

Developing An Optimistic Attitude

No matter how many programs of work, or number of ministers a congregation may have, unless there is an optimistic attitude throughout the congregation (and especially among the elders, deacons, minister and/or ministers) the Lord's cause will never begin to reach its true potential.

Being optimistic is not being naive nor blind. Rather it is an inclination to put the most favorable construction upon actions. Is not this to be the Christian's attitude towards the Lord's work and life in general? Such an attitude is not easily developed, even among God's people, because of a lack of faith and unwillingness to ridigly submit to God's Word. Below are five points that will (if applied) help develop an optimistic attitude that can and must prevail (no matter what problems may arise) among God's people if we are to be as God would have us!

1. Earnestly petition our heavenly Father daily for help.

2. Think before commenting upon any conversation, realizing what you say will encourage or discourage others and have an effect upon the Lord's work.

3. Study diligently God's word daily and strive with your entire being to let it dwell in your heart.

4. When you see brethren demonstrating pessimistic attitudes towards the Lord's work, do everything to inject optimism.

5. No matter your occupation, view each day as an opportunity of service to the Lord.

Now, take this and place it in an area where others as well as yourself may see it daily.



Vídeos In The Church Library

There are several videos in our church library which offer a wide variety of subjects and these are available for check-out You may check these out for a period of two weeks. Below is a listing of some of these and a brief description:

One of our latest additions is the *Jule Miller's Visualized Bible Study Series Videos.* These are an updated version of the filmstrip series which have been popular for so long. In addition, we converted our latest set of filmstrips to video tape so that they would be easier to use. Along with the Video series we received a "preview" video to use in helping to set up Bible studies with prospects. (It is essential that if you take these videos that you sign the card so if someone has a Bible study

going that they can locate the person who has the tape.).

We also have two of the Freed-Hardeman University Preachers and Church Workers Forums. The 1985 Forum was on the subject of *The Restoration Movement And Unity*. The 1987 Forum was on *Discipling*, *Church Growth*, *Unity*. This last one was regarding the Boston/Crossroads Movement.

We have the tapes of our 1987 and 1989 Teacher's Workshops. The one in 1987 was conducted by a group from Willow Ave. in Cookeville and it was designed to give ideas on preparing class material in the lower grades. The workshop in 1989 was conducted by a group from the Estes congregation in Henderson and it was on using "learning centers" in Vacation Bible School. The group from Estes left us a video tape of their own 1988 V.B.S. We have a copy of our own V.B.S. this year on the "Conversions In Acts."

Debates are always interesting. One of the subjects which is so controversial in our society today is that of organic evolution. We have a tape of brethren Bert Thompson and Wayne Jackson as they debated Paul Ricci and Bryan Myers on the subject of evolution versus creation. Another subject which is of great interest in the church today is that of the use of instrumental music in worship. The Highers-Blakely Debate is a truly informative debate.

The history of the restoration of the church in our country is a subject which many would be well to educate themselves on. A video, *Our Restoration Heritage* does a good job of giving an overview of this information.

For the children we have the *Tales From The Great Book* set of 6 tapes. These are cartoon of several Bible stories.

The 1989 and 1990 Missions-World Evangelism Lectureships are also available. Why not take advantage of these opportunities to learn more?







a lectureship last year, I picked up a magazine furnished by the airline to pass the time. The above caricature caught my eye and set my mind to thinking on some of the infringements of truth in our day. I fear that false teachers, sometimes referred to as liberals, would push some unsuspecting souls into wrong positions in order to "restructure" the Lord's church and make it another denominational body without the identity given to it by the Lord (Acts 20:28; Mk. 16:18; Eph. 5:22-23).

not be made into, nor be used by others to become, the "silly women laden with sins, led away with divers lust" (II Tim. 3:6). Some teachers, who seemingly have designs on "change" at all cost, would be willing to put the ladies out front, even if it took making them the "sacrifice" of their error. Under the guise of giving women "a more prominent and authorative position in the church" it is feared they will only make them the "sacrifice" to use for their own desired ends.

No one appreciate godly women more than this writer, who also knows of the many good works that are accomplished by them in the name of Christ. But it is also known that these godly ladies are concerned to respect God's word, the order clearly taught in the holy scriptures, and who will not allow others to place them in the position of the "sacrifice." We heartily commend the Christian ladies who would not allows the Nashville "Jubilee" promoters to jeer them into positions of disobedience!

