

Moses' Excuses, God's Answers

God told Moses He wanted to send him to deliver His people. He responded, "Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh, and that I should bring the children of Israel out of Egypt?" God took away the excuse by promising to be with him. Anyone is someone with Almighty God on his side (Exodus 3:9-12; Romans 8:31).

Moses asked who he should say had sent him. God said to say, "I Am has sent me," or the One who exists by His Own power (Exodus 3:13-14; Revelation 1:4)! Moses was to tell the Israelite elders that God had seen their suffering, would deliver them and take them to the promised land. Moses and the elders were to ask Pharaoh to let them go three days' journey into the wilderness to worship their God. He foretold that Pharaoh would not let them go, even by a powerful hand. The Almighty would send them out with abundance as if Egypt had been plundered (Exodus 3:13-22; Genesis 15:14)!

Moses said the people would not believe him. God gave him three miracles designed to convince the elders that he was God's chosen messenger. His rod would become a serpent and turn back into a rod. His hand would be leprous and then whole again. Water from the river would turn to blood when poured out on the ground (Exodus 4:1-9).

Moses next said he was not an eloquent public speaker, either before God began speaking or at that very moment. This excuse borders on being an accusation against God. It is tacitly false, as Deuteronomy demonstrates. God did not remedy this supposed problem, but He said He had made man's mouth and could strengthen Moses (Exodus 4:10-12).

Moses finally asked God to send anyone but him. God was angry because He had promised all necessary aid. He gave to Moses his brother Aaron as his mouthpiece. The ultimate power would come from God as He gave Moses the words to speak (Exodus 4:13-17).

The futility of making excuses to God is evident. He made us. He knows us. He will not ask us to do anything we are unable to do.

Lessons From A Coffin

Many events from the life of Joseph exemplify the great faith that he had in God. You may recall the advances of Potiphar's wife toward the young, vulnerable Joseph. He maintained his purity, for he knew to give in to temptation was to sin against God (Gen.39:9). Perhaps you remember Joseph's attitude toward his brothers who had so mistreated him. His faith in God allowed Joseph to maintain an attitude of love and concern for his brothers (Gen.50:19-21). However, no other event in the life of Joseph shows his great faith in God as does the commandment he gave concerning his death (Gen.50:25,26). Many great lessons can be gleaned from the injunction Joseph gave concerning his burial.

First, it shows that Joseph's faith was not dimmed. Joseph was separated from everything and everyone he knew and loved—everyone, that is, except for God. Joseph was in an idolatrous nation where no one knew him. He could have very easily renounced his faith in God and done as he pleased, but Joseph's faith in God would not allow him to do so. He was separated from God's people, yet he was determined to please God, even if he were the only one in the whole nation who was willing to take this stand. His faith was his own. It was not inherited, and it was not reliant upon others. Because of this, Joseph did not allow circumstances that occurred throughout his life to dim his faith.

Second, the commandment Joseph gave concerning his death shows that his heart was in Canaan even though he was in Egypt. Joseph could see past the adversity. He knew that the things he had endured were not the end of it all. Through the eye of faith Joseph could see the unseen. In his heart, Joseph longed for that land that God had promised to His people (Gen.12:1-3). Although Joseph did not know when this would take place, he knew that it would happen. God promised it would be so, and in Joseph's heart that settled it. Joseph knew he was but a stranger in a strange land, a citizen of the land of Canaan, merely passing through Egypt.

Third, the commandment Joseph gave concerning his death serves as a reminder. It reminds us that

God is faithful to keep His promises. Joseph's coffin is a reminder that we are all mortal. Despite this fact, Joseph's coffin reminds us that there is hope of life beyond this life. Joseph's coffin reminded Israel that Egypt was not their home, and it reminds us that this world is not our home. Joseph's coffin serves as a reminder that we need to be patient. It took over 215 years for Joseph's command concerning his death to be fulfilled! Every time the children of Israel saw Joseph's coffin, or walked past his tomb, they were reminded of these things. Joseph faced the hardships of life with an unwavering faith, and he faced death with the same great faith.

What a great lesson in faith for all of us!



Psalm 119

Psalm 119 is the longest Psalm. It is also the longest chapter in the Bible. It is an acrostic. Each verse in each section of eight verses begins with the same letter of the Hebrew alphabet, through 22 sections in (Hebrew) alphabetical order. Quite a literary feat! In addition, every one of the 176 verses contains a synonym for God's Word: "law" verse 1, "testimonies" verse 2, "ways" verse 3, "precepts" verse 4, "statutes" verse 5, "commandments" verse 6, "rules" verse 7, "statutes" verse 8, etc.

God's Word is our joy and delight. "In the way of your testimonies I delight as much as in all riches" (14). "I will delight in your statutes; I will not forget your word" (16). "Your testimonies are my delight; they are my counselors" (24). "The law of your mouth is better to me than thousands of gold and silver pieces" (72). "Oh how I love your law! It is my meditation all the day" (97).

God's Word keeps us from sin. "How can a young man keep his way pure? By guarding it according to your word" (9). "I have stored up your word in my heart, that I might not sin against you" (11).

God's Word is eternal and unchanging. "Forever, O Lord, your word is firmly fixed in the heavens" (89). "Your righteousness is righteous forever, and your law is true" (142). "Your testimonies are righteous forever; give me understanding that I may live" (144). "The sum of your word is truth, and every one of your righteous rules endures forever" (160).

God's Word helps us in our afflictions. "This is my comfort in my affliction, that your promise gives me life" (50). "Before I was afflicted I went astray, but now I keep your word" (67). "It is good for me that I was afflicted, that I might learn your statutes" (71). "Trouble and anguish have found me out, but your commandments are my delight" (143).

God's Word keeps us from error. "Through your precepts I get understanding; therefore I hate every false way" (104). "Therefore I consider all your precepts to be right; I hate every false way" (128).

God's Word defines our fellowship. "I am a companion of all who fear you, of those who keep your precepts" (63). "Let those who fear you turn to me, that they may know your testimonies" (79).

God's Word guides our way safely. "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path" (105). "Great peace have those who love your law; nothing can make them stumble" (165)

First Things First!

Christ revealed the need for setting proper priorities in Matthew 6:33. Putting first things last and last things first is far too easy and frequent. Therefore, consider four particulars from the words of Christ that will aid in putting first things first.

Obligation: "seek." We must understand that Jesus issued a command—not an option. If we desire a heavenly home, we must follow this absolute imperative. Seeking requires a diligent effort on our part. Notice Hebrews 11:6, which reads, "but without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him."

Objects: "the kingdom of God and his right-eousness." The top priorities in a Christian's life are the "kingdom" or the church (Matthew 16:18-19) and "his righteousness." These are revealed in the Gospel of Jesus Christ (Romans 1:16-17).

Order: "first." The emphasis is that the church which belongs to Christ must never take a back seat. In all we do, we must seek to put these things first in our hearts, minds, souls and strength! The concept of "seeking first" for the things of God is a predominant biblical concept that touches one's motivation and priorities including how one spends his or her leisure time, the goals one sets in life and whether a person experiences spiritual growth.

Outcome: "all these things shall be added unto you." This statement shows the blessings that will

result if one's priorities are right. The result for obediently seeking the kingdom and God's right-eousness will lead to every need being supplied in accordance with God Himself. What an awesome promise. This does not mean that all one's wants will be granted. Without fail, God will surely take care of a Christian's daily requirements. It is also a clear reminder that "So likewise, whoever of you does not forsake all that he has cannot be My disciple" (Luke 14:33).



A Plea for Restoration

Men like John Wycliffe, in the 1300's, saw a corrupted church, which led, in turn, to remarkable wickedness. They called for men to use Scripture only to determine the will of God. Good people are shocked by the changes of recent days. Hatred seems to grow by the minute. Sin is openly practiced and set forth as the way every right-thinking person should walk, or at least praise. Our world needs the Savior and His church, but division has torn believers apart. We must restore the church of the Bible if we are to turn the world around.

A restored church is united on the Bible alone. Its members must speak the very words of God (I Peter 4:II). Those words God spoke are found in Scripture (2 Timothy 3:16-17). Every believer should, over time, grow in knowledge so he or she can teach others. "For though by this time you ought to be teachers, you need someone to teach you again the first principles of the oracles of God; and you have come to need milk and not solid food" (Hebrews 5:12 NKJV).

A restored church will reject all manmade creeds. A creed is "a brief authoritative formula of religious belief" (Merriam-Webster.com). God's children must, as Paul told Timothy, "Hold fast the pattern of sound words which you have heard from me, in faith and love which are in Christ Jesus" (2 Timothy 1:13). He later explained that the young preacher should only preach the Word (2 Timothy 4:1-4). He also told Titus, "But as for you, speak the things which are proper for sound doctrine" (Titus 2:1).

