and health care work. Later, the villagers make me the village "doctor." I went to visit and study at the province hospital and



other provinces. I received a certificate for the completion of studies from the Health Department. I studied about the affliction of diseases and the punishment of drinking whiskey and smoking. Therefore I had stopped doing these things about 10 years before becoming a Christian.

I also studied with the Village Development project and received a certificate from the Ministry of Interior. I went to view many of the development project in many provinces. I came to study the Bible at the age of 44 years. I finished 2 years of Bible study. I learned much truth and went to teach my wife and family and brought them to Christ. I have 7 in the family, 5 of them children. After finishing 2 years of Bible, I was going to move to make a living in LamPang province in north. I went to survey the land in the north and found it good to plan and sell fruit. I went up there to have the area planted with vegetables and fruit. Upon coming back to Srisaket brother Pradit asked me to help in preaching and teaching the gospel there. At first I did not think I would do so, but then again I decided to do so because of what Christ had done for me. I have come to preach the gospel of Christ, even though it is very difficult and must have lot of patience. And, then money is not enough, but must be patient because God loved us first and gives everything to us in the world. I am presently 48 years of age.



I Don't Know How To Invite My Friend To Worship

It's very possible that a major factor for not inviting my friend to worship is that "I don't know how." For this reason we are going to consider the following suggestions that might help as you make an effort to bring you friend to worship.

First, be positive when you talk to your FRIEND about being your guest for this special day. You need to be convinced that Christ is a needed ingredient in their lives, that HE can change them for the better. You want to be a friend by getting them to know about the Lord and salvation through HIM.

Second, remember that FRIENDS respect and love one another because they want to, not because they have to. It's because of this love that one wishes to share with another, that he will want to share the Lord with them. Let them know that your work in the church and relationship with Christ is important, and they will be more willing to listen because they love and respect you.

Third, explain your motive. Many people resist if they think that they will get a "sales pitch" or just to win you a prize. Let them know that everyone at church is urged to bring their FRIENDS, and that you want them for your FRIEND this day.

Fourth, try to answer any questions they may have before they ask them. When you are on the defensive it is difficult to be positive, so answer as many of their questions as possible BEFORE THEY ASK THEM. Let them know that they will not be embarrassed or asked to do anything publicly that they would not wish to do. You want them to feel completely at ease at worship and not be apprehensive about what might happen to them. Now, having eliminated the negative, let's emphasize the positive.

Fifth, build up their anticipation of the day. Tell them how much you enjoy worshipping in song and prayer, how much you enjoy the spiritual lessons that you receive and the deep sentiment of the Lord's Supper. If they are your FRIENDS, they will wish to share with you the enjoyment that you have, so let them know what a difference Jesus makes in your life. Get them thirsty for the water of life.

There are some people who come along "once in a lifetime." Lee Flatt was one of those men. This past week we gave up one of our dear brothers and a shepherds of the flock. He will truly be missed by all of us.

little multiple cups for communion for the sake of unity. Those are precisely the same kinds of questions. And, anybody who says that multiple cups is different from the instrument only says that because I don't think that he's really being honest with the issues. Forgive me, of course their being honest, but I think that there's a blindness there to the similarity. I think that they are similar."

Another preacher has said: "Now in response to this patternistic formula, I wish to set forth this challenge for all of us to consider. I will present it in the form of a question: What was the hermeneutic of the primitive church? Did they follow a rigid pattern established in Scripture? Ephesians 4:4-6 sets forth the principles of unity for the church. There is one body and one Spirit, just as also you were called in one hope of your calling; one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all who is over all and through all and in all.' Traditionally in the Restoration Movement we have interpreted the 'one faith' to refer to the system of beliefs or doctrines revealed in the 27 books of the New Testament, specifically that system of belief found between Acts and Revelation. But is such an interpretation correct? I do not believe it is."

These quotes given above should certainly emphasize that the church has a tremendous problem on its hands. We have men who are rejecting the pattern of the Word and as a result their practice will catch up with their theory. If this kind of teaching is not stopped you will begin to see and hear of all sorts of strange things from our brethren!

"The New Hermeneutic"

(Part 5)

In the previous installments we have sought to give a brief indication as to what was involved in the *New HermENEUTIC*. This installment will show that the issue is much more crucial than many think. Quotations will be given from some different men who preach in churches of Christ and show that this is not some imagined problem, but is in fact very real. The following quotations are but a sample of what is being taught. No names are attached to any of the quotations, for what is taught is either true or false, regardless of who teaches it.

One preacher has said: "I think that maybe the problem, or at least one of the problems, for our particular group, those of us who call ourselves the Church of Christ, is that we may perhaps be requiring that menfollow patterns which are not outin-out in conflict with scripture, they are in wonderful harmony with scripture—most of the time. It is just that we have required that men sometimes ascribe to these patterns and these philosophies, which while they are not out of harmony with scripture, the scripture doesn't say that everybody has to follow these patterns and these guidelines. One of the major questions, or major approaches that is so common in our fellowship or our particular group is a perspective of looking at the scriptures. Is our pattern or our plan of biblical exegesis—how do you know what the Bible really says to do when you go to the Bible? Do we have a little pattern or little form? It is called—well, we know it by three ways: by command, by example, by necessary inference. If it commands it, you do it. If you find an example of it in Scripture, then that's binding upon you. If its necessarily inferred by Scripture, then that's also binding upon you. At least that's been the perspective of the Churches of Christ for about a century or more. And, I think that's one of the reasons why perhaps we are so divided today. And, I subscribe whole-heartedly, one-hundred percent, to that idea of whatever the Bible commands we are to do. But, when it comes to the concept of finding out what we are supposed to do by those other two avenues, by example and by necessary inference, I didn't buy that. It doesn't work. There isn't a Church of Christ anywhere who's consistent with that philosophy."

Another has said: "Many... have bought into a view of Scripture as the seamless depository of Revelation which functions as the basic blueprint for the entire Christian enterprise. To change the metaphor, Scripture is viewed as a kind of quarry out of which is mined facts, inerrant propositions, or sacred history (take your choice), which are supposed to provide a body of coherent doctrines that, in turn, furnish authoritative answers to our theological quests. If we have a theological issue (the nature of the life hereafter; the office of ministry) we assume that to find the answer we need to have a serious Bible study. That will surely solve the problem because the answer has to be encoded somewhere in the Scriptures; and if the answer does not come our procedure is to study it again—perhaps with a new hermeneutical technique. The truth is that biblical theology cannot distill from the current texts of the Bible a seamless body of doctrine, and no hermeneutical model can find consistent and widespread approval among us for something that is not 'in the text.'"