Paul's great letter to Timothy, was for the purpose of helping him to: "know how thou oughtest to behave thyself in the house of God, which is the church of the living God, the pillar and ground of the truth." (I Tim. 3:15). It surprises this writer that some would suggest that Paul was not referring to the assembly of the church in public worship when he wrote "that men pray every where, lifting up holy hands" and that the women are to "learn in silence with all subjection" (I Tim. 2:11). And, in the following verse Paul says, "But I suffer not a woman to teach, nor to usurp authority over the man, but to be in silence" (I Tim. 2:12). For certain, women under proper circumstances can (and are commanded to) teach (Tit. 2:3-4), but not in the presence of men, or in taking charge over the man. In the Corinthian letter, Paul also writes clearly that "God is not the author of confusion, but of peace, as in all the churches of the saints. Let your women keep silence in the churches: for it is not permitted unto them to speak; but they are commanded to be under obedience, as also saith the law" (I Cor. 14:33-34). They can sing in the public assembly, (Eph. 5:19), but are not to lead the singing; they can publically confess with the mouth Jesus as Lord (Rom. 10:1), but they are not to publically preach; all because of inspired limitations.

Ladies, do not allow some to "make you the sacrifice!"

TO STAND OR NOT

"Watch ye, stand fast in the faith, quit you like men, be strong." (I Cor. 16:13.)

There is no problem with me making up my mind whether I will stand or not. Others seem to have trouble making up their minds. Some will not even watch much less stand. This admonition to "watch" is a serious one. It means to be careful with your life and it also means to avoid the mistakes that are pointed out to you. Paul had told the church at Corinth of certain problems that thy must overcome in order to be faithful Christians. Watch means to keep your eyes peeled lest your soul be ruined.

"Stand fast" means to take a position and then stay there. Of course this depends upon taking the right position. We must have a position on everything. We cannot compromise principles. Once we compromise our position on one thing we will likely do so on another. We are talking about standing firm 365 days out of the year. Not first hot and then cold, first in and out of something, but stand firm. Oh, how we need faithful men. Further, how badly we need faithful men. Further, how badly we need faithful men to stand fast.

Paul's admonition was not to stand fast for just anything but rather to "stand fast in the faith." Some have denied the faith and they walk no more with faithful Christians. Some of them write and say very hateful things about faithful men who proclaim the truth. The faithful are called "brotherhood saviours" or "nit pickers." Men are everywhere ridiculed for taking a stand for truth. Some receive cold stares when they are in the midst of a gathering of Christians due to their stand for the faith. Paul said "stand" for the faith and Jude said to "contend" for the faith. (Jude 3)

Men who do not stand are cowards. They cannot cope with enemies. They must take a position that is favorable to most. They cannot be bold and brave. This is exactly what the admonition refers to in telling one to "quit you like men."

To "be strong" is to go ahead and sound out the cry of the Lord. Call for the old paths and then stand in them. To be weak is to condone the watered down doctrine that the weak will use. Weakness is shown in emotionalism. We can substitute emotions for most anything else. Emotionalism hides or covers up what is lacking in other areas. We believe that touching the emotions is alright but to do so without first touching the intellect shows a weakness. Preachers cannot hide the lack of study or their inability to be strong behind the banner of emotionalism and get by with it. We can see through that with ease. Nothing will substitute for standing firm with the Lord all the days of our lives. When we obey, God will strengthen us.

Recently I read of a minister whose mail brought a request which read, "Will you please tell us all you know about Mr. A., his character, his habits, and his financial responsibility."

They say that it is the only time father can sleep mornings. His name is not recorded in our treasurer's books, so I cannot tell anything about his financial responsibility. This is all I know."

Somehow the letter got back to Mr. A. Was he ever burned up and did he get that minister told! Among the things he said was, "Any minister worthy of the name should know that a man's relationship to the church and his financial contributions are of a confidential nature."

So the minister wrote a second letter. "All I know of the gentleman in question is of a confidential nature and he has explicitely requested that I not tell the truth."

WHAT IS THE TRUTH ABOUT YOU? What is the truth about your relationship to the Lord's Kingdom? What is the truth about your service...your attendance... your prayer...your stewardship. Remember, someday we will stand face to face before the King of Life who will know the truth before we answer. Don't make excuses! Make good to God!

Also, you must inform us before you address changes. It costs us 29 cents for every one returned. If we receive a returned bulletin we will drop it from the list also.



#### A JOURNEY INTO A "FAR COUNTRY"

#### DAN ROGERS,III

It has been correctly said, "You are what you eat." Likewise, it may well be also said, "You are what you read." I should know, for as a result of a reading diet of too much RESTORATION REVIEW, ONE BODY, and such liberal ilk, and not enough Bible, I became, in the late 1980's, quite disillusioned with the churches of Christ. Reacting to what I perceived to be unchristian attitudes among my brethren (and not even recognizing at the time that my own attitudes were rotten), more and more I began to take, especially in published articles, a militant stance against the churches of Christ. Coming under the insidious influence of the recent unity movement being propagated by the Independent Christian Church and certain liberal brethren, I became an advocate of "full and complete unity" with the Independent Christian Church, and embraced the concept that the silence of the Scriptures does not forbid the use of instrumental music in worship. Thus it was, in the summer of 1989, and at the height of my disillusionment with my brethren, that I made the transition (digression) into the Independent Christian Church, moving to NE Ohio to work with an instrumental church of Christ. This was done in spite of the protests of my wife.