A restored church will only use scriptural names for the people of God. The church itself has no proper name, only descriptions. It is described as the church of God; the temple of God; the church of the firstborn ones; the body of Christ; the household of God; the kingdom of the Son; churches of Christ; and the household of God (1 Corinthians 1:2; 3:16; Hebrews 12:23; Ephesians 1:22-23; 2:19; Colossians 1:13; Romans 16:16; Galatians 6:10). God gave

Christ's disciples the name Christian (Acts I I:26). We know God gave the name because the word "called" is used in Scripture to describe a divine message (Matthew 2:12, 22; Hebrews 11:7). Each church is self-governing in the restored church. Paul addressed the letter to the church in Philippi, "To all the saints in Christ Jesus who are in Philippi, with the bishops and deacons" (Philippians 1:1). Those bishops, or overseers, are responsible for watching out for the souls of the saints where they serve (Acts 20:28). Peter, who was an elder, instructed his fellow elders to, "Shepherd the flock of God which is among you, serving as overseers, not by compulsion but willingly, not for dishonest gain but eagerly; nor as being lords over those entrusted to you, but being examples to the flock" (I Peter 5:1-4).

The saved were the only members of the first century church, and likewise, the saved are the only members of the first century church – the restored church – in the 21st century. Luke reported that the Lord added those being saved to the church (Acts 2:47). No human being or group of humans voted on their membership. They had to have been set free from their sins as described by Peter to those asking what they must do to be saved (Acts 2:37-41). Paul likewise understood that one enters a new life as he comes up out of the waters of baptism (Romans 6:3-4).

The solution to the hatred and sinfulness surrounding us is found in a call to **restore the church as God designed it**. We must probe the depths of God's Word to find His will for our lives, because knowing it can change the world.



Jesus: The Good Shepherd

"...We are his people, and the sheep of his pasture" (Psa. 100:3). "For he is our God; and we are the people of his pasture, and the sheep of his hand..." (Psa. 95:7).

Jesus, as the Good Shepherd, cares for the sheep individually. "To him the porter openeth; and the sheep hear his voice: and he calleth his own sheep by name, and leadeth them out" (John 10:3).

Jesus, as the Good Shepherd, leads his sheep in the right way. "And when he putteth forth his own sheep, he goeth before them, and the sheep follow him: for they know his voice" (John 10:4).

Jesus, as the Good Shepherd, saves the sheep. "I am the door: by me if any man enter in, he shall be saved, and shall go in and out and find pasture" (John 10:9).

Jesus, as the Good Shepherd, gave his life for the sheep. "I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd giveth his life for the sheep" (John 10:11). "As the Father knoweth me, even so know I the Father: an I lay down my life for the sheep" (John 10:15).

Jesus, as the Good Shepherd, protects the sheep. "But he that is an hireling, and not the shepherd, whose won the sheep are not, seeth the wolf coming, and leaveth the sheep, and fleeth: and the wolf catcheth them, an scattereth the sheep" (John 10:12).

Jesus, as the Good Shepherd, unifies the sheep. "And other sheep I have, which are not of this fold: them also I must bring, and they shall hear my voice; and there shall be one fold, and one shepherd" (John 10:16).

"Then said Jesus unto them again, Verily, Verily, I say unto you, I am the door of the sheep" (John 10:7). "And he said, . . . He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned" (Mark 16:16).

Faith Strengthening Questions

The world challenges the Christian's faith daily. Paul understood that and wrote to strengthen the faith of the brethren at Rome through a series of rhetorical questions. I am thankful to Roger Johnson for helping me see these powerful questions.

"If God is for us, who can be against us?" (Romans 8:31). Joshua and Caleb understood this, though they saw the same giants as the other ten spies (Numbers 14:6-9). Isaiah and John both underscored the power of having God on their side (Isaiah 41:14-15; I John 4:4).

"How shall He not with Him also freely give us all things?" (Romans 8:32). This question follows the simple, yet dynamic statement that God gave His own Son up for us. We should, therefore, put God's kingdom, the church, first in our thinking and acting (Matthew 6:33; Ephesians 3:14-20).

"Who shall bring a charge against God's elect?" (Romans 8:33). God actively works so those who live in accord with His will can be as if they never sinned (Romans 4:7-8). Our accuser is defeated because of the offering of Jesus' blood (Revelation 12:10-11).

"Who is he who condemns?" (Romans 8:34). Jesus is seated at God's right hand. He is able to completely save us, and He is ready to intercede on our behalf (Hebrew 7:25). There is no condemnation for those who have been baptized into Christ and walk according to the Spirit's direction (Galatians 3:27; Romans 8:1).

"Who shall separate us from the love of Christ?" (Romans 8:35). Those who continue to walk in the light, confessing any sins into which they may stumble, can be assured of ongoing cleansing through Jesus' blood (1 John 1:7-9).

Rejoice in Paul's powerful words!

Yet in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us. For I am persuaded that neither death nor life, nor angels nor principalities nor powers, nor things present nor things to come, nor height nor depth, nor any other created thing, shall be able to separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord. (Romans 8:36-39).

A Lack of Knowledge

These were difficult days. By swearing and lying, killing and stealing and committing adultery, they broke all restraint. Bloodshed was followed with more bloodshed. The land itself mourned, and everyone living there languished. What horrible conditions in which to live! The source of these troubles, however, was easy enough to diagnose. There was no knowledge of God in the land, of His will, of truth, mercy and justice. While there was much external religious activity, it was based on human emotions, not the revealed will of God. Everyone's image of God was based on their own desires, not on God's revelation of Himself in Scripture, His revealed truth. The result was Hosea's cry that, "My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge" (Hosea 4:6).

The above description, while written almost 2,700 years ago, would well fit our day and age. While there is a lot of talk about God, Jesus and spirituality, there is little time spent in the only source available that reveals them clearly and authoritatively, the Bible. Emotions and feelings take priority and God must conform to these. Actually, it must be the other way around. Our knowledge and understanding of God must grab our attention, focus our emotions and motivate our actions. Paul spoke of the lews of his day ..."I bear them witness that they have a zeal for God, but not according to knowledge. For, being ignorant of the righteousness that comes from God, and seeking to establish their own, they did not submit to God's righteousness" (Romans 10:2-3). The same is true of many today.

Of course, knowledge without love puffs up, resulting in arrogance (I Corinthians 8:1). It shouldn't be one or the other, but one with the other. The current swing of the pendulum in modern society, away from a real knowledge of God based in Scripture, has produced the same results that Hosea lamented in his day. Problems in government, problems in society, even problems in the church, share a common source. When everyone does what is right in his own eyes (Judges 21:25), the consequences can be devastating. Unless we get back to living as God intends, how much farther will society go? Unless we get back to Scripture as a pattern for the church, will we become just another denomination?

We must redefine the parameters of our love within the framework of a knowledge of God. We

must take Scripture to heart, and apply it to life. We must cease trying to form God to our image, and instead allow ourselves to be molded in His image. "And it is my prayer that your love may abound more and more, with knowledge and all discernment, so that you may approve what is excellent, and so be pure and blameless for the day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ, to the glory and praise of God" (Philippians 1:9-11).

God Does Not Compromise

As the land of Egypt suffered through the plagues God sent against them in punishment for Pharaoh's refusal to allow the Israelites to go into the desert and serve the LORD, Pharaoh, having already broken many promises but under pressure from his servants (Exodus 10:7), offered up a compromise solution. Pharaoh offered to let the Israelites go into the wilderness but only on the condition that they leave their children behind (Exodus 10:8-11). The Lord's response was the plague of locusts followed by darkness. Then Pharaoh offered to let the Israelites go into the wilderness and take their children, but on the condition that they leave their flocks and herds behind. But Moses rejected his offer because it was not what God wanted (Exodus 10:24-26).

Often today, people wish to bargain with God over what he will allow and what he requires of them. For some reason, they believe that if they go along with some of God's requirements, he should just forget about the rest. However, God does not operate that way. He knows what is best for us and offers us a covenant that is in our best interest out of his love (1 John 4:7-11). Our obedience -- without any exceptions we may propose -- is essential to pleasing him (Hebrews 5:8-9). Pharaoh had every opportunity to accept God's will and let the Israelites serve him in the wilderness. Due to his own pride, he lost his slave laborers not only for a few days but forever. As we consider what God tells us to do, we must remember: God does NOT compromise. He does not change (Malachi 3:6) -- we must change (loshua 1:7).



Ecclesiastes 12:1

Forgive Seven Times?

In Matthew 18:21-22, we read, "Then came Peter to him, and said, Lord, how oft shall my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? till seven times? Jesus saith unto him, I say not unto thee, Until seven times: but, Until seventy times seven." Among some of the rabbis it had come to be understood that a man did not have to forgive his neighbor more than three times. They used Amos I:3 and 2:6 to support this belief. By asking the question the way Peter did, he was going beyond rabbinical teaching. He increased it to seven times. Seven was seen as the number for completion or perfection. Three was the number for heaven and four was the number of the world. Adding them together gave the idea of union of heaven and earth to the rabbis.

However, Peter's question still gave the impression that there was a limit to forgiveness. In the Jewish rabbinical mind one was doing something exceptional to forgive. One was foregoing a right when one forgave someone. To put limitation on it meant there was not an eternal right for forgiveness in the kingdom of God.

Jesus' response demonstrated that God's mercy and grace is eternal. As long as someone is sorry for what he did and asks for forgiveness, forgiveness should be given. Jesus supported this teaching in Luke 17 when He stated that if a brother trespassed against you seven times in one day, then you should forgive him seven times that day if he repented. I am glad that our God is so forgiving. I know that I will stumble and fall in my spiritual life. I know that no matter how many times it happens, I can repent and ask forgiveness and God will give it to me. He is the God of love.