And consider: "I love the churches of Christ. But, whoever wrote this tract, Can We All Understand The Bible Alike?, and the answer is, of course we can. Forgive me, but that's just an ignorant view. Its just ignorant." "You want our history, lets start. Can you support you support missionaries through a Missionary Society? Absolutely! Absolutely not! Can you worship God with an instrument? Absolutely! Absolutely not!" After discussing some of the different things which have divided the churches of Christ he comes to the division which occurred in the 1950's over church cooperation and institutional support. He further emphasized that those taking the "anti" view oppose having a kitchen in the building. Then he says: "Personal comment. There is no command, example, or inference for a kitchen. And when you the kitchen, if you get honest with your hermeneutic, it begins to get real interesting. I've heard people like, and I love the man Jimmy Jividen, say why don't—why doesn't the Christian Church give up the instrument for the sake of unity? And I think that's a wonderful plea. But I don't hear us rising to the occasion and be willing to give up Sunday School, and institutional support and our







As many of you know, over the past few months we have been attempting to work on a religious census of Warren County. We were assisted in this effort by several of our sister congregations. As a result of these efforts. 8,384 people were contacted regarding their religious preferences. Of that number 3,692 expressed the churches of Christ as their preference. The second largest group was the Baptist churches which numbered 1,934. Surprisingly, the third largest category were those who expressed no religious preference or would not answer. There were representatives from almost every religious group but many were less than 1% of the total and would not show up well in the chart so they were grouped into the miscellaneous category.


And, as a result of these efforts we now have a name, address, and congregational listing for the 3.692 people who stated the churches of Christ as their religious preference. This will give each congregation an ability to contact those claiming that congregation as their preference and encourage them to get active in the work and worship of the church. Ideally, this should result in those who have "fallen by the wayside" to be contacted and then restored back to faithful service. If just one soul is saved through this effort, then all of the time and trouble will have been well worth it all.

There are numerous people who went above and beyond the call of duty in working on this in our congregation. In the initial stages we would not have had the participation if it had not been for the experience and contacts of John Biddle. He was able to get many of the sister congregations to help us. Words cannot express the appreciation to Brenda Bratten for the countless hours that she typed the information into the computer. As always the fine Christian sisters of the Thursday Ladies Bible Class were eager to help and sorted and counted the cards. The work was a cooperative effort and the work of everyone has been deeply appreciated. ~T.L.~





"If The Foundations Be Bestroyed"

The Psalmist wrote, "If the foundations be destroyed, what can the righteous do?" (Ps. 11:3). As we look about us we see organized efforts by prominent people in many walks of life to undermine the foundations of society. They deny the existence of anything resembling right and wrong, and define liberty to be a license to do anything one pleases to do regardless of the effect it may have upon others. With such a philosophy supported to a great degree by our court system, how can we expect to win the war on drugs, or crime, or any other war as far as that is concerned? The answer is that we can't.

It is necessary for us to select a solid foundation and to build upon that in our own lives first. Then we can do what we can to influence others to do the same. The foundations of a self-pleasing society cannot stand, nor can a society built upon such a foundation long endure.

Jesus taught, "Therefore whosoever heareth these sayings of mine, and doeth them, I will liken him unto a wise man, which built his house upon a rock: And the rain descended, and the floods came, and the winds blew, and beat upon that house; and it fell not: for it was founded upon a rock. And everyone that heareth these sayings of mine and doeth them not, shall be likened unto a foolish man, which built his house upon the sand: And the rain descended, and the floods came, and the winds blew, and beat upon that house; and it fell: and great was the fall thereof." (Matt. 7:24-27).

It takes both hearing and doing to build upon that solid foundation. Here Jesus makes it clear that his teaching is that solid rock upon which to build our lives. Upon another occasion Jesus asked his disciples what people thought of him, and various answers were given. Then he asked the disciples for an answer. "And Simon Peter answered and said, Thou art the Christ, the Son of the living God." Jesus commended him for the answer, then said, "And I say also unto thee, That thou art Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church:" (Matt. 16:13-19). Some become confused at this point since "Peter" means "rock" and think that Jesus meant to build upon Peter. But the words are different. Peter means a small pebble, while the rock upon which the church is built is a solid bed-rock. The church is not built upon a "rolling stone," but upon a solid bed-rock. Neither can we build our lives upon some man, not even Peter.

Paul wrote, "For other foundation can no man lay than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ." (I Cor. 3:11). The writer of Hebrews speaks of "a city which hath foundations, who builder and maker is God." (Heb. 11:10). As we look carefully at these Scriptures, we conclude that Jesus is the person upon which we build. In doing so, we build upon the truth that he is the Son of God. Further we build upon his word. It is necessary that we know the teaching of Jesus and do it in order to build.

This foundation is dependent upon God and His Son Jesus Christ. The truth concerning this foundation is an abstract truth, no dependent upon man's belief or rejection. We have not the power to remove these foundations. We have only the power to remove ourselves from these foundations, and head for destruction as a result. We are responsible for hearing, and doing the will of God as revealed by Jesus Christ. To fail to do so is to insure disaster. In doing the will of God, we must lay the foundation not only of faith, but of repentance. (Heb. 6:1). Paul warns the rich against trusting in wealth, but rather in using what they have in good works and so "laying up in store for themselves a good foundation against the time to come, that they may lay hold on eternal life." (I Tim. 6:17-19). We do not have to be rich in this worlds' goods to lay a foundation of good works in obedience to Jesus Christ.

God never promised us a life without pain or problems. Often the Christian will suffer as much as the sinner. But there are two big differences. The first is in the way that we handle the problems of life. We are not alone. God will share the load with us. We can withstand the storms of life with the unbeliever will be destroyed. The second is in the great day of Judgment where the sinner cannot stand. He will be destroyed for all eternity, while the faithful Christian will be given the glories of heaven. It makes a difference what we believe and do. Eternity will reveal that difference.