As I prepare this article, it has now been just about a year and a half since I entered into "full and complete unity" with the Independent Christian Church. Both before and after I made the transition, several faithful brethren tried to show me the error of my position. I steadfastly refused to be swayed by their scriptural argumentation. However, what their argumentation could not do (not because it was faulty, but because I refused to let it do so), my experience of "full and complete unity" with the Independent Christian Church began to accomplish.

The congregation that I have been working with is quite "conservative," as compared to most Independent Christian Churches. None the less, my whole time with them has been a time of struggle, both with the congregational leaders, as well as with the majority of the members, over their erroneous concepts and teachings on such matters as grace (Swindoll, and not Paul, is emphasized), baptism is "unto" the remission of sins, and thus will accept just about any person who has been immersed, regardless of his reason for being immersed), Premillennialism (the Persian Gulf war has caused it to surface in the congregation, and most of the members seem to be tainted by it), woman's role (they have no problem with women leading prayers, leading singing, or even addressing the assembly), divorce and remarriage (they seem basically to hold the typical liberal views that Hicks and others espouse), the qualifications of elders (for example, a divorced and remarried man, with no children, has been an elder of the congregation within the last year), the Holy Spirit (typical denominational views concerning the direct operation of the Holy Spirit are held), the observance of Christmas and Easter (and even Halloween!), and such like. Now please remember, this is a "conservative" congregation I am talking about. Based upon my knowledge gained from what I have read in Independent Christian Church publications, and from my dealings with area congregations, it is much worse than this in most Independent Christian Churches!

As a result, my eyes have really been opened to just how erroneous my doctrinal stance on the silence of the Scriptures not forbidding the use of instrumental music in the worship of God actually is, as well as the grave error of both my advocacy and practice of fellowship with the Independent Christian Church! You see, in some of the erroneous things which they advocate, I have heard them make appeals to the silence of the Scriptures, and it is their use of that same kind of argumentation that I used with regard to instrumental music in worship was wrong. This realization, as well as some of the other areas wherein they advocate that which I firmly believe to be incorrect doctrine, has in turn caused me to realize that there is just no way that I, if I want to be true to God's word (and I do), can continue in fellowship with the people of the Independent Christian Church.

## HOW DO YOU THINK WE WOULD RATE?

A man visited 18 different churches on successive Sundays to find out what the churches were really like. According to the article that reported this story, the man said, "I sat near the front. After the service, I walked slowly to the rear, then returned to the front and back to the foyer, using another aisle. I smiled. I was dressed neatly. I asked one person to direct me to a specific place - a fellowship hall, a preacher's study, etc. I remained for coffee, if served. I used a scale to rate the reception I received."

His point scale was:

- 10 for a smile from a worshipper
- 10 for a greeting from someone sitting nearby
- 100 for an exchange of names
- 200 for an invitation to return

1000 - for an introduction to another worshipper 2000 - for an invitation to meet the preacher

Would you be interested in knowing what he found? Eleven of the 18 churches scored fewer than 100 points, and 5 scored less than 20. His conclusion: "The doctrine may be Biblical, the singing inspirational, the sermon uplifting; but when a visitor finds nobody who cares whether he's there, he is not likely to come back."

How do you think we rate? It is so important that each one of us strive to make visitors feel welcome, appreciated, and wanted. This Sunday make a special effort to reach out to those you do not know.

# **Visitor's Day**

The day has come for "Visitor's Day" and we want it to be an overwhelming success. We want people to have an opportunity to hear the gospel who perhaps would not have an opportunity otherwise.

The subject for Sunday morning's lesson will be "Visitors" in the Bible. We will consider some of the passages in the Bible where visitors were welcomed. You can tell your neighbors and friends that they will not be under obligation to *do* anything. Some who have visited various denominational churches have found themselves put in extremely uncomfortable circumstances when they were personally singled out for "high pressure" tactics from the pulpit and those near them in the pews. Assure them that no such thing will occur here. To use the words of scripture we just want them to "come and see." (John 1:46).

Here is a list of some you might want to invite:

- Your family members that are not attending.
- Your close friends who are not going to church.
- Your business acquaintances who are not going to church.
- Your co-workers at your job.
- Someone who you know is struggling spiritually.
- Those you know need to hear the gospel.