Study your Bible. Learn all you can from it. Obey God. Make sure you are in the proper relationship with Him so that you can receive forgiveness when you sin. If any of this is hard to understand, ask an adult to help you.

Watch Your Mind Food

Do you not yet understand that whatever enters the mouth goes into the stomach and is eliminated? But those things which proceed out of the mouth come from the heart and they defile a man. For out of the heart proceed evil thoughts, murders, adulteries, fornications, thefts, false witness, blasphemies. These are the things which defile a man, but to eat with unwashed hands does not defile a man. (Matthew 15:17-20)

Each child of God would be blessed by devoting time to consideration of what he is feeding his mind. The best "restaurant" for the mind is not found in popular music, magazines or television programs. Instead, it is found in a diligent search through God's Word to discover how to be a proper workman for him (2 Timothy 2:15). Those who have been risen with Christ must put their focus on "those things which are above, where Christ is, sitting at the right hand of God. Set your mind on things above, not on things on the earth" (Colossians 3:1-2).

Paul gave specific types of "mind food" on which to focus. "Finally, brethren, whatever things are true, whatever things are noble, whatever things are just, whatever things are pure, whatever things are lovely, whatever things are of good report, if there is any virtue and if there is anything praiseworthy—meditate on these things" (Philippians 4:8). Any faithful reader of God's Word will recognize the greatest source of materials of these sorts is the Bible. Let us resolve to make daily Bible reading a habit. It will make us better people.





Jesus And The Passover

The Israelites were instructed to kill an unblemished lamb, "a male a year old" (Exodus 12:5) on the 14th day of Abib (April), "at the going down of the sun" (Deuteronomy 16:6), and to put the blood on the two side posts and the headpiece of their doors (Exodus 12:7). The lamb was to be roasted and eaten with unleavened bread ("the bread of affliction") and "bitter herbs" that night (Deuteronomy 16:3; Exodus 12:8).

The Lord promised that, as he passed through the land to smite the Egyptians "at midnight," when "I see the blood, I will pass over you," and not allow "the destroyer" to enter that house (Exodus 12:13, 23, 29).

So the Passover Feast was begun, and the Israelites were commanded to "keep this ordinance in its season from year to year" (Exodus 13:10), saying to their children: It is the sacrifice of Jehovah's passover, who passed over the houses of the children of Israel, when he smote the Egyptians, and delivered our houses (Exodus 12:26-27).

This "day" became a "memorial," a "feast to Jehovah" (Exodus 12:14) "by an unlimited (olam) ordinance" (Exodus 12:14). But "in the fullness of time" (Galatians 4:4), "according to the eternal purpose" (Ephesians 3:11), Jesus appeared as a planned replacement of the Passover lamb, becoming "the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world" (John 1:29). Yes, in "the plan of the mystery, hidden for ages in God" (Ephesians 3:9), Jesus became "our Passover Lamb" (I Corinthians 5:7).

As no bones of the Passover lamb were broken (Exodus 12:46; Numbers 9:12), so it was predicted

that no bones would be broken in the body of "our Passover Lamb" (Psalm 34:20; John 19:36).

The Israelites, in their annual Passover "memorial," through 1500 years from the days of Moses, remembered that their ancestors walked "out from the land of Egypt" in "a night to be much observed" (Exodus 12:14, 17, 37, 42). So Christians now honor in a weekly memorial their "Passover Lamb" (Acts 20:7; I Corinthians 5:7). This their "Passover Lamb" has requested, "Do this in memory of me" (I Corinthians 11:24-25). Thus the Old Testament Passover Feast, by God's plan, is "fulfilled in the kingdom of God" when Christians in the Lord's Supper "eat and drink," said Jesus, "at my table in my kingdom" (Luke 22:16, 30; I Corinthians 11:20).



Four Gardens

Meaningful is a study of four prominent gardens of the Bible: Eden, Gethsemane, the Garden Tomb, and Paradise. On Lord's day, May 30, 1971, in a room at the airport hotel in Tel Aviv, the worship service included a sermon on "The Four Gardens" capably delivered by Gene Priest to three listeners: Joe and Harold Bryant and this writer. The four had recently visited two of the four gardens.

Eden. Moses gave clear information that the garden of Eden God had placed in ancient Mesopotamia, present day Iraq (Genesis 2:10-14). Two of the four rivers irrigating Eden are still known to geographers: Tigris and Euphrates. Civilization thus had its beginning in the Mesopotamian valley.

The name "Eden" ('eden, from 'dn, to live luxuriously) means "pleasantness," and since everything the Lord had made was "very good" (Genesis 1:31), the garden of Eden must have been delightful: no thorns, brambles, thistles, diseases, death, or decay. Out "of the ground Yahweh God caused to grow every tree pleasant to see and good for food" (Genesis 2:9).

Two of the trees not only produced edible food but had miraculous power. One of them was "the tree of the knowledge of good and evil," and the other was "the tree of life" (Genesis 2:9). Of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil Adam and Eve were not to eat (Genesis 2:17).

Their sin caused them to be ejected from the garden, which also cut them off from the tree of life, of which they could have eaten and have lived "forever" (Genesis 3:22). The garden of Eden has long

since disappeared, and so the story of the first Bible garden ends in sadness. We look for a restoration in another garden, the fourth in this study.

Gethsemane. The garden of Gethsemane was on the west side of Mount Olive and east of the walls of Jerusalem "beyond the brook Kidron" where "Jesus often went" with "his disciples" (John 18:1-2). The name "Gethsemane" means an oil press, and the garden was located where multitudes of olive trees grew. Shown to tourists today are eight very thick and aged trees still producing olives. They may well be the growth from the roots of the trees which Jesus saw there.

When General Titus in 70 A.D. destroyed Jerusalem he "ordered that they should bring timber together, and raise banks against the city, ... So the trees were now cut down immediately, and the suburbs left naked" (Josephus, WARS OF THE JEWS, V-VI, 2). Hardly could trees so close by as Gethsemane's have been spared.

The garden containing the present day eight old trees is supervised by the Franciscans. A church building there is called "The Basilica of the Agony" (or, "The Church of All Nations," because sixteen nations made contributions). A tourist is told that the church houses the "rock" (?) where Jesus kneeled and prayed.

Adjacent to the garden with the eight old trees is another garden of Gethsemane. It is supervised by Russian Orthodox nuns. In it the trees are much younger. Also a church is there called "The Church of St. Mary Magdalene." An escorting nun said that no one knows the exact site of the garden where Jesus prayed, but it is certain that it was somewhere in the area now marked off by the two gardens.

Oil pressing was done in the fall, and the garden would have been abandoned in the spring when Jesus went there. Jesus' perspiration, compared to "great drops of blood falling down upon the ground" (Luke 22:44), was not because of a hot night, because the night that Jesus was there (Thursday, April 6, A.D. 30) was "cold" (psuchos),

requiring, when people were outside, a warming "charcoal fire" (anthrakia, John 18:18, 25).

Jesus was outside, but he had no warming fire. His sweating was because of his mental anguish and agony, "even to death" (Matthew 26:38), hoping against hope that there might be some other way for him to save sinners without his death. As a human being he offered up "both petitions and pleas with loud crying and tears to the One who could save him from death" (Hebrews 5:7), yet always qualifying his begging, "Not as I will, but as you will" (Matthew 26:39).

The Garden Tomb. A living, sweating, agonizing human was in the garden of Gethsemane around midnight, and the next afternoon before the sun went down, his corpse was taken into another garden. "Now in the place where he was crucified there was a garden; and in the garden a new tomb" (John 19:41). This third garden could be called a garden of hope, for there, early on Sunday morning, a startled Mary Magdalene heard encouraging words: "Go to my brothers, and say to them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, and my God, and your God'" (John 20:17).

Paradise. The fourth garden is called "the Paradise of God," a figurative description of heaven (Revelation 2:7). The word "paradise" means a park, a place of pleasure. The word is found in the Septuagint Greek translation of Genesis 2:8 describing the garden of Eden: *paradeisos*. That the translators used the best possible word is borne out by the fact that Jesus used the same word in describing heaven: "To him who overcomes, to him I will give to eat of the tree of life in the Paradise of God" (Revelation 2:7).

Thus heaven is pictured as a restored garden of Eden. The "tree of life," on "both sides of" a "river of the water of life (clear as crystal," is in the restored garden "bearing twelve fruits monthly" (Revelation 22:1-2). The curse placed on the original garden of Eden (Genesis 3:17-19) will be gone forever, for in "the Paradise of God" there "shall be no curse any more" (Genesis 3:17-19; Revelation 2:7; 22:3).





Don't Follow Me, I'm Lost!

One day while driving my automobile, I came near enough to the car in front of me to be able to read the sticker on the back bumper. It read, "Don't follow me, I'm lost." I was reminded of a personal experience of mine that occurred a few years ago.