While we do not want to imitate the example of the hypocrites of Jesus' day and be more concerned with the approval of men than with the approval of God, we must not be indifferent toward the impressions we leave on those who visit the services of the church. Consider these impressions. VISITORS SHOULD FIND FRIENDLINESS. It is most important that visitors feel welcomed. A religious

most important that visitors feel welcomed. A religious survey of visitors who returned revealed that the number one reason prompting their return was "Ifelt accepted." Everyone needs to feel welcomed. Gene Carrell, a Columbus, Ohio minister, wrote about eating in a small northern Ohio town. The locals made him feel unwelcomed by their stares. He does not expect to eat at that place again, because of his negative experiences. True friendliness draws like a magnet whether it be in a place of business, or in an assembly of Christians. Each member of the church needs to feel a personal responsibility for making visitors feel welcomed, wanted. We may need to spend a hitle less time talking with our friends and more time introducing ourselves to strangers. VISITORS EXPECT TO FIND A PEACEFUL

VISITORS EXPECT TO FIND A PEACEFUL CHURCH. Most people covet peaceful situations. Homes, businesses and churches where strive exists repel visitors. The New Testament church in Corinth with all of its division and strife does not appear very appealing. On the other hand, the church in Philippi appears to have been an attractive church with peace and harmony. Developing a peaceful church is a responsibility of every member. Paul admonishes us to "keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace," and "Let us follow the things that make for peace" (Eph. 4:3; Rom. 14:19). 
(Col. 3:15). VISITORS WANT TO FIND A CHURCH THAT POSSESSES LOVE. True love is not hypocritical. Love manifests itself in a number of ways. Jesus called our love for our brethren our badge of discipleship, John 13:35: "By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one to another." Love manifests itself in our concern for lost souls. A loving church will be an evangelistic church. Love reveals itself in reaching out to the less fortunate to assist the fatherless, widow, poor and stranger. A loving church will have an active benevolent work.

Not every group of people calling themselves a church honor God's Word. There is a temptation to teach and preach what pleases man, but this we cannot afford to do. Paul charged Timothy to "Preach the word" and "take heed unto thyself, and unto thy doctrine; continue in them: for in doing this thou shalt both save thyself, and them that hear thee." (II Tim. 4:2; I Tim. 4:16). VISITORS SHOULD FIND A CHURCH WHERE ITS

Ideas For Evangelism That Anyone Can Use

You've heard it before. The preacher got fired up Sunday morning and delivered a stirring sermon on how the church ought to reach out to the lost. It's not that he said anything wrong, after all, everyone knows that the church ought to evangelize. The problem is there wasn't enough of the "how to" in the sermon to help you do much more than normal. Well, here's a list of ideas for evangelism that anyone can use. You might note that most of them don't call for you to do much teaching. Evangelism is a team effort, don't forget that. Do your part and then depend on those who are good teachers and evangelists to help you reach those friends and neighbors. Be positive. When we all work together the church can grow!

1. Invite people to attend Bible class and the assembly on Sunday morning. Here is a tried and true method. Surveys have shown that the most people not in church in America are open to an invitation to attend church services. Be positive about the church. Tell people the ways you are benefiting and growing. If they have children, talk about our Bible classes. People must believe that we have something worthwhile before they will attend, but if they see that you have found something that works, they will likely be open to your invitation. By the way, if they don't come the first time, keep inviting.

2. Invite your friends to attend your next zone fellowship. Most of our zones schedule dinners out, picnics or other times when people can get to know one another. Research into church growth says that most people belong to a church because of the influence of friends or family. Plus, once becoming a member, the more friends a person has within the church, the greater probability they will remain faithful. So, bring people to events where they can meet members of the church and form friendships with them. It just might be the first step to saving the lost.

3. Talk about what you are learning. Whether it is in Bible class or a sermon, if you learn something that proves helpful to you, then share it with others. Find a good point out of a lesson and focus on it. Changes are that if you find something in the Bible that helps you, it will help others as well. The key here is for you to talk about it. Once you have the person's attention, you can then invite them to come study for themselves.

4. When you bring a visitor to the assembly, remember to introduce them to the minister and elders. It eliminates the awkwardness that many people experience in a new situation and it says that you consider your guests to be important. Making sure that your guest meets church leaders helps establish contact so that future visits are much easier on everyone.

5. As much as possible, keep discussion on spiritual things focused on the gospel. Romans 1:16 says that the gospel is God's power to save. A person may have many questions, but Paul said in I Corinthians 15:1-4 that the gospel comes first. Your should always keep the person's mind on Jesus Christ. You will do a good job if you help develop faith in Christ.

6. Believe that doing things such as we have suggested here is important. Evangelism happens and the church grows when members realize how important they are to the process. The job can't be done by a few. Develop the attitude that says, "I can make a difference in someone's eternity."



The Gospel Of Success

Recently in talking with some folks who were not Christians I got the impression that they believe, like many who followed the teachings of Jim & Tammy Baker, that if one were only a faithful Christian then everything in life will be successful and prosperous. If one were only able to live and give to such a degree, the love and grace of God would prevent that person from ever contracting a dreaded disease, losing their job, or having any sort of "reverse" in life. This is what I have often referred to as the "Gospel of Success."

Perhaps many well-meaning Christians have often fostered this idea themselves. For, after all was it not even the faithful King David who said, "I have been young, and now am old; Yet have I not seen the righteous forsaken, nor his seed begging bread." (Ps. 37:25). However, this passage does not deal with the everyday life of the child of God, it was given as instruction not to be envious of evil doers. The message was that God will ultimately judge wicked men and they will not be perpetually successful. On the other hand, those who are righteous will see the deliverance of the Lord. This passage is not promising peace and prosperity on a daily basis.

Consider the fact that some of the most faithful children of God did not enjoy physical prosperity, but rather saw difficult and struggling times. Perhaps one of the clearest examples is that of Lazarus. The Bible description is: "Now there was a certain rich man, and he was clothed in purple and fine linen, faring sumptuously every day: and a certain beggar named Lazarus was laid at his gate, full of sores, and desiring to be fed with the crumbs that fell from the rich man's table; yea, even the dogs came and licked his sores." (Lk. 16:19-21). Certain ones in the book of Hebrews were praised "For ye both had compassion on the that were in bonds, and took joyfully the spoiling of your possessions, knowing that ye have for yourselves a better possession and an abiding one." (Heb. 10:34). The church at Smyrna was addressed: "I know thy tribulation, and thy poverty (but thou art rich), and the blasphemy of them that say they are Jews, and are not, but are a synagogue of Satan. Fear not the things which thou art about to suffer: behold, the devil is about to cast some of you into prison, that ye may be tried; and ye shall have tribulation ten days. Be thou faithful unto death, and I will give thee the crown of life." (Rev. 2:9-10). Does this sound like the message of prosperity and a gospel of worldly success?