We have emphasized that we are not trying to pull faithful Christians from sister congregations. We want them to assemble with their respective congregations. We are concerned with the *lost* and want to teach and encourage them.

One very important thing we must do Sunday is to let our visitor know that we appreciate them being with us and let them know they are welcome at any time. To do so we are going to have to show ourselves friendly and open. Here is a list of some things which you might want to do this Sunday (and which would be good every Sunday):

- Try to arrive early so that you can greet our visitors.
- Park in the outer parking spaces and leave the closer ones for our visitors.
- Plan on staying for the fellowship meal to follow services at 11:30. (How would you feel if invited somewhere for lunch and all of your bosts left?)
- When you enter the auditorium, do not just go sit down. Get up and go meet our visitors and tell them you are glad they are visiting with us.
- Be sure to wear a smile on your face and let them know that you are glad for the opportunity to worship the Lord (Ps. 122:1). Tony

#### **Organizing The Unchurched**

In the late 70's, a study was made of the socalled "unchurched" in America. Thirty-one organizations and religious bodies sponsored the poll and study to determine how many Americans were not members of "a church or synagogue." The study revealed that 41% or 61 million of the adult population in North America was unchurched. (*The Search For America's Faitb*, pp. 79,80).

According to a recent article in *Newsweek*, (Dec. 17, 1990), about 57% of Americans "now attend church or synagogue." Obviously, 43% of Americans do not attend."

It is interesting to see the number of people who for some reason do not attend or belong to any "church" nonetheless turn to the church for help when they need food, clothes, bills paid, lodging, etc. If those people, who do not believe in attending worship services or being an active participant in "church activities," could somehow get organized then they could help their fellow non-church goers, and God's people would have more funds to give to people who are actively involved in "church" and yet who sometimes have unfortunate things happen in their lives which result in their being in need.

One hears interesting "explanations" from those who do not attend worship services and yet seek material assistance from the church. Recently when asked where she went to church, a lady wanted material assistance from the church said that her depression caused her to eat so much that she couldn't wear her clothes; consequently, she could not go to church!

People have a strange way of looking at things. They have neither time nor the concern for the church and yet they expect the church to immediately respond to their every wish

Perhaps they know that God's people do care for those who suffer. Perhaps they know that the Lord has taught his people to be compassionate. Maybe they know that God's people even help ingrates.

God's people are taught to "do good, especially unto those who are of the household of faith." (Gal. 6:10) This church believes and practices this divine directive. Tom Holland, Nashville, TN

## A PIG OR A CHICKEN?



# Is It Healthy to Forgive?

A New York physician says about seventy percent of his patients reveal resentment in their case histories. "Ill will and grudges help to make people sick. "Forgiveness," he says, "will do more toward getting them well than any pills." So it is healthy to forgive, to say nothing of being the right way to live. Here are rules for the Christian.

- 1. Determine that you are going to forgive. It is not easy to revise emotional attitudes, but in due time you will feel the resentment leave you.
- 2. Remember the harm resentment can do, not to the other person, but to you.
- 3. Remember that you will never be spiritually blessed until you forgive.
- 4. Thinking about forgiving is not enough. You must come to a specific moment when you say, "With God's help, I now forgive."
- 5. Repeat the disciples' prayer, inserting your offender's name, "Forgive me my trespasses as I forgive
- 6. Practice praying for the other person, asking specific blessings for him.
- 7. Speak to others in a kindly manner about the person against whom you harbor antagonism.
- 8. Write a brief letter of good will. Do not be offended if it is not answered. You have cleansed your own heart; that is what really matters.
- 9. Study the factors which created this unhappy situation to correct the "mistake pattern" in yourself. 10.Ask God to help you to be a more forgiving person.




# Aloha

We need to know how many will be present so that we can



#### Did The Church Of Christ Have A Convention Last Week?

According to WKRN-Channel 2 in Nashville, the churches of Christ had a "convention" in Nashville last week. If one followed the report closely you would think that the church now meets in Nashville annually for a spiritual revival and to decide which trends to adapt the church to. There was talk by those directing it of not changing church "doctrine." Others, according to newspaper reports think that the church needs to change its opposition to instrumental music among other things.

I believe some observations are necessary to correct what the news media has reported and perhaps what some who are directing the program would like to be:

- 1. The churches which sponsor the Nashville Jubilee do not speak for all of the churches of Christ, nor do any collection of churches speak for the churches of Christ. The Lord, through His word has provided man a sufficient creed-book, the Bible. Man can vote and proclaim all he wants to and it will not change one whit what God's word says!
- 2. It is evident from the names listed on the program that the Nashville Jubilee was composed of wellknown false teachers who are leading men astray. These men are looking for means and methods of attracting the masses. If it is not done through the pure gospel, of what good is it? Compromise is deadly when the truth is at stake (Gal. 1:6-9).