I was endeavoring to find a particular building located near a lake and I began following some people I thought were going to the same gathering of brethren where I was supposed to be making a speech, and that they would be able to lead me safely to my destination. I was wrong. After traveling some distance on a dirt road, we came to a dead end. The car in front of me stopped and the driver got out and came to my side of the car and started to ask if I knew where the building we both were looking for was located. I answered quickly that I did not know and that I had been following them, thinking that they knew the directions. Eventually, we all arrived at our desired destination.

In religious matters, we must not assume that others know the way of salvation. This would include preachers, parents, loved ones and friends. There is the probability that a blind leader could cause you to be lost (Matthew 15:14). Just because a certain way seems right does not insure that it is a safe path to travel (Proverbs 14:12). The sad fact is that the majority of people are traveling the wrong highway in this life (Matthew 7:13,14). Individually, we have the responsibility to search the scriptures for ourselves (2 Timothy 2:15; Acts 17:11). The Bible is the only road map that can safely direct us from this life to eternal bliss (Psalm 119:105; Acts 20:32).

Another point that I want to emphasize is that people who are lost spiritually and know it, would do a tremendous service to others by wearing a sign that reads, "Don't follow me, I'm lost." A father who refuses to obey the Gospel could lessen his influence with his children by making it clear that he was lost and that he did not want them to follow his example of disobedience. An unbelieving marriage partner, by wearing this sign would greatly encourage the other mate not to listen to his/her excuses for not obeying Christ. The moralist

would no doubt keep innocent people from believing that he was saved and they could also be saved separate and apart from the blood of Jesus Christ. The hypocrites and backsliders could really help in this matter by wearing this sign, thus informing all people that Christ was not living in them and that they were lost and doomed to eternal perdition. This might prevent others from following their ungodly examples.

The only sure and safe way to travel in this life is to follow Jesus who is "the way" (John 14:6). And, he is the one who says to us, "follow me" (Matthew 16:24).

Make a Christian life, a Christian home and Christian children your legacy, and future generations will call you blessed.

The Church of Today or Tomorrow?

A very popular song of years gone by recognized that "children are our future." In viewing the future, the past must be considered. The record reveals sin to be man's problem (Gen. 2:16-17; 3:6-7), but it doesn't have to be that way (James 4:7; I Thess. 5:22). The devil knows all of this and starts with our young.

Obedience to God should start in youth (Ecc. 12:1). The world understands this as the public education system is directed to the youth, and a continued push is for even younger participation. It's recognized in sports and other activities all directed to the young. Jesus the perfect example gave divine recognition to growth and development in youth with help of His good earthly parents (Luke 2:52).

Every accountable person is responsible to God. Consider Samuel of old (I Sam. I-4). His mother dedicated him to the Lord, and at a very young age God called for him. Timothy, commended in Acts 16:2 by the brethren at Lystra and Iconium, is an example of one remembering God in his youth (II Tim. I:5). He progressed so well in on-the-job training, that in youth he could be left in Berea (Acts 17:13-14) while Paul escaped to Athens. At the proper time youth do become accountable to God.

Is there something you can do about the future of the church of God? Yes, parents are charged to train up their children (Proverbs 22:6) with dad responsible (Eph. 6:4). Who is in charge, parents, at your house? You or your children?

Youth have responsibility, too. Remember the disrespect shown Elisha (II Kings 2:22-24). God

pronounced a death penalty on those rebellious youths. Children learn respect for God and for family at home (Prov. 19:18). Study habits can and should be set in the home (II Tim. 2:15). Serving others (James 1:27), worship (John 4:24), leading others to Christ (John 1:40-41), choosing good friends (I Cor. 15:33) all should be seen and taught primarily in the home. If the home works as designed by God, then this will be done, and it greatly affects the future of the Lord's people.

It has often been observed that youth are the future of the Church. If our youth have obeyed the gospel of Christ, then they're the church of today as well as the church of tomorrow. The way to overcome moral decay and troubles of our day is to teach and prepare children now. Neither government money nor any state social program can replace the good that God can do through the lives of dedicated, prepared children. Invest wisely in the future, let's train our children now. Make them aware of the pitfalls of sin and evil in the world, and let them see Christ living in us.



2 Timothy 3:16-17

Can You Know?

"Who really knows what the Bible means? Everybody has his own interpretation of it." If this is true, then why don't we see this as a big problem in the New Testament?

The first Christians had no trouble understanding baptism. They knew they were baptized to be saved. When Peter said to repent and be baptized to be forgiven of sins (Acts 2:38), the Jews didn't argue, "That's not how we've heard it. We believe we are baptized to show we've already been saved." We read of no such misinterpretation because the people just accepted the Word for what it said.

The early churches had no problem understanding their duty to assemble for worship on the first day of the week. This "assembly" was a given for James' readers. He didn't have to prove it was necessary or explain what it was (James 2:2). When the writer said not to forsake this assembly like some (Heb. 10:25), his readers knew what he meant. Paul wrote about the Corinthians "coming together" (I Cor. 5:4; 11:17-34; 14:23-26), but they didn't ask, "What kind of gathering is he talking about?" They knew what their duty was.

Members of the church in the first century had no difficulty understanding the observance of the Lord's Supper. They knew which foods were to be used. They realized how and when and why it was given even though they sometimes abused it through their selfish pride (I Cor. 11:17-34). When Paul wrote Ephesians, Colossians, and other epistles he made no mention of the Lord's Supper. Why? They understood it. How was that possible if the Bible is so open to various interpretations that they couldn't know what it meant?

Someone may say, "Yes, but those Christians did misinterpret the word of God sometimes. Paul wrote to the church at Corinth and they misapplied what he said according to I Corinthians 5:9-11." That is true, but Paul cleared up their misunderstanding in those verses and the church at Corinth got the message and did what Paul told them to do (I Cor. 5:10-11; II Cor.

2:1-10). Those people were human just like us. They didn't always understand perfectly what they read the first time, but with patience and effort they did.

When Paul wrote to the church at Ephesus, he said, "When ye read, ye may understand" (Eph. 3:3-4). How could the Christians there have understood this letter if it could have been interpreted in different ways and no one could be sure what it taught? Notice also that Paul said they could understand the words he wrote by *reading* them. They didn't have to get a priest, a bishop, or a pope to tell them what it said. They could read it for themselves and know what it meant.

Jesus said, "And ye shall know the truth." (John 8:32). His promise is true for us today. We should be humble as we read the Bible, but we should not let people confuse us.

"Do you see that faith was working together with his works, and by works faith was made perfect And the Scripture was fulfilled which says, "Abraham believed God, and it was accounted to him for righteousness." And he was called the friend of God. You see then that a man is justified by works, and not by faith only"

James 2:22-24

What Makes a Successful Church?

The answer to that question depends on whom you ask. Most people think a successful church is measured in large numbers, big budgets, programs that meet their needs, and state-of-the-art facilities.

However, none of those "standards" are proof of success. In fact, each one of those standards could just as well be present in a dead church. Do you remember the church at Sardis (Revelation 3:1-6)? This was a church that had a good reputation and was alive and well in the eyes of the community, but in the eyes of God, they were dead (Revelation 3:1).

Apparently, God doesn't see as we see (Isaiah 55:8-9), and he doesn't measure success in the same way that we measure success. While there is nothing wrong with numbers, programs, big budgets, and large facilities, a church can be successful in the eyes of God without possessing a single one of these qualities.

What, then, is the measure of a successful church?

- Christians who humbly try to live out the Lordship of lesus in their lives daily.
- Christians who love the truth supremely, who will not allow their own personal desires or situations to skew their perception of God's revelation.
- Christians who are committed to moral living and are more concerned with godliness than fitting in with society.
- Christians who love peace more than they do a fight and who love the calmness of unity more than the rhetoric of a fuss.
- Christians who support the weak, restore the fallen, and reaffirm their love and commitment to those who have stumbled.

Now, these characteristics would make a successful church! And note: It's not about size, big budgets, programs, or facilities. Rather, it's about inward transformation and spirituality. And here's the best news of all: we don't have to have large numbers, multimillion-dollar budgets, or state-of-the-art facilities. The qualities that bring success and constitute greatness in God's eyes are qualities that are within our reach.



What lies before us? Part I

"Brethren, I do not count myself to have apprehended; but one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind and reaching forward to those things which are ahead, I press toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus." — *Philippians 3:13–14, NKJV*

Every Christian has a past, but praise be to God—we are not prisoners of it. Whether it's a past full of mistakes, regrets, or even great successes, Scripture teaches us not to live backward but forward. As Paul so powerfully says in Philippians, we are to forget what is behind and press on toward Christ.

I. The Burden of the Past

The past has a way of lingering. Sometimes it's the memory of sin we've committed before we obeyed the gospel. Other times, it's mistakes we've made even after becoming Christians. There are also personal hurts, failures, and disappointments that weigh us down emotionally and spiritually.

Satan loves to weaponize our past. He wants to remind us of who we were so we forget who we are in Christ. He accuses, he shames, and he distracts us from our mission (Revelation 12:10). But when God forgives, He remembers our sins no more (Hebrews 8:12). If God has let it go, why should we hold on?

Holding on to guilt that has already been forgiven is not humility—it's unbelief. We must believe that the blood of Jesus is truly sufficient to cleanse us (I John I:7). We are not defined by what we've done but by what Jesus has done for us.