The Christian may or may not enjoy a good measure of success and prosperity in this life. We should beware of giving the impression that such is a measure of one's spirituality for some of the greatest men have struggled greatly in this life, and even others have chosen such because of their faith (cf. Moses, Heb. 11:24-26). The true success and true riches are found in Jesus Christ and the salvation which He provides. T.L.

The Third Epistle Of Paul To Timothy...

Paul, an apostle of Jesus Christ, to Timothy, Associate Youth Minister of the church

I besought thee to abide still at Ephesus, when I went to the Macedonian workshop, that thou mightest share thy dynamic motivational personality with the keen teens. I exhort therefore, that first of all, candlelight devos be held for all cell groups. Meditate upon new schemes to keep them stirred up on fire, give thyself wholly to them, lest the aged men and women teach them to be sober-minded.

But what out for them in all things. Do the work of a recreational director, plan a social calendar, entertain at hootenanies, chauffeur to amusement parks, referee ball games, make full proof of they ministry. For bodily exercise produceth firm believers. These things write I unto thee, hoping to come unto thee shortly: but if I tarry long, that thou mayest know how thou oughtest to behave thyself in the fieldhouse of God, which is the gymnasium of the church, the backboard and track of progress.

Let no man despise thy youth rallies: but be thou an example of the latest fad, in hugs, in applause, in altar calls, in neo-charismatic spirituality, in cliches. Do thy diligence to schedule Hymenaeus and Philetus for next year.

Study to show thyself an intellectual. But progress beyond the things which thou hast learned and hast been assured of, knowing the rigid traditionalist from whom thou has learned them. Let the elders that rule be told that they have no authority, especially over you.

I charge thee therefore before God, and the Lord Jesus Christ, preach self-image psychology: relate, placate, and motivate with all values clarification and counseling. Use vague speech, that cannot be pinned down, that he that is of the contrary part may look foolish, having no charges that you cannot later deny. These things suggest and present as all personal opinion so that anyone who disagrees may be ignored. Hold back the faithful word, which you were taught, that you may be able by new doctrines both to find and fill felt-needs. For there are many dynamic speakers and misunderstood thinkers, especially they of the circumcision, whose mouths must be given a wider hearing. A man that is a heretic to older brethren, after the first and second brotherhood backlash, take a caravan of children a hundred miles to hear. Lay hands suddenly on anyone who seems visibly successful; keep thyself popular.

(5) Hair styles must be neat, trim and clean.

Ladies, how would you react if the elders should compose the following with regards to your appearance in worship? (1) Women are required to wear dresses, skirts and blouses, and all must be conservative in style. (2) Strapless or spaghetti strap dresses and bare midriffs are not acceptable. (3) Dress shoes and hosiery are required. (4) Jeans are not allowed. (5) Shirts with writing and cartoons are inappropriate. (6) Hair styles must be neat, trim and clean.

COMMENTS: Most would resent receiving from the elders a set of dress codes. "They are overstepping their bounds," many would say. Others would say, "They are binding something that no one else would" AND many would go on wearing what they want to wear, however

inappropriate for the occasion! (SAD... BUT TRUE).

HOWEVER... The preceding "DRESS AND GROOMING CODE" has been composed and imposed! Not by elders, but by SEARS, ROEBUCK & CO. for its sales-persons in the Los Angeles Group! Amazing as it may seem, they made no apology for their "dress and grooming code." They do however, offer this explanation: "There is no substitute for good judgement in appropriate dress. Our customers deserve and expect to shop in a pleasant, professional-appearing, courteous environment. Our employment relies on our ability to attract and retain the business of our customers."

OBSERVATION: Of course, the code of Sears was to attract "paying customers" through their doors. Our desire should be to attract and retain the approval of God and the interest of others. When Joseph was called from prison to meet Pharaoh, "he shaved himself, and changed his raiment" and then "came in unto Pharaoh" (Gen. 41:14). As we would say, he "put his best foot forward." Appearance wise, he showed respect to the King. Can we do less to THE KING?

CONCLUSION: I agree with Sears, "there is no substitute for good judgement in proper dress." We must reverence worship! Whether we admit it or not, our dress and appearance reflect our respect for the occasion. I'm amazed and ashamed that many go to worship the Creator of the universe dressed as they would go to a ball game. Does not the majesty of God demand more? Do men expect more at graduations, funerals and weddings than they do at the worship of Jehovah? It certainly appears so!

A Filthy Habit Ben F. Vick, Jr.

"Sean Marsee was just twelve years old when he picked up some free samples of Skoal and Copenhagen tobacco at a local rodeo. Dipping snuff was a popular habit at his school, especially among the athletes. And Marsee, a budding track star, quickly grew accustomed to the feel of a juicy wad in his mouth and the slight head buzz that goes with it. By the time he entered high school, he was dipping his way through seven to ten cans a week. Then in 1983, his senior year, Marsee developed a painful sore on his tongue. It refused to heal, and a biopsy showed it was malignant. Over the next six months, the teenager, from Ada, Oklahoma, endured four operations, progressively losing parts of his tongue, throat, and jaw. Neither the surgery nor searing radiation treatments contained the cancer. In February 1984. the boy voted 'most valuable athlete' of his class died, a disfigured and skeletal wraith."

The preceeding paragraph appeared in the July 15, 1985, issue of **TIME** magazine in which "smokeless tobacco" was shown to be a widespread problem especially with American youth. The **TIME** article stated, "The amount of snuff sold annually in the U.S. is up 60% since 1978. And while national figures on teenage use are not available, local surveys in Oklahoma, Oregon, Texas, and Massachusetts suggest that between 20% and 40% of high school boys are chewing or dipping."

Chewing tobacco or dipping snuff is not a harmless habit. Beside the fact that it is a filthy habit, doctors and dentists are warning of its dangers. Those who think that the "smokeless tobacco" is healthier or safer than smoking need to see what the medical profession is saying.

Arden Christen, chairman of the preventive dentistry department at Indiana University, says that

dipping causes visible damage in as little as three to four months. *"The gums may recede, the teeth loosen, biting surfaces are abraded, and tough, white patches call Lukoplakia may appear on the gums and cheeks."* **TIME**.

According to recent studies, this filthy habit raises the blood pressure; and "contrary to what some ballplayers might think, ... it slows reaction time." Elbert Glover, a researcher of East Carolina University in Greenville, N.C., says, "The nicotine level in the blood is higher in smokelesstobacco users than smokers."