Did the church have a "convention" last week? No, not anymore than it had a "Summit" a few years ago. Some would like for the church to be a denomination where they could speak authoritative for the church as its hierarchy, but that won't happen with the Lord's true church for He left no such leaders. He demonstrated his wisdom in making each autonomous with Elders who "tend the flock of God which is among you" (I Pet. 5:2). There they can "convict the gainsayers" and stop the mouths of those are "teaching things which they ought not." (Tit. 1:9,11).

# WILL YOUR CHILDREN GO TO HEAVEN?

Elders all over the nation are concerned about the dropout rate of our young people. And well they ought to be. It is a tragic thing to see these precious boys and girls, who are so thrilled with Bible study as little people, grow cold and uninterested in the Lord's work as they grow older.

Lately, several congregations have made in-depth studies of all the factors available concerning all their young people, with an eye to learning what might be done to help solve this problem. What do we need? More youth programs? More rallies? Special teachers?

From the material that has been published on these studies it seems to me that one great central truth has begun to merge. Faithfulness of the young person to Jesus doesn't have anything to do with special programs or teachers. It is not dependent on whether they are members of a large congregation or a small one. The single most important value is their own immediate family.

One congregation found that where both parents were faithful to the Lord, and that includes active interest in the local congregation's programs, 93% of the kids remained faithful. On the other hand, if only one of the parents was faithful, that figure dropped to 73%. Where the parents were only what we would call reasonably active in the Lord's work, only 53% of the young people maintained their faith.

Now here comes the shocker: In those cases where both parents attended only infrequently, the percentage of their children who remained faithful to the Lord dropped to 6%. Want Your Children to Go to Heaven? Then make certain you are leading them. That's the only way they are going to make it.

Before your child has come to seven Teach him well the way to heaven! Better still the truth will thrive, If he knows it when he is five! Better yet, if at your knee He learns it when he is only three! Best of all is when you have begun To teach of Jesus before he is one.






This coming Sunday evening we will have a very important teachers meeting in the new large room upstairs. The purpose of this meeting is to make

### Sensationalism Or Service

Today on every hand, people of the world, and, sadly, even some in the Lord's church, are trying to build a relationship with God based on sensationalism. Many are not satisfied with a religion of simple obedience to the will of God, nor with "old fashioned" worship that is organized according to New Testament authority. They look for God in the sensational, the stupendous, and the colossal. To them, worship is boring if it's not of the spectacular, charismatic, "foot-stomping" variety.

Even within our brotherhood, there is an ever increasing tendency to denounce reverent, Bible-centered worship, as being too "traditional." The advocates of the new "pop culture" in worship want to apply Hollywood tactics to our assemblies, turning them into highly orchestrated entertainment productions. Witness the recent flyer received from the organizers of the Middle Tennessee Summer Youth Series (the Madison church of Christ, in cooperation with David Lipscomb University), advertising the 1991 summer series, for June 4, 11, 18, 25, and July 2. In bold-faced letters the title proclaimed: "when JC talks, the natives get RESTLESS! 5 NIGHTS OF PRAISE!", complete with stick figures shown dancing across the top of the page. Not only was their grammar incorrect, but their reference to the only begotten Son of God as "JC," is appalling, if not blasphemous.

Were they inviting our young people to serious Bible study and reverent Bible-centered worship? Well, you tell me! The flyer proclaimed the following list of activities: "personal testimonies, singing, drama, art work, poetry, short stories, special music, etc., get to be part of the New Testament worship? And, what about that special music? Was that guitars, drums, a full orchestra, or what? Since the natives were going to get restless, according to the picture on the flyer, maybe it was a Caribbean dance band, for all I know!

What were they doing, you ask? I believe they were trying to appeal to the masses and compete with the "hip" approach to religion that permeates the denominational world of today. They and others like them, in youth rallies all over our nation, are leading our young people down the primrose path of liberalism, as they try to make Christianity a religion of emotionalism and sensationlism, and as they try to turn our worship services into focal points for an "emotional high."

I am not saying that Christianity doesn't involve our emotions, nor that our worship and service to God shouldn't be filled with enthusiasm and zeal. To the contrary, such would be vain worship and lukewarm work, both of which are condemned in the Scriptures. Rather, I am saying that our enthusiasm, excitement, and zeal should be tempered with a scriptural knowledge of how to properly channel that emotional energy into Biblically authorized avenues of worship and service to God. Paul spoke of this in Romans 10:2,3, when speaking of the Jews he said, "For I bear them record that they have a zeal of God, but not according to knowledge. For they being ignorant of God's righteousness, and going about to establish their own righteousness, have not submitted themselves unto the righteousness of God."