2. Biblical Examples of Moving Forward

Paul, who penned Philippians, is the perfect example. Before becoming an apostle, he persecuted Christians, dragging them from their homes and approving their deaths (Acts 8:1–3; Acts 9:1–2). He described himself as the "chief" of sinners (1 Timothy 1:15). Yet after encountering Christ, he did not let his shame paralyze him. He

accepted grace and spent the rest of his life pressing forward.

King David also made tragic mistakes—adultery, deceit, and even murder. But when he repented, God forgave him, and David continued to seek after God's heart (Psalm 51; Acts 13:22). Even Peter, who denied Jesus three times, found restoration and purpose (John 21:15–19). Their stories teach us that God is not finished with us when we fail. He redeems broken pasts and uses them for His glory.

3. Forgetting Does Not Mean Erasing

When Paul says "forgetting those things which are behind," he does not mean a literal erasure of memory. Paul often recalled his past (Galatians I:13) as a testimony to God's grace. Instead, he meant that the past no longer controlled or defined his present.

There is a difference between learning from the past and living in it. The past may explain us, but it does not excuse us—and it does not own us. God can use even the worst parts of our history as instruments of His mercy and power. Joseph told his brothers, "You meant evil against me, but God meant it for good" (Genesis 50:20). That's what God can do with your past.

Conclusion: Press On

What lies behind you may explain part of your story—but it does not define you. In Christ, you are a new creation (2 Corinthians 5:17). Forget what is behind. Reach forward to what is ahead. Keep your eyes on Jesus. The best is not behind you—it's ahead of you.

"Let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith..."

— Hebrews 12:1–2

Let's run with joy. Let's press on. Let's look forward to Christ.





What lies before us? Part 2

"Brethren, I do not count myself to have apprehended; but one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind and reaching forward to those things which are ahead, I press toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus." — Philippians 3:13–14, NKJV Every Christian has a past, but praise be to God— we are not prisoners of it. Whether it's a past full of mistakes, regrets, or even great successes, Scripture teaches us not to live backward but forward. As Paul so powerfully says in Philippians, we are to forget what is behind and press on toward Christ.

4. Reaching Forward to Christ

We don't just forget the past—we press forward. Christianity is not just about what we leave behind but what we are striving toward. Paul says he reaches for "the prize of the upward call of God in Christ lesus." That prize is eternal life in the presence of God. But reaching forward requires focus. We can't run the Christian race while looking backward. Just as a runner strains ahead toward the finish line, we must put our energy, focus, and hope into knowing Christ more each day (Philippians 3:10). We are growing into His likeness, and every day is an opportunity to become more like Him. This pursuit includes personal devotion, worship, service, evangelism, and faithfulness in trials. It means making choices today that align with the future we are promised. It means looking not at temporary setbacks, but at the eternal reward (2 Corinthians 4:17-18).

5. Grace for Today, Hope for Tomorrow

Sometimes we're not held back by past sins but by past pain—loss, trauma, betrayal, or broken dreams. Jesus offers healing for that too. He invites the weary and burdened to come and find rest (Matthew 11:28–30). He is not only the Savior of our souls but the healer of our hearts.

God doesn't promise a life without difficulty, but He does promise new mercies each morning (Lamentations 3:22–23). He gives grace for each step, no matter how broken we feel. Our future is not determined by our past but by His promises. And His promises are sure. We are promised a home in heaven (John 14:2–3), a crown of life (James 1:12), and fellowship with God forever. That is what we look forward to. That is our motivation to keep going.

6. Living Forward as a Church

As a congregation, we too must apply this truth. Sometimes churches hold on to past conflicts, old wounds, or even traditions that hinder growth. Just like individuals, congregations must commit to being future-focused. Let us forgive as Christ forgave us (Ephesians 4:32). Let us support one another in growth and spiritual maturity. Let us reach out to the lost, build up the saved, and keep our eyes on Jesus. The church is not a museum of perfect people, but a family of redeemed sinners striving together toward heaven. Let's move forward in unity, purpose, and love.

Conclusion: Press On

What lies behind you may explain part of your story—but it does not define you. In Christ, you are a new creation (2 Corinthians 5:17). Forget what is behind. Reach forward to what is ahead. Keep your eyes on Jesus. The best is not behind you—it's ahead of you. "Let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith..." Hebrews 12:1–2.

Let's run with joy. Let's press on. Let's look forward to Christ.



IT JUST WASN'T CONVENIENT, BUT WE WENT ANYWAY!

I remember as a young lad, attending church wasn't nearly as convenient as it is now. I remember most of the time we would hitch the mules to the farm wagon and make the 2 mile trip to the meeting house. It didn't matter how cold, hot, or wet it might be — we had an appointment to keep. There were no paved roads — just mud. There were no modern conveniences such as indoor plumbing, electric lights, air conditioning, or electric heat. There were two small buildings, one was marked "Women" the other "Men" and they were outside, one on either side of the church building. They really did stink too!

The windows would be up in the dog days of summer and the insects must have loved the preaching because the building would be full of them. There were no padded pews, no nursery for crying babies, and no water fountain to entice kids to run in and out. Children were not allowed to get up and down and disturb the worshipers. Revival meetings lasted for 2 weeks, sometimes 3, and the preacher dare not quit before 2 hours of "Explaining the way of the Lord more perfectly" to us!

That really kept us away, Right? Wrong, because the people came. We walked. We drove cars. We borrowed rides. We drove mules and wagons. It was not an inconvenience for us to make the effort to be there. Obviously, we did not come because of those inconveniences, but neither did they keep us away.

Today we have nice buildings, padded pews, electric lighting, central heat and air, carpeted floors, well furnished nurseries, cold water fountains, indoor plumbing, and sermons that dare not go beyond about 30 minutes. Even our transportation is heated and cooled. All of these things have increased interest and attendance, right? Wrong again!

I like conveniences as well as the next fellow but we do not go to worship because of them nor do we stay away because of a lack thereof! Instead, we assemble because of an intense love, devotion, and appreciation to the Lord who loved us and saved us by His blood. And when we are willfully absent it is because of a lack of these same attributes of love, devotion, and appreciation. The answer is not more gadgets and gimmicks but in lifting up the Lord. When men appreciate what Christ has done for them at Calvary, convenience is the last thing on their minds!





Proof of God's Existence

The question of God's existence is one of the most important inquiries mankind can make. We hold firmly that God not only exists, but that He has revealed Himself clearly through creation, His Word, and ultimately through His Son, Jesus Christ. Our faith is not blind, but is grounded in evidence that compels the honest seeker to acknowledge the reality of God.

First, the created world itself testifies of God's existence. The apostle Paul declared, "For since the creation of the world His invisible attributes are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, even His eternal power and Godhead, so that they are without excuse" (Romans 1:20). Order, complexity, and design cannot come from nothing or from chaos. The heavens declare the glory of God (Psalm 19:1), showing us a Designer who is both powerful and intelligent. Just as a house demands a builder, and a painting demands a painter, so creation demands a Creator. This reasoning is both biblical and rational, and the church of Christ consistently appeals to it in defending the faith.

Second, God has revealed Himself through His inspired Word, the Bible. We believe the Scriptures are more than human writings; they are "Godbreathed" (2 Timothy 3:16). Their unity, despite being written over centuries by various men, is remarkable. The fulfilled prophecies within the Bible provide undeniable evidence of divine origin. For example, prophecies concerning the coming of Christ, such as His birth in Bethlehem (Micah 5:2) and His sacrificial death (Isaiah 53), were spoken hundreds of years before their fulfillment. Only God, who knows the end from the beginning (Isaiah 46:10), could provide such accurate revelation. The Word not only affirms God's existence but also reveals His will and character.

Third, the greatest proof of God's existence is found in Jesus Christ. The New Testament records His life, death, and resurrection, all supported by eyewitness testimony. His resurrection is the cornerstone of Christian faith, for if Christ was raised, then God exists and has acted powerfully in history (I Corinthians 15:3-8). The apostles, who witnessed the risen Lord, willingly gave their lives rather than deny what they had seen. Their testimony, preserved in Scripture, remains a compelling proof that God is real and that He has revealed Himself through His Son.

Finally, the evidence of God is also seen in the transformed lives of those who obey the gospel. The church of Christ emphasizes that obedience to God's Word changes hearts and produces holiness, love, and hope. Atheism and human philosophies cannot provide lasting peace or moral grounding, but faith in God gives life purpose and meaning.

In conclusion, the church of Christ affirms that the existence of God is proven through creation, revelation, Christ's resurrection, and the power of the gospel. This is not a matter of speculation but of faith built upon evidence. As Hebrews 11:6 declares, "But without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him." God exists, and those who sincerely seek Him will find Him.



Broken?

The psalmist David, king in Israel, poured his heart and soul out in poetic literature left for all. The highs and lows in his life are seen through the words written for our learning (Rom. 15:4). It's believed that the low and lonesome time of Psalm 51 came after his sin with Bathsheba as David was a broken man after his confrontation with Nathan the prophet of God (II Sam. 12:7). He was broken, but he didn't wallow in his brokenness. He rather sought forgiveness from the Father to be a blessing to Israel.