Though there have been less studies on smokeless tobacco than cigarettes begin linked to cancer, it has become increasingly clear that there is a connection. "Doctors estimate that between 3% and 6% of the callus-like leukoplakia ultimately become malignant." In June of this year the U.S. Surgeon General, C. Everett Koop, appointed a panel of medical experts to assess the risks of smokeless tobacco. Many medical organizations have called for federally required warning labels on packages and cans of smokeless tobacco and have encouraged a ban on television commercials.

The facts given above ought to suffice in convincing one who desires to follow the Bible. Paul wrote, "What? know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost which is in you, which ye have of God, and ye are not your own? For ye are bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's" (I Cor. 6:19-20). Does the use of tobacco, whether in smoking or smokeless form, glorify God? Anything which harms your body or mind is a sin. Smoking and using smokeless tobacco does harm your body. Therefore, smoking or the use of smokeless tobacco is a sin.

One who chews tobacco or dips snuff also needs to think of his influence (Matt. 5:13-16). We,

as Christians, are to be reflector lights of the true Light, Jesus Christ (John 1:9). The smokers, dippers, and chewers of tobacco are a poor reflection of Jesus Christ. Could anyone imagine the holy and harmless Son of God engaging in such a filthy habit? Anything which hurts one's influence for the cause of Christ is wrong. Smoking, chewing, and dipping of tobacco hurts one's influence for the cause of Christ. Therefore, smoking, chewing, and dipping tobacco are wrong.

According to the TIME article, it seems that chewing tobacco and dipping snuff are more addictive than cigarettes. It was discovered by Glover that "would-be-quitters couldn't even stop for half a day." Paul told the Thessalonian brethren, "that every one of you should know how to possess his vessel in sanctification and honor" (I Thess. 4:4). One's "vessel" is one's body. Too many socalled Christians are possessed by tobacco. One who says that the can "take it or leave it" usually takes it because he will not leave it. It (tobacco) possesses him. What a shame! We are to be servants of the Lord, not tobacco (Rom. 16:18).

The smokeless habit (whether chewing tobacco or dipping snuff) is not only a filthy one, but is a sinful one. Why not break the habit today? (Phil. 4:13)!

{Editor's Note: I read this article with great interest. There are many who still use tobacco and don't see its obvious health complications. This article was presented in hope that someone who is now under the addiction to this substance will make and effort to give it up. We have lost too many to cancer here at Bybee Branch. We do not want to lose anyone unnecessarily! Think seriously about this. *T.L.* }



Counting The Cost

Luke 14:27-33 And whosoever doth not bear his cross, and come after me, cannot be my disciple. For which of you, intending to build a tower, sitteth not down first, and counteth the cost, whether he have sufficient to finish it? Lest haply, after he hath laid the foundation, and is not able to finish it, all that behold it begin to mock him, Saying, This man began to build, and was not able to finish. Or what king, going to make war against another king, sitteth not down first, and consulteth whether he be able with ten thousand to meet him that cometh against him with twenty thousand? Or else, while the other is yet a great way off, he sendeth an ambassage, and desireth conditions of peace. So likewise, whosoever he be of you that forsaketh not all that he hath, he cannot be my disciple.

Jesus called for men to follow him. He called on them to bear his cross. However, Jesus knew that is would not be an easy task for everyone. Hence, he called on men to "count the cost" before following him. He used two well understood illustrations: that of a man building a tower and that of a king going to war. His use of these illustrations was not to discourage men from following him, but to get them to understand that being a disciple of his required effort and dedication. For a person to start and not be able to finish would put that person in a worse situation than he had been in and to bring shame on the Lord. "And Jesus said unto him, No man, having put his hand to the plow, and looking back, is fit for the kingdom of God." (Luke 9:62). It is further declared that "For if after they have escaped the pollutions of the world through the knowledge of the Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, they are again entangled therein, and overcome, the latter end is worse with them than the beginning. For it had been better for them not to have known the way of righteousness, than, after they have known it, to turn from the holy commandment delivered unto them. But it is happened unto them according to the true proverb, The dog is turned to his own vomit again; and the sow that was washed to her wallowing in the mire." (II Peter 2:20-22). So it is abundantly clear that one should seriously consider the life and vocation that he is about to undertaken in the Lord for he may further endanger his soul. Many Christians should view these verses carefully and realize that there must be dedication to the Lord.

There is another perspective which one could draw from these verses though it is not specifically stated. One must "count the cost" for not becoming a disciple of Christ. It is possible that in this life that one might be able to avoid persecution, amass a great amount of wealth, and otherwise seem to prevail physically speaking by not becoming a disciple of Christ, but he will learn, as did the rich man, that these things cannot be carried into eternity. On the other hand, one may have to endure a great amount of conflicts and sufferings here, but to use the words of Paul, "For I reckon that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us." (Romans 8:18). In other words, comparing the two lives here on earth and the two destinies which will result from them, counting the cost reveals that the Christian life is the only real choice.

Sometimes a serious appraisal of one's life and direction can reveal that he should be making a change of direction. We should be investing in our future, our eternal future.



The Folly Of Worldly Wisdom

1Corinthians 2:1 "And I, brethren, when I came to you, came not with excellency of speech or of wisdom. declaring unto you the testimony of God. 2 For I determined not to know any thing among you, save Jesus Christ, and him crucified. 3 And I was with you in weakness, and in fear, and in much trembling. 4 And my speech and my preaching was not with enticing words of man's wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power: 5 That your faith should not stand in the wisdom of men, but in the power of God. 6 Howbeit we speak wisdom among them that are perfect: yet not the wisdom of this world, nor of the princes of this world, that come to nought: 7 But we speak the wisdom of God in a mystery, even the hidden wisdom, which God ordained before the world unto our glory: 8 Which none of the princes of this world knew: for had they known it, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. 9 But as it is written, Eye bath not seen, nor ear beard, neither have entered into the beart of man, the things which God hath prepared for them that love him. 10 But God hath revealed them unto us by his Spirit: for the Spirit searcheth all things, yea, the deep things of God."