You see, according to Matthew 25:31-46, and I Corinthians 1:18-31, God has made Christianity a religion of simple things. By the world's standards, Bible-based worship, the cross of Christ, and the preaching of the Gospel are all foolish, weak things, stumbling blocks. But to those who truly understand God's ways, they are "the power and the wisdom of God."

Brethren, Christianity is not in the sensational, it's in the simple! It's things like love, service, perseverance, obedience, meekness, kindness, faithfulness, gentleness, humility, forgiveness, patience, and virtue. It's the daily

# THE BONES OF THE SAINTS

This article is not about "holy relics." I am not going to report on some recent trip to view the mortal remains of the Apostles. No, this article deals with the bones of living saints. When one examines the various bones of the human body, he can draw some very interesting parallels to the actions and attitudes of the Christian, who, after all, is a part of the Body of Christ. Notice the following "bones" (some literal, some not) which we might find in just about any congregation of the Body of Jesus Christ:

(1) JAWBONE CHRISTIANS. How many people have you seen in the Body who were all talk, and no action? Those who profess much, but practice little are "Jawbone" saints! Those who make a commitment to serve God, or to serve one another in the Body, but who fail to live up to that commitment are "Jawbone" saints. Also those who are opinionated, judgmental, argumentative, and who are constantly and vocally stirring up strife, are "Jawbone" saints. With the "jawbone of an ass" Samson slew a thousand men. Without a doubt, that same piece of anatomy is doing its damage even today.

(2) TAILBONE CHRISTIANS. These are also known as "pew warmers." These are individuals who may attend every meeting of the saints, and sit in the same spot year after year, and believe that in so doing they are faithfully serving their God. "Tailbone" saints are great spectators, but poor participators. They know all the rules of the "game" and all the "players," and can quickly spot an infraction of the "rules," but they prefer not to "get out on the field and play the game."


(3) WISHBONE CHRISTIANS. These saints are filled with desires and wishes for the church: they have a "vision" of how things ought to be. Some are willing to be "broken" so that those wishes might be realized; others are satisfied only to dream of what "might be," and are not willing to exert themselves so that the dreams can become reality. "Wishbone" saints can be either good or bad, depending upon their willingness to act upon their wishes.

(4) SKULLBONE CHRISTIANS. Sadly, some saints can hardly be classified as anything other than "hard-headed" and "thick-skulled." They are virtually impossible to reason with, because nothing seems to penetrate through the thickness of their skull bones. "Skullbone" saints are usually very self-willed and domineering. Theirs is the philosophy of "MY way, or NO way!" If you've ever tried to "butt heads" with a "skullbone" saint, you have probably come away bruised and blooded, and with a splitting headache.

(5) BACKBONE CHRISTIANS. Hopefully, this is the type of saint each of us truly is. . . or, the type we are striving to become. We stand tall and straight in Christ Jesus. We have the "backbone" (courage of conviction) to stand solidly for Truth, and against every false way and teaching. We are able to bear up under burdens and pressures in life without buckling, and we are willing to take the burdens of others upon our back and thus help them endure. A "backbone" Christian is not afraid to shoulder the responsibilities of Christian service, nor to take upon himself the yoke of servitude to Jesus Christ. These are the workers who carry the load; the overcomers who bear up under the burdens; the encouragers who bear the discouragements of others. . . these are the "backbone" of the church!

and performed in the name of Jesus Christ and that they must give thanks to the Father through Jesus. (Col. 3:17) He did not distinguish between the importance of what we say about Christ, and what we do that Christ tells us to do.

The efforts of some modernist teachers and writers to move the churches of Christ away from doctrinal matters under the guise of our responsibilities to exalt Jesus Christ, seems to me to be comparable of the liberal Disciples of Christ who engineered the innovations of affiliation with missionary societies and the introduction of mechanical instruments of music in worship during the latter part of the 1800's. To them it matters little what we do as worship, just so long as the focus is on our faith in God and in His Son, Jesus Christ. We can well be drifting rapidly in to the currents of liberalism today, which will take us in the same direction which the Christian church has gone, namely, 'we accept the man (Christ), but not the plan (doctrine).'

My sixty-three years in the pulpits of churches of Christ have convinced me that we must not lose our distinctive plea in matters of faith and practice.

### **Christ and His Doctrine**

There seems to appear an emerging element among the pulpiteers of the churches of Christ who propose that preaching should be directed away from an emphasis on the doctrine of Christ, toward "a change in emphasis" to exalting Christ himself. They charge that the undue emphasis which churches of Christ place on doctrine is causing some people to think congregations are more responsive to matters of doctrine than they are to the Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. We are told that we must see the "church in transition" by transforming itself from the image of a church of doctrine orientation, to that of a church of Christ orientation.