As one of the children of Israel, he fell into the sin trap. To remove that sin he cried out to God for mercy and forgiveness (Psa. 51:1-9). The sense he speaks of is one all will experience at some point in life, that of being surrounded—overwhelmed—by the wicked world. David came into a world of sin and rather than rising above it, he fell into it. With broken spirit he asked the Lord to forgive and to hide His face from his sins. Not only that but he also asked that his iniquities be blotted out (v. 9).

A prayer for the renewal of repentance follows (vv. 10-13); "create in me a clean heart, O God" recognizing he had heart trouble and needed the great Physician to fix it. The world will certainly soil the heart; it's important to know and keep it clean because from your heart are the issues of life (Prov. 4:23). A pure heart (Psa. 24:4) divested of worldly things produces a right spirit pleasing to God (Matt. 18:3).

The God of Heaven recognizes "a broken spirit" and "a broken and contrite heart" (Psa. 51:17). This is borne out in the prayer of commitment to righteousness (vv. 14-17). Only One has the ability to look upon the heart (I Sam. 16:7).

A prayer of intercession (vv. 18-19) closes Psalm 51. Much like the appeal of Christ "Thy will be done" (Matt. 6:10), is the appeal of the psalmist asking God to act for their good according to His [God's] good pleasure.

For the Christian it is much the same, just better. The Light was manifested (I John I:3) so that we could have remission of sins, and a Savior who acts in our behalf. This should produce joy (v. 4) in service to Christ (Phil. 4:4). In the new covenant children of God are blessed to "walk in the light" (I John I:7), and enjoy the grace of God. In all times the confession of sin before a loving God has been key (I John I:8-9). The old saying: "honest confession is good for the soul" is right. God's people of old were told to repent and pray (II Chron. 7:14), and that's the same today.

Can God forgive me? Killed any Christians lately? Saul of Tarsus did and God forgave him, making him a beloved apostle. Done what David did? God forgave him and regarded him as a man after His own heart. If your spirit is broken before God, then you are set by His direction to be a blessing.

Have you obeyed the Gospel?

God, in His great love, has provided a clear and simple plan for mankind to be saved from sin. The Scriptures teach that "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Romans 3:23). But through Jesus Christ, God made a way for us to be reconciled to Him.

The plan begins with **hearing** the gospel, for "faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God" (Romans 10:17). Once we hear, we must **believe** that Jesus is the Son of God (John 8:24). Belief alone, however, is not enough. We must **repent**—turning away from sin and turning toward God (Acts 17:30).

Next, the Bible calls us to **confess** Jesus before men, acknowledging Him as Lord (Romans 10:9-10; Matthew 10:32). Then, we must be **baptized** into Christ for the forgiveness of sins (Acts 2:38; Mark 16:16). In baptism, our sins are washed away, and we are added to the body of Christ (Galatians 3:27; Acts 2:47).

The plan of salvation does not end at baptism. We are called to **live faithfully** unto death (Revelation 2:10), continuing to walk in the light of God's Word (1 John 1:7).

God's plan is not complicated—it is rooted in His grace and revealed in His Word. The question is whether we will humbly obey it.

Have you followed the Lord's plan of salvation? Paul said, "now is the day of salvation" (2 Corinthians 6:2).

Brotherly Kindness: A Vital Christian Virtue

The inspired apostle Peter, in his second epistle, gives a list of virtues that Christians are to diligently add to their faith. He writes: "And beside this, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue; and to virtue knowledge; and to knowledge temperance; and to temperance patience; and to patience godliness; and to godliness brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness charity" (2 Peter 1:5-7). Among these essential graces, Peter includes brotherly kindness, which deserves careful attention from every child of God.

Brotherly kindness is not simply a suggestion—it is a divine requirement. It flows directly from the love of God and reflects the unity that Christ prayed for among His followers (John 17:20-21). Let us consider what brotherly kindness means, how it is demonstrated, and why it is essential for the faithful Christian walk.

The word translated "brotherly kindness" in 2 Peter 1:7 comes from the Greek word 'philadelphia' ($\phi\iota\lambda\alpha\delta\epsilon\lambda\phi(\alpha)$, which literally means "love of the brethren." It is a deep affection that Christians are to have for one another, rooted in the fact that we are members of God's family. The church is not a mere human institution but the body of Christ, purchased with His precious blood (Acts 20:28).

Thus, brotherly kindness is not optional; it is the natural outworking of our new relationship in Christ. As John writes, "We know that we have passed from death unto life, because we love the brethren. He that loveth not his brother abideth in death" (1 John 3:14). To be without brotherly kindness is to be without evidence of eternal life.

Brotherly kindness begins with the recognition of God's love toward us. Paul wrote: "But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8). Since God showed His love to us when we were undeserving, we must reflect that love toward others—even when they may fall short.

Jesus Himself gave the perfect example of love and service in washing the disciples' feet (John 13:14-15). He then commanded, "By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one to another" (John 13:35). Brotherly kindness, therefore, is a testimony to the world of the authenticity of our faith.

The Scriptures give us many practical ways to demonstrate brotherly kindness in the church:

- 1. Bearing One Another's Burdens Gal. 6:2
- 2. Forgiving One Another Ephesians 4:32
- 3. Preferring One Another Romans 12:10
- 4. Supporting the Weak Romans 15:1
- 5. Hospitality Hebrews 13:1-2

Why is brotherly kindness so vital in the church of Christ? It Maintains Unity, Encourages Growth, Honors Christ, and It Prepares Us for Heaven.

The lack of brotherly kindness is a serious spiritual problem. Where there is envy, backbiting, gossip, or coldness among brethren, the cause of Christ suffers. John makes it plain: "He that loveth not his brother whom he hath seen, how can he love God whom he hath not seen?" (I John 4:20). Without brotherly kindness, we cannot truly claim to love God.

Brotherly kindness is not a mere courtesy; it is a command of God, rooted in the very essence of the Christian faith. It grows out of our love for God and is shown in our love for His people. It is indispensable in maintaining unity, strengthening the body, and glorifying God.

Peter reminds us that adding brotherly kindness to our faith ensures that we will not be barren or unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ (2 Peter 1:8). Let us, then, resolve to cultivate this virtue diligently, remembering always that we are members one of another (Romans 12:5). In doing so, we reflect the love of Christ and shine as lights in a darkened world.



My family and I enjoyed a nice fall break trip to Florida. We relaxed and spent good quality time with family and friends. However, every vacation must come to an end. We are excited to get back to work and refocus on the task at hand, bringing souls to Christ!

Discipleship in Christ

Discipleship is at the very heart of Christianity. Jesus' call to His followers was not simply to believe in Him, but to follow Him. In Matthew 16:24 (NKJV), He declared, "If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow Me." To be a disciple of Christ means to live in complete devotion and obedience to His teachings. Within the Church of Christ, discipleship is viewed as a lifelong commitment to learning from Jesus, imitating His example, and helping others do the same.

The Call to Follow Christ

From the beginning, Jesus invited men and women into a relationship defined by obedience and transformation. When He called Peter, Andrew, James, and John, He said, "Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men" (Matthew 4:19). They left their nets immediately and followed Him. Their example shows that discipleship requires sacrifice and a willingness to leave behind worldly priorities. A disciple is one who puts Christ first in every area of life (Luke 14:33).

Discipleship begins with hearing and obeying the gospel. Faith comes by hearing the Word of God (Romans 10:17). That faith leads a person to repent of sin, confess Jesus as Lord, and be baptized for the forgiveness of sins (Acts 2:38; 22:16). Through baptism, one is united with Christ and begins a new life of following Him (Romans 6:3-4). Discipleship does not end at conversion—it begins there.

Learning and Living the Word

A true disciple of Christ is a continual learner. Jesus said, "If you abide in My word, you are My disciples indeed" (John 8:31). Discipleship means more than simply attending worship; it means allowing the Word of God to shape one's heart, mind, and actions. The early Christians in Acts 2:42 "continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in prayers." They were dedicated students of the gospel and examples of what it means to live out faith daily. Members of the body of Christ are encouraged to study Scripture diligently, not to follow human creeds or traditions, but to follow the pure Word

of God. As Paul wrote to Timothy, "Be diligent to present yourself approved to God, a worker who does not need to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth" (2 Timothy 2:15). Through continual study, prayer, and obedience, disciples grow in the likeness of Christ.

Serving and Sharing

Discipleship also involves serving others. Jesus said, "The Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve" (Matthew 20:28). Every disciple is called to follow this example of humble service. In the Lord's Church, believers are encouraged to use their abilities for the good of others—teaching, encouraging, helping the needy, and strengthening the church. True discipleship is seen in love and service.

Furthermore, disciples make other disciples. Jesus commanded, "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations" (Matthew 28:19). This Great Commission is central to the mission of the Church. Each member has the responsibility to share the gospel and help others come to know Christ. Discipleship, therefore, is both personal growth and active evangelism.