During the questions and answers period of the World Evangelism Lectureship, brother Joe Gray made a comment which has caused me to think further. He stated that our schools were on a collision course with the faith on one side and the "scholarship" on the other. We are living in a time when some within the church are discontent with the sound gospel and desiring to have the blessing and favor of the world, these have given ground. They have acquiesced to the world's demands for acceptance. This is the reason we hear of such strange notions such as "theistic evolution." We hear some of the "learned" men of our number criticize the church of our Lord for being small in the eyes of the world. We are told by these men that we must catch up with what "scholarship" has said all along. We are charged as being out of step with the times in both our worship and doctrine.

The scripture printed above with its accompanying context reveals that this world's wisdom is what many men expect, and want. However, it is this wisdom which will come to no good end. The Holy Spirit, through Paul, called these people "fools" "Professing themselves to be wised, they became fools." (Rom. 1:22). It is only through our faith in and dependence upon God which will save us eternally. Man is incapable of devising a plan sufficient to save himself. Jeremiah observed, "O Jehovah, I know that the way of man is not in himself; it is not in man that walketh to direct his steps." (Jer. 10:23). Man must rely on the revelation of God to know what is true and right religiously. The fact that "scholarship" holds that a certain point is true or fales is irrelevant when we have revelation from God on the matter. In fact, Paul said, "For ye see your calling, brethren, how that not many wise men after the flesh, not many mighty, not many noble, are called: But God hath chosen the foolish things of the world to confound the wise; and God hath chosen the weak things of the world to confound the things which are mighty; And base things of the world, and things which are despised, bath God chosen, yea, and things which are not, to bring to nought things that are: That no flesh should glory in his presence." (I Cor. 1:26-29).

The fact that many today are clamoring for a new teaching should not surprise us. Men have looked for a long time how to be accepted by the world. Let us seek the acceptance which really counts, that of God!



She had become more of an object upon whom care should be bestowed rather than a companion or helper. But he stayed by her side. She didn't want anyone else caring for her. So he went about the chore of turning her in bed every 45 minutes throughout the night, and keeping her clean and comfortable as possible. Everyone talked about the care he was faithfully giving her, and I passed the compliments along. He politely brushed them off by saying, "I made that commitment to her 40 years ago.

Duty may be an old-fashioned word, but it's a regal one. General Robert E. Lee said, "Duty is the sublimest word in the language; you can never do more than your duty; you should never wish to do less."

Daniel Webster said, "A sense of duty pursues us ever. It is omnipresent, like the Deity. The news media has revealed recently a battle that has been brewing for over a year now. The battle is over the funding of the National Endowment for the Arts or NEA. The issue has been over many of the so-called works of arts that it has sponsored using tax dollars. Many of these have been so pornographic that they have been banned from exhibition by several cities. They have involved the public display of the female body (one display involved a woman's nude body covered in a coating of chocolate), homosexual acts, and other deviant sexual acts. This is not a paltry sum either. The amount of funding for the NEA is set at \$180,000,000. Of that amount, \$1,600,000 was to buy a display that honored women featuring thirty-nine plates on a large banquet table and on each a sculpture of a woman's sexual organ. As you might expect, this has produced a considerable stir amount the legislators.


Some in the news media and many of the Hollywood actors have wanted to place this issue in the realm of the exercise of one's "freedom of speech." Though we recognize the need to keep our speech free and unrestricted, there are certain limits to any freedom. One's freedom to go where he might please do not grant permission to enter someone's house uninvited. There are obscenity laws in our country which forbid the public display of nudity which some of these "works of art" violate. In spite of these things, however, the issue is not really the freedom of speech, it is whether or not the government will pay for it with tax dollars. These people want to spread their filth, but they want the general public to pay for it.

Many Christians wonder if there is anything which they can do to stop this downward spiral of indecency. One thing which we *must* do is to let our elected officials know what we think and that we are willing to *vote our moral convictions on election day!* One thing is certain, if we never attend a town or regional meeting, if we never write and express our convictions, these legislators will assume that those who do write and call are the only ones who are interested in the outcome of these disputes and will vote accordingly. We must have more who are willing to speak out.





Will Warren County Legalize Package Liquor?

According to the *Southern Standard* (Wednesday September 26, 1990), there has been a petition presented to the Warren County Election Commission to have referendum on legalizing package stores. It was noted in the article that the churches of Warren County had mounted a strong opposition to this in the past and that the opposition dealt the issue a resounding defeat.

Warren County already has a problem with alcoholic beverages as is well illustrated by the other items in the news regarding the sale of these beverages


to minors. Alcohol has been responsible for taking the lives of too many of Warren County's Youth. It is a plague on our society which needs to be banished.

The Christian's stand against alcoholic beverages is one based on moral convictions, not just personal preference. The Bible reveals that certain things are harmful and sinful to man and the imbibing of strong drink is certainly one which the Bible condemns. If you have any question in your mind, study carefully the following passages (Gen. 19:30-38; Lev. 10:3-11; Deut. 21:20; Prov. 20:1; 23:29-35; Isa. 287; Hab. 2:15,16; I Cor. 5:11; Gal. 5:21; Eph. 5:18).

There will be no doubt some who will raise the question to the matter of tax revenues which are generated from the sale and distribution of alcoholic beverages. First and foremost it must be understood that wrong is wrong regardless of how much profit comes from it. Why not then legalize and tax other vices such as prostitution, gambling, drug dealing, etc. Second, there is considerable misinformation regarding the tax benefit. The Second Special Report to the U.S. Congress on Alcohol & Health, New Knowledge, U.S. Dept. of HEW, June 1974 stated that the total alcohol related cost in 1971 was \$25.37 Billion, but at the same time, the total Federal, State, and Local taxes collect only amounted to \$7.96 Billion. In other words, it costs \$3.18 for every \$1.00 collected in taxes. You may collect it on one end, but you have to shovel it out on the other. Now that is a regressive tax!



I Saw What Alcohol Could Do In Carrollton, Kentucky...

On May 14, 1988, I went to Carrollton, Kentucky to preach in a series of Gospel Meeting. Late that Saturday night I was awakened to the sounds of sirens and helicopters, and I knew that something serious had happened. The next morning there was a deep sense of tragedy as I rode by the National Guard Armory which had been converted into a temporary morgue for the burned and mangled bodies of so many young people. On Tuesday night of the Gospel Meeting, the church gave the use of many of its chairs to a counselling group there to comfort the bereaved families. I will never forget the sight of the family members crying in the conference room at the Holiday Inn. It was a tragedy which you cannot fully appreciate unless you were there.