Fortunately, the charges simply are not well taken! There has never been a time when the churches of Christ have neglected to represent a "Christ-exhalting movement." The preachers during the first century delivered a Christ-centered message. Christ told his

apostles to teach the disciples "to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you." (Matt. 28:20) These disciples, therefore, "continued steadfastly in 'the apostles' doctrine." (Acts 2:42) The evangelists during the early days of the Restoration Movement in America went forth preaching that Jesus is the Christ the Son of the living God. A majority of those gospel preachers in the last decade of the twentieth century are exalting Jesus Christ in their sermons.

There seems to be no explanation for these charges except an evident intent to ridicule, down-grade and belittle the "mainline churches of Christ," and to influence them to become more like the people around them. We must not concede that the preaching of the gospel has become an either/or proposition—we preach doctrine or we "preach Christ and him crucified." I am convinced that if we preach either, we preach both. One cannot preach Christ without preaching his doctrine, nor can one preach the doctrine of Christ without exalting Christ.

The apostles and early disciples gave attention to both Christ and doctrine at the same time. Paul told the church at Corinth that "we preach not ourselves, but Jesus Christ the Lord;" (II Cor. 4:5) yet, he admonished Timothy to "give attendance to reading, to exhortation, to doctrine." (I Tim. 4:13) Simon Peter in his sermon on Pentecost not only exalted Christ, but he also said that God had exalted Jesus. Yet, Peter told the hearers who were convinced that God had made that same Jesus whom they had crucified "both Lord and Christ" that they must "repent and be baptized. . . in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins." (Acts 2:38) The apostle had no reluctance to preach the doctrine of baptism while at the same time exalting Christ. Phillip used the prophecy of Isaiah to preach Jesus unto the eunuch. (Acts 8:35) However, they had not traveled very long and very far until the eunuch was convinced that the doctrine of Christ required him to confess and be baptized in water. (Acts 8:36)

When we preach about the church today we exalt Jesus Christ as the head, (Eph. 1:22-23) and as "the Savior of the body." (Eph. 5:23) When we meet around the table to observe the Lord's Supper, we do so in memory of Christ and to show the Lord's death. (I Cor. 11:26) We preach baptism in water for the remission of sins as the means by which we get into Christ and put him on. (Gal. 3:26-27)


It was the deep concern which John had for the preeminence of Christ and regard for his doctrine that he wrote:

Whosoever transgresseth and abideth not in the doctrine of Christ hath not God. He that abideth in the doctrine of Christ hath both the Father and the Son." (II John 9)

The Colossian Christians learned from the pen of Paul that what they said or did (in word and deed), must be spoken





- 8. Blessed are the teachers who plan their work wisely: for their students shall be led to more successful understandings.
- 9. Blessed are the teachers who use a variety of methods: for their classes do not become dull and boring.
- 10. Blessed are the teachers who maintain good classroom order: for they are leading their students toward self-discipline.
- 11. Blessed are the teachers who are fair and impartial in evaluating students' work: for they shall enjoy the respect of their students.
- 12. Blessed are the teachers who work cooperatively with their associates: for they shall be worthy of recommendation.
- 13. Blessed are the teachers who accept criticism constructively: for they shall improve their efficiency and their personality.
- 14. Blessed are the teachers who hunger and thirst after new materials and ideas: for they shall broaden their own perspective of teaching.

### The Sermon Not Preached

My appreciation to the elders for the time away last week to attend the Firm Foundation lectures in Chattanooga. The theme was "The Unshakeable Kingdom." We heard inspiring, motivating, faithbuilding lessons. We also heard disturbing ones of continued departures from the faith. Departures in the leadership, worship, mission, etc. of the church. One cannot bury his head in the sand and hope this apostasy will go away. Thus it is good to be warned of what is happening across the brotherhood.

On Thursday night as we got down to the very last lesson on the program, the final speaker was being introduced. 





# A Cappella Music In The Church

Last week I received a Newsletter from the *A Cappella Preservation Network* in Sherman, Texas. I read the whole newsletter with deep concern and serious reservations. I would like to share some of these in this article.

The first thing which hit me was the statistics. It was noted that a professional congregational singing school teacher has taken a poll among churches of Christ nationwide and found that 55% favor instrumental music in our public assemblies. Also, Abilene Christian University in a survey of teenagers attending churches of Christ found that most see nothing wrong with instrumental music in worship. While one might question the churches and individuals participating in the polls and survey's one thing is clear: there is a generation now which does not know why we should not use instrumental music in worship.