The Cost and the Reward

Discipleship requires commitment, endurance, and sometimes sacrifice. Jesus never promised that following Him would be easy, but He did promise that it would be worth it. "Be faithful until death," He said, "and I will give you the crown of life" (Revelation 2:10). Perilous Times

We are living in perilous times. School shootings are increasing at an alarming pace. Murder is a nightly occurrence. Fornication is perhaps at the highest it has ever been. Profanity is heard on the streets, in restaurants, on television and almost everywhere you go. The way folks dress, the language we hear, the lifestyle of many all point to the fact that morality is almost a thing of the past with many. The murder of the unborn continues daily, and folks say little. We are living in a time much like that expressed at the end of the book of Judges: "In those days there was no king in Israel: every man did that which was right in his own eyes" (Judg. 21:25).

As bad as it is, we should not be surprised. The Holy Spirit, through Paul, told us what our world would be like. "This know also, that in the last days perilous times shall come. For men shall be lovers of their own selves, covetous, boasters, proud, blasphemers, disobedient to parents, unthankful, unholy, Without natural affection, trucebreakers, false accusers, incontinent, fierce, despisers of those that are good, Traitors, heady, highminded, lovers of pleasures more than lovers of God; Having a form of godliness, but denying the power thereof: from such turn away" (II Tim. 3:1-5). As you read these inspired words, does this not sound like our world?

As Christians, what should be our response to these things? What should we do? For one thing, we should be standing out as different from those of the world. Paul wrote, "I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service. And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God" (Rom. 12:1-2).

Instead of "fitting in" by conforming to the world's standards, we are to be different. Jesus says that we are to "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven" (Matt. 5:16). Later, the apostle Paul, speaking by inspiration, speaks of the world we live in and writes, "Do all things without murmurings and disputings: That ye may be blameless and harmless, the sons of God, without rebuke, in the midst of a crooked and perverse nation, among whom ye shine as lights in the world; Holding forth the word of life; that I may rejoice in the day of Christ, that I have not run in vain, neither laboured in vain" (Phil. 2:14-16).

We "hold forth the word of life" in at least two ways. One is by living in accordance with its teaching: "Only let your conversation be as it becometh the gospel of Christ" (Phil. I:27). Two, by teaching and preaching it. "Preach the word; be instant in season, out of season; reprove, rebuke, exhort with all long suffering and doctrine" (II Tim. 4:2). So let each of us determine to live for Him who died for us, and continue to teach the Gospel. And whatever we do, "let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not."



Is Your Cup Half Empty or Full?

I want to discuss the well-known idiom that asks whether the cup is half empty or half full. A person who sees a cup as half full is usually more optimistic and focuses on what is already present in the cup. Someone who sees the cup as half empty is more pessimistic, focusing on what is missing from the cup.

What is your perception of the cup? More specifically, how do we perceive our lives and react to the situations that happen to us?

Half-full (optimistic) people have a positive outlook and are hopeful about the future. This positive view can help people see the good in situations and even help influence others to do the same. While viewing things as half-empty (pessimistic) can sometimes be realistic, it may also lead to negativity and discouragement.

When the road of life is easy, we can view the cup as half full. When challenging or difficult times come, we can easily become discouraged and view the cup as half empty. We may start to question God about why this is happening.

When we face difficult situations that we don't understand, one of the best things to do is to trust in God. "We know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose" (Romans 8:28). How do we learn to trust God? By studying his words more thoroughly. Verses like Proverbs 3:5-8 remind us to "trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight."

Things will happen in life that will make our cup look more empty than full, but no matter what we are going through, we have to keep our outlook on life focused on God. God knows we are challenged at times, and we must trust he knows what is best for us. He use these difficult situations for the completion of his works.

The last question we must ask involves internal thought. Are these challenges just a random occurrence due to living in a broken world, or have our life decisions or benevolent discipline brought them on? "Is it not from the mouth of the Most High that good and bad come? Why should a living man complain, a man, about the punishment of his sins?" (Lamentations 3:38-40). Let us test and examine our ways to make sure we are still on the Christian path forward. When the cup begins to feel more empty than full, just remember God has made our cup runneth over with the hope of heaven (Psalm 23:5).



Different by Design

From the beginning of creation, God made a clear distinction between light and darkness, right and wrong, truth and error. In Genesis 1:4 we read, "God saw the light, that it was good; and God divided the light from the darkness." This divine separation shows that God intends His people to be different by design. We are not meant to blend in with the world but to shine as lights in it (Philippians 2:15).

The Lord's church, the Church of Christ, was designed to be different from the religious world around it. Jesus said in Matthew 16:18, "I will build My church, and the gates of Hades shall not prevail against it." The church belongs to Christ, not to man. It follows His pattern, not human traditions or creeds. Paul reminded the Corinthians, "For no other foundation can anyone lay than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ" (I Corinthians 3:11). The design of the Lord's church is therefore unique—it is divine in origin, simple in structure, and distinct in purpose.

The church is called to be a peculiar people—not odd or strange, but set apart for God's service. Peter wrote, "But you are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, His own special people, that you may proclaim the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light" (I Peter 2:9). The word "holy" means "set apart." To be holy is to live differently—to think, speak, and act according to the will of God rather than the patterns of this world.

Paul urged Christians, "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind" (Romans 12:2). This transformation is not accidental; it is intentional. We are designed to live by the teaching of Christ. The pattern for worship, organization, and daily living is found in the New Testament. We sing without instruments because the early church sang with the heart (Ephesians 5:19). We partake of the Lord's Supper each first day of the week because that is what the disciples did (Acts 20:7). We have elders and deacons as the Bible directs (Philippians 1:1). These are not traditions of men—they are part of God's divine design for His church.

Being different will sometimes bring challenges. Jesus said, "If the world hates you, you know that it hated Me before it hated you" (John 15:18). Yet, our difference is our strength. When we live as God intends, the world can see Christ in us. Our kindness, honesty, purity, and love all testify that we belong to Him.

We must never apologize for being different by design. It is what God intended from the beginning. The Lord's church is not just another denomination—it is the body of Christ, distinct in name, worship, and doctrine because it follows the pattern revealed in Scripture.

Let us embrace that difference with joy and conviction, remembering Paul's words: "Therefore, come out from among them and be separate, says the Lord" (2 Corinthians 6:17).

To be different by design is not a burden—it is a blessing. It is the way to glorify God and to lead others to His marvelous light.



The Character of God

Understanding the characteristics of God shapes every part of a Christian's faith. The Scriptures reveal not a distant deity, but the living God who created us, loves us, and calls us to walk in His ways. As Paul declared, "that they should seek the Lord... though He is not far from each one of us" (Acts 17:27). Knowing who God is helps us know how to serve Him faithfully.

God Is Holy

One of the most fundamental traits of God is His holiness. Scripture proclaims, "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of His glory!" (Isaiah 6:3). God's holiness means He is completely pure, set apart, and without any moral flaw. Because God is holy, He calls His people to holiness: "Be holy, for I am holy" (I Peter I:16). Our conduct, decisions, and values must reflect His purity.

God Is Love

John beautifully writes, "God is love" (1 John 4:8). This does not merely describe what God does—it describes who He is. His love is shown throughout Scripture, culminating in the giving of His Son: "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son" (John 3:16). The cross is the clearest picture of God's character. His love is unselfish, sacrificial, patient, and steadfast. As recipients of such love, Christians are called to love one another in the same way (1 John 4:11).

God Is Just

God's justice assures us that He always does what is right. Moses declared, "All His ways are justice. A God of truth and without injustice; righteous and upright is He" (Deuteronomy 32:4). In a world filled with injustice, God stands as the perfect Judge who "will render to each one according to his deeds" (Romans 2:6). His justice also means that sin cannot be ignored. The penalty of sin was paid through Christ, satisfying both the justice and the mercy of God.

God Is Merciful and Gracious

While God is just, He is also wonderfully merciful. David praised Him, saying, "The Lord is gracious and full of compassion, slow to anger and great in mercy" (Psalm 145:8). The mercy of God means He withholds the punishment we deserve, and His grace means He gives blessings we could never earn. This mercy is extended to those who turn to Him. Through obedience to the gospel—faith, repentance, confession, and baptism into Christ—we receive His grace and walk in newness of life (Romans 6:3–4).

God Is All-Knowing, All-Present, and All-Powerful

God's nature is beyond human comprehension. He is all-knowing, for "His understanding is infinite" (Psalm 147:5). He is everywhere present: "Where can I go from Your Spirit? Or where can I flee from Your presence?" (Psalm 139:7). He is all-powerful: "For with God nothing will be impossible" (Luke 1:37). These characteristics assure believers that God sees every struggle, hears every prayer, and has the power to sustain and deliver His people.

God Is Faithful

The Scriptures emphasize the unwavering faithfulness of God. Paul declares, "He remains faithful; He cannot deny Himself" (2 Timothy 2:13). Every promise God has made He will fulfill. His faithfulness gives Christians confidence to endure trials, knowing that "He Himself has said, I will never leave you nor forsake you" (Hebrews 13:5).

Conclusion

The more we know about God's characteristics, the more we can genuinely worship, trust, and obey Him. As we grow in our understanding of His holiness, love, justice, mercy, power, and faithfulness, we learn what it means to be His people. Let us commit ourselves to drawing nearer to the God who made us, redeemed us, and sustains us each day.