What caused this great accident? A young man got off from work and went and imbibed in his alcoholic beverages, then he took to the streets. While under the influence of the alcohol, he drove down the wrong side of the intestate highway and ran head on into a church bus filled with young children returning from a day of fun. This young man would have never thought about doing such a thing if he were able to reason rationally. The problem is that when a person comes under the influence of alcohol he will do numerous things that he would not normally do while in his right mind. This is the reason why so many of the crimes are described as "alcohol related."

Warren County is now facing a referendum in which the citizens are being asked to vote to legalize the sale of hard liquor (we already have the sale of alcohol). All other issues aside, it would be extremely foolish for us to want something which brings so much tragedy and heartache. It would further deteriorate our society and bring social ills which we have not seen up to the now. Some will counter us by saying that you can buy liquor in other surrounding counties, and these people will drink it anyway. People are deceiving themselves if they think that the consumption will remain the same or decrease. The consumption will rise dramatically when the liquor is made more accessible. Our kids will grow up seeing it and thinking that it is acceptable. One thing that struck me the first time I went to Carrollton was the aisles of hard liquor in the local stores.

I saw what alcohol can do in Carrollton, Kentucky and know what it can do in Warren County. It can make our job of trying to stand for the truth that much harder. As serious as the social issue may be, the most important issue is the spiritual side. The Bible is so clear that one has to willingly choose to be ignorant on the subject to give any thought that alcoholic consumption is alright. *No faithful Christian could vote to support the sale or distribution of alcoholic beverages!*





"Six Gallons Each Day"

The television reports of the conflict in Kuwait give new insight into the Bible account of the exodus from Egypt. The scene of what the Arabian desert is like helps us to understand the wilderness in which the Jews wandered for forty years. The two deserts are located close to each other and conditions in each of them is almost identical.

One of the first new reports tells of the American general who instructed his solders to drink at least six gallons of water every day to avoid dehydration. There is talk of transporting barges filled with fresh water to seaports so the demands for water can be met.

Using the figure of six gallons for each soldier each day, consider just how much water the Israelites have needed in the wilderness. Instead of the 50,000 soldiers we have in Saudi Arabia, Moses had 603,550 men of war. This number included only those "...from twenty years old and above... men who are able to go to war" (Numbers 1:3). It did not include those from the tribe of Levi (22,000); nor the aged or infirm men; nor the wives most of these must have had; nor the children. Assuming that 95% of the men were married and each had at least three children the total number would have exceeded three million. If six gallons is a true figure (and who can argue with a general!), the daily requirement would have been 18,000,000 gallons of water each day for forty years! When you consider water needed for other purposes, including water for their animals, the numbers become astronomical.

The miracles associated with the exodus show how great our God is. He who cared for them cares for us!



"As The Oracles Of God" (9 Peter 4:11)

Question: Is it scriptural to use a quartet in worship? If it is right to use the quartet, why is it wrong to use the choir?

Usually quartets are used not so much for worship, but for entertainment. I think it sinful to use any item of worship as a mere entertainment. Our singing should be an outburst of thanksgiving and praise from our hearts to God for His goodness, love and mercy to us. The song services should be instructive and inspiring. A quartet may sing God's praises, but God does not call upon us to praise Him by proxy. If we put a quartet in the worship to sing God's praises for us, we are either trying to praise Him by proxy or else we are just using the quartet for entertainment. I suppose that there is just as much authority for a quartet as for a sextet or choir. Paul said to the church at Ephesus: "Speaking to one another in psalms, hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody with your heart to the Lord." (Ephesians 5:19). Again, he said to the Colossian Christians: "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; in all wisdom teaching and admonishing one another with psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts unto God." (Colossians 3:16). These scriptures include every member present at the worship. The singing is distributed to all. It is similar to all eating the Lord's Supper. No one can do this by proxy; neither canhe sing God's praises by proxy.

Mark Twain And Evolution

One of the fallacies that has led to a belief in evolution is a failure to recognize that one cannot always project backwards on the basis of the current situation. Many evolutionists ignore the effect such would have on the formation of fossils, the origin of coal and oil (cf. Henry Morris' writing for a full discussion of the matter) and consequently reach conclusions that far miss the mark. In fact, Peter talks of those who argue that "all things continue as they were from the beginning of the creation" and shows how it had led to wrong conclusions in his day (II Peter 3).

That great American humorist, Mark Twain, so vividly points out that one cannot always know the past simply by looking at the present. The following is from his pen:

Since my own day on the Mississippi, cutoffs have been made at Hurricane Island; at Island 100; at Napoleon, Arkansas; at Walnut Bend; and at Council Bend, These shortened the River, in the aggregate, 67 miles. In my own time, a cutoff was made at American Bend which shortened the River ten miles or more.

Therefore, the Mississippi between Cairo and New Orleans was 1,200 miles long 176 years ago. It was 1,180 after the cutoff of 1772. It was 1040 after the American Bend cutoff. It has lost 67 miles since that time. Its present length is only 973 miles.

Now if I want to be one of those ponderous scientific people, and "let on" to prove what has occurred in the remote past by what has occurred in a given time in the recent past, or what will occur in the far future by what has occurred in late years, what an opportunity is here! Geology has never had such a chance, nor such exact data to argue from. Not "Development of the Species," either. Glacial epochs are great things, but they are vague.

In the space of 176 years the lower Mississippi has shortened itself 240 miles. This is a trifle over one and one-third miles per year. Therefore, any calm person who is not blind or idiotic, can see that in the old Silurian Period, just a million years ago next November, the lower Mississippi was upwards of one million three hundred miles long and stuck out over the Gulf of Mexico like a fishing rod. And by the same token, any person can see that 742 years form now the lower Mississippi will be only one and three quarters of a mile long, and that Cairo and New Orleans will have joined their streets together and be plodding along under a single mayor.

There is something fascinating about science. One gets such a wholesale return of conjecture out of such a trifling investment of fact. (Mark Twain).



Was The Apostle Peter An Idiot?

In a recent Bible School lesson entitled, "Have You Made Your Reservations?" the author referred to the Apostle Peter and his writing in the following manner:

"Peter tends to get left out of the Bible Study. After all, his books are not very long, not numerous and not generally known for their theological depth. Anyway wasn't he the oaf who tried to walk on water, cut off Malchus' ear and denied the Lord three times." [Foundations, "Strengthening Spiritual Muscles," Gospel Advocate Family Bible Studies, Adults, Fall 1990 (Lessons for October 14, 1990) published by Gospel Advocate Company, Nashville, Tennessee, p. 29].