The second matter which was discussed in the paper was the inability of previously used methods to combat the problem, namely confrontational methods such as the presenting of arguments and preaching. I believe that it should be observed that there are not numerous debates going on around the country. Those who are advocating the use of instrumental music, for the most part are refusing to defend their position. It is my conviction that rather than backing off from confrontation, we should be encouraging it. Those who are leading the church down the path of error should be called on to defend their beliefs. If they do not, they are no less than cowards. Scripture calls on them to be ready to give answer (I Pet. 3:15). One does not have to be mean, unkind, or ugly in debating an issue, but the issue must be discussed.

I wholeheartedly reject the idea that preaching cannot persuade the hearts and minds of men. It is worldly reasoning which rejects the efficacy of preaching. Paul stated that God chose through the "foolishness of preaching to save them that believe" (I Cor. 1:21). Perhaps the preachers have not done their job, or at least not very well, but that does not mean that preaching on the subject is ineffective.


The underlying plan which seems to be suggested by the newsletter is that there should be a greater emphasis on singing. It was well noted that whenever we want to gain some time in our worship services, it is usually at the expense of singing. This tends to diminish the importance of singing in the minds of the congregation. Also, there is the fact that the repertory of songs is usually limited to the same songs week after week and year after year. This can make it easier to just sing the words without any thought to what they are saying. We should be striving to worship God to the best of our ability.

In connection with strongly encouraging good singing I believe that the writers have fallen prey to a faulty argument. It has been said that the best argument against instrumental music is good congregational singing. One may have the best voice in the world and not be pleasing to God, and some who cannot "carry a tune in a bucket" may tickle the ears of God. Why, because the melody is made in the heart! (Eph. 5:19). It is essential to see that the biblical purpose of singing is to teach and admonish (which places emphasis on the words) and to offer praise and adoration to God (which places emphasis on the heart). Truth is not determined by what pleases man.

It may sound as if I am against these brethren. I applaud these brethren for being concerned about an obvious departure in the brotherhood. To their credit they are asking for the input of brethren all over the country. I believe, however, they have severely limited their effectiveness by denigrating previous efforts which were based on sound biblical principles.


However, if you can use me, I shall do my best for you, (even if I have to work to help pay my support).





### Free At Last — The Hostages Come Home

There was untold joy among the families of the men who over the past few days have gained their freedom. Tears have welled up in the eyes of many as they saw a father get to meet his daughter for the first time. It was a tremendously moving experience to realize that some of these men who have been held hostage for years now to be free. The are "free at last."

As serious as it is to take hostages, I believe that there is a captivity that is much more serious. Paul wrote to Timothy: *"In meekness instructing those that oppose themselves; if God peradventure will give them repentance to the acknowledging of the truth; And that they may recover themselves out of the snare of the devil, who are taken captive by bin at his will."* (II Tim. 2:25,26). You see, the Devil is every bit as low and despicable as any of the radical factions of.


Consider a few observations regarding the hostages and lessons we could learn:

- 1. The men who were taken hostage were in a dangerous place. They were in a hot bed of hostage takers. In this world there may be no place that is totally safe, but there are some places much safer than others! In the spiritual realm, some find themselves dangerously close to the Devil's domain and put their own souls at risk. The only place to be safe is with the Lord. *"And I give unto them eternal life; and they shall never perish, neither shall any man pluck them out of my band. My Father, which gave them me, is greater than all; and no man is able to pluck them out of my Father's hand. I and my Father are one."* (John 10:28-30).
- 2. Captors often play mind games with their captives and delude them into sympathy with them and their cause. Paul stated: "But I see another law in my members, warring against the law of my mind, and bringing me into captivity to the law of sin which is in my members. O wretched man that I am! who shall deliver me from the body of this death?" (Rom. 7:23,24)
- 3. We feel a deep sense of gratitude toward those who are responsible for the release of the captives. Jesus is our great Liberator. "Wherefore be satth, When be ascended up on bigh, be led captivity captive, and gave gifts unto men." (Eph. 4:8). "And be came to Nazareth, where be had been brought up: and, as bis custom was, be went into the synagogue on the sabbath day, and stood up for to read. And there was delivered unto him the book of the prophet Esaias. And when he had opened the book, be found the place where it was written, The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he bath anointed me to preach the gospel to the poor; be bath sent me to beal the brokenbearted, to preach deliverance to the captives, and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty them that are bruised. To preach the acceptable year of the Lord. And he closed the book, and he gave it again to the minister, and sat down. And the eyes of all them that were in the synagogue uere fastened on him. And he began to say unto them, This day is this scripture fulfilled in your ears." (Luke 4:16-21).

We are thankful that the hostages are home. They are free! Would you be free from the burden of sin? Look to the great Deliverer — Jesus Christ.