God's Family

The idea of belonging is one of the deepest longings of the human heart. From the beginning, God created mankind for fellowship with Him and with one another. Throughout Scripture, the Lord uses family language to describe His relationship with His teaching reflect the design God intended for His people. In the New Testament, this theme reaches its fullness as God invites all who obey the gospel to become part of His family-a spiritual household built upon Christ. Understanding what it means to be God's family helps us appreciate our identity in Christ and our responsibility toward one another in the church.

foundation of the world. Paul wrote that God "chose us in Him before the foundation of the world" (Ephesians 1:4). His desire was to bring redeemed people into a relationship that mirrors the intimacy, unity, and love found within a household. When one weep with those who weep (Romans 12:15). The obeys the gospel—believing, repenting, confessing Christ, and being baptized for the remission of sins (Mark 16:16; Acts 2:38)—that person is added by the Lord to the church (Acts 2:47). The church is not a social club, an institution of human design, or a loose collection of religious ideas. It is the family of God, called out of darkness and brought into His marvelous light (1 Peter 2:9).

As God's family, we have the privilege of calling Him our Father. Paul reminds Christians, "For you are all sons of God through faith in Christ Jesus" (Galatians 3:26). This is not a mere figure of speech but describes a real spiritual adoption. Through Christ, we are no longer strangers or outsiders but His children—loved, protected, and disciplined for our good (Hebrews 12:6-7). Because we have been adopted into God's household, we share an inheritance that "does not fade away, reserved in heaven" (I Peter I:4). Every Christian, no matter background or nationality, becomes part of this same family.

In God's family, Christ is the head of the church (Ephesians 1:22-23). As members of His body, we are connected to Him and to one another. This unity is not based on personal preference, cultural similarity, or human tradition. It is rooted in our common

submission to God's word. Jesus prayed that His followers "may be one" (John 17:21), and this unity is maintained as we walk together in the doctrine of Christ (2 John 9). The church of Christ emphasizes returning to the New Testament pattern so that our worship, organization, and

The New Testament also describes Christians as brothers and sisters. This language highlights our responsibility to love one another deeply. Jesus teaches that the world will know we belong to Him by our love (John 13:35). This love is not superficial but sacrificial, patient, and sincere. Paul God's plan for His family began before the writes, "Be kindly affectionate to one another with brotherly love" (Romans 12:10). In God's family, we bear one another's burdens (Galatians 6:2), encourage the fainthearted, restore the erring (Galatians 6:1), rejoice with those who rejoice, and church becomes a place where no one should feel alone because every member is connected by a spiritual bond stronger than blood.

> Being part of God's family also carries responsibility. As children of the King, we are called to holiness: "But as He who called you is holy, you also be holy in all your conduct" (I Peter 1:15). We strive to reflect our Father's character in purity, kindness, faithfulness, and obedience. Just as earthly families share values and identity, God's family is distinguished by Christlike living.



The Gospel Plan of Salvation

One of the greatest blessings revealed in Scripture is that God desires all people to be saved and come to the knowledge of the truth (I Timothy 2:3-4). Salvation is not a mystery reserved for a select few, nor is it based on human traditions or feelings. It is grounded in the clear and consistent teaching of the New Testament. The Lord's church has long emphasized the need to return to the simple, biblical pattern for becoming a Christian—the same plan taught and practiced by the apostles in the first century. This plan is not man-made; it is the gospel of Christ, "the power of God to salvation" (Romans 1:16). The gospel plan of salvation is revealed step-bystep in Scripture, showing how a sinner moves from being lost to being saved, from being outside of Christ to being added to His church.

Hearing the Gospel

The journey begins with hearing the message of Christ. Faith does not arise from emotion or inherited belief but from exposure to God's word. "So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God" (Romans 10:17). On Pentecost, the 3,000 who obeyed did so only after hearing Peter preach the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus (Acts 2:22–36). No one can obey a gospel they have never heard, and no one can be saved without understanding the truth about Jesus.

Believing in Christ

Hearing alone is not enough; one must believe. Jesus said plainly, "If you do not believe that I am He, you will die in your sins" (John 8:24). Biblical belief is trusting Christ as the Son of God and accepting His authority. The eunuch confessed, "I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God" before he was baptized (Acts 8:37). This belief forms the foundation of obedience. It is not a mere mental acknowledgment —it is a conviction that leads to action.

Repenting of Sin

The gospel demands a change of heart and life. Repentance is not simply feeling regret; it is turning away from sin and toward God. Peter declared, "Repent, and let every one of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins" (Acts 2:38). Paul preached that God "commands all men everywhere to repent" (Acts 17:30). Repentance is

essential because sin separates man from God (Isaiah 59:1–2), and no one can cling to sin while seeking salvation.

Confessing Christ

The New Testament also teaches that one must confess Jesus openly. "If you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved" (Romans 10:9–10). Jesus Himself said, "Whoever confesses Me before men, him I will also confess before My Father" (Matthew 10:32). This confession is not a ritualistic statement but a sincere acknowledgment of Jesus' identity and authority.

Being Baptized for the Forgiveness of Sins

Baptism is a crucial part of God's plan, not a symbolic act but a moment of spiritual transformation. The Bible clearly states that baptism is "for the remission of sins" (Acts 2:38). It is the point at which sins are washed away (Acts 22:16), one is buried with Christ and raised to walk in newness of life (Romans 6:3–4), and one puts on Christ (Galatians 3:27). Every conversion in Acts includes baptism as an essential step in becoming a Christian. Through baptism, God adds the saved to the church (Acts 2:47).

Living Faithfully

The gospel plan does not end at baptism. Christians must continue walking in the light (I John 1:7), remain faithful until death (Revelation 2:10), and grow in grace and knowledge (2 Peter 3:18). Salvation is a lifelong commitment to Christ, motivated by love and sustained by obedience.

Conclusion

The gospel plan of salvation is simple, beautiful, and powerful. It reflects God's desire for all to be saved and the loving sacrifice of Jesus Christ. As the church of Christ, we call all people back to the same plan taught by the apostles: hear the gospel, believe in Christ, repent of sins, confess His name, be baptized for the remission of sins, and live faithfully. This is the path to salvation revealed in the New Testament and available to all who will humbly obey.



Hearing the Gospel

From the beginning of God's redemptive plan, hearing the Gospel has been essential to man's salvation. The Lord's church has long emphasized that faith is not produced by feelings, personal experiences, or inherited belief, but by hearing the revealed word of God. The New Testament repeatedly affirms that hearing the Gospel is the first necessary step in coming to Christ and obeying Him.

The apostle Paul plainly states, "So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God" (Romans 10:17). Faith does not originate within the human heart apart from revelation; it is the result of exposure to God's inspired message. Without hearing the Gospel, there can be no genuine faith, and without faith, it is impossible to please God (Hebrews 11:6).

The Gospel itself is clearly defined in Scripture. Paul writes, "Moreover, brethren, I declare to you the gospel which I preached to you... that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, and that He was buried, and that He rose again the third day according to the Scriptures" (I Corinthians 15:1–4). Hearing the Gospel means hearing these divinely revealed facts concerning Jesus Christ—His death, burial, and resurrection—and understanding their meaning for our salvation.

Jesus emphasized the necessity of hearing during His earthly ministry. In the parable of the sower, He described different responses to the word, but the seed was always the same—the word of God (Luke 8:11). The condition of the heart determined whether the hearer benefited. Christ often concluded His teaching by saying, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear!" (Matthew 11:15). This highlights that hearing involves more than sound waves reaching the ear; it involves attentive, receptive listening that leads to obedience.

The book of Acts provides inspired examples of how people were saved, and in every case, the Gospel was first heard. On the Day of Pentecost, the apostles preached Christ to the Jews in Jerusalem. Luke records, "Now when they heard this, they were cut to the heart" (Acts 2:37). Their hearing produced

conviction, which led them to ask what they must do. The Ethiopian eunuch likewise heard the Gospel when Philip "preached Jesus to him" (Acts 8:35). Only after hearing could he believe and obey by being baptized.

The church of Christ stresses that hearing must come before belief, repentance, confession, and baptism. This divine order is not accidental. Jesus commanded, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature" (Mark 16:15). Preaching is required because people cannot respond to a message they have never heard. Paul asked rhetorically, "How shall they believe in Him of whom they have not heard?" (Romans 10:14). This underscores the urgency of evangelism and sound teaching.

Hearing the Gospel also requires respect for biblical authority. Not every religious message is the Gospel. Paul warned of those who would preach "another gospel" which is not truly good news (Galatians 1:6–9). Therefore, the church must be diligent to proclaim the pure word of God, "speaking the truth in love" (Ephesians 4:15), without addition or subtraction. Only the message revealed by the Holy Spirit has the power to save.

Furthermore, hearing is an ongoing responsibility for Christians. While initial hearing leads one into Christ, continual hearing sustains faith. The early church "continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine" (Acts 2:42). Regular exposure to God's word strengthens, corrects, and equips believers for every good work (2 Timothy 3:16–17).

In conclusion, hearing the Gospel is foundational to God's plan of salvation. It is through hearing that faith is produced, hearts are convicted, and souls are moved to obedient response. Christians must continue to emphasize clear, scriptural teaching so that men and women may hear, believe, and obey the saving message of Jesus Christ. As Jesus said, "Blessed are those who hear the word of God and keep it!" (Luke 11:28).