Two glaring mistakes have been made by the author.

The author charges Peter with being a shallow writer, i.e., his books are "not generally known for their theological depth." The great Apostle Peter wrote concerning: The foreknowledge of god, sanctification, salvation, the sacrifice (blood) of Jesus, the mercy of god, the Christian's hope by the resurrection of Jesus Christ, the Christian trials, proving the Christian's faith, obedience, holy living, redemption, obedience to the truth, love of brethren, begin begotten of God, and the indestructibility of God's Word. All of this brethren in the *first chapter of First Peter* — but it lacks theological depth! This charge against Peter's writings is ludicrous!!!

The second charge made by the author is that Peter was an oaf. Webster defines an oaf as:

"An elf's child; changeling; hence a deformed or foolish child; a simpleton; dolt; blockhead; idiot; also a lubberly person." (Webster's Seventh New Collegiate Dictionary)

According to the author of the quarterly, the Apostle Peter was a *simpleton*, a *dolt*, a *blockhead*, an *idiot*. I wonder if those on Pentecost (Acts 2) were aware that the Gospel they were hearing was being preached by a blockhead? I suspect that this statement about Peter is an example of the atrocious manner in which some today are interpreting the Word of God.

The author also needs to note that Peter didn't "try" to walk on water, he did (Matthew 14:29). Peter did deny the Lord three times and wept bitterly because of his sin (Matthew 26:75). Peter did cut off Malchus' ear (John 18:10): had he not stated that he was willing to die for Christ (Matthew 26:35)?

The Apostle Peter may have been weak at times (aren't we all), he may have been impetuous, but he was a fearless worker accomplishing much in the Kingdom of God. He certainly was not a dolt, blockhead, or idiot.


The author of the lesson owes an apology to God, Peter, and his readers for the flippant manner in which he has handled the Word of God. I sincerely pray that it will be forthcoming.



the early day of Christianity; neither were they provided for in the New Testament; their origin, organization, and perpetuation are condemned in the New Testament. There is not a single intimation that God endorses them or that the Holy Spirit guides their different activities. If Paul censured the dissensions and party feelings in the church at Corinth, how much more reprehensible must be the ripened fruit of such schisms in religion today? They are antagonistic to, and destructive of, the spirit of unity. There is nothing in the New Testament that can be fairly construed to give any justification of denominationalism. Such divisions among the followers of Christ were not only unknown in apostolic times, but are by explicit apostolic teachings condemned for all time. And since denominations had their origin since the days of the apostles, they must certainly pass away before "we all attain unto the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God" (Ephesians 4:13).

Some who have advocated denominationalism have ceased to do so and are now excusing it by saying that there was a time for denominations, but now the time has come for them to cease and all come together in one great body and form one new gigantic denomination.³ Such a claim betrays ignorance of Bible teaching. There is as much authority for two hundred denominations as there is for one; there is absolutely no authority for the existence of any of them. If denominations are to remain, union is impossible. There is no reason that can justify such organizations from New Testament teaching. Those who may be set for the defense of denominationalism must understand that they are opposed to New Testament teaching. No one can be right with God and in harmony with his truth and at the same time justify division among the believers in Christ. A denomination has not the authority of Jesus Christ for its existence; hence, it has no mission divinely guided, neither has it any work that is ordained by God. Moreover, he has not promised to bless anyone for loyalty to or service in any denomination. If they are perpetuated, it must by the will of man and in opposition to the will of God.

The Sin of Denominationalism

H. Leo Boles

Nothing is taught more clearly and emphatically in the New Testament than that Christians, disciples of Christ, should be united. Jesus, before he established his church, prayed that his disciples should be one. "And the glory which thou hast given me I have given unto them; that they may be one, even as we are one; I in them, and thou in me, that they may be perfected into one" (John 17:22-23). The Holy Spirit through Paul exhorted Christians to "be perfected together in the same mind and in the same judgement" (I Corinthians 1:10). Again Paul wrote by the Holy Spirit to the church at Philippi "that ye be of the same mind, having the same love, being of one accord, of one mind" (Philippians 2:2); and again the Holy Spirit taught through Peter that God's people should be "all like-minded, compassionate, loving as brethren, tenderhearted, humble-minded" (I Peter 3:8). Scriptural quotations could be multiplied which emphasize the fact that God's people should be united. Not only do the Scriptures clearly teach that the disciples of Christ should be united, but division among the people of God is condemned. The church at Corinth was instructed to speak the same thing: "And that there be no divisions among you." The New Testament is as clear in condemning division as it is in emphasizing that God's people should be united.

One of the vital questions of our day is that of bringing together all of the professed followers of Jesus. The question is frequently asked: "How shall the followers of Christ, now ranged under different banners, be rallied and united under one standard, when party names shall be known no more?" The desire of many is that the distinctions which are represented by party names pass away and the reproach of division be removed. Many earnest and honest hearts are pondering the difficult solution of uniting the believers in the Lord. They feel keenly that such divisions as now exist are condemned by the New Testament. At the same time they see no satisfactory conclusion of the present divided condition; they know that no power can force people to unite; they know that the union must be wholehearted on the part of everyone. The heads of the denominational bodies know that they cannot compel the members of the different denominations to disband and merge into one large body of believers. No one denomination today will claim to have all the truth, and each denominations. **A uniting of all the denominations into one large denomination is not the unity for which Christ prayed and which the New Testament teaches.**

The union of believers in Christ cannot be had by the different denominations "agreeing to disagree"; there is no such thing as uniting these different religious bodies by getting them to ignore the differences that separate them into different bodies; neither will they be brought together into one body be agreeing to differ with each other, and yet maintain their distinct organizations. It is impossible to form a confederation of the denominations and have so many "wheels within a wheel." Any theory of unity that assumes and makes provision for the perpetuation of denominationalism is doomed to failure. Many fatal objections can be urged against it, and no wise leader among them is bold enough to urge such a thing. The efforts that have been made toward union on such grounds have resulted in still more confusion, and as a result we have "confusion more confounded." As a result of such efforts, denominations have multiplied and subdivisions have been the result of the different methods and theories urged for the union of religious people. Some have concluded that it is impossible for believers in Christ to be united. God requires all of his children to be of the same mind. If all cannot be of the same mind and be united, then God requires an impossibility of believers, or believers are condemned for not being of the same mind, united in Christ.

The Bible nowhere intimates that the perpetuity of denominations shall continue. They did not exist in






